

Don Gibb

HEAD COACH (FLORIDA '85)

Entering his sixth year as head coach, Don Gibb looks to improve on both team and individual performances from last season and use the gained experience to further enhance the program.

Gibb, the 1995 and 1998 ACC Men's Coach of the Year, continues to strengthen the men's and women's programs on the regional and national levels. He earned his 25th victory in 1996-97 and has had two National Champions in the past two years. Gibb coached the team to a third place finish at the ACC Championshipsin 1998. The accolades which the swimmers from his men's team received last season includes two ACC individual champions and two

relays at the conference meet in Charlottesville, ACC Swimmer of the Year and garnered the ACC Coach of the Year award. Six Seminole swimmers also participated in the NCAA Championships in Auburn competing in five relay events and five individual events. Coach Gibb's swimmers accumulated seven All-American finishes, a thirteenth place team finish and the school's second swimming national champion as Brendon Dedekind won the 50 Freestyle event after breaking the pool record in the preliminaries.

Coach Gibb also led the women's team to a 5-2 season and a 6th place finish in the ACC meet. The women also took fourth at both the Georgia Invitational and Auburn Invitational. Their success at the ACC meet included a second and third place finish in the 100 Breast, a third place finish in the 800 Free Relay and top eight finishes in the 200 Breast, 200 IM,

100 and 200 Free and the 400 Free Relay. Gibb coached the ladies to many consider-

ation times for the NCAA's and used the top performances to reflect on the season to come.

Prior to becoming head coach for the Seminoles, Gibb spent one year as an assistant on the Seminoles' staff and was the top assistant for the University of Florida's men's program for five seasons.

Gibb, who graduated from the University of Florida in 1985 with a degree in psychology, swam for the Gators for two seasons (1981-1983). While at Florida, Gibb was an SEC and NCAA Champion and ranked top 25 in the world three years in a row.

Gibb and his wife Gena of 13 years, herself a 1994 graduate of the Florida State School of Nursing, have two daughters, Sarah (8) and Emily (2).

Russ Bertram DIVING COACH (INDIANA '89)



Russ Bertram joined the Florida State staff in August as the diving coach for the Seminoles.

Bertram comes to Florida State from Fort Lauderdale where he spent two years as a Junior Olympic Diving Coach and Business Operations Manager for Fort Lauderdale Diving, Inc. His responsibilities included private instruction at all levels of competition as well as M.I.S Operations, accounts receivable, desktop publishing and customer relations.

Prior to coaching, Bertram was the Administrative Assistant for U.S. Diving, Inc. in Fort Lauderdale from 1990-96 where he worked with the National Technical Director to implement national programs designed to prepare U.S. athletes for world and Olympic competitions. He served as the Assistant to the

Director of Education, Safety, and Development for U.S. Diving from 1992-95 producing and editing videos for spring-board and platform diving and produced the visualization training tapes for members of the 1992 and 1996 U.S. Olympic Diving Teams.

Bertram received his B.S. in Business Operations and Systems Magnagement from Indiana University in 1989. He attended Ohio State University as a graduate assistant diving coach and studied clinical and mental health counseling. Bertram also created, administered and coached a university-sponsored diving program for local children.

As a competitor, Bertram is a seven-time member of the U.S. Diving National Team, a five-time U.S. Diving National Champion and a finalist in the 1992 and 1996 U.S. Olympic Diving trials.

Cashel Mack ASSISTANT COACH (DRURY COLLEGE '92)



Cashel Mack enters her third year as assistant coach with Florida State's swim program. Although Mack will have responsibilities with both the women's and men's squads, but her primary duties will be in assisting with the women's team. Mack will handle many administrative duties for the swimming program including assisting with recruiting, planning the travel itineraries, overseeing the academic support, and supervising strength training and conditioning.

Mack came to FSU after serving as the head age group coach for Clearwater Aquatics in Clearwater, Fla, since August of

1993. Mack was nominated the 1996 Florida Age Group Coach of the Year. Prior to her head coaching position in Clearwater, Mack served as graduate assistant coach at her alma mater Drury College in 1993. She helped the 1993 Drury team to a NAIA Championship that year.

While a student-athlete at Drury, Mack swam the sprint freestyle and butterfly events. She was named Most Valuable Swimmer in 1989 and 1990 and was captain of Drury's first NAIA Championship women's team in 1992.

Mack graduated in 1992 from Drury College with a degree in elementary education.

Andy Robins

ASSISTANT COACH (WILLIAM AND MARY '83, FLORIDA STATE '87)



Andy Robins continues as assistant coach with the Seminoles for his third year.

In addition to his on deck coaching duties, he will assist with recruiting and organizing team workout information and data.

Robins has been actively coaching in the swimming field since 1980. He has held various assistant and head coaching positions, especially in the local Tallahassee area. Beginning in 1985,

Robins began coaching for the Area Tallahassee Aquatic Club and eventually became head coach for A.T.A.C. in 1993. Robins led A.T.A.C. to a top 10 finish at the Junior Nationals.

Other local swimming coaching positions Robins has held include coaching Leon High School in Tallahassee from 1986-1991.

His hard work at Leon earned him recognition as the *Tallahassee Democrat's* High School Coach of the Year in 1987.

Robins also served as head coach of Florida's All-Star Team in 1990 and 1991, after previously holding the assistant coaching position for the team in 1989.

Robins also served on the Florida Swimming Board of Directors and House of Delegates, from 1987 to 1998.

A graduate of William & Mary, Robins swam both the backstroke and distance freestyle events. His swimming accomplishments at William and Mary include setting a school record in the 1650 free.

Robins and his wife Karen have 4 children, Beth (20), Kurt (19), Jenna (13), and Annemarie (2).



The 1998-99 season looks very promising for the Lady Seminoles after last year's 5-2 record and a sixth place finish at the ACC Championships. The return of All-Americans Anne Blachford and Samantha White and a solid recruiting class will provide Florida State with the necessary strength to score at the NCAA Championships.

Co-captain Samantha White, a senior from Ormond Beach, Florida, looks to return to the NCAA Championships this year. White completed last season finishing 3rd in the 100 Breast, 9th in the 200 Breast and was a member of the 6th place Medley Relay at the ACC Championships. Anne Blachford, a junior from Brampton, Ontario, returns stronger than ever this year. She sat out the first three meets of last season after breaking her collarbone before the Miami meet but returned for the Auburn Invitational and competed the rest of the season. Blachford completed the season at the ACC Championships finishing 2nd in the 100 Breast, 4th in the 200 Breast, 5th in the 200 IM and was a member of the 6th place 400 Medley Relay. FSU also returns two of its top scorers from the 1997-98 season in Sherri Fowler and Kristen Adams. Fowler, a senior from Silver Spring, Maryland, is third on the FSU All-Time Top 10 list for her times in the 200 Fly and 400 IM. She finished 12th in the 200 IM and 13th in both the 400 IM and 200 Fly at the ACC Championships last spring. Adams, a sophomore from Greer, South Carolina, holds the second spot on the FSU All-Time Top 10 list for her 500 Free time and holds the third place spot in the 100 and 200 Free. She finished 6th in the 200 Free, 8th in the 100 Free and 9th in the 500 Free and was a member of the 3rd place 800 Free Relay, 5th place 400 Free Relay and 6th place 400 Medley Relay at the ACC Championships. Divers Marya Sabesky and Kirsti Carrihill also return for the Seminoles. Sabesky, a junior from Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, finished 7th on the 3-meter and 10th on the 1-meter at ACC's and competed at the NCAA Zonal Regional Championships. Carrihill, a junior from Harare, Zimbabwe, also competed at the NCAA Zonals and finished 21st on the 3-meter at the ACC Championships.

Florida State welcomes strong recruiting class which will help add the necessary strength in scoring. NCAA hopefuls Tanya Gurr, Summer Washburn and Amber Goodwin will lead the newcomers this season. Gurr,

a junior from Harare, Zimbabwe, joins the Seminoles after spending two years at Indian River Community College. She was an NJCAA All-American her freshman and sophomore years in the 50, 100 and 200 Free and holds the NJCAA record in the 200 Free. Gurr was a member of the Zimbabwe National Team from 1994-96 and will be a strong point scorer at the ACC Championships. Goodwin, a freshman from Midland, Texas, was an All-American and all-state swimmer in Texas. She received All-American and all-state honors in the 50 Free and 100 Back her junior and senior years and received honors her sophomore year in the 400 Free Relay and 200 Medley Relay. Goodwin was also the Texas state champion in the 100 Back in 1997 and holds the state record in the 200 Back. Washburn joins the Seminoles from Apollo Beach, Florida where she was first team all-conference for three years in high school. She was an all-state in the 100 Back and 200 IM her sophomore, junior and senior years and was an All-American in the 100 Back and 200 IM.



Washburn was state champion in the 100 back and will play an important role in the Back and IM events. Caren Hirai joins the diving squad this year and should have an immediate impact. The freshman from McLean, Virginia was a first team all-region and all-district all four years of high school and was the most valuable player from 1995-98. She was an All-American and Academic All-American her senior year and earned honorable mention recognition as a sophomore and junior. She finished second in the state and was team captain her junior and senior years and garnered McLean High School Female Athlete of the Year her final year. She will provide depth to the diving squad at the ACC Championships.

After placing 13th at the NCAA Championships last year, the Seminoles look to excel in the 1998-99 season with the return of seven NCAA qualifiers and six All-Americans.

Leading the way are two National Champions, Brendon Dedekind and Stephen Parry. Dedekind, a senior and international swimmer from Natal, South Africa, brought home FSU's second swimming national championship last year after winning the 50 Free at the NCAA Championships. He is a member of the gold medal World All-Star team from the Goodwill Games and competed in the World Championships last year in Australia where



he finished 6th in the 50 Free. Dedekind also finished 4th in the 100 Breast and 10th in the 100 Free at the NCAA's last year. He is a five-time Individual All-American and has won seven events at the ACC Championships, including the 50 Free the last three years, the 100 Breast in 1998 and 1997 and the 100 Free in 1997 and 1996. Parry, a senior co-captain and international swimmer, joined Dedekind at the Goodwill Games and represented his home country of Great Britain in the World Championships. Parry was FSU's first ever swimming national champion as he won the 200 Fly at the 1997 NCAA Championships. He finished 4th in the 200 Fly and 14th in the 200 Free last year at the NCAA Championships and was on the 7th place Free Relay and 8th place Medley Relay teams. Parry also finished 3rd in the 200 Fly and 4th in the 200 IM and 100 Fly at the ACC Championships last year, was the ACC Champion in the 200 Free and 200 Fly in 1997, and was named ACC Co-Swimmer of the Year that year along with Dedekind.

Two seniors and two juniors round out the All-American. Seniors Matt McVittie and Julio Santos will provide leadership to the squad. McVittie, a co-captain from Chelsea, Michigan, competed in the 50 and 100 Free and was on the 7th place 200 and 400 Free Relays at the NCAA Championships. He also finished 5th in the 50, 100 and 200 Free at the ACC meet. Santos, who transferred from Indian River Community College last year, also competed in the 50 and 100 Free and was on

the 7th place 200 and 400 Free Relay teams and the 8th place Medley Relay team. He finished 2nd in the 50 Free and 6th in the 100 Free at ACC's. Juniors Kevin Flanagan and Brett Petersen also return for the Seminoles. Flanagan, who came to Florida State from Honolulu, Hawaii, was a member of the 7th place 200 and 400 Free Relays at NCAA's and a member of the 200 and 400 Free Relay champion teams at the ACC's. Petersen, who has competed in international meets for South Africa, competed in the 100 Breast and was on the 8th place 200 Medley Relay at NCAA's, finished 2nd in the 100 Breast and was a member of the 1998 ACC Champion 200 Medley Relay team.

The diving squad returns three juniors this year who should provide valuable scoring. Brent Burkman will provide consistency and has the potential to qualify for Senior National Meet this year. The junior from Reston, Virginia finished 3rd on the one and three meter springboard competition last year at the ACC's and competed at the NCAA Zone Regionals. Glen Gonzales, the junior from Pensacola, Florida, will be a strong competitor this year and has the ability to make the NCAA's. He finished fourth on the one and three meter competition at the ACC's and competed at the NCAA Zone Regionals. Ben Nuttal, who came to FSU from Thunder Bay, Ontario, could place among the top three at the ACC's and qualify for NCAA's. He finished 8th on the 1meter and 9th on the 3-meter springboard competition at last year's ACC meet and also competed at the NCAA Zone Regionals.

The Seminoles newcomers are three freshman this year, two from Virginia and one from Florida. Jonathan Fry comes to FSU from Chesterfield, Virginia where he swam all four years of high school. He was an all-metro selection his freshman, junior and senior years and will add depth in the IM and Backstroke events. Jonathan Kaplan, a Back and IM swimmer from Winter Haven, Florida, was an four-time most valuable swimmer in high shoool His solid work ethic will allow him to score high in the IM and breast events. He qualified for the state championships all four years and was third in the 200 IM at the state championships his sophomore year. Michael Singelton, an IM swimmer from Richmond, Virginia, was a team captain his junior and senior years and is a versatile swimmer who will compete for a spot on the ACC team. He was a second team all-metro his senior year and represented the state of Virginia in U.S. Swimming his junior and senior years.

from rags to riches

\$ wimming in a lane with six or seven people is not the ideal training conditions for an Olympic swimmer. But for Brendon Dedekind, it was the starting point for what would soon become much success internationally and in collegiate competition.

"Swimmers from South Africa who would go to the US to train always came back swimming much faster times" Dedekind said. "Even at a young age, I wanted to train in the US. It was a dream for me."

After the 1992 South African Nationals, he began to pursue that dream. Dedekind sent out 32 applications to United States universities and received many prospect questionnaires, but no scholarships materialized. So in 1993 he enrolled in engineering classes in South Africa and gave up on the dream.

"You have to be on a good scholarship to get to a school abroad," Dedekind said. "Without that money, the exchange rate is too high for athletes to attend school in the US. Many foreign athletes would do anything for some of the facilities you have here."

But in 1993, the tables began to turn for Dedekind and he started to see the dream becoming a reality. Then FSU assistant coach Neil Harper received a phone call from former LSU teammate, Darryl Cronje, a fellow South African swimmer, telling him about a South African swimmer who could be an asset to the team. Not too long after, Dedekind received a call from Head Coach Don Gibb offering him a scholarship.

"I really liked the ideas Don put forward over the phone, the way he wanted to train sprinters, so I signed...and the rest is history," Dedekind laughed.

History is exactly where Dedekind has placed himself. He started at Florida State in January of 1995 and immediately saw the differences in training.

"The biggest difference to me was the facilities, the pool and weight room, and the support structure. There was such a positive atmosphere on the pool deck and away from the pool which made it easier to train and take my swimming to the highest level of competition."

When he first came to Florida State, Dedekind had no international swimming experience behind him. Dedekind envisioned swimming at a university for four years and contributing as a team player while training for the 2000 Olympics. He never even thought about the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta let alone the NCAA title. When he realized he might have a shot

at the 1996 Olympics, he returned home and qualified for a spot on the South African Olympic team. At the Olympics, Dedekind surprised his country and fellow swimmers as he qualified for the finals in the 50 Free and finished 5th. But 1996 was just the beginning.

"Making the finals in the Olympics was just a stepping stone for the 2000 Olympics, Dedekind said. "I hope to medal in Australia."

The stepping stones also began on the collegiate level for Dedekind in 1994. As a freshman, he qualified for the NCAA Championships at the University of Texas. He had seen pictures of the pool and swimming at such a major university was overwhelming. Although he made the consolation finals in the 50 Free and won the heat finishing 9th, he was still overcome by the facility and the stronger, faster swimmers. This gave him more incentive to train and work harder and it all paid off.

The following March, Dedekind started to make his mark in FSU swimming history. The 1997 NCAA Championships were held at the University of Minnesota and with one NCAA meet under his belt, Dedekind felt more relaxed and less overwhelmed by the enormity of the competition. He qualified in the 50 and 100 Free and the 100 Breast and made it his goal not only to make the finals but to win the events that night. became the first swimmer in FSU history to garner All-American honors in three events in the same year with his top 5 finishes in the three events. Dedekind also swam in the fastest heat of the 50 Free in NCAA history. That same year, teammate Stephen Parry won the 200 Fly event at the NCAA's, becoming the first FSU swimmer to win an individual title.

"After swimming in that fast of a heat and with Steve winning the 200 Fly, I knew I had to train harder," Dedekind said. "Steve winning made me want to push myself harder. He and I are very competitive and push each other, but we are still the best of friends."

In the 1998 NCAA meet at Auburn, Dedekind's goal was make the finals. His 19.17 qualifying time in the 50 Free set a new pool record and gave him the top seed going into the evening competition.

"I took the races as just another race," Dedekind said. "It was really exciting to win the 50 Free but I was still not satisfied with my time. I think I could have swam faster that night."

With an NCAA individual title under his belt and a summer of international competition behind him, Dedekind has set his sights on defending his title. He also will strive to win the 50

and 100 Free and 100 Breast at NCAA meet in March. Beyond this is his hope for Florida State as a team.

"We have the potential to do the best FSU has ever done at the NCAA meet but we'll have to come to gether at the right time," Dedekind said. "We could have two national champions this year and all our relays could all final. We've got a lot of seniors leaving this year and it would be nice to see such a good group of guys go out with a bang!"

a national champion

Since its inception in 1949, the Florida State men's swimming and diving program has had 19 men and 8 relay teams earn the distinction of All-American. In 1961, Curt Genders won FSU's first diving NCAA title on the one and three meter springboards. And now, 36 years later, Seminole swimmer Stephen Parry has again made history for the program, bringing home FSU's first individual swimming NCAA championship.

Parry, now a junior, trained in crowded pools and limited facilities in Liverpool, Great Britain, but from that setting came great accomplishments. He was the 1994 Junior European Champion and the 1995 England National Champion in the 200 Fly. When Parry came to FSU, he brought with him his greatest ambition — to make the Olympic finals. Parry chased that dream competing to qualify for the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta. He finished second at the British Olympic Trials but did not reach Great Britain qualifying times.

"I was disappointed," Parry said. "The Olympics has been a goal for me for a long time. I just didn't swim as well as I could have."

"Stephen supported Rob (Braknis) and Brendon (Dedekind) at the Olympics but I think watching his teammates swim in Atlanta really hit home for him," Head Coach Don Gibb said. "He knew he should be at the Olympics and realized he had to work that much harder to make it. Juggling school, swimming and a personal life was a challenge and he realized he would have to prioritize."

Parry found his first year at FSU to be a challenge, having to adjust to a new training program, a new school, and new country all together. But it was after the British Trials that he knew he had to change something. He returned to FSU with a new ambition — a team victory at the Atlantic Coast Conference Championships and a top five finish in the NCAA. He took advantage of the training facilities and started working harder and longer.

"Coming from Liverpool, the training facilities were completely different," Parry said. "It took the summer of '96 for me to realize what I had available to me."

All his hard work and dedication paid off for Parry. He improved his times throughout the season, but saw the biggest improvements at the ACC Championships. Going into the championships, Parry was ranked first in the 200 Fly and he did not disappoint. Not only did he win the event, but he set an ACC record in the process. He went on to win the 200 Free and was on the

200 and 400 Medley Relay Champion teams, leading to Co-Swimmer of the Year honors in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

At the NCAA championship meet in Minneapolis, Minnesota, Parry and his teammates achieved several honors. Dedekind became the first FSU swimmer to achieve three All-America finishes and all five Seminole relay teams scored for the Seminoles. But perhaps the greatest accomplishment came on the night of March 29th when Parry, who was seeded first in the 200 Fly going into the finals, won the first national championship for swimming in FSU history. His pool record time of 1:44.28 won him the title and helped him restore some confidence.

"I wasn't really thinking about it (the championship) at the time," Parry said. "Going into the race seeded first, there was some pressure but I wasn't expecting to win. It was more of a shock than anything else. I just swam the race the way coach planned it out. It really didn't hit me until I got back to Tallahassee that I had won a national championship. And it wasn't even until this summer that I realized I'm as good as the best swimmers in the nation."

Parry continued to compete internationally this summer, representing England in the European Championships and winning a Bronze Medal in the 200 Fly. He next competed in the World University Games in the 200 Fly and finished fifth overall.

"The Europeans were exciting," Parry said. "I was representing my country and was pleased with finishing third. I was just excited to be there. As for the World University Games, it wasn't my best swim but swimming against the best swimmers in the world made me realize I am among the best."

Parry's competed this summer in the Commonwealth Games in Malaysia where he finished 3rd in the 200 Fly. After a summer of international competition, he has set his sights on training for another year of collegiate swimming, but the Olympic experience still sits in the back of his mind.

"Stephen Parry has just scratched the surface," Gibb said. "The national championships and this summer have proved to him he is on of the best in the country and the world. He learned how to prioritize this summer realizing he's one of the best because of his dedication and hard work. The 2000 Olympics are a realistic goal for him."

Mear, but far from the glaring strips of neon amusement, and the castles and crowds of Disney, lies another magical place in the Sunshine State — one of pow-wows, plantations, politics and great pride. Often described as "The Other Florida" with its deeprooted history, rolling hills, canopy roads of mossdraped oaks, cool climate and Southern-style hospitality; it is a Florida few have seen. It is Tallahassee — Florida with a Southern accent.

Best known as Florida's capital, Tallahassee is an intimate neo-metropolitan city where the power of state government, the academic and the artistic are complemented by subtle, old-fashioned charm. It is the perfect two- or three-day diversion for the more than 41 million annual visitors to Florida and 13 million residents.

Tallahassee touts a menagerie of sights including one of the world's deepest freshwater springs, site of America's first Christmas, a wildlife habitat, Capitile, rich soil and four distinct, yet pleasant, seasons breed floral brilliance and natural vitality year-round.

Like the city itself, the story of how Tallahassee was chosen as the state capital is rich in history. In 1823, two explorers set out — one on horseback from St. Augustine and the other by boat from Pensacola — to find a permanent, central location for the Legislature to convene. The two met at a beautiful site that the Creek and Seminole Indians called "tallahassee" — derived from the words "talwa" meaning town and "ahasee" meaning old. The rendezvous point remains Florida's capital.

The "old town" has undergone many changes, but one thing remains the same — it is still a government town fiercely proud and dedicated to preserving its heritage. The Capitol buildings, both old and new, epitomize Tallahassee's perseverance.

The 22nd floor of the New Capitol provides a pan-







tol buildings, fascinating museums of history, sprawling plantations, highly acclaimed fishing and hunting adventures and nearby beaches. Spirited area festivals range from celebrations of Tallahassee's spectacular spring and swamp stomps to genuine rattlesnake roundups and seafood festivals.

With the Gulf of Mexico just 20 miles south and the Georgia border only 14 miles north, Tallahassee rests between the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains and the juncture of Florida's panhandle and peninsula. Nearer in miles to Atlanta than to Miami, Tallahassee more closely resembles its Southern neighbors than Florida in topography, climate and lifestyle.

Accentuating Tallahassee's Southern persona are lush rolling hills, likened to the seven hills of Rome, and five "official" canopy roads of patriarch oaks. The fer

oramic scope of a sophisticated Southern city awash in a sea of flowering azaleas, snowy dogwoods, towering pines, fragrant magnolias, and hundreds of shimmering lakes, springs, swamps, rivers and sink holes. Special legislative viewing galleries are open during the legislative session.

Below, in the shade of giant live oaks, proudly stands the Old Capitol, originally constructed in 1845 and restored to its 1902 splendor complete with red-and-white candy-striped awnings, a dome adorned with stained glass, antique furnishings and political memorabilia.

Across from the Old Capitol are the 40-foot twin granite towers of the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial, and the blue stone Union Bank, Florida's oldest surviving fi-
