The Coaches

Don Gibb (Florida '85) Head Coach

 \it{T} he 1994-95 swimming season is Don Gibb's second as the head of the Seminole program. It also marks his third year on the Seminole

staff after five seasons as the top assistant for the University of Florida men's program.

A 1985 graduate of the University of Florida with a degree in psychology, Gibb swam for the Gators for two seasons (1981-82 and 1982-83) and was a member of the Florida 1982-83 national championship team. Individually, he was the SEC

100-yard freestyle champion in 1982, and also a World Games Trials finalist in the 100m freestyle.

He played an important role in 1983 as a member of the Gators NCAA champion 400-yard free relay team which clinched the national title for Florida. Gibb also took seventh place in the 100-yard (43.62) freestyle at the 1983 NCAAs.

Gibb also led both the Florida State men's and women's teams to third place finishes at last season's ACC Championships, their highest places in the school's three year history in the league.

Married for nine years, Gibb and his wife Gena, a 1994 graduate of

Florida State School of Nursing have a four-year-old daughter, Sarah.



The Coaches

Gary Cole (Bowling Green '75) Diving Coach

In his 13th year as the diving coach at Florida State, Gary Cole continues to recruit and train some of the best divers in the nation. Besides his coaching

responsibilities, Cole also assists with the team computer management systems.

A member of the NCAA Diving Rules Committee and the U.S. Professional Diving Coaches Association, Cole has coached two World Age Group Champions and four collegiate All-Americans in his career. In 1984, three of his athletes finished in the top eight at the Canadian Olympic Trials. In 1988, Cole was selected as South Korea's

Olympic Coach and also earned Metro Diving Coach of the Year honors. After the 1991 and 1992 seasons, Cole was honored as an All-American Diving Coach by the Professional Diving Coaches Association.

Last season, Cole served as the meet director for the Atlantic Coast Conference Swimming and Diving Championships held in Florida State's Bobby E. Leach Center. The FSU diving team was the first to win the ACC without having an individual champion in an event.

Cole, a standout diver in college and high school where he was instructed by U.S. Olympic Coach Ron O'Brien, is married to the former Vickie Welcher of Ormond Beach. Their first child, Angela Lynne, turned two on July 16, 1994.

Leigh Ann Fetter-Witt (Texas '93) Assistant Coach

E ntering her second year on the Florida State swim staff, Leigh Ann Fetter-Witt, is one of the most accomplished swimmers in NCAA history. The 1993

graduate of the University of Texas was a four-year letter winner for the powerhouse Longhorns.

Fetter-Witt was the first woman in the world to break the 22 second barrier in the 50 freestyle and she currently holds the American record in that event.

She is also an international competiton veteran, swimming in the 1988 Olympics, the 1989 Pan Pacific Games,

the 1990 Goodwill Games, the 1991 Pan Pacific Games and the 1991 World Championship Games. While at Texas, Fetter-Witt was a 17-time NCAA Champion and worked as a student assistant for the Longhorns after completing her eligibility in 1991.

Fetter-Witt is married to Mike Witt and the couple celebrated their first anniversary on August 27, 1994.

Neil Harper (Louisiana State '88) Assistant Coach

I College coaching and his first as part of the "new look" Seminole staff. The two-time British Olympian comes to Florida State after six successful years at his alma mater, Louisiana State.

Harper's responsibilities include men's and women's recruiting coordinator, individualized strength and conditioning for all FSU swimmers and the on-deck coaching of the IM and stroke groups. During his

tenure at LSU, his recruiting and coaching helped the men to two Top 15 NCAA finishes and the Lady Tigers to two Top 20 and two Top 15 NCAA finishes.

Harper graduated from LSU with a Bachelor of Science degree in Education and Kinesiology. He also earned his teacher's certificate in Physical Education and Social Studies K-12.

As a collegiate student-athlete he was a seventime NCAA All-American and a four-time SEC Champion. In 1988 he led LSU to its first SEC team championship and a sixth place finish at the NCAAs. He also swam in two Olympic Games representing his native Great Britain in 1984 and 1988 making the final of the 400 Medley Relay on both occasions. In 1986, he competed in the 1986 World Championships and won a silver medal in the Commonwealth Games that same year.

Harper is married to the former Paige Busch of Orlando, herself a former high school and NCAA All-American and SEC 100 breastroke champion. Harper and his wife Paige had their first child, Katherine Alexis, on November 8th of this year.

Anthony Frangello (Georgia '91) Assistant Coach

 $m{A}$ nthony Frangello begins his first year as a full-time assistant with Florida State after spending the past two years as a graduate assistant with the swimming program. This will be Frangello's second season as the

Frangello had an outstanding collegiate career at Brevard Community College in Cocoa, FL, then at the University of Georgia. While at BCC, Frangello was the Junior College National Champ in the 100 and 200 butterfly and was a five-time NJCAA All-American. At Georgia, he set the Bulldog school record in the 200 fly three times and was a Southeastern Conference finalist and



As a swimmer at Florida State she was a member of the FSU record holding 400 freestyle relay team, and in high school she was a two-time state champion in the 50 free as well as claiming twelve letters in six different sports.

cently earned her master's degree in athletic administration and is currently pursuing a doctorate degree in the same field.

Ladies' Outlook

The Lady Seminoles swimming and diving team has improved their Atlantic Coast Conference finish one place every year since becoming a conference member three years ago. They concluded last season with a successful third place finish and head coach Don Gibb sees the trend continuing as his women's program continues to improve and picks up steam.

Coach Gibb feels this could very well be the year that the Lady Seminoles start knocking not only on the conference door, but begin getting recognition on the national scene as well. "We have established ourselves on the conference level, but we're not satisfied with that," said Gibb. "We have work to do. We have done some great things here recently and we look to continue in that direction."

The Lady Seminoles are again led by returning All-ACC swimmers Dora Bralic and Helen Jepson.

Bralic, a senior from Riyeka, Croatia, was the conference champion in the 100 breastroke and finished second in the 200 breast. She has been an All-ACC selection all three years at FSU and is the Croatian national record holder in the 100 breast.

Jepson finished second in the conference in the 200 fly and third in the 100 fly.

The junior from West Yorkshire, England is a two-time NCAA qualifier in the 200 fly and is also the school record holder in that event. Jepson just missed representing her native England in the 1992 Olympics.

While Jepson has qualified for the NCAAs the last two years, the coaching staff feels more athletes can qualify this year. "Helen went to NCAAs last year, and she should have a solid chance of reaching the finals at this year's," said Gibb. "Our program is moving into the area where we should have more swimmers qualify every year."

The Lady Seminoles will also rely heavily on seniors Ruth Kominski and Betty Engel, junior Claudia Wilson and sophomore Caroline Hamilton.

Kominski is an outstanding relay swimmer who recorded last season's fastest 50 free time. She also finaled in the 50 free and 100 fly at the ACC championships.

Engel is a former transfer from Indian River Community College where she was named National



Junior College Athletic Association Swimmer of the Year. She has the potential to be one of the ACC's top IM swimmers.

Wilson, from Brazil, has finaled in the 400 IM both years while at Florida State, and Hamilton returns as having swam the second fastest 200 breast time on the team behind the aforementioned Bralic.

Diving Coach Gary Cole returns the nucleus of last season's ACC diving championship team including junior Julie Henderson and sophomore Erin Gillooly. Both finished in the top five in the ACC with Henderson placing third and Gillooly fifth overall.

A newcomer to the diving squad is Julie's freshman sister Sarah, who is a former Florida high school state champion.

One sure sign the FSU program is rapidly improving is the talent-laden recruiting class which Coach Gibb considers to easily be national caliber. Among the headlining names are Jodi Krieg, Allison Smith and Mara Toole. All of whom are expected to make an immediate impact on the team.

The 1994-95 Florida State Women's Swimming and Diving Team returns the bulk of last year's highly successful squad, supplemented by one of the South's finest recruiting classes. Mix that with a young, enthusiastic, coaching staff with olympic experience and what could be realized is the establishment of one of the region's most exciting and up and coming swim programs.





Men's Outlook

R ecent occurances suggest the Florida State men's swimming and diving program is quickly becoming one of, if not, the most up and coming program in the South.

Evidence points to the Seminoles third place finish in the Atlantic Coast Conference last season which means FSU has improved their conference finish every year since joining the ACC three seasons ago. FSU also returns three individuals who qualified for NCAA's, including two who qualified for the World Championships in Rome. FSU also boasts a recruiting class which is one of the strongest in school history. Parlay that with a young, energetic coaching staff and its easy to understand why Florida State is developing a national class swimming program.

Florida State will be led by senior Ignacio Merino, junior Robert Braknis and sophomore Chip Haberstroh.

Merino, who hails from Quito, Ecuador, has qualified for the NCAAs the past two years in the 200 fly, and was named second team All-American after he finished 13th at the NCAAs. He is the school record holder in the 100 and 200 fly and also is a part of two school relay records. This summer, Merino competed in the World Championships in Rome.

Braknis is a returning two-time ACC champion in the 100 backstroke. He also qualified for the NCAAs in the 200 back, an event in which he is also the school record holder. In all, Bracknis, from Chateauguay, Ontario, holds three individual school records and is a member of three school record holding relay teams.

A sophomore from Canton, Massachusetts, Haberstroh was the third Seminole to qualify for the NCAAs last season. An All-ACC selection, Haberstroh qualified in the 1650 free, an event which he is a school record holder in addition to the 1000 free.

One mark of a strong swimming and diving program is having quality depth. Already having outstanding individuals head coach Don Gibb sees his program acquiring quality depth. "We fully expect to have more individuals qualify for the NCAAs this year," said Gibb. "What Ignacio, Rob, and Chip did is great, but we want more to join that group."

A few possibilities of joining the NCAA group and also greatly contributing to any success enjoyed by FSU are Thomas Bendixen, Eduardo Coelho, Kevin Murphy and Matthew Schmauch.



Bendixen, a junior from Denmark is a strong middle distance freestyler who returns as having the team's fastest 200 free time. At last year's ACCs, Bendixen finished fourth in that event, as well as being a consolation finalist in the 500 free.

A sophomore from Rio de Janeiro, Eduardo Coelho is a freestyle and fly sprinter with a legitamate shot at qualifying for the NCAAs. He is a member of FSU record-holding 200 free and 400 medley relay teams.

Murphy, from Bowie, MD returns as an ACC finalist in the 200 breast the last two years. The junior also finaled in the 200 IM at the conference championships.

A former transfer, junior Matthew Schmauch returns as recording the team's fastest 200 IM time a year ago. Coach Gibb believes Schmauch has a good chance of reaching the ACC finals in as many as three events.

With FSU's recent moves up the ACC ladder and the program's improvement as a whole, it has begun to attract national-caliber recruits. Highlighting the impressive class are Dustin Bengston from St. Petersburg's Boca Ciega High School, and Chris Plaisted from Rockledge High School. Bengston enters FSU as a high school All-American while Plaisted was ranked second nationally in the 1500 free for his age group.

With virtually everyone returning from last year's successful team and a stellar recruiting class entering, the Florida State men's team is poised to have one of its finest season's in school history.

1993-1994 Season In Review

During the 1993-94 season, Florida State's Swimming and Diving program continued their upward climb in the Atlantic Coast Conference and made numerous positive strides which are beginning to put Florida State on the national swimming and diving map.

Florida State finished in third place in both the men's and the women's ACC championships. The third place finish marked the highest finish for both team's in their young, three year existence in the conference, an existence which has seen FSU finish higher in the ACC every year.

FSU also claimed two individual champions, Dora Bralic in the 100 breast and Robert Braknis in the 100 back. In addition to Bralic and Braknis, three others claimed All-ACC honors including Helen Jepson, Chip Haberstroh, and Ignacio Merino.

Helen Jepson, Braknis, Haberstroh and Merino also qualified for the NCAA championships in Minneapolis. Merino finished thirteenth in the 200 fly to claim honorable mention All-American honors.

One of the biggest stories of the 1993-94 season was nine school records were broken. Robert Braknis claimed school records in the 50 free, 100 back and 200 back. Chip Haberstroh set the school record in the 1000 and 1650 free, while Ignacio Merino set records in the 100 and 200 fly. In addition to the seven new individual records being set, two school relay records were broken in the 200 and 400 medley relays.



The ACC Championships

T he 1994-95 Atlantic Coast Conference Swimming and Diving Championships return to the Koury Natatorium in Chapel Hill, with the University of North Carolina serving as host. The women's championships will be held February 16-18 while the men's championships will be held the following week, February 23-25. The return to Chapel Hill marks the eighth time in the past nine years that the championships have been held in the state of North Carolina.

Florida State played host to the 1993-94 ACC Swimming and Diving Championships for the first time. The Championships were held in the Bobby E. Leach Center with North Carolina taking both men's and women's team honors.

Florida State had their most successful ACC finish in school history by finishing third place in both the men's and women's championships. Helen Jepson and Robert Braknis claimed individual titles in the 100 breast and 100 back respectively. FSU also placed Helen Jepson, Bralic, Chip Haberstroh, Ignacio Merino and Braknis on the All-ACC team.



The University

From its beginning as "The Seminary West of the Suwannee" in 1857, Florida State University has grown to stretch across 347 acres of rolling oak and pine-covered hills to comprise a campus which has educated millions of students over the last century.

Florida State University has boasted a heritage of service and scholarship since the beginning when the legislature passed an act authorizing two state colleges — one east (now University of Florida) and one west of the meandering Suwannee River.

Starting with a 130-member coed enrollment in 1857, the Seminary survived the Civil War, reconstruction, radical social changes, and a variety of name changes to emerge in 1909 as the Florida State College for Women.

It was helped back into coed status in 1947 by a legislature anxious to open up the state's educational resources to thousands of degree-seeking ex-Gl's from World War II. It also was granted a new name "Florida State University." The university's expanse and complexity today contrast vividly with its beginning. Sixteen schools and colleges within the University serve more than 28,300 students who are enrolled in the 276 graduate and undergraduate degree programs and live and work among 1,300 faculty and 2,600 staff members. About 5,000 degrees are awarded every year.

In the past several years, the University has joined an elite group of universities in the United States which produce more than 200 doctoral graduates annually. Emphasis on graduate research and study at the University continues to grow, and today more than 4,000 graduate students pursue a variety of degrees.

Student life at Florida State University also offers young people ample opportunity to acquire leadership skills and to apply their classroom learning in student government, residence hall government, Greek social organizations, honors programs, departmental organizations and more than 200 other registered student organizations active on campus. The FSU Artist Series, the Distinguished Lecture Series and outstanding music, theater and dance production provide enjoyable evenings for the entire community.

Being a student at Florida State University means stepping into a tradition of more than 130 years of higher education. From its Flying High Circus to its Supercomputer Computations Research, Florida State provides a panorama of excitement, blending the educational and social sides of campus life.







Architectural depth and richness abound throughout Florida State's campus. From the Westcott building's grand turreted facade with its landmark fountain out front, to interesting walkways winding beneath turn-of-the-century brick archways and modern concrete canopies, students and professors alike find the trek between classes a short walk through this university's unique history.

Florida State Academics

A cademic, personal and professional support are essential to college success. At Florida State University, we have developed an outstanding support program which enables student-athletes to reach their full potential. The successes of the FSU swimming and diving program have carried over into the academic field as well. Earlier this year the men's team was the recipient of the prestigious Golden Torch Award which is presented annually at a black tie affair to the team with the higest grade point average on campus. The women's swimming and diving team finished second on campus with an overall GPA of 2.95 for the '93-'94 school year.

FSU's academic support philosophy is "to offer an academic support program integrated with the total university that will assess all student-athletes with the transition into college and provide continued support in all phases of academic and professional development culminating with graduation, job placement or graduate school."

To accomplish this goal we have developed an academic environment which facilitates the academic success of student-athletes. Student success is encouraged through competent academic counseling, career exploration, planning and placement and academic assistance through tutorial programs.

Our program operates on a "proactive" rather than "reactive" approach. At Florida State, our academic staff does not wait for academic crises to occur. We gather important background information and build an academic profile on all student-athletes to assess their needs in advance. We also stay informed on the daily progress of each student athlete.

The academic programs are moving to the state-of-the-art University Center and will be located on the sixth floor of the \$126,000,000 facility. It includes private study carrels, a tutorial study area and a computer lab outfitted with 16 new IBM computers and laser printers. In addition, athletic sky boxes are utilized for group and individual tutorial instruction.

FSU offers 16 Schools and Colleges with 99 undergraduate degrees and 75 post-baccalaureate degrees.


