

ear, but far from the glaring strips of neon amusement, and the castles and crowds of Disney, lies another magical place in the Sunshine State — one of pow-wows, plantations, politics and great pride. Often described as "The Other Florida" with its deep-rooted history, rolling hills, canopy roads of mossdraped oaks, cool climate and Southern-style hospitality; it is a Florida few have seen. It is Tallahassee — Florida with a Southern accent.

Best known as Florida's capital, Tallahassee is an intimate neometropolitan city where the power of state government, the academic and the artistic are complimented by subtle, old-fashioned charm.

Tallahassee — derived from the words "talwa" meaning town and "ahasee" meaning old —has undergone many changes, but one thing remains the same — it is still a government town fiercely proud and dedicated to preserving its heritage.

The famous Gulf beaches and major metropolitan areas of the South are a short trip from Tallahassee. As Florida's capital city, Tallahassee offers the grace and charm of a small city, while Atlanta, Jacksonville, Tampa, Orlando and New Orleans are within easy driving distance.

CLIMATE

Tallahassee enjoys four distinct seasons with an average annual temperature of 67 degrees. Weather conditions are mild and moist due to close proximity to the Gulf. Summer temperatures are subtropical with an average of 83 degrees while winters average a pleasant 50 degrees.

The Capitol buildings, both old and new, epitomize Tallahassee's perseverance. With the 22-story New Capitol towering overhead since 1977, the Old Capitol, erected in 1845, has been restored to its 1902 appearance complete with red-and-white candy-striped awnings and a gracious dome adorned with stained glass. The 22nd floor of the New Capitol reveals a spectacular view of the rolling hills of Leon County all the way to the shimmering Gulf of Mexico. Chambers of the House and Senate buzz with political zeal during the March through May legislative session.



The first Christmas mass celebrated in the United States was held in Tallahassee



Standing nine feet tall, Herman, a skeletal prehistoric mastodon — originally weighing about five tons — was pulled from Wakulla Springs in the 1930s. The Museum of Florida History also features the Prehistoric Florida Exhibit, Spanish treasures, war relics and even a riverboat.



Downtown Tallahassee grew as a trade center with Florida's first railroad — a simple mule-drawn, rail trolley epitomizing the leisurely pace of Southern life — connecting Tallahassee and St. Marks. The 16-mile railroad has now been paved as the St. Mark's Bike Trail, and the Old Trolley remains a stylish way to get around.



Only 13 miles from the Capitol, amid alligators, anhingas and tranquillity is the 2,900-acre Wakulla Springs State Park. Visitors can drift lazily aboard a jungle cruise boat on Wakulla Springs while the alligators sun on the shore. Tallahassee's underwater passages have intrigued adventurers from around the world - even National Geographic magazine attempts to uncover the hidden mysteries of the springs in many issues.



The Winter Festival and Celebration of Lights, an outdoor celebration of holiday lights, music and the arts with activities including a night glow parade, Jingle Bell Run and Santa's Enchanted Forest has become a popular wintertime event in Tallahassee.



As one of the largest arenas in Florida, the Tallahassee-Leon County Civic Center, situated on 22 downtown acres, provides the ideal setting for "star-studded" events. The Civic Center Arena was the site of the 1995 NCAA Basketball Southeast Regional while Jacksonville native Jimmy Buffet makes regular visits to Tallahassee.

Red wolves, Florida panthers, alligators and other fascinating wildlife in a 52-acre habitat highlight the Tallahassee Museum of History

and Natural Science.

senior member of the 10-member State
University System, FSU was founded as an institution of higher learning in 1852 by legislative act and began in Tallahassee with its first students in 1857. Today, Florida State's operating budget is \$442 million. Faculty and administrators generate more than \$95 million annually in external funding to supplement state-sponsored research. Three direct-support organizations serve to bolster the University: the FSU Foundation, which raises millions in private gifts to support academics, the Seminole Boosters and the FSU Alumni Association.

Florida State continues to progress and grow — from its pre-Civil War foundation as the Seminary West of the Suwannee, through the early 20th century as the academically respected Florida State College for Women, returning to coeducational status as a university in 1947, to its modern development as an acclaimed research institution, a top-ranked competitor in intercollegiate athletics and as a standard-setter in the basic sciences and the performing arts. **



The Dr. Bobby E. Leach Center, a state-of-the-art student recreation facility, with an indoor pool, saunas, basketball and racquet-sport courts, was completed in 1991. And in June, a 2300 square foot free weight area was completed.

Florida State University, nearing its golden anniversary as a co-educational graduate research institution, has joined the nation's elite in both academics and athletics. Located on the oldest continuous site of higher education in Florida and building rapidly on the framework of a highly regarded liberal arts college for women, the University has emerged over the past 48 years as an institution of national and international esteem.



With 1,568 members, the FSU faculty currently includes five members of the National Academy of Sciences and eight members of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and has included five Nobel laureates. It is backed by 2,987 administrative/professional and support staff.



FSU ranked 20th in the nation for 1990-91 in the number of black Ph.D. students it graduates. Over the five years from 1986 to 1990, FSU ranked eighth nationally by granting doctorates to 70 African-Americans.




FSU's high-tech program in structural biology in 1991 received the University's largest single foundation grant, \$4 million, to position it among the leaders in the field worldwide.



Vice President of the United States Al Gore spoke at the dedication of the National High Magnetic Field Laboratory at Florida State in October 1994. The National Science Foundation established the \$100 million magnet lab at Florida State, which is partnered in research with the Los Alamos National Laboratory and the University of Florida, in 1990. A Nobel laureate in physics and a top Russian physicist were among the first scholars drawn to the faculty by the magnet lab. The world's largest magnet — two stories high and capable of generating 45 tesla or 1 million times the Earth's magnetic field — is to be installed in 1995 at the NHMFL, located in the off-campus research complex, Innovation Park.




Florida State University alumnus, Dr. Norman Thaggard ended the longest space flight in U.S. history in July after a historic mission on the Russian space station Mir. Thaggard who received his undergraduate degree in engineering at FSU in 1965 and his masters a year later, is an avid Seminole football fan and brought his cosmonaut counterparts to their first college football game in Tallahassee last year. Thaggard's Florida State pennant could be clearly seen in the space shuttle aboard Mir during press conferences. Thaggard has been on three space missions including the historic six-day flight on the Challenger in 1983 that included Sally Ride.



Library holdings at Florida State include 2.06 million book titles, 18,498 serials and 4.25 million microforms. The main library facility, the Robert M. Strozier Library, is linked via computerized information systems to other state university and national research libraries. The Paul A.M. Dirac Science Center Library is located at the heart of the University's science research complex. FSU also maintains extensive music, library science and law libraries, and the Mildred and Claude Pepper Library houses the personal and professional papers of one of Florida's best known political couples.



Florida State ranks first in popularity nationwide among high school seniors, based on the number of students who request their Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and American College Test (ACT) scores be sent to an institution. FSU was the only institution listed among the top 10 choices of both black and white college-bound students. Florida State is also tops in the state for community college transfers as FSU admits over 3,000 transfer students every fall semester.



In fall 1994, the first tenants moved in to the east side of the \$82 million University Center, a classroom-and-office facility at Doak Campbell Stadium. The stadium's south end zone also was enclosed and the adjacent Moore Athletic Center expanded. When the west side is completed in 1996, the University Center will provide 550,000 square feet of much needed academic space and a centralized location for student services.

HEAD GOACH TERRY LONG (Florida State '63)



Terry Long, the 1994 NCAA District III Coach of the Year, begins his eighth season as the head coach of both the men's and women's track teams. Following in his father's footsteps, Long continues the tradition sixteen seasons after his father, Mike, retired as head coach at Florida State. Long has been associated with the

Seminole track program since he was 15 years old, his age when Mike Long began his head coaching legacy at FSU in 1955.

A few years later, Long formally joined the program as a student-athlete and ran track for the Tribe for four seasons. His senior year, he had the nation's fastest time in the 220 yard hurdles. Long completed his bachelor's degree in 1963 and his master's in 1965, both at FSU. Long then began his track coaching career as head track and assistant football coach at Seacrest High School in Delray Beach before taking the head track and cross country coaching job at Lakeland High School.

Long came to Florida State from the University of Florida where he served two seasons as an assistant men's track coach. Long built his reputation as a top track coach during 14 years of coaching at Santa Fe Community College in Gainesville and Seminole Community College in Sanford, Florida.

While serving in the Florida junior college ranks, Long developed literally hundreds of JC All Americans and 56 national junior college champions. His teams won 14 state junior college track and cross country titles. He was named Junior College National Coach of the Year three times. In 1982 and 1983, he guided the Santa Fe CC women's team to back-to-back national championships before moving on to Florida State.

During his tenure at Seminole Community College, Long was inducted into the Florida Track Hall of Fame, as his father had been years earlier.

The sport of track has certainly been a tradition in the Long family. In addition to Mike Long, for whom Florida State's track facilities are named, his three sons all became coaches.

In 1986, Long rejoined Florida State as the head women's track coach and coordinator of both the men's and women's track teams. Following the retirement of men's coach Dick Roberts after the 1988 season, Long

became the head coach of both the men's and women's teams.

As head coach and administrator of the program over the past six seasons, Long has continued a strong tradition of track success by the Seminoles' program. In 1994, Long coached the men to the ACC indoor title and was named ACC Coach of the Year. He has kept Florida State near the top in collegiate track and field with over 30 individual All-Americans.

In 1988, Long coached U.S. Olympian Arthur Blake who made the Olympic finals in the 110 high hurdles and is recognized as one of the top hurdlers in the world. Long also coached national intermediate hurdle champion Kim Batten. Batten was named the TAC Outdoor meet's most outstanding female after breaking the collegiate record in the 440-hurdles in 1991. Batten set the world record in that event with a time of 52.61. In addition to Blake and Batten, Long has coached Olympians Chandra Cheeseborough, Michelle Finn, Tom Reither, Rey Robinson and Dennis Mitchell.

Terry is extremely active in track outside of Florida State and even the state of Florida. In 1984, he coached the United States team in the first World Indoor Track Championships, held in Paris, France. He has also served as the co-chairman of the National Olympic Development Sprint Committee.

Long, 54 has been head coach of the Athletic Attic, Mazda and Bud Light Track clubs and his indoor and outdoor teams have won six national TAC championships. In 1988, Long brought the TAC Junior National Meet to Tallahassee.

Scott Irving

Assistant Coach Middle and Long Distance (Williamette '73)

A veteran coach, Irving enters his second season as a member of the Seminole track and field coach-

ing staff. Irving will handle the Tribe middle and long distance runners.

Although a relative newcomer to Tallahassee, Irving is not new to track and field, or the state of Florida. Coach Irving brings well deserved credentials to Florida State University. He has directed countless conference champions, over 30 NCAA All-Americans, six national champions, numerous national team members and two Olympians, in a coaching career that spans nearly two decades.

Irving began his coaching career in the heart of distance running country at the University of Oregon (1977-83). He received cross country instruction from noted distance coach Bill Dellinger and was assistant track and field coach with the women's program.

Coach Irving's next stint was at the University of Florida (1983-89), where he assisted Dr. Lyle Knudson with the women's cross country program that captured the '85 SEC title. From Florida, Irving joined the Fighting Illini in the fall of '89 as the field events coach/recruiting coordinator.

A recipient of two master's degrees, the 1973 Williamette University graduate makes the pursuit of academic excellence an utmost priority. Oregon athletes annually dotted the dean's list. Athletes who were coached or recruited by Irving at Florida made All-SEC Academic teams 40 times. Phenomenally, in two of only four years at Illinois he had athletes awarded the most prestigious accolade, the Big Ten Medal of Honor, for academic/athletic excellence.

A new tradition in academic and athletic excellence has begun at FSU with the men's Cross Country team gaining Golden Torch honors for high grade point average. The team carried an all-sport high GPA of 3.11 in 1995. Florida

State had their highest individual finishers ever at the 1995 ACC Cross Country Championships. Brian Lucyk placed 20th overall for the men and Kristen Birmelin finished ninth while earning All-ACC Honors for the Women.

Coach Irving also played an instrumental role in the foundations for national championship programs at both Oregon (1985) and Florida (1991).

Irving and his wife, Allyn, have been married for twenty-three years and have two sons, eight year old Shannon and Kevin, four.



Kim McKenzie

Assistant Coach Sprints/Hurdles (Texas EL Paso '84)

Kim McKenzie begins her ninth season on the Florida State staff in

1996. The former Olympic bronze medalist began her coaching career in 1987 as a volunteer assistant while training for the '88 Olympic games.

McKenzie was a member of the 1984 U.S. Olympic team and won the bronze medal in the 100 meter high hurdles in Los Angeles. She brings a multitude of experience and talent to her duties with the sprinters and high hurdlers, whom she has helped for the past four seasons. Born in Birmingham, Alabama, McKenzie was the top scorer in the high hurdles during the 1991 Grand Prix season. The former Lady Seminole wasd ranked among the top 10 in the world in the 100 meter high hurdles in recent years.

A native of Detroit, Michigan, McKenzie has an extensive background in national and international track. In 1990, she set the American record in the 50 meter hurdles in an indoor meet in Canada. In addition, McKenzie was the NCAA Champion in the 100 meter hurdles in 1984, her junior season at Texas El Paso. McKenzie also captured a silver medal at the Pan Am Games in the 100 meter hurdles.

McKenzie coaches with a very spirited and enthusiastic approach while inspiring athletes to perform to their maximum potential. Two of McKenzie's prize pupils are current Seminole All-American Jonathan Carter and NCAA 55 meter hurdle champion Phillip Riley.

McKenzie has a son, Leander, 9.

Harlis Meaders

Assistant Coach Throws (University of North Carolina '92)

Harlis Meaders enters his second season on the Florida State coaching staff as throws coach. Meaders, a high school All-American in 1988, competed on the collegiate level at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill.

His collegiate track experience includes the shot put, the 35 lb weight throw and the discus. While at UNC, Meaders was a three time individual ACC champion and made a significant contribution to the 1992 outdoor ACC championship team. Meaders was also a NCAA qualifier in the discus throw and qualified for the 1992 Olympic trials. Meaders currently holds the school record in the discus throw at North Carolina.

Meaders comes to Florida State by way of Western Carolina University where he served as assistant track and field coach for three years and obtained his masters degree in physical education.

While at Western Carolina, Meaders coached three Southern Conference Champions and several other all-conference athletes in the throwing events for both men and women. Meaders helped the men's and women's programs obtain their highest place finishes ever in the Southern Conference.

Assistant Coach Pole Vault, Javelin, High Jump (Florida State '82)

Dennis Nobles enters his tenth year with the Seminole track and field staff and has developed into

one of the top coaches in the field. A pole vaulter on FSU's track team from 1979-81, Nobles graduated cum laude from Florida State's School of Physical Education. He went on to obtain his master's degree from FSU in Exercise Physiology in 1983.

Following graduation from Florida State, he began his coaching career at Wayland Baptist College, an NAIA track powerhouse in Plainview, Texas.

While at Wayland Baptist College, he coached 17 All-Americans, two national champions, a pair of Olympic qualifiers and a national record holder. He also led the school to a national championship and two-runner up finishes. He returned to his alma mater in 1985 to accept a position as assistant coach. Nobles has since coached several All-Americans, another Olympian and a world record holder. He is currently working towards his Ph.D in Athletic Administration.

His duties at FSU include coaching athletes in the javelin, high jump and pole vault events. In recent years, he has been invited to participate in the elite women's javelin clinic in Long Beach, California.

Dennis and his wife, Vicki, have one daughter, Sally.


John Citron has been involved in the sport of track and field as a

During his years on the Florida State staff, Long has coached numerous NCAA All-Americans. One former All-American decathlete, Rohn Stark, has been one of the NFL's top punters over the past few seasons.

Volunteer Assistant World Champion / World Record Holder (Florida State 1988-91)


Kim Batten is unquestionably one of the finest track athletes in Florida State history. Batten set the World Record in the 400m intermediate hurdles this year with a time of 52.61. She is one of several Seminoles who are in training for the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta.

On February 12, 1996, Batten received one of the highest honors acheivable in the sports world. She received the ESPY Award for Women's Track and Field Performer of the Year, beating out track stars Jackie Joyner-Kersey and Gwen Torrence in the voting.

Batten's name still fills the Florida State record book. She is the school record holder in the 100m hurdles, 400m

intermediate hurdles and 55m intermediate hurdles.

As she continues her training in Tallahassee the for Olympics, Batten will assist Coach Terry Long with instruction of the 1996 Seminole track team.



1996 MEN'S PREYLEW

he Seminole men enter the 1996 season with hopes of returning to the top of the ACC. After winning the ACC indoors in 1994, the squad followed with a sixth place indoor finish and a fourth place outdoor finish to complete the 1995 season. Head Coach Terry Long and the Florida State coaching staff hope that the right blend of young talent and established veterans can bring the team back for another run at the ACC title in 1996.

The Seminoles will call on some underclassmen to step to the forefront as they enter the indoor season. Lost to graduation is All-American 400m hurdle standout and relay member John Rothell. Add in the absence of NCAA Champion Phillip Riley, All-American Jonathan Carter, and 400m specialist Tim Franklin during the indoor season and it leaves a glaring hole in the Seminole lineup as the three seniors have only outdoor eligibility remaining.

"The absence of Carter, Riley and Franklin will hurt in the indoor season," said Coach Long. "These three guys, in terms of the running events, will be extremely difficult to replace."

Sophomore Patrick Hayes, an NCAA qualifier in the 55 meters, will have an opportunity to step into a leadership role as he continues to develop into a premier sprinter. Coach Long is asking Hayes to move to the 400m event as well. The Seminoles do not have a bonafide quarter-miler since Franklin is finished with his indoor elgibility. Another with the talent to step forward is redshirt freshman Cleon Blake. In the sprints, Blake and Hayes will have to carry the weight until Riley, Carter and Franklin return for the outdoor season.

Another key loss is Mike Hampton, a middle distance runner who was a scorer in the 800m and 1500m. Long and the FSU coaching staff are confident in the ability of Tim Middelkoop in the 800m. Middelkoop, a senior, has experience in that distance and should be a solid performer. Anton Kelly is the wildcard in the middle distances. Kelly has "all the tools" according to Coach Long and needs to make the transition into a scoring role. Nafthaly Kurgat, a native of Kenya, is coming off a redshirt year and should be ready to contribute in the middle distances.

The long distances are an area in which the Seminoles would like to see some improvement. Brian Lucyk and Reid Montini have continued to show improvement and should make the men stronger in that area. Jasen Ritter and David

Ogeltree will compete in both the mile and the steeplechase.

"Whatever Ritter and Ogeltree do in those events will be significant because they are it," stated Coach Long. "Those are the two who will have to get it done."

In the throws, the Seminoles will be without the services of Ryan Carson and Marc Anderson, who finished 2nd and 3rd in the ACC Championships last season. The proven performer is javelin thrower Justin Johnston, who earned All-America honors last year. Anthony Sasso, the highest returning placer in the shot and discus, must become a force at the con-

ference level. FSU has some young underclassmen with the possibility of making some noise in the throws in Greg Jack, William Shirk and Jody Lawrence.

"I really think we have got the people who can move into the throws", said Coach Long. "Anderson and Carson did a real good job for us the last couple of years."

In the pole vault, Brian Till will be asked to take over for Richard Grist. Grist was the top vaulter from last season, but was forced to transfer in order to pursue another major. Till, a junior, has the talent and should be ready to contribute according to Coach Long.

Senior Anthony Washington leads the Seminoles in the high jump and triple jump. Washington will be shooting for the NCAA qualifying marks this year in both events.

"Anthony is our number one high jumper and our number one triple jumper," said Coach Long. "He has all the talent in the world. He must come forward and make a significant contribution."

The young Florida State team will be tested early until the big guns return for the outdoor season. If the likes of Patrick Hayes and Cleon Blake can make big strides early on, the Seminole men will be a force in the ACC. The outdoor season should find the squad at full strength when Riley, Carter and Franklin return to the track.

"Indoors we are going to be really young and we may struggle a bit," commented Coach Long. "Outdoors we will begin to put things together as we as we get some of that leadership back in the mix. "I think we will be surprisingly strong by the outdoor season."
