## THIS IS FLORIDA STATE

**FROM ITS BEGINNINGS AS** "The Seminary West of the Suwannee" in 1857, Florida State University has grown to stretch across 418 acres of rolling oak and pine-covered hills to comprise a campus which has educated millions of students over the last century.

Florida State University has boasted a heritage of service and scholarship since the Florida legislature passed an act authorizing two state colleges – one east (now the University of Florida) and one west of the meandering Suwannee River.

Starting with a 130-member coed enrollment in 1857, the Seminary survived the Civil War, reconstruction, radical social changes, and a variety of name changes to emerge as the Florida State College for Women in 1909.

It was converted back into a coed institution in 1947 by a legislature anxious to open up the state's


educational resources to thousands of degree-seeking ex-GI's from World War II. It also was granted a new name, "Florida State University." The University today contrasts vividly with its beginning. Sixteen schools and colleges within the university serve more than 29,000 students who are enrolled in the 275 graduate and undergraduate degree programs, and live and work among 1,558 faculty and 2,915 staff members. About 5,000 degrees are awarded every year.

In the past several years, the University has joined an elite group of institutions in the United States which produce more than 200 doctoral graduates annually. Emphasis on graduate research and study at the University continues to grow, and today more than 4,000 graduate students pursue a variety of degrees.

Student life at Florida State University also offers young people ample opportunity to acquire leadership

skills and to apply their classroom learning in student government, residence hall government, Greek social organizations, honors programs, departmental organizations and more than 200 other registered student organizations active on campus. FSU Artist Series, the Distinguished Lecture Series and outstanding music, theater and dance productions provide enjoyable evenings for the entire community.

Being a student at Florida State University means stepping into a tradition of more than 130 years of higher education. From its Flying High Circus to its Supercomputer Computations Research, Florida State provides a panorama of excitement, blending the educational and social sides of campus life.



## HEAD COACH TERRY LONG

**Terry Long**, the 1994 ACC Track and Field Coach of the Year, begins his seventh season as the head coach of both men's and women's track teams. Following in his father's footsteps, Long continues the tradition fifteen

seasons after his father, Mike, retired as head coach at Florida State. Long has been associated with the Seminole track program since he was 15 years old, his age when Mike Long began his head coaching legacy at FSU in 1955.

A few years later, Terry formally joined the program as a student-athlete and ran track for the Tribe for four seasons. His senior year, he had the nation's fastest time in the 220 yard hurdles. Completing his bachelor's degree in 1963, and his master's in 1965, both at FSU. Long then began his track coaching career as head track and assistant football coach at Seacrest High School in Delray Beach an then head track and cross country at Lakeland High School.

In 1986, Long rejoined Florida
State as the head women's track coach and coordinator of both the men's and women's track teams. Following the retirement of men's coach Dick Roberts after the 1988 season, Long became the head coach of both the men's and women's teams.

As head coach and administrator of the program over the past five seasons, Long has continued a strong tradition of track success by the Seminoles' program. He has kept Florida State near the top in collegiate track and field with 31 individual All Americans.

In 1988, Long coached U.S. Olympian Arthur Blake who made the Olympic finals in the 110 high hurdles and is recognized as one of the top hurdlers in the world. Long has also coached na-

tional intermediate hurdle champion Kim Batten. Batten was named the TAC Outdoor's meet's most outstanding female after breaking the collegiate record in the 440-hurdles in 1991. In addition to Blake and Batten, Long has coached Olympians Chandra Cheeseborough, Michelle

Finn, Tom Reither, Rey Robinson and Dennis Mitchell.

Long came to Florida State from the University of Florida where he served two seasons as an assistant men's track coach. Long built his reputation as a top track coach

during 14 years of coaching at Santa Fe Community College in Gainesville and Seminole Community College in Sanford, Florida.

While serving in the Florida junior college ranks, Long developed literally hundreds of JC All Americans and 56 national junior college champions. His teams won 14 state junior college track and cross country titles. He was named Junior College National Coach of the Year three times. In 1982 and 1983, he guided the Santa Fe CC women's team to back-to-back national championships before moving on to Florida State.

During his tenure at Seminole Community College, Long was inducted into the Florida Track Hall of Fame, joining his father.

The sport of track has certainly been a tradition in the Long family. In addition to Mike Long, for whom Florida State's track facilities are named, his three sons all became coaches. Terry is now head coach at FSU, Jim was an


assistant for the Seminoles and Curtis is the head coach at Western Kentucky.

Terry is extremely active in track outside of Florida State and even the state of Florida. In 1984, he coached the United States team in the first World Indoor Track Championships, held in Paris, France. Presently, he serves as the co-chairman of the National Olympic Development Sprint Committee.

Long, 54 has been head coach of the Athletic Attic, Mazda and Bud Lite Track clubs and his indoor

and outdoor teams have won six national TAC championships. In 1988, Long brought the TAC Junior National Meet.

A Tallahassee Leon High School graduate, Long is married to DeeDee Malone Long. ■

# ASSISTANT COACHES

### SCOTT IRVING MIDDLE AND LONG DISTANCE (WILLIAMETTE '73)

**Scott Irving** returns to the Sunshine State after a four year hiatus at the University of Illinois. A veteran coach, Irving enters second season as a member of the Seminole track and field coaching staff. Irving will handle the Tribe middle and long distance runners.



Although a relatively new-comer to Tallahassee, Irving is not new to track and field, or the state of Florida. Coach Irving brings well deserved credentials to Florida State University. He has directed countless conference champions, over 30 NCAA All-Americans, six national champions, numerous national team members and two Olym-

pians, in a coaching career that spans nearly two decades.

Irving began his coaching career in the heart of distance running country at the University of Oregon (1977-83). He received cross country instruction from noted distance coach Bill Dellinger and was assistant track and field coach with the women's program.

Coach Irving's next stint was at the University of Florida (1983-89), where he assisted Dr. Lyle Knudson with the women's cross country program that captured the '85 SEC title. From Florida, Irving joined the Fighting Illini in the fall of '89 as the field events coach/recruiting coordinator.

A recipient of two master's degrees, the 1973 Williamette University graduate places the pursuit of academic excellence an utmost priority. Oregon athletes annually dotted the dean's list. Athletes that were coached or recruited by Irving at Florida made All-SEC Academic teams 40 times. Phenomenally, in two of only four years at Illinois he had athletes awarded the most prestigious accolade, the Big Ten Medal of Honor, for academic/athletic excellence.

Coach Irving also played an instrumental role in the foundations for national championship programs at both Oregon (1985) and Florida (1991).

Irving and his wife, Allyn, have been married for twenty-one years and have two sons, eight year old Shannon and Kevin, four.

### KIM MCKENZIE ASSISTANT COACH/SPRINTS (PACIFIC WESTERN '94)

**Kim McKenzie** begins her eighth season on the Florida State staff in 1995. The former Olympian bronze medalist began her coaching career in 1987 as a volunteer assistant while training for the '88 Olympic games.



McKenzie was a member of the 1984 U.S. Olympic team and won the bronze medal in the 100 meter high hurdles in Los Angeles. She brings a multitude of experience an talents to her duties with the sprinters and high hurdlers, whom she has helped for the past three seasons. She currently competes for the Mazda Track Club.

Kim was the top scorer in the high hurdles during the 1991 Grand Prix season. In 1992, she was a finalist on the Mobil Grand Prix circuit. McKenzie also finished fifth in the 100 meter high hurdles at the World Cup championships last year.

A native of Detroit, Michigan, McKenzie has an extensive background in national and international track. In 1990, she set the American record in the 50 meter hurdles in an indoor meet in Canada. In addition, McKenzie was the NCAA Champion in the 100 meter hurdles in 1983, her junior season at Texas El Paso. McKenzie also captured a silver medal at the Pan Am Games in the 100 meter hurdles.

McKenzie has a son, Leander, 9.

### HARLIS MEADERS ASSISTANT COACH/THROWS (UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA '92)

**Harlis Meaders** enters his first season on the Florida State coaching staff as throws coach. Meaders, a high school All-American in 1988, competed on the collegiate level at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill.



His collegiate track experience includes the shot put, the 35lb weight throw and the discus. While at UNC, Meaders was a three time individual ACC champion and made a significant contribution to the 1992 outdoor ACC championship team. Meaders was also a NCAA qualifier in the discus throw and qualified for the 1992 Olympic trials.

Meaders currently holds the school record in the discus throw at North Carolina.

Meaders comes to Florida State by way of Western Carolina University where he served as assistant track and field coach for three years and obtained his masters degree in physical education.

While at Western Carolina, Meaders coached three Southern Conference Champions and several other all-conference athletes in the throwing events for both men and women. Meaders helped the men and women programs obtain their highest place finishes ever in the Southern Conference.

**Dennis Nobles** enters his ninth year with the Seminole track and field staff and has developed into one of the top coaches in the field. A pole vaulter on FSU's



track team from 1979-81, Nobles graduated cum laude from Florida State's School of Physical Education. He went on to obtain his master's degree from FSU in Exercise Physiology in 1983.

Following graduation from Florida State, he began his coaching career at Wayland Baptist College, an NAIA track powerhouse in

Plainview, Texas.

While there, he coached 17 All-Americans, two national champions, a pair of Olympic qualifiers and a national record holder. He also led the school to a national championship and two-runner up finishes. He returned to his alma mater in 1985 to accept a position as assistant coach. Nobles has since coached several All-Americans, another Olympian and a world record holder. He is currently working towards his PH.D in Athletic Administration.

His duties at FSU include coaching athletes in the javelin, high jump and pole vault events. In recent years, he has been invited to participate in the elite women's javelin clinic in Long Beach, California.

Dennis and his wife, Vicki, have one daughter, Sally.

# '95 MEN'S PREVIEW

The Florida State Seminoles are coming off their best finish ever at the ACC indoor and outdoor championships and are looking to continue their momentum into the 1995 seasons. If the 'Noles are to defend their ACC indoor championship and move up from second to first at the conference outdoor meet Coach Mike Long's squad will have to do it without three departed All-Americans. Three time All-Americans Jeff Bray and Marcus Dixon as well as two time All-American Kelsey Nash completed their eligibility last year. The departure of these three men means that their only four All-Americans left, so the cupboard is obviously not bare.

All-Americans Kevin Ansley and Jonathan Carter lead a strong group of sprinters in 1995. Ansley finished second in both the 200 and 400 meters at the ACC outdoor championships and finished fifth in the 400 at the NCAA meet in Boise, Idaho. He is the number one returning quarter miler in the ACC after the graduation of NCAA champion Derek Mills of Georgia Tech. Carter is the defending ACC champion in the 100 meters with a time of 10.44. He has a personal best of 10.19. He and Ansley are the only returnees on the Seminole 4x100 meter relay team that finished seventh at last year's NCAA championships. Other returning sprinters include football players Philip Riley and Warrick Dunn. These four will probably make up the 4x100 relay for the 'Noles. Newcomers to the FSU sprint ranks will be Patrick Hayes and Cleon Blake, both are 100 and 200 meter runners. Hayes was a four time Louisiana state champion in the 200 and added the 100 meter state championship his senior year. Blake is the cousin of former FSU standout Sheryl Covington.

The hurdling Seminoles will be led by NCAA 55 meter hurdles runner-up Philip Riley. He qualified for both the hurdles and the 55 meter dash at the NCAA indoor championship and the 110 high hurdles at the NCAA outdoor meet. His ACC 110 high hurdles winning time of 13.71 is the sixth fastest in FSU history. All-American 400 intermediate hurdler John Rothell returns after finishing 8th at the outdoor NCAA meet last year. He finished third in that event at the ACC outdoor meet. His winning time of 49.99 at the Seminole Twilight meet is tied for second on the FSU all-

time list. Returning ACC point scorers Tim Franklin (400 IH) and Don West (110 HH) will join freshman Eric Lucas to round out a solid but thin hurdling corps.

National qualifier Mark Gray (800) returns to help a young but determined distance brigade face the ACC. Tim Middelkoop will be looking to improve on his third place finish in the 800 meters from a year ago and make it to the nationals this year. Veteran ACC point scorer Mike Hampton (1500, 5000) returns for his final season with the 'Noles. Redshirt freshmen Anton Kelly (800) and David Ogletree (1500) will improve the Seminole distance fortunes greatly.

The departure of Jeff Bray and Kelsey Nash is certainly going to change the outlook of the jumps this season. The high jumpers return ACC point scorer Jason Costner for his sophomore season and add redshirt freshman Hunter Glaum and true freshman Chris Osborne. The pole vaulters will be led by Golden Torch Award winner Bryn Wells and will include Steve Saunders and redshirt freshmen Ignacio Garcia, Dee Grist and Brian Till. The long and triple jumpers are also very young but showing signs of challenging for the upper echelon of the ACC. The group is led by redshirt freshmen David McIntyre and Oscar Robinson but also includes freshman Patrick Hayes.

The strongest part of the Seminoles' field events may be the throws. The throwers led the way last year sweeping the top two places at the ACC outdoor championship in the shot put and javelin. Returning shot put champ Ryan Carson (SP & DT) and runner-up Marc Anderson (SP) are joined by sophomore Tony Sasso (WT, SP, & DT) and freshman Greg Jack (SP, DT, & JT) to give the Seminoles a powerful 1-2-3-4 punch in the shot and discus. Returning ACC champ and new FSU school record holder in the javelin Lou Angelo and runner-up Justin Johnston along with the addition of Greg Jack give FSU three potential NCAA qualifiers in the event.

The core of outstanding athletes is present for the men to make a bid for the ACC indoor and outdoor crowns. However, it will depend on the newcomers and the underclassmen to decide whether or not they reach their goals of making a run at the NCAA championships.







## '94 SEMINOLE REVIEW

**Coach Terry Long** and the FSU men's track and field team reached the top of the Atlantic Coast Conference indoor track mountain in 1994. It was the first conference team championship for the Seminoles since entering the ACC three years ago. The Seminoles were within four points of sweeping the conference championships but fell to the University of North Carolina at the ACC outdoor meet.

Junior sprinter Phillip Riley led the team with two victories at the indoor conference meet. His time of 6.19 in the 55 meter dash and 7.19 in the 55 meter hurdles earned him Most Valuable Performer accolades. Other winners at the ACC indoor meet included Kelsey Nash in the long and triple jumps. His mark of 53-11<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> in the triple jump broke his own FSU in-

door school record. Florida State defeated Clemson University by the score of 133-106 to capture the indoor championship.

Riley continued his excellence at the NCAA indoor meet in Indianapolis with a second place finish in the 55 meter hurdles. His time of 7.18 was his fastest of the year. The Seminoles finished in a tie for 24th in the country.


The outdoor season was one of near misses for the Seminoles. The squad finished second to the University of North Carolina at the ACC championships by the score of 168-164.

FSU led the meet going into the final day of competition but an injury to 100, 200 and 110 high hurdles finalist Marcus Dixon caused him to drop out of the meet and allowed the Tar Heels to pass the 'Noles and take the team title.

The final day had it's share of good news for the Seminoles, also. Riley continued his outstanding performances with a win in the 110 high hurdles and Jonathan Carter won the 100 meters.

The Seminoles took a large contingent to the NCAA championships in Boise, Idaho. Junior quartermiler Kevin Ansley earned All-America honors by finishing 5th with a time of 45.84. John Rothell also earned All-America honors with his eighth place finish in the 400 meter hurdles. Other scorers for FSU was the 4x100 meter relay team that finished seventh and Lou Angelo's seventh place finish in the javelin.

Florida State finished in a tie for 30th with the University of Arizona.





# MIKE LONG TRACK

**Open since 1955, Mike Long Track** has been the home of the Seminole track and field program for close to forty years. In its existence, the complex has grown and seen the Seminole track and field program grow into national prominence.

The Mike Long Track complex is recognized as one of the best outdoor facilities in the country. Aside from the 1,500 seat stadium, Florida State track and field athletes have the luxury of working out in a 3,000 square foot strength and training facility adjacent from the track that is used exclusively by Seminole track and field team members that opened in October of 1989.

That facility also houses the FSU track coaches' offices and also offers the latest in personalized training with the use of video cameras and the facilities 48" inch television to work on technique.

Named after Florida State's first track and field head coach Mike Long, the complex has attracted some of the top track and field meets in the nation. Mike Long Track and the City of Tallahassee have played host to the USA Track and Field National Junior Championships in 1988 and the AAU National Championships in 1991. The USA Track and Field National Junior Championships will return to Mike Long in the summer of 1994. Florida State and Mike Long Track also played host to the Atlantic Coast Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships in its first year in the league, 1992.

Mike Long Track has been the training facility for many national and world class athletes. And as the Seminole track and field program continues to prosper, will continue to host many more.



# '94 WOMEN'S REVIEW

The 1993-94 track and field season for the Lady Seminoles was a time of overall improvement by the team and outstanding performances by some individuals. The Lady 'Noles finished fourth at the Atlantic Coast Conference Indoor Championships with 76.5 points. Sheryl Covington led the way for Florida State with victories in the 55 and 200 meter dashes. For her performance, Covington was awarded the Most Valuable Participant trophy for the meet.

Head Coach Terry Long had two Lady Seminoles qualify for the NCAA National Indoor Track and Field Championships in Indianapolis but could only take one. Indianne Henry qualified for the NCAA's in the high jump with a mark of 5-10 at the ACC meet but could not perform at the NCAA's due to a back injury. Covington qualified in the 200 hundred meters but did not make the finals.

The Lady Seminoles had their best finish since entering the ACC at the outdoor championships. Their 115 points was good enough for third place behind North Carolina and Virginia. Indoor conference runner-up Indianne Henry moved up one place at the outdoor

championships, winning with a height of 5-11.25. Radhiya Teagle ran away from the field in the 400 meter hurdles and the 4x400 meter relay of Myrium Charles, Sophia Danvers, Erica Shepard and Sheryl Covington capped the meet by taking home first place honors in the last event of the meet.

Florida State took one of its largest contingents ever to the NCAA Championships in Boise, Idaho. The 4x100 relay team of Deletea Bradley, Sophia Danvers, Casey Custer, and Sheryl Covington qualified for the championships but did not make the finals. Bradley made it to the semi-finals of the 100 meter dash but could dash no more once a recurring injury reared its ugly head. Henry competed in the high jump with an extremely soar back and finished in a tie for ninth with a mark of 5-8.75. The 4x400 relay team earned All-America honors with a seventh place finish and Covington added to her list of accomplishments with a fifth place in the quarter mile. The Lady Seminoles finished the meet in a tie for 39th with Middle Tennessee State and Nevada-Las Vegas.







# ACADEMICS

**Academic**, personal and professional support are essential to college success. At Florida State University, we have developed an outstanding support program which enables student-athletes to reach their full potential.

FSU's academic support philosophy is "to offer an academic support program integrated with the total university that will assess all student-athletes with the transition into college and provide continued support in all phases of academic and professional development culminating with graduation, job placement or graduate school."

To accomplish this goal we have developed an academic environment which facilitates the academic success of student-athletes. Student success is encouraged through competent academic counseling, career exploration, planning and placement and academic assistance through tutorial programs.

Our program operates on a "proactive" rather "reactive" approach. At Florida State, our academic staff does not wait for an academic crises to occur. We gather important background information and build an academic profile on all student-athletes to assess their needs in advance. We also stay informed on the daily progress of each student athlete.

The academic programs have moved to the stateof-the-art University Center and will be located on the sixth floor of the \$126 million facility. It includes private study carrels, a tutorial study area and a computer lab outfitted with 16 new IBM computers and laser printers. In addition, athletic sky boxes are utilized for group and individual tutorial instruction.

FSU offers 16 Schools and Colleges with 99 undergraduate degrees and 75 post-baccalaureate degrees.


