This Is Tallahassee







Accentuating Tallahassee's Southern persona are lush rolling hills, likened to the seven hills of Rome, and five "official" canopy roads of patriarch oaks.

The fertile, rich soil and four distinct, yet pleasant, seasons breed floral brilliance and natural vitality year-round. Like the city itself, the story of how Tallahassee was chosen as the state capital is rich in history. In 1823, two explorers set out — one on horseback from St. Augustine and the other by



boat from Pensacola — to find a permanent, central location for the Legislature to convene. The two met at a beautiful site that the Creek and Seminole Indians called "tallahassee" — derived from the words "talwa" meaning town and "ahasee" meaning old.




The rendezvous point remains Florida's capital. The "old town" has undergone many changes, but one thing remains the same — it is still a government town fiercely proud and dedicated to preserving its heritage. The Capitol buildings, both old and new, epitomize Tallahassee's perseverance. The 22nd floor of the New Capitol provides a panoramic scope of a sophisticated Southern city awash in a sea of flowering azaleas, snowy dogwoods, towering pines, fragrant magnolias, and hundreds of shimmering lakes, springs, swamps, rivers and sink holes. Special legislative viewing galleries are open during the legislative session. Below, in the shade of giant live oaks, proudly stands the Old Capitol, originally constructed in 1845 and restored to its 1902 splendor complete with red-and-white candy-striped awnings, a dome adorned with stained glass, antique furnishings and politi-



cal memorabilia. Across from the Old Capitol are the 40-foot twin granite towers of the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial, and the blue stone Union Bank, Florida's oldest surviving financial institution. The nostalgic Old Town Trolley, a replica turn-of-the-century street car, carries passengers through restored Adams Street Commons to numerous other historical downtown shops for free — unheard of even 100 years ago. Minutes from downtown lies the Governor's


Mansion, which resembles the home of Florida's military hero Andrew Jackson; and the 52-acre natural animal habitat and 1880s farm of the Tallahassee Museum of History

and Natural Science, which provide the rare chance to walk and talk with native Florida animals. Tallahassee remains firmly linked with the past as evidenced by the unearthed 1539 winter encampment of Spanish Hernando de Soto, the site of the first Christmas celebration in America. Visitors travel back through time as they stand in the shadow of a giant 12,000-year-old American Mastodon at the Museum of Florida History or explore other historical spots including The Knott House that Rhymes, The Columns, San Luis Mission, Lake Jackson State Archaeologi-cal Site, Natural Bridge Battlefield, First Presbyterian Church, Brokaw-McDougall House, Goodwood Plantation and Adams Street Commons. Nearby, alligators lazing in the sunshine and anhinga "snake birds" perched on twisted cypress branches are seen at Wakulla Springs, one of the world's deepest freshwater springs and site of many underwater scenes in the "Tarzan" movies with Johnny Weissmuller and Maureen O'Sullivan. Safaris aboard glass-bottomed and jungle cruise boats whisk





to curiosity and antique shops. Cultural interests are sparked by widely-acclaimed museums and galleries and elaborate entertainment at the 14,000-seat Tallahassee-Leon County Civic Center. Tallahassee is a collaboration of power-play politics and classical character splashed with a twist of Southern beauty and charm. Tallahassee is Florida with a Southern accent.










This Is Florida State









brida State University, which will mark its golden anniversary as a coeducational graduate research institution in 1997, has joined the nation's elite in both academics and athletics.

Located on the oldest continuous site of higher education in Florida and building rapidly on the framework of a highly regarded liberal arts college for women, the University has emerged over the past 49 years as an institution of national and international esteem. Its stature is evidenced by a number of additions to its record of excellence in the 1990s:

- In 1994, Florida State was classified a "Research University I" by the Carnegie Foundation, placing it among the nation's top research universities.
- In 1994, the college referral service, "Who's Who Among American High School Students," placed FSU among its top 10 with such universities as Harvard, Duke, Stanford, North Carolina-Chapel Hill, Michigan-Ann Arbor and Yale of most frequent choices of more than 100,000 of the nation's best and brightest high school students who asked that a specific college be notified of their recognition in "Who's Who."
- Vice President of the United States AI Gore spoke at the dedication of the National High Magnetic Field Laboratory at Florida State in 1994. The National Science Foundation established the \$100 million magnet lab at FSU, which is partnered in research with the Los Alamos National Laboratory and the University of Florida, in 1990. A Nobel laureate in physics and a top Russian physicist were among the first scholars drawn to the facility. The world's largest magnet two stories high and capable of generating 45 tesla or 1 million times the Earth's magnetic field was installed in 1995 at the NHMFL, located in the off-campus research complex, Innovation Park.
- In 1996, the NSF renewed and increased by 50 percent the NHMFL's funding for another five years.
- FSU created the first multipurpose student identification/banking card. The Card Application Technology Center is a national leader in "smart card" systems.
- At the forefront of supercomputing since obtaining its first high speed computer in 1985, FSU took yet another step in ultrafast and parallel computing in 1990 when it acquired two supercomputers, the Thinking Machine Corp. Connection Machine and the Cray Y-MP.
- In fall 1994, the first tenants moved into the east side of the \$100 million University Center, a classroom-and-office facility at Doak Campbell Stadium; the stadium's south end zone was also enclosed and the adjacent Moore Athletic Center expanded. When the west side is completed in 1996, University Center will provide 550,000 square feet of much needed academic space and a centralized location for student services.
- One of the first academic areas to make its home in University Center, was the FSU School of Motion Picture, Television and Recording Arts. Offering training for one of Florida's fastest growing industries, FSU conferred its first master's degree in film in 1991 and it's first bachelor's in film in 1993. The film school's students have already produced national and international award-winning films.
- The Center for Civic Education and Service was established in 1994 aimed at promoting community involvement and civic responsibility as integral elements of a liberal arts education at FSU. The center supports such service-learning programs as Project Amistades, which provides educational services to migrant farmworkers. Through ServScript, student's service may be recorded on their official academic transcript.
- In 1990, Florida State ranked second in popularity nationwide among high school seniors, based on the number of students who request that their Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) scores be sent to an institution. FSU was the only institution listed among the top 10 choices of both black and white college-bound students.
- FSU's high-tech program in structural biology in 1991 received the University's largest single foundation grant, \$4 million.
- Capping more than a decade of national prominence in intercollegiate athletics, Florida State's athletic teams, nicknamed "Seminoles," joined the Atlantic Coast Conference as its ninth member in 1990. The FSU football team won the 1993 National Championship and its quarterback, Charlie Ward, won the University's first Heisman Trophy.
- To better understand the world's cultural diversity, FSU undergraduate students are required to complete at least two courses that focus on diverse traditions beyond Western civilization. The multicultural study requirement, in effect since 1991, complements a long-established liberal studies program at Florida State.
- The Dr. Bobby E. Leach Center, a state-of-the-art student recreation facility, with a pool, saunas, basketball and racquet-sport courts, was completed in 1991.
- The Appleton Museum of Art in Ocala, its vast art collection and an eminent scholar chair were donated to FSU and Central Florida Community College in 1990.
- FSU ranked 20th in the nation for 1990-91 in the number of black Ph.D. students it graduates. Over the five years, 1986 to 1990, FSU ranked eighth nationally by granting doctorates to 70 African-Americans.



 FSU acquired the Asolo Performing Arts Center in Sarasota, home to the graduate theater program, the FSU/Asolo Conservatory of Professional Actor Training.

As this list of highlights attests, Florida State is excelling in the 1990's with exceptional strength, energy and vision for the future. Under the leadership of the University's 12th president, Talbot "Sandy" D'Alemberte, who took office in January 1994, FSU will continue to build on the foundation of its history of excellence in scholarship, research and service.

A senior member of the 10-member State University System, FSU was founded as an institution of higher learning in 1851 by legislative act and began in Tallahassee with its first students in 1857.

Today, FSU's operating budget is \$452.5 million. Faculty and administrators generate more than \$99.9 million annually in exter-

nal funding to supplement state-sponsored research. Three direct-support organizations serve to bolster the University; FSU Foundation, which raises millions in private gifts to support academics, Seminole Boosters and FSU Alumni Association.

The main campus is spread over 450.6 acres in Tallahassee; FSU, which has one of the smallest campuses in the SUS, has been actively acquiring land in the 1990s after years of being land-locked at 847 acres. FSU owns 1,303 acres in Leon, Bay, Franklin and Sarasota counties.

Within the state, the University maintains facilities at its 25-acre campus in Panama City, its Marine Laboratory on the Gulf of Mexico, the Appleton Museum in Ocala and the Asolo Performing Arts Center in Sarasota. The Center for Professional Development and Public Service, housed in the Augustus B. Turnbull III Florida State Conference Center on the edge of the campus, provides extensive credit and non-credit continuing education programs statewide.

For years FSU has reached far beyond Florida through international programs in Switzerland, France, Panama, Costa Rica and the Caribbean. FSU's study centers in Florence, Italy and London, England are considered by many to be the nation's best in Europe.

Florida State offers 283 graduate and undergraduate degree programs through its eight colleges - Arts and Sciences; Business; Communication: Education; Engineering (operated jointly with Florida A&M University, a historically black institution); Human Sciences; Law; and Social Sciences (which also incorporates the Reubin Askew School of Public Administration and Policy) - and eight schools - Criminology and Criminal Justice; Library and Information Studies; Motion Picture, Television and Recording Arts; Music; Nursing; Social Work; Theatre; and Visual Arts and Dance.

With 1,671 members, the FSU faculty has five National Academy of Sciences members and eight American Academy of Arts and Sciences members, and has included five Nobel laureates. It is backed by 2,990 administrative/professional and support staff.

Library holdings at Florida State include 2.1 million book titles, 18,296 serials and 4.4 million microforms. The main library facility, the Robert M. Strozier Library, is linked by computer to other state university and national research libraries. The Paul A.M. Dirac Science Center Library is located at the heart of the University's science research complex. FSU also maintains extensive music, library science and law libraries.

On the top floor of the Dirac Library is the headquarters of the Supercomputer Computations Research Institute, a multidisciplinary, multinational program established in 1984 that brings together some 50 scientists, engineers and technicians.

Also providing research opportunities is the tandem Van de Graff Superconducting Accelerator Laboratory, which houses two powerful atom smashers and has been ranked among the top four nuclear research centers in the nation by the National Science Foundation.


Graduate students, who number more than 5,856, pursue advanced degrees in fields as diverse as business administration and theoretical particle physics. A majority of research done at FSU is the direct result of student effort, culminating in numerous books, monographs and journal articles relating to the whole spectrum of intellectual interests and the practical needs of society.

FSU, a residential campus, places a high priority on its 30,268 students and their needs and interests (of the student population: 45 percent are male; 55 percent are female; 18.5 percent are minorities; and 2.4 percent are foreign students). The University Honors Program, Disabled Student Services, International Student Center, Student Government, Flying High Circus and intramural sports are among more than 200 organizations and activities in which students can participate.

Situated in the heart of the state's thriving capital city, Florida State's main campus blends Gothic and modern styles of architecture with the oaks, pines, dogwoods, palms and azaleas of North Florida.

Florida State continues to progress and grow -from its pre-Civil War foundation as the Seminary West of the Suwannee, through the early 20th century as the academically respected Florida State College for Women, returning to coeducational status as a university in 1947, to its modern development as an acclaimed research institution, a top-ranked competitor in intercollegiate athletics and as a standard-setter in the basic sciences and the performing arts.


In all areas of its mission - excellence in teaching, research and public service - Florida State University is advancing boldly toward the 21st century.












Head Coach Terry Long



Terry Long enters his ninth season as the head coach of the Florida State track team. Long, the 1994 NCAA District III Coach of the Year, heads both the men's and women's teams. Following in his father's footsteps, Long continues the tradi-

tion seventeen seasons after his father, Mike, retired as head coach at Florida State. Long has been associated with the Seminole track program since he was 13 years old, his age when Mike Long began his head coaching legacy at FSU in 1955.

A few years later, Long formally joined the program as a student-athlete and ran track for the Tribe for four seasons. His senior year, he had the nation's fastest time in the 220-yard hurdles. Long completed his bachelor's degree in 1963 and his master's in 1965, both at FSU. Long then began his track coaching career as head track and assistant football coach at Seacrest High School in Delray Beach before taking the head track and cross country coaching job at Lakeland High School.

Long came to Florida State from the University of Florida where he served two seasons as an assistant men's track coach. Long built his reputation as a top track coach during 14 years of coaching at Santa Fe Community College in Gainesville and Seminole Community College in Sanford, Florida.

While serving in the Florida junior college ranks, Long developed literally hundreds of junior college All Americans and 56 national junior college champions. His teams won 14 state junior college track and cross country titles. He was named Junior College National Coach of the Year three times. In 1982 and 1983, he guided the Santa Fe CC women's team to back-to-back national championships before moving on to Florida State.

During his tenure at Seminole Community College, Long was inducted into the Florida Track Hall of Fame, as his father had been years earlier.

The sport of track has certainly been a tradition in the Long family. In addition to Mike Long, for whom Florida State's track facilities are named, his three sons all became coaches.

In 1986, Long rejoined Florida State as the head women's track coach and coordinator of both the men's and women's track teams. Following the

retirement of men's coach Dick Roberts after the 1988 season, Long became the head coach of both the men's and women's teams.

As head coach and administrator of the program over the past eight seasons, Long has continued a strong tradition of track success by the Seminoles' program. In 1994, Long coached the men to the ACC indoor title and was named ACC Coach of the Year. He has kept Florida State near the top in collegiate track and field with over 40 individual All-Americans.

In 1988, Long coached U.S. Olympian Arthur Blake who made the Olympic finals in the 110 high hurdles and is recognized as one of the top hurdlers in the world. Long also coached national intermediate hurdle champion Kim Batten. Batten was named the TAC Outdoor meet's most outstanding female after breaking the collegiate record in the 440-hurdles in 1991. Batten set the world record in the 400m hurdles with a time of 52.61 and went on to win the silver medal later that year for the USA in the 1996 Olympic games in Atlanta. In addition to Blake and Batten, Long has coached Olympians Chandra Cheeseborough, Michelle Finn, Tom Reither, Rey Robinson and Dennis Mitchell.

Terry is extremely active in track outside of Florida State and even the state of Florida. In 1984, he coached the United States team in the first World Indoor Track Championships, held in Paris, France. He has also served as the co-chairman of the National Olympic Development Sprint Committee.

Long, 56 has been head coach of the Athletic Attic, Mazda and Bud Lite Track clubs and his indoor and outdoor teams have won six national TAC championships. In 1988, Long brought the TAC Junior National Meet to Tallahassee.

Scott Irving begins his fourth year at the helm of the Seminole distance program.

His collegiate coaching career began in the heart of distance running country at the University of Oregon (1977-1983). Irving studied under the legendary Bill Dellinger, who coached Alberto Salazar, while assisting with the women's track and field program that eventually won the NCAA outdoor title. Irving's next stint was at the University of Florida from 1983-89, where he assisted Dr. Lyle Knudson with the women's cross country program that captured the '85 SEC title and helped Beverly Kearney develop an eventual NCAA national track and field championsip team. From Florida, Irving joined the University of Illinois in the fall of 1989 where he took over recruiting coordinator responsibilities and returned the Fighting Illini to prominence in the Big Ten Conference and on the national scene.

In his first year of coaching at FSU, the men's 4x800m relay team ranked fourth in the nation by Track and Field News with a school record time of 7:19 set at the 1994 Penn Relays. The distance medley relay won the conference DMR title and helped the team to victory at the ACC Indoor meet. The 1996 ACC Outdoor Championships were the best ever for the Seminole distance corps. They not only had the only double scorer in the 1,500m and steeplechase, but also produced FSU's first 10,000m scorer at the ACC meet. He has directed countless conference champions, over 30 NCAA All-Americans, six national champions, numerous national team members and two Olympians in a coaching career that spans more than two decades.

A recipient of two Master's degrees (Architectural History, Northwestern University '77 and Biomechanics / Athletic Administration, University of Oregon '79), the 1973 Willamette University graduate places the pursuit of academic excellence as an utmost priority. Irving-coached athletes at Oregon annually dotted the dean's list. Athletes at Florida made All-SEC Academic teams 40 times. Phenomenally, in two out of only four years at Illinois he had athletes awarded the most prestigious accolade, the Big Ten Medal of Honor, for academic/athletic excellence. In 1995, the FSU men's

cross country team ranked sixth nationally for overall team grade point average at 3.22. The men's team won the Golden Torch Award, the top academic award at FSU, in both the 1994-95 and 1995-96 academic years. Recent recruiting successes signal that Irving has Florida State cross country heading in the right direction.

Irving and his wife, Allyn, have married for 22 years and have two sons, ten-year old Shannon and Kevin, who is seven.

Assistant Coach Throws (University of North Carolina '92)

Harlis Meaders enters his third season on the Florida State coaching staff as the throws coach. Meaders, a high school All-American in 1988, competed on the collegiate level at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill.

His collegiate track experience includes the shot put, the 35-lb. weight throw and the discus. While at UNC, Meaders was a three-time individual ACC champion and made a significant contribution to the 1992 outdoor ACC championship team. Meaders was also an NCAA qualifier in the discus throw and qualified for the 1992 Olympic trials. Meaders currently holds the school record in the discus throw at North Carolina.

Meaders comes to Florida State by way of Western Carolina University where he served as assistant track and field coach for three years and obtained his masters degree in physical education. While at Western Carolina, Meaders coached three Southern Conference Champions and several other all-conference athletes in the throwing events for both men and women. Meaders helped the men's

and women's programs obtain their highest place finishes ever in the Southern Conference.

At Florida State, Meaders has helped the Seminoles become one of the best all-around throwing squads in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Last year, the FSU throwers scored over 100 points in the ACC Championship meets. Under Meaders, the throwers continue to set both personal and school records. Several throwers are expected to qualify for the NCAA Championships this year.

Andi Lyons returns to her alma mater after four years at Mississippi State University. As an assistant coach at MSU, Lyons coached hurdles and sprints along with the field events for the past four years.


The former Lady Seminole was instrumental in Mississippi State's global recruiting efforts. Lyons helped bring quality national and international talent to MSU that collectively combined to set many school records and win several conference championships.

As an assistant at Florida State, Lyons will coach sprints, hurdles and relays. She will also coordinate all women's recruiting and compliance matters.

Lyons earned All-America honors as a part of the 4x100 meter relay team in 1991 and '92. She currently holds the seventh fastest 100-meter dash time in school history at 53.88 and her name is listed in the top ten as a member of both the 4x100 and 4x400 meter relay teams in the women's all-time performance list.

A dean's list student at FSU, Lyons received her

bachelor's degree in communication in 1992. More recently, the 26-year old Ohio native earned her master's degree in sports administration from Mississippi State this past summer.


Assistant Coach Pole Vault, Javelin, High Jump, Long Jump, Triple Jump (Florida State '82)

Dennis Nobles enters his 11th year with the Seminole track and field staff and is recognized as one of the top coaches in the field. A pole vaulter on FSU's track team from 1979-81, Nobles graduated cum laude from Florida State's School of Physical Education. He went on to obtain his master's degree from FSU in Exercise Physiology in 1983.

Following graduation from Florida State, he began his coaching career at Wayland Baptist College, an NAIA track powerhouse in Plainview, Texas.

While at Wayland Baptist College, he coached 17 All-Americans, two national champions, a pair of Olympic qualifiers and a national record holder. He also led the school to a national championship and two-runner up finishes. He returned to his alma mater in 1985 to accept a position as assistant coach. Nobles has since coached several All-Americans, another Olympian and a world record holder. He is currently working towards his Ph.D in Athletic Administration.

His duties at FSU include coaching athletes in the javelin, high jump, long jump, triple jump and pole vault events. Nobles is the current coach of two-time All-American javelin thrower Justin Johnston, who finished fifth at the 1996 NCAA Outdoor Championshps. In recent years, Nobles has been invited to participate in the elite women's javelin clinic in Long Beach, California.



Assistant Coach Hurdles (Florida State '70)


Jim Long brings a lengthy track background to his 21st season with the Florida State program.

A former Seminole sprinter and son of former FSU head coach Mike Long, Jim came back to his alma mater in 1975 as an assistant coach. His return followed a successful stint as head track coach at Leon High School in Tallahassee. He has served as a clinician at the U.S. Olympic Development camp in Orlando, joining brothers Terry, head coach at Florida State and Curtis, his Western Kentucky mentor. Long was inducted into the Florida Track Hall of Fame in 1991.

During his years on the Florida State staff, Long has coached numerous NCAA All-Americans. One former All-American decathlete, Rohn Stark, became the NFL's all-time leader in punt yardage in 1996. Long has also coached two Olympic hurdlers in Kim McKenzie and Arthur Blake.

He and his wife Janis have two sons; Justin 20 and Jarrett 17.

Nim Batten Volunteer Assistant (Florida State 1988-91)

Kim Batten is unquestionably one of the finest track athletes in Florida State history. Batten set the World Record in the 400m intermediate hurdles last year with a time of 52.61. At the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Batten won the silver medal in that event with a time of 53.08, .26 of a second behind Jamaica's Deon Hemmings.

On February 12, 1996, Batten received one of the highest honors acheivable in the sports world. She received the ESPY Award for Women's Track and Field Performer of the Year, beating out track stars Jackie Joyner-Kersey and Gwen Torrence in the voting.

Batten's name still fills the Florida State record book. She is the school record holder in the 100m hurdles, 400m intermediate hurdles and 55m intermediate hurdles.

As she continues her training in Tallahassee, Batten will assist Coach Terry Long with the instruction of the 1997 Seminole track team as she has done the past several years.

1997 Men's Preview

The 1997 edition of the Florida State men's track and field team will see a changing of the guard in the sprints and hurdles, always one of the strongest areas on FSU's squad.

This year's team must replace two of the finest athletes in Seminole track and field history.

Gone are national champion Phillip Riley and six-time All-American Jonathan Carter. Riley won the 1995 NCAA Indoor Championship in the 55-meter hurdles and Carter finished his FSU career earning all-America status in three events (100, 200 and 4x100) at the 1996 NCAA Outdoor Championships, where he and Riley helped the Florida State men to a 21st place finish overall.

"The big challenge on the men's side is going to be replacing Jonathan Carter and Phillip Riley," said Head Coach Terry Long. "It's essentially a matter of Patrick Hayes, Cleon Blake and the younger guys stepping up and they are going to have a lot more responsibility."

Also returning is one half of the 4x100 relay team that finished sixth at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Warrick Dunn and Byron

Capers will be important factors when they return to the track team after football season is completed. Dunn was a provisional qualifier in the 100 meter dash and placed third at the ACC's in the 55m dash and the 100m dash. Capers has made progress each year on the track and will run the 200 and the 400.

"Byron Capers has gotten a lot better and it's a great accomplishment when a guy comes from football over to track and becomes an All-American in track," said Long. "He and Warrick Dunn are really outstanding examples of dual-sport athletes."

Complimeting Dunn and Capers in the 4x100 will most likely be Cleon Blake and Patrick Hayes. Both have relay experience and Colombo ran on the team last year that recorded a season-best time of 39.50, the seventh fastest qualifying time in the nation.

"I really think we return a very strong sprint/hurdle nucleus," commented Long. "In the hurdles, we expect Anthony Bolton to step in and we think he will be outstanding. Don West has been very steady and is going into his senior year. If he can continue his improvement he will definitely help us. If Dexter Jackson, Peter Warrick, Ron Dugans, Vannez Gooch and Germaine Stringer come over after football they could also contribute."

Another key loss for the Seminole men is 400-meter hurdler Tim Franklin. Franklin just missed qualifying for the NCAA's in that event in '96. Franklin was a valuable asset as he also ran the 400-meters.

"The 400 hurdles is really a glaring weakness for us," said Coach Long. "Reggie Glover and Bolton will help us there. Franklin did double duty at the conference meet

and scored in both. So we are looking at Freshmen Kenyun Langston and Antonio Smith stepping in early."

Danny Smith and Anton Kelly appear to be the leaders in the 800 meters. Smith, a sophomore, and Kelly, a senior, were both ACC finalists last year. The key for Smith is staying healthy as he is rebounding from a hip injury.

"In the half-mile, we will count on Danny Smith and Anton Kelly," stated Coach Long. "Anton is a senior and it is his turn to contribute."

An area that has seen vast improvement is the distance events. Brian Lucyk and David Ogletree return after scoring at the ACC Outdoor Championships last year. Reid Montini and Jasen Ritter should be in top condition after cross country season along with Auburn transfer Joe Simolari.

"I don't see the glaring gaps that we had at one time in the distance events", said Coach Long. The emphasis has shifted a little now. We will look to the distance guys to do the job while some of the younger people in areas like the 400 and 4x400 are maturing."

The jumps will give some of the freshman and younger athletes an opportunity to compete as well. Darius Jones and Brian Till are the contenders in the pole vault. Jones and Todd Marine, both freshman, will long jump and triple jump this season along with returnees Oscar Robinson and Dave McIntire.

"We haven't had a 24-foot long jumper in a couple years now and we need someone to step up," commented Coach Long. "We are looking at a couple of people who jump in the 46 and 47 foot range in the triple jump and we need them to be jumping 49, 50 and 51 feet."

The throws should be very strong with All-American Justin Johnston leading the way in the javelin. The Seminoles lost Anthony Sasso to graduation, but return plenty of talent with William Shirk, Greg Jack and Brad Hess.

"Justin is going to be one of the top javelin throwers in the country and he's ready," said Long. "I think Jody Lawrence has vastly improved his freshman year over high school and looks to be greatly improved this year. The throws will be one of the strong points for us."

Although the men's team must replace All-Americans Jonathan Carter and Phillip Riley, Terry Long and The FSU coaching staff feel they have enough new talent and potential to be just as competitive as last season. If the men hope to improve on their 21st place overall finish at the NCAA's, Riley and Carter's shoes will have to be filled quickly. This year, the Tribe should be able to count on more scoring in the throws and the distances.


"All in all, we essentially have a very young group," summarized Coach Long. "If we have some people step into the gaps we are going to be a quality team and we are anxious to defend the Florida Intercollegiate Championship. That's one of the highlights of the year, going down to Gainesville and beating Florida as well as the other state programs."

Mike Long Track

ike Long Track will serve as the home of the Florida State track and field team for the 42nd year with the start of the 1997 season. In its existence, the complex has grown and seen the Seminole track and field program rise into national prominence.

The Mike Long Track complex is recognized as one of the best outdoor facilities in the country. In addition to the 1,500 seat stadium, Florida State track and field athletes have the luxury of working out in a 3,000 square foot strength and training facility adjacent to the track. It is used exclusively by Seminole track and field team

members and opened in October of 1989.

That facility also houses the FSU track coaches' offices and also offers the latest in personalized training with the use of video cameras and a 48" television that allows athletes to work on technique.

Named after Florida State's first track and field head coach, the complex has attracted some of the top track and field meets in the nation. Mike Long Track and the City of Tallahassee have played host to the USA Track and Field National Junior Championships in 1988 and the AAU National Championships in 1991. Florida State and Mike Long Track also hosted the Atlantic Coast Conference Outdoor Track



and Field Championships in its first year in the league, 1992. The USA Track and Field National Junior Championships returned to Mike Long Track in the summer of '94. The British Olympic Team, who trained in Tallahassee before the 1996 Olympic Games, used the facility for all their track and field practices and workouts over the summer.

Mike Long Track has been the training facility for many national and world class athletes. and as the Seminole track and field program continues to prosper, Mike Long Track will continue to host some of the top athletes, teams and meets in the sport.

Deion Sanders

The All-America cornerback was a valuable asset in the sprint events and relay teams. "Prime Time" still remains in the Seminole record book with the 6th best ever time in the 100 and 7th best in the 200-meters.


Dexter Carter

1997 Women's Preview

he 1997 Lady Seminole track team looks to improve after a year in which they finished 20th at the NCAA Indoors and 25th at the NCAA Outdoors. FSU placed third at the ACC Indoors and improved to a second place conference finish when the ACC Outdoors rolled around.

This year's Lady Seminole track team will be led by the 4x400 meter relay team. The senior group of Sophia Danvers, Yashiva Edwards, Maria Embon and Erica Shepard are coming off a season in which they finished second at both the NCAA Indoor & Outdoor Championships.

"The 1997 women's team definitely starts with the women's 4x400 team," said head coach Terry Long. "They did a phenomenal job for us last year. Each one of those athletes are very capable of being national qualifiers and scorers in their individual events."

Senior Casey Custer will set the standard for the Lady Seminoles in the sprints. Custer, an NCAA qualifier, should contend for ACC honors in the 100 and 200-meters. Yashiva Edwards, Maria Embon and Sophia Danvers (3/4 of the women's 4x400) will drop down from their usual 400m to give Coach Long three quality participants in the 200m. Redshirt freshman Zuzette Mullings and freshman Tonya Carter round out the FSU sprint team.

"I feel comfortable with the sprints and the short relays, and confident in the 4x400m relay as long as we stay healthy," said Long. "I think Sophia Danvers is probably the best leadoff leg in the country in the 4x400 relay and Yashiva Edwards is one of the best anchors. Erica Shepard is an All-American in the 800m indoors and Maria Embon has gotten better every year. I think we have a real strong nucleus there."

Shepard, the ACC Champion in the 800m, leads a solid group at that distance. Behind Shepard are Nicole Singleton and Myriam Charles, two athletes who have the potential to qualify for NCAA competition. FSU also returns sophomore Marleena Crosby, an ACC scorer in the 800m last season.

In the longer distance events, the Lady Seminoles will look to Singleton in the 1,500m and senior Heather Anderson in the 1,500m and 3K. Freshman Diana Hartnup, coming off a solid cross country campaign, will be called on to be an early contributor if FSU hopes to pick up points in the distance areas.

Kristen Thorne, a provisional qualifier in both the 100m and 400m hurdles, hopes to have a solid senior season. Rikke Ronholt is coming off a hip injury, but looks to return to the NCAA's in the 400m hurdles. Ronholt will

also compete in the 100m hurdles along with the high jump and the 4x400m relay.

"I would like to see Kristen
Thorne at the NCAA
Championships this year," said
Long. "She is one of the top
hurdlers in the conference and I
expect her to continue to
improve."

Petena Moultrie, a senior jumper, is another who recorded an NCAA provisional mark last season. Moultrie only has outdoor eligibility remaining. Coach Long will also look for Zuzette Mullings to continue her progress in both the long jump and the triple jump. Freshman Shelby Cannon is another jumper who comes to FSU with many high school accomplishments and should give the Lady Seminoles additional depth.

In the high jump, Christine Daniels and Rikke Ronholt lead the way. Daniels is a returning ACC scorer in the event and Ronholt is a talented athlete who has the ability to win meets in multiple events.

FSU will boast one of the strongest throwing teams in school history. The Lady Seminoles lose Cathy Erickson, but return a core group that set new standards for Coach Harlis Meaders' squad. Shannon Cook, Lakeisha Mose and Laura Goens are solid in all the throwing events. Add freshman Andrea Pappas, a Junior Olympic Champion in the shot put, and the Lady Seminoles will have one of the top throwing teams in the conference.

"I feel good about our throwers," said Long. "Cook, Mose and Goens are three of the better throwers we have ever had here. We lose Erickson, but Pappas should be able to step in early in the shot and also the javelin."

The 1997 Lady Seminoles are an experienced group that should contend for the conference title. The senior 4x400 team of Sophia Danvers, Maria Embon, Yashiva Edwards and Erica Shepard will put FSU in position to win the conference title this season. Solid sprint and throwing teams should give Coach Long's Lady Seminoles the added scoring they need during the regular season meets.

"We should be considered contenders to win the ACC Championship," said Long. "If we can stay injury-free and have some young talent contribute in several areas we will have a great year."





Florida State Academics

Student Services and Academic Support

Academic, personal and professional support are essential to college success. At Florida State University, we have developed an outstanding support program which enables student-athletes to reach their full potential.

Our philosophy is "to offer an academic support program integrated with the total university that will assist all student-athletes with the transition into college and provide continued support in all phases of academic and professional development culminating with graduation, job placement or graduate school."

To accomplish this goal we have developed an academic environment which facilitates the academic success of student-athletes. Student success is encouraged through competent academic counseling, career exploration, planning and placement and academic assistance through tutorial programs.

Our program operates on a "proactive" rather than "reactive" approach. At Florida State, our academic staff does not wait for academic crises to occur. We gather important background information and build an academic profile on all student-athletes to assess their needs in advance. We also stay informed on the daily progress of each student-athlete.

Our academic support staff includes a director, five counselors, and three graduate interns forming a group of professionals serving the needs of all our student-athletes.

In 1994, the academic programs moved to the state-of-the-art University Center and are located on the 6th floor of the \$126,000,000 facility. It includes private study carrels, a tutorial study area and a computer lab outfitted with 16 new IBM computers and laser printers. In addition, athletic sky boxes are utilized for group and individualized tutorial instruction sessions.

1996 Year In Review

he Florida State track team recorded impressive finishes during the regular season, as well as in conference and national meets in 1996. The regular season was highlighted by a team title at the Florida Intercollegiate meet, defeating state rivals Florida and Miami. The men's team placed fourth in both the ACC Indoor and Outdoor Championships, while the women finished third and second, respectively.

In Gainesville, the Lady Seminoles took first place at the Barnett Bank Florida Intercollegiate at Pearcy Beard Track. The FSU women placed first with 155 points, followed by Florida (132) and Miami (104). The Lady Seminoles took the "state championship" with first place finishes by Kirsten Birmelin (1,500m) and the 4x400m relay team of Rikke Ronholt, Maria Embon, Sophia Danvers and Erica Shepard.

The men completed the sweep the following day with a point total of 173, well ahead of Florida (125) and Miami (86.5). Senior Phillip Riley led the way with a first place finish in the 110-meter hurdles. Also contributing first place points were sprinters Warrick Dunn (100) and Jonathan Carter (200). Justin Johnston (javelin), Jody Lawrence (discus), Anthony Washington (triple jump) and Greg Jack (shot put) picked up first place points in the field events to help the Seminoles to an easy victory.

At the ACC Indoor Championships in Greensboro, NC, the Lady Seminoles brought home a third place finish. Erica Shepard won the ACC crown in the 800 meters and 4x400-meter relay team of Sophia Danvers, Maria Embon, Erica Shepard and Yashiva Edwards placed first as well.

The men managed a fourth place effort without the services of All-Americans Phillip Riley and Jonathan Carter, who had only outdoor eligibility remaining. Picking up key points were Tim Middelkoop (second in the 800), Warrick Dunn (third in the 100) and William Shirk (third in the weight throw).

The ACC Outdoor Championships brought an improvement for the FSU women. The team improved to second place with the same four performers taking a pair of ACC crowns. Casey Custer recorded career-best times in the 100 and 200, placing

third and fourth in the finals. Also contributing to the effort was Shannon Cook, who picked a first, second and third place finish in the throws.

Phillip Riley was the lone ACC Champion on the men's side. Riley won the 110-meter hurdles and also added fifth place points in the 100-meter dash. Freshman Jody Lawrence recorded a career-best toss in the discus in a second place effort.

The 4x400-meter relay team placed second at the NCAA Indoor Championships in early March. The squad, competing in Indianapolis, were clocked at a time of 3:33.59 in the finals with LSU winning the championship in 3:32.53. Erica Shepard did double duty as she also competed in the 800-meters. Shepard earned All-America status with her seventh place finish in the event. The points helped the Lady Seminoles to a 20th place finish overall.

The women's 4x400-meter relay team continued to roll with as they finished second in the nation behind Texas at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Eugene, Oregon. The team recorded their best time of the year (3:31.18) as Yashiva Edwards overtook Florida on the anchor leg to clinch national runner-up status again for the Lady Seminoles.

Senior Jonathan Carter led the way for the FSU men as he earned All-America honors in three events. Carter placed sixth in the finals of the 100-meter dash with a time of 10.33 seconds. The six-time All-American just missed qualifying for the finals of the 200 with a time of 20.91 in the semifinals. Carter also ran on the second leg of the sixth place 400-meter relay team. Only Walter McCoy (10) has earned the All-American distinction more times than Carter (6).

Phillip Riley finished fifth overall in the 110-meter hurdles. In the semifinals, Riley recorded a career-best time of 13.39 that placed him second on the FSU all-time list behind Arthur Blake. Justin Johnston placed fifth in the javelin after finishing sixth in 1995. The men's 4x100 team of Phillip Riley, Warrick Dunn, Jonathan Carter and Byron Capers took sixth place in helping the men to a 21st place in the team standings.
