Head Coach Neil Harper

Neil Harper Neil Harper Head Coach, 2nd year (Louisiana State, 1988)



Neil Harper begins his second year at the helm of the Florida State swimming and diving programs after a very successful return to Tallahassee last season. The 1999-2000 season was culminated in Sydney, Australia as Harper, a coach of the South African Olympic Team, coached former Seminole All-Americans Brendon Dedekind and Brett Petersen to their Olympic semi-finals and finals, respectively.

The Florida State regular season saw the Lady Seminoles send a teamhigh five individuals to the NCAA Championships with all of them achieving at least All-American honorable mention honors. Christy Cech and Tanya Gurr swam to individual ACC champion honors in the 100 and 200 freestyles respectively. The tandem teamed with Anne Blachford and current team captain Kristen Adams to become ACC Champions in the 400 Free Relay. Not to be outdone, the Seminole men's team of Greg Main-Baillie, Nnamse Ammons, Joey Marshburn and Kevin Flanagan captured the 200 Freestyle Relay at the ACC Championships, keeping FSU's conference championship in that event alive at six years. The men's team also had its first NCAA diving qualifier in seven years. Brent Burkman qualified at the Southeast Regionals after win-

ning the one-meter springboard at the ACC Championships.

Harper returned to Tallahassee in May of 1999 after two years as the Head Women's Swimming Coach at Ohio State. In two seasons, Harper's team posted a mark of 15-12 and qualified six Buckeyes to the NCAA Championships. In both years, his teams were NCAA all-academic teams and more than 20 of his athletes were named to the Big Ten Conference All-Academic

Team.

From 1994-97, Harper served as the top assistant at Florida State where he coordinated recruiting, served as the strength and conditioning coordinator and coached the stroke/IM group. During that time, Stephen Parry became FSU's first ever NCAA Swimming Champion in the 200 yard Butterfly and FSU produced its first three All-Amercan women in over 10 years as Harper coached

Anne Blachford (200 IM), Helen Jepson (200 Fly) and Samantha

White (100 Breast) to NCAA success.


Harper graduated from Louisiana State University where he served as an assistant coach from 1988-94. During that time, he helped coach 21 swimmers to NCAA All-American and seven Southeastern Conference champions. As an LSU Tiger, Harper was a seven-event NCAA All-American and four-event SEC champion. As a senior, he captained LSU's men's team to its first SEC team championship.

The London native represented Great Britain in the 1984 and 1988 Olympic Games placing sixth and fourth, respectively,

in the 400 Medley Relay.

Harper is married to the former Paige Busch, herself an NCAA All-American at LSU and SEC 100 Breaststroke champion. They have been married 10 years and have two daughters, Katherine (6) and Kelly (4).





Assistant Coaches

Assistant Coach, 6th year (William & Mary '83) Andy Robins Andy Robins

The veteran of the Florida State swimming and diving coaching staff, Andy Robins is in his sixth year as an assistant coach with the Seminoles. While at FSU, Robins has been instrumental in the development and success of several All-Americans including Stephen Parry, Nelson Mora and Anne Blachford. In addition to his on deck coaching duties, Robins' responsibilities include recruiting, organizing team workout information, performance data and home meet management.

Robins has been actively coaching swimming since 1980. He has held various assistant and head coaching positions, especially in the local Tallahassee area. Beginning in 1985, Robins began coaching for the Area Tallahassee Aquatic Club and eventually became head coach for A.T.A.C. in 1993. Robins led A.T.A.C. to a top 10 finish at the spring 1996 Junior Nationals.

Other local swimming coaching positions Robins has held include coaching Leon High School in Tallahassee from 1986-1991. In 1987 he was recognized as the *Tallahassee Democrat's* High School Coach of

Robins also served as head coach of Florida's All-Star Team in 1990 and 1991, after previously holding the assistant coaching position for the team in 1989.

Robins served on the Florida Swimming Board of Directors, the House of Delegates, and the Technical Planning Committee from 1987-1998.

A graduate of The College of William & Mary, Robins swam both the backstroke and distance freestyle events. His swimming accomplishments at William and Mary include setting a school record in the 1650 free and serving as co-captain.

Robins earned a Master's Degree in Science Education from Florida State in 1987. He and his wife Karen have four children, Beth (22), Kurt (21), Jenna (15) and Annemarie (4).

Michelle Gacio Michelle Gacio Assistant Coach, 2nd year (Florida '96)

Michelle Gacio begins her second year as an assistant coach at Florida State. Gacio joined the Seminole swimming and diving coaching staff after serving two years as an assistant coach under Head Coach Neil Harper at Ohio State.

Prior to Ohio State, Gacio spent three years coaching with the 200 member Florida Aquatic Swim Team (FAST) in Gainesville, Fla., working as the Head Coach, Head Age Group Coach and Head Masters Coach. She coached all levels of swimming, both male and female, including several Olympic qualifiers and numerous Senior and Junior National Qualifiers.

In 1998, Gacio received her master's degree from the University of Florida in exercise and sport sciences specializing in sports administration. She also received her bachelor's in business administration from Florida in 1996. As a Gator, Gacio was an All-American and received all-conference honors in the 400 IM. She was a member of the Southeastern Conference team champions from 1991-1995 and in 1992, was on the third place NCAA Championships team. Gacio finished 11th in the 1992 Olympic Trials in the 200 IM.

Patrick Jeffrey Patrick Jeffrey Diving Coach, 2nd year (Ohio State '88)

Patrick Jeffrey, a former much-heralded diver at Ohio State University, enthusiastically returns for his second year on the Seminole Swimming and Diving staff as the Head Diving Coach.

Jeffrey and FSU welcome six new divers to a team that saw vast improvement in 1999-2000. Under Jeffrey's direction, the FSU men's diving team scored more points than any other conference diving team at the 2000 ACC Championships by getting three divers into each of the two finals and taking one individual title in the one-meter event. Jeffrey also qualified FSU's first diver in seven years to the Division I NCAA Championships as Brent Burkman competed at the 2000 Nationals.

Jeffrey, who has been a diving coach for five years, has enormous national and international coaching experience. He served as the U.S. Olympic Team Coach in the Sydney Olympics, the USA Senior World Cup Team Coach in 1997 and 1999, the Senior National Team Coach from 1997-00 and the Junior National Team Coach in 1998. His coaching has produced four individual Senior National Championships, three individual Junior National Championships and two Senior Men's Team third-place finishes.

As a competitor, Jeffrey participated in the 1988 Olympics in Seoul and the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta where he was a finalist on the 10-meter Platform at both Games. He is also a three-time U.S. Diving National Champion on the 10-meter Platform.


Jeffrey graduated from Ohio State in 1988 with a degree in journalism and advertising. While at OSU, he was a three-time NCAA Champion in 1988, winning the 1-meter, 3-meter and 10-meter Platforms. Jeffrey also received the NCAA Diver of the Year Award his final season.




Women's Outlook

2000-01 Florida State Women's Swimming and Diving Outlook: The Lady Seminoles begin the season with high expectations.









After an impressive first season at the helm of the Florida State women's swimming program, Head Coach Neil Harper and the 2000-2001 Lady Seminoles enter this year with high expectations. If solid road victories over Florida Atlantic and Miami in early October are any indication of what Harper can expect from his team, then the Florida State women's program is in for a successful season By adding depth in every event, the Lady Seminoles have the potential to achieve great things.

"We have five or six people, freshmen included, who in any given meet, can step up and dictate the pace or amount of wins we have in a meet," Harper said. "Any one person can contribute at any given time. With an overall team effort, with everyone swimming well from top to bottom, we can surprise a few teams."

Veterans senior Kristen Adams and junior Christy Cech will provide leadership for an FSU team that returns 14 letterwinners from last year's squad that went 9-4 and sent five swimmers to the 2000 NCAA Championships. Adams, a team captain who hails from Greer, S.C., hopes to accomplish even greater things this season after competing in the 200, 400 and 800 Free Relays at the NCAA Championships last season. Cech, of Pietemarizburg, Natal in South Africa, enjoyed a successful sophomore campaign as she won the ACC title in the 100 Free and competed in a maximum five events at the NCAA Championships.

"We will look to Kristen for leadership both inside and outside the pool," Harper said. "Christy is our top sprinter. She is a big threat in the 50, 100 and 200 free styles. I expect for both of them to lead by example."

Also returning is sophomore Christine Williams, who was also a member of the last year's NCAA Championships 400 Free Relay team. The Mercerville, N.J., native, should continue to contend in the sprint free-style events.

With several NCAA near-qualifiers from last year's squad returning, Florida State's NCAA meet participation should only improve. Junior Summer Bell of Apollo Beach, Fla., will compete in the fly, middle distance free and IM events. Sophomore Keryn Krynauw, also of Pietemaritzburg, Natal in South Africa, looks to improve on fourth-place finishes in the 100 and 200 breaststroke events at last year's ACC Championships. Junior Amber Goodwin, who hails from Midland, Texas, should once again contend in both backstroke events.

Florida State welcomes six freshmen and two transfers to this year's roster. Sophomore Candice Nethercott, who transferred to Florida State from LSU, will compete in the fly events. Sophomore Margaret Colley, who transferred from Florida, will add depth to the team in the back and fly events.

"What we have done with our team in terms of recruiting and with the addition of a couple of transfers, our team is deeper than it ever has been," Harper said. "We've added depth in the stroke events. Our first and second swimmers in almost every stroke event are strong. Our top sprinter is continually a strong point while our relays look to be very solid as well."

The diving squad is young with just one returnee with collegiate experience in junior Caren Hirai of McLean, Virginia. Hirai will be counted on to help mentor the squad's three newcomers Chelsie Lerew, Michelle Sekeres and Lauren Walker. Hirai's strength will be in the one-meter, where she hopes to qualify for the NCAA Championships this year. The FSU coaches look for Lerew to make an immediate impact, but all four divers have the potential to qualify for the NCAA Championships.

Highlighting the Lady Seminoles' schedule will be a meeting with nationally-ranked Arizona in Tucson as well as road trips to Auburn, Ala., and the University of Georgia Invite. FSU's home schedule includes meets against Florida, Texas and Louisiana State.

Men's Outlook

Second-year Head Coach Neil Harper and the Florida State men's swimming and diving team kicked off the 2000-01 season with a splash in mid-October, with solid road victories over Florida Atlantic and Miami. After finishing last season with a No. 22 national ranking and a fourth-place finish at the ACC Championships, the Seminoles are geared up to surpass those accomplishments. Despite losing 11 seniors, the Seminoles return with a young squad eager and determined to compete this season.

The men have worked hard in the off season and the pre-season, participating in extensive weight room training as well as exhausting themselves in various dry land exercises. Harper couldn't be happier about their effort and progress.

"The team looks hungry and is fired up for the upcoming season," Harper said. "I am very excited at where things are headed for this group of men this year."

The Seminoles return with a young nucleus of swimmers that intend to lead this year's charge. After a fourth-place finish in the 100 Backstroke at last year's ACC Championships, co-captain Greg Main-Baillie will be looked upon to lead the squad in short freestyle events as well as the backstroke and individual medley events. Sophomore Devin Crock, who placed third in the 100 Fly and fourth in the 100 Backstroke at last year's ACC Championships, is also expected to have a strong influence on this year's team. With a year of collegiate competition under their belts, sophomores Justin Betts, Joey Marshburn and Nnamnse Ammons will also be heavily counted on to play a key role in the success of this year's team.

"These four sophomore swimmers, along with Main-Baillie and captain Will McReynolds, will lead the Seminole charge," Harper said. "This year's sophomore class have made a great transition from being freshmen and are leading the team by example. It's great to see the rest of the team following behind the positive influences from this year's sophomore class and our seniors."

Florida State welcomes 13 newcomers to this year's roster and will look to them to make an immediate impact. The FSU coaches are confident with the performance capabilities of this year's recruiting class of incoming swimmers and divers. With 11 freshmen and two transfers, the Seminole coaching staff hopes these swimmers will quickly make the necessary adjustments of competing at the collegiate level.

"There is no doubt that we will give the newcomers the opportunity to perform and compete in races this season," Harper said.

Senior co-captain Lou Dondero, the only returning diver from last season, will lead this year's team. Dondero will be looked upon as the "go-to" man and will also be a mentor for the incoming class of divers. Freshmen Josh Edelman, Mike Franks and James Korten are all expected to be solid additions to the diving team this year. Freshman Jeff Boatright, from Waynesboro, Va., will add depth to the butterfly events, while freshman Erik Moe, from Melbourne, Fla., will contribute heavily in the freestyle events as well as the relays.

The 2000-2001 schedule features several great rivalries. As the program continues to improve each year, so does FSU's strength of schedule.


"Our tough schedule will provide our young team the experience of competing against some of the more successful teams out there," Harper said. "It will make our opponents aware that we are here to compete and that we mean business."


Highlighting the Seminoles schedule will be a trip to Auburn, Ala., for a meet with the two-time NCAA national champion Tigers, as well as a meeting with nationally-ranked Arizona in Tucson. FSU's home schedule includes meets against Georgia Tech, Florida and Louisiana State.

Harper hopes as the season progresses, so will the performance of the young men's team. The Seminoles are striving for a Top 3 finish at this year's ACC Championships.

"All we can really control is what we do," Harper said. "Our goal for this season is for everyone on our team to record a lifetime personal best. If we can do that, the results will take care of themselves."

This Is Tallahassee

Near, but far from the glaring strips of neon amusement, and the castles and crowds of Disney, lies another magical place in the Sunshine State - one of plantations, politics and great pride. Often described as "The Other Florida" with its deep-rooted history, rolling hills, canopy roads of moss-draped oaks, cool climate and Southern-style hospitality; it is a Florida few have seen. It is Tallahassee - Florida with a Southern accent.

Best known as Florida's capital, Tallahassee is an intimate neo-metropolitan city where the power of state government, the academic and the artistic are complemented by subtle, old-fashioned charm. It is the perfect two- or three-day diversion for the more than 41 million annual visitors to Florida and 13 million residents.

Tallahassee touts a menagerie of sights including one of the world's deepest freshwater springs, site of America's first Christmas, a wildlife habitat, Capitol buildings, fascinating museums of history, sprawling plantations, highly acclaimed fishing and hunting adventures and nearby beaches. Spirited area festivals range from celebrations of Tallahassee's spectacular spring and swamp stomps to genuine rattlesnake roundups and seafood festivals.





With the Gulf of Mexico just 20 miles south and the Georgia border only 14 miles north, Tallahassee rests between the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains and the juncture of Florida's panhandle and peninsula. Nearer in miles to Atlanta than to Miami, Tallahassee more closely resembles its Southern neighbors than Florida in topography, climate and lifestyle.

Accentuating Tallahassee's Southern persona are lush rolling hills, likened to the seven hills of Rome, and five "official" canopy roads of patriarch oaks. The fertile, rich soil and four distinct, yet pleasant, seasons breed floral brilliance and natural vitality year-round.

Like the city itself, the story of how Tallahassee was chosen as the state capital is rich in history. In 1823, two explorers set out - one on horseback from St. Augustine and the other by boat from Pensacola - to find a permanent, central location for the Legislature to convene. The two met at a beautiful site that the Creek and Seminole Indians called "tallahassee" - derived from the words "talwa" meaning town and "ahasee" meaning old. The rendezvous point remains Florida's capital.

The "old town" has undergone many changes, but one thing remains the same - it is still a government town fiercely proud and dedicated to preserving its heritage. The Capitol buildings, both old and new, epitomize Tallahassee's perseverance. The 22nd floor of the New Capitol provides a panoramic scope of a sophisticated Southern city awash in a sea of flowering azaleas, snowy dogwoods, towering pines, fragrant magnolias, and hundreds of shimmering lakes, springs, swamps, rivers and sink holes. Special legislative viewing galleries are open during the legislative session.
