

SEMINOLES

The Florida State men's track team used 1997 as a rebuilding year after losing several key athletes from a year ago.

Young runners were asked to step in for six-time All-American sprinter Jonathan Carter and '95 NCAA 55-meter hurdle champion Phillip Riley. With an untested group in the sprints, the Seminoles counted on key points from the field events.

In the first meet of the indoor season some of the FSU men competed at the LSU Invitational while the remainder of the team went to Florida for the University Centre Hotel Invitational.
William Shirk (weight throw) and Danny Smith

(800m) recorded second place finishes in Baton

Rouge. Closer to home, a pair of freshman had impressive FSU debuts in Gainesville. Darius Jones placed third in the pole vault (14-7.25) and fifth in the long jump (23-2.75) while Todd Marine was fifth in the triple jump (46-0.50) and sixth the long jump (22-10.50).

Junior thrower Greg Jack led the way at the Wildcat Classic in Lexington, KY. Jack took first place in the shot put with a throw of 53-3.50. Germaine Stringer was second in the 200m with a time of 21.48 and Anthony Bolton clocked in at 7.97 in the 60m hurdles, also good for second place. In another split squad weekend, William Shirk won the weight throw at the Barnett Bank Invitational.

At the ACC Indoor Championships, the men placed sixth in the team standings. Jack, All-ACC captured Florida State's first ever indoor shot put title with a throw of 56-3.75. Also adding points with fourth place finishes were Warrick Dunn in the 55m dash, William Shirk in the weight throw and Todd Marine in the triple jump.

The highlight of the men's outdoor season was a second consecutive team title at the Florida Intercollegiate Championships. FSU successfully defended their "state championship" with a close victory over Miami. Jasen Ritter (steeplechase), Chris

Osborn (high jump), Brad Hess (discus), William Shirk (weight throw) and Dore Louis (javelin) paved the way with first place finishes.

place effort.

The squad improved their conference standing from the indoor season at the ACC Outdoor

Championships in Atlanta, moving up two notches to fourth place. The Seminoles had four scorers in the javelin with Justin Johnston, Greg Jack, Gabe Arola and Dore Louis placing first, third, fourth and sixth, respectively.

Senior Justin Johnston was the lone competitor for the men's team at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Bloomington, IN. Johnston attained All-America status for the third straight year in the javelin with an eighth

LADY SEMINOLES

Behind the performances of a veteran cast of athletes, the FSU women's track and field team put together an outstanding season in 1997. The '4x400 relay team continued to run impressively as they collected their third and fourth All-American distinctions over the last two years.

Senior Shannon Cook began the indoor season with a pair of first place finishes in the throws at the LSU Invitational. Cook, who was awarded ACC Performer of the Week for her efforts, won the shot put and the weight throw in Baton Rouge. Also finishing first were Maria Embon in the 400m and Erica Shepard in the 800m.

Following the ACC/SEC Challenge, the FSU women traveled to Kentucky for the Wildcat Classic. In Lexington, three individuals and the 4x400 relay team recorded NCAA provisional marks. Cook and Yashiva Edwards finished first in the shot put and the 200m dash, respectively, while Sophia Danvers placed third in the 400m.

After a tune-up at the Carolina Indoor Open, the Lady Seminoles traveled to Greensboro, NC for the ACC Indoor Championships. The squad took second in the final point standings, their highest finish since joining the conference in 1992. Leading the way were All-ACC performers Shannon Cook in the shot put along with the duo of Shepard and Rikke Ronholt in the 800m. The women stood in first place after the first day of action, highlighted by Cook's defeat of two-time champion Nicole Sims (Clemson) in the shot put for the ACC title. On the final day, FSU held on to second place with Shepard taking first in the 800m and three scorers in the weight throw (Lakeisha Mose, Cook and Laura Goens).

The women's 4x400m relay team were fourth place finishers at the NCAA Indoor Champinships in Indianapolis. The senior foursome of Danvers, Edwards, Embon and Shepard gave FSU a 28th place finish overall.

Ronholt got the outdoor season off to a fast start at the FSU Relays as she recorded two first place finishes and earned ACC Performer of the Week honors. Ronholt ran on the anchor leg of the NCAA automatic qualifying 4x400m relay team that edged LSU in an exciting finish while also winning the 400m hurdles in an NCAA provisional time.

The women placed second at the Florida Intercollegiate, held at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex for the first time in '97. Edwards, named ACC Performer of the Week, won the 200m and the 400m while Kristen Thorne (400m hurdles) and Christine Daniels (high jump) added first place points in Orlando.

At the ACC Outdoor Championships in Atlanta, the women's team again placed second in the team standings. Shepard won her fourth consecutive ACC 800m title, Sophia Danvers won the 400m and Cook took home top honors in the shot put to lead the Lady Seminoles. The 4x400m relay team of Danvers, Shepard, Marleena Crosby and Myriam Charles also finished first.

Both relay teams earned All-America status at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Bloomington, IN. The 4x100m squad, which finished seventh, consisted of Edwards, Danvers, Casey Custer and Zuzette Mullings. The 4x400m relay team (Danvers, Edwards, Ronholt and Embon) were NCAA runners-up for the second straight year as the women tied for 25th place in the overall standings.

Florida State University, in its golden anniversary as a coeducational graduate research institution, has joined the nation's elite in both academics and athletics. Located on the oldest continuous site of higher education in Florida and building rapidly on the framework of a highly regarded liberal arts college for women, the University has emerged over the past 48 years as an institution of national and international esteem.

A senior member of the 10-member State

University System, FSU was founded as an institution of higher learning in 1852 and began in Tallahassee with its first students in 1857.

Florida State continues to progress and grow—from its pre-Civil War foundation as the Seminary West of the Suwanee, through the early 20th century as the academically respected Florida State College for Women, returning to coeducational status as a university in 1947, to its modern development as an acclaimed research institution, a top-ranked competitor in intercollegiate athletics and as a standard-setter in the basic sciences and the performing arts.

Today, Florida State's operating budget is \$442 million. Faculty and administrators generate more than \$95 million annually in external funding to supplement state-sponsored research. Three direct-support organizations serve to bolster the University: the FSU Foundation, which raises millions in private gifts to support academics, the Seminole Boosters and the FSU Alumni Association.

Florida State offers 275 graduate and undergraduate degree programs thorugh its eight colleges—Arts & Sciences; Business; Communication; Education; Engineering (operating jointly with Florida A&M University); Human Sciences; Law; and Social Sciences (which also incorporates the school of Public Administration and Policy) —and eight schools—Criminology & Criminal Justice; Library & Information Studies; Motion Picture, Television & Recording Arts; Music; Nursing; Social Work; Theatre; and Visual Arts & Dance.

With 1,568 members, the FSU faculty currently includes five members of the National Academy of Sciences and eight members of the National Academy of Arts and Sciences, and has included five Nobel Laureates. It is backed by 2,987 administrative, professional, and support staff.

Library holdings at Florida State include 2.06 million book titles, 18,498 serials, and 4.25 million microforms. The main library facility, the Robert M. Strozier Library, is linked via computerized information systems to other state university and national research libraries. The Paul A.M. Dirac Science Center Library is located at the heart of the university's science research complex. FSU also maintains extensive music, library science, and law libraries, and the Mildred and Claude Pepper Library houses the personal and professional papers of one of Florida's best known political couples.

Florida State ranks first in popularity nationwide among high school seniors, based on the number of students who request their Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and American College Test (ACT) scores be sent to an institution. FSU was the only instituttion listed among the top ten choices of both black and white college bound students. Florida State is also tops in the state for community college transfers as FSU admits over 3,000 transfer students every fall semester.

In its mission of excellence in teaching, research and public service, Florida State University is advancing boldly into the 21st century.

Student Services and Academic Support

Academic, personal and professional support are essential to college success. At Florida State University, we have developed an outstanding support program which enables student-athletes to reach their full potential.

approach. At Florida State, our academic staff does not wait for academic crises to occur. We gather important background information and build an academic profile on all student-athletes to assess their needs in advance. We also stay informed on the daily progress of each student-athlete.

Our academic support staff includes a director, five counselors, and

To accomplish this goal we have developed an academic environment which facilitates the academic success of student-athletes. Student success is encouraged through competent academic counseling, career exploration, planning and placement and academic assistance through tutorial programs.

Our program operates on a "proac-

three graduate interns forming a group of professional serving the needs of all our student-athletes.

In 1994, the academic programs moved to the state-of-the-art University Center and are located on the 6th floor of the \$126,000,000 facility. It includes private study carrels, a tutorial study area and a computer lab outfitted with 16 new IBM computers and laser printers. In addition, athletic sky boxes are utilized for group and individualized tutorial instruction sessions.

Named after Florida State's first track and field head coach, the complex has attracted some of the top meets in the nation. Mike Long Track and the City of Tallahassee played host to the USA Track and Field

plex is recognized as one of the best outdoor-facilities in the South. In addition to the 1,500 seat stadium, Florida State track and field athletes have the luxury of weight training in a 3,000 square foot strength and training facility adjacent to the track. It is used exclusively by Seminole track and field team members and opened in October of 1989. The facility also houses the FSU track and field coaches' offices and offers the latest in personilized training with the use

National Junior Championships in 1988 and the AAU National Championships in 1991.

Florida State and Mike Long Track also hosted the Atlantic Coast Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships in FSU's first year in the league, 1992. The USA Track and Field National Iunior Championships returned to Mike Long Track in the

Summer of '94. The British Olympic Team, who trained in Tallahassee for the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, used the facility for all their track and field practices and workouts over the summer.

Mike Long Track has been the training facility for many national and world class athletes. As the Seminole track and field program continues to prosper, Mike Long Track will continue to host some of the top athletes, teams and meets in the sport.

head women's track coach and coordinator of both the men's and women's track/cross country teams. Following the retirement of men's coach Dick Roberts after the 1988 season, Long became the head coach of both the men's and women's teams.

As head coach and administrator of the programs, Long has continued a strong tradition of track success with 41 individuals earning allamerican honors. His teams have set 10 new school records in men's track and 12 new school records in women's track. While in the Metro Conference,

Long's men's and women's teams never lost a conference track championship. Since joining the Atlantic Coast Conference, Long has coached the men's

team to the 1995 ACC Indoor title and has been named ACC Coach of the Year and NCAA District III Coach of the Year.

During his career, Long has coached numerous outstanding athletes. Notable among those athletes are Olympians Arthur Blake, World Champion and world record holder Kim Batten, two-time gold medalist Chandra Cheeseborough, Michelle Finn, Dennis Mitchell, Tom Reither, Esmerelda Garcia, Rey Robinson, and NCAA national champions Phillip Riley, Andrea Thompson, Janet Levy and lanet Davis.

Long is extremely active in track outside of Florida State and even the state of Florida. From 1978-85, he served as co-chairman of the USA Olympic Development Sprints Committee and was very active within the Olympic Development Elite Athlete Project. In 1984, he coached the USA men's team in the first World Indoor Games held in Paris, France and has led other USA teams in international competitions held in Japan and Israel. Additionally, Long has served as head coach and assistant coach of the South Team in the USA Olympic Festival and was head coach for the Athletic Attic, Bud Light Track America and Mazda Track club teams which won six USAT&F national championships.

In 1977, Long co-founded one of the nation's premier high school post-season championship team meets at the Golden South Track Classic in Orlando, Fla. He also served as its meet director from 1977-79 and was inducted into the Golden South Hall of Fame in 1985. In 1988 and 1994, Long brought the USA National Junior Track Championships to Florida State and he also served as the meet director for the National AAU Track Championships hosted in Tallahassee in 1992.

TERRY LONG enters his 10th season as the head coach of the Florida State men's and women's track teams. Following in his father's footsteps, Long continues the tradition eighteen seasons after his father,

Mike, retired as head coach at Florida State. Terry Long has been associated with the Seminole track program since he was 13 years old, when Mike Long began his head coaching legacy at FSU in 1953.

A few years later, Long formally joined the program as a student-athlete and lettered for the Tribe for four seasons. During his career as an FSU athlete, Long set new school records in all indoor and outdoor hurdle events as well as running on school record setting 440, 880 and sprint medley relays. His senior year, he had the nation's fastest time in the 220-yard hurdles. Long completed his bachelor's degree in 1963 and his master's in 1965, both at FSU. Long began his head coaching career at Leon High School in Tallahassee before moving on to Delray Beach Atlantic High School and then Lakeland High School.

Long built his reputation as one of the nation's finest track coaches during 16 years of coaching at Seminole Community College, Sante Fe Community College and the University of Florida. While serving in the community college coaching ranks, Long produced over 200 all-americans and 56 national champions. His teams won 16 state track and cross country titles and he was named coach of the year three times. In 1982 and 1983, he guided the Sante Fe women's track team to back to back national championships. During his tenure at Seminole Community College, Long was inducted into the Florida Track Hall of Fame.

The sport of track has certainly been a tradition in the Long family. In addition to Mike Long, for whom Florida State's track facilities are named, his three sons all became coaches.

In 1985, Long rejoined Florida State as the




began in the heart of distance running country at the University of Oregon (1977-83). Irving studied under the legendary Bill Dellinger, who coached Alberto Salazar, while assisting with the women's track and field program that eventually won the NCAA outdoor title. Irving's next stint was at the University of Florida from 1983-89, where he assisted Dr. Lyle Knudson with the women's cross country program that captured the '85 SEC title and helped Beverly Kearney develop an eventual NCAA national track and field championship team. From Florida, Irving joined the University of Illinois in the fall of 1989 where he took over responsibilities as the recruiting coordinator and returned the Fighting Illini to prominence in the Big Ten Conference and on the national scene.

In his first year of coaching at FSU, the men's 4 x 800m relay team ranked fourth by *Track and Field News* with a school record 7:19 set at the 1994 Penn Relays. The distance medley relay won the conference title and helped the team to a victory at the ACC Indoor meet. The 1996 ACC Outdoor Championship was the best ever for the Seminole distance corps. They not only had the only double scorer in the 1,500m and steeplechase, but also produced FSU's first 10,000m scorer at the ACC meet. He has directed countless conference champions, over 30

time in the steeplechase.

A recipient of two master's degrees (Architectural History, Northwestern University '77 and Biomechanics/ Athletic Administration, University of Oregon '79), the 1973 Willamette University graduate places the pursuit of academic excellence as an utmost priority. Irving-coached athletes at Oregon annually dotted the dean's list. Athletes at Florida made All-SEC Academic teams 40 times. Phenomenally, in two out of only four years at Illinois he had athletes awarded the most prestigious accolade, the Big Ten Medal of Honor, for academic/athletic excellence. The FSU men's cross country team ranked sixth nationally for overall team grade point average and have won the Golden Torch Award (FSU's top team) the past two years. Following the 1997 season, both men's and women's teams earned NCAA All-Academic honors (the women's team with distinction). With a 3.27 GPA in 1996, the women's team led all ACC schools and the men were runners-up in the conference. Along with the academic success, the FSU cross country teams boasted their best recruiting classes during Irving's tenure this season.

Irving and his wife, Allyn, have been married for 25 years and have two sons, 11-year-old Shannon and Kevin, who is eight.



HARLIS MEADERS enters his fourth season on the Florida State coaching staff as the throws coach. A high school All-American in 1988, Meaders competed on the collegiate level at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill.

His collegiate track experience includes the shot put, the 35-lb. weight throw and the discus. While at UNC, Meaders was a three-time individual ACC champion and made a significant contribution to the 1992 ACC Outdoor Championship team. Meaders was also an NCAA qualifier in the discus throw and qualified for the 1992 Olympic trials. Meaders currently holds the school record in the discus at North Carolina.

Meaders came to Florida State by way of Western Carolina University, where he served as the assistant track and field coach for three years and obtained his masters degree in physical education.

While at Western Carolina, Meaders coached three Southern Conference Champions and several other all-conference athletes in the throwing events for both men and women. Meaders helped the men's and women's programs obtain their highest place finishes ever in the Southern Conference.

At Florida State, Meaders has helped the Seminoles become one of the best all-around throwing squads in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Meaders coached a pair of ACC Champions last year on both the men's and women's teams - Greg Jack (indoor shot put) and Shannon Cook (indoor & outdoor shot put). Under Meaders' guidance, FSU again hopes to have several throwers compete for conference honors.

ANDI LYONS returned to her alma mater after four years at Mississippi State University in 1997. As an assistant coach at MSU, Lyons coached hurdles and sprints along with the field events for the past four years.

The former Lady Seminole was instrumental in Mississippi State's global recruiting efforts. Lyons helped bring quality national and international talent to MSU that collectively combined to set many school records and win several conference championships.

As an assistant at Florida State, Lyons coaches sprints and relays. She will also coordinate women's recruiting while also handling all compliance matters and academics. Lyons' first recruiting class was a successful one as she brought in several of

At the '97 NCAA Outdoor Championships, Lyons coached the Lady Seminole 4x100 meter relay team that finished seventh in the nation and had several individuals qualify for the NCAA Championships. Lyons also trained FSU's senior football players and helped them prepare for the NFL draft She is the lead instructor at both the Florida State Track & Field Camp for sprints and hurdles and Camp Celebration Walt Disney World for sprints and jump events during the summer. Lyons is a SAQ (speed, agility, quickness) clinician at the NCAA Women's Final Four earlier this year and has also spoken at several symposiums on the SAQ program. She was the lead instructor at the Louisiana Track & Field Coaches Association. In addition, Lyons has instructed certification classes for Level I Track & Field Coaches.

Lyons earned All-America honors as a part of the 4x100 meter relay team in 1991 and '92. Her name is listed in the top ten as a member of both the 4x100 and 4x400 meter relay teams in the women's all-time performance list.

A dean's list student at FSU, Lyons received her bachelor's degree in communication in 1993. More recently, the 27-year old Ohio native earned her master's degree in sports administration from Mississippi State in '96.

Entering his 12th year with the Florida State track and field staff, **DENNIS NOBLES** is recognized as one of the top coaches in the country. Nobles graduated cum laude from Florida State's School of Physical Education while also starring on the FSU track team as a pole vaulter from 1979-81. He went on to obtain his master's degree from FSU in Exercise Physiology in 1983 and is currently an instructor with.

Following graduation from Florida State, he began his coaching career at Wayland Baptist College, an NAIA track powerhouse in Plainview, Texas.

While at Wayland Baptist College, he coached 17 All-Americans, two national champions, a pair of Olympic qualifiers and a national record holder. He also led the school to a national championship and two-runner up finishes. He returned to his alma mater in 1985 to accept a position as assistant coach. Nobles has since coached several All-Americans, another Olympian and a world record holder. He is currently working towards his Ph.D in Athletic Administration.

His duties at FSU include coaching athletes in the javelin, high jump, long jump, triple jump and pole vault events. Last season, Justin Johnston earned All-America status in the javelin for the third straight year under Nobles' guidance. In recent years, Nobles has been invited to participate in the elite women's javelin clinic in Long Beach, California.

JIM LONG brings a lengthy track background to his 22nd season with the Florida State program.

A former Seminole sprinter and son of former FSU head coach Mike Long, Jim came back to his alma mater in 1975 as an assistant coach. His return followed a successful stint as head track coach at Leon High School in Tallahassee. He has served as a clinician at the U.S. Olympic Development camp in Orlando, joining brothers Terry, head coach at Florida State and Curtis, his Western Kentucky mentor. Long was inducted into the Florida Track Hall of Fame in 1991.

During his years on the Florida State staff, Long has coached numerous NCAA All-Americans. One former All-American decathlete, Rohn Stark, became the NFL's all-time leader in punt yardage in 1996. Long has also coached two Olympic hurdlers in Kim McKenzie and Arthur Blake.

He and his wife Janis have two sons; Justin 21 and Jarrett 18.

KIM BATTEN Volunteer Assistant Coach Florida State '91

During her four years at Florida State, **KIM BATTEN** established herself as one of the finest track athletes in school history. As she has done in the past, Batten will assist head coach Terry Long with the 1998 team while she continues her training in Tallahassee.

Batten starred in multiple events for the Lady Seminoles including the long jump, triple jump, and the 100, 200 and 400-meter dashes. The nine-time All-American's top events were the 100 and 400-meter hurdles and she advanced to the NCAA Championships in each of her four years. Batten was named the Metro Conference's Most Outstanding Female Athlete in each of FSU's last three years in the league.

As a professional, Batten has recorded some of the greatest honors achievable on the world track and field circuit. She set the world record in the 400-meter hurdles with a mark of 52.61 at the 1995 World Championships in Goteburg, Sweden. In February of '96, Batten received the ESPY Award for Women's Track and Field Performer of

the Year. At the '96 Olympics in Atlanta, the FSU graduate won the silver medal in the 400-meter hurdles.

The men's track and field team is comprised of several athletes who will play key roles in determining the success of the 1998 team. With the loss of two All-Americans, Warrick Dunn in the sprints and Justin Johnston in the javelin, it is time for some new faces to take over in those events.

In the field events, Darius Jones enters his sophomore year as one of the team's best in the pole vault, high jump and long jump. Jones' versatility will help the Seminole men pick up conference points in multiple events.

"Darius has really trained well and I think he is going to be an outstanding athlete for us," said head coach Terry Long. "Ultimately. He is going to become a quality decathlete."

Along with Jones in the high jump, Chris Osborn returns for his senior season with plenty of experience. Osborn took third at the ACC Outdoors last season in the event.

Jody Lawrence will lead the way in the throws as he aims to qualify for the NCAAs in the discus after a redshirt season in '97. Lawrence will also throw the shot put, weight and hammer. Brad Hess is an ACC scorer in the discus and will be able to throw the shot this year after a wrist injury held him back last season. William Shirk is

another thrower with conference scoring experience and will compete primarily in the weight and hammer. Donald Heaven, a starting offensive guard on the football team, will throw the shot and discus after scoring at ACC Indoors as a freshman last year.

"There is a good likelihood we will redshirt Greg Jack (ACC Indoor shot put champion) this year," said Long. "He has a chance to do some things with the Canadian Olympic team during the indoor season so will probably bring him back next season."

The loss of three-time All-American Justin Johnston will be felt in the javelin, but the coaching staff is confident senior Dore Louis will be able to ease the loss.

"Dore was fifth in the conference a year ago in the javelin even though he pulled a hamstring earlier in the decathlon," said Long. "He will have to step up and fill the void for us."


Freshman Jason Dean, a Junior Olympic and state champion, starts his career in the pole vault for the Seminoles. Coaches expect Dean to make an immediate impact in the event.

In the sprints, the Seminoles have a huge slot to fill with the loss of All-American Warrick Dunn.

"I don't know how we are going to replace Warrick Dunn," said Long. "Everybody struggles when they lose one of their All-Americans, especially a real strong leader like Warrick. He was outstanding indoors and outdoors for us."

Patrick Hayes is the top returnee in the sprints and lead candidate to step in as the No. 1 sprinter for Dunn. He is coming off a redshirt year (hamstring injury) and is a former NCAA qualifier. Antonio Smith and Kenyun Langston both enter their sophomore year in the longer sprints. A pair of freshmen in Tavaris Spradley and Jayson Jones have shown signs of being able to contribute immediately in the sprints.

"It will be interesting to see what happens in the sprint areas," said Long.



"It is wide open and we will need some people to step it up. Travis Minor and Germaine Stringer will come over from football and they will be in the mix as well."

The hurdles are strong at the top with Anthony Bolton in the 110m and



Reggie Glover in the 400m. Both have proven they can handle high level competition and both are possible NCAA qualifiers as they enter their junior years. However, after Bolton and Glover, there is a significant drop-off.

Darius Jones and Dore Louis are available on a limited basis in the 110m hurdles as multi-event decathletes.

In the middle distances, Coach Long believes Danny Smith has a chance at a conference title and an NCAA qualifying mark in the 800m. Jeremiah Hunt, Nafthaly Kurgat and Wade Brett will give the Seminoles possible scoring behind Smith.

The 1500m group will be stronger with the cross country trio of David Ogletree, Michael Maier and Aaron Scheer.

"Maier and Ogletree are excellent steeplechasers and we will see them in that event as well," said Long. "Scheer ran No. 1 in cross country so he could help us in the 3K and the 5K."

Senior Joe Simolari will also run the steeplechase and possibly the 3K and 5K in his final year of eligibility. Brad Shriver should contribute in the longer distance events as well after a solid cross country season.

"I think this team has the opportunity to improve in the conference (sixth - indoor, fourth - outdoor) if our top athletes respond and we get some production from the newcomers," said Long. "We have several guys going for NCAA marks so hopefully that will push some of the younger guys to reach their potential."




PHILLIP RILEY




Ken Lanier holds the second longest shot put in FSU history. A second-team AP All-American for the Seminoles at offensive tackle, Lanier



PREVIEW

The term "rebuilding year" defines the 1998 women's track and field team. A talented recruiting class will be called on to replace five All-Americans and a handful of conference scorers.

"The women's team faces the largest mass graduation of quality athletes since the national championship team in 1984," said head coach Terry Long. "We really are rebuilding in all areas of the program, but we did bring in an outstanding group of freshmen and I think they could become one of the strongest groups we've had."

In the sprints, All-American Zuzette Mullings returns in the 100m, 200m and the 4x100m relay. Tonya Carter is an NCAA qualifier (4x100m) and will compete in the same sprint events.

"Zuzette and Tonya have both sprinted well and appear to be the front-runners starting out," said Long. "Filling in behind them will be hight school All-American Teresa Bundy, and Jennifer Mayhue and Tangela Wobbleton who will both run the 400m as well. Sophomore Philadelphia native Ayana Townsend, will compete in both hurdle events. Aysha House, Danielle Riley and Melanie Black return off redshirt years to give the Lady Seminoles a deep and talented group.

In the middle distances, Ronholt will run the 800m along with Marleena Crosby and Nicole Singleton. Sophomore Diana Hartnup joins Singleton in the 1500m along with freshman Cynthia Campbell.

"Campbell will eventually be our top 5K runner as well," said Long. "Natalie Reid is another freshman who has adapted well after spending the fall with the cross country team and should be able to help us there."

Mullings and Cannon return as the top jumpers and will be backed up by Terita Norton, Christa King and Johnson.

"It looks like Zuzette (Mullings) could qualify for nationals in the sprints and the jumps," said Long. "I also wouldn't be at all surprised if Chinette (Johnson) did also. She shows an awful lot of talent. Over-

all, the long and triple jumps are very solid."

Senior Christine Daniels is the top returnee in the high jump and is expected to compete for conference honors as a spot as a NCAA qualifier. The twin sister combination of Michaela and Shannon Steele will push Daniels as they enter their sophomore seasons. Shannon also throws the javelin and is the lone returnee in that event.

The pole vault will see its first season of action in '98 and the coaching staff will work with Lindsay Adkins and King in the new event.

With the graduation of Shannon Cook and the late transfer of Andrea Pappas, Lakeisha Mose comes back as the only thrower with any significant experience. Mose will compete in all the throws along with several untested freshmen.

"With all the losses, the women are a major rebuilding program," said Long. "You aren't normally going to lose a dozen athletes in a year. We will have to be a little stronger in areas we haven't been in the past. I think the distance runners will have to pick up the slack, where in the past maybe it was the sprinters, throwers and jumpers who have picked it up. We will have some long days out there, but the talent nucleus is there for the future."








climate and lifestyle. Accentuating Tallahassee's Southern persona are lush rolling hills, liken to the seven hills of Rome, and five "official" canopy roads of patriarch oaks. The fertile, rich soil and four distinct, yet pleasant, seasons breed floral brilliance and natural vitality year-round. Like the city itself, the story of

TALLAHASSEE

Near, but far from the glaring strips of neon amusement, and the castles and crowds of Disney, lies another magical place in the Sunshine State - one of powwows, plantations, politics and great pride. Often described as "The Other Florida" with its deep-rooted history, rolling hills, canopy roads of mass-draped oaks, cool climate and Southern-style hospitality; it is a Florida few have seen. It is Tallahassee -Florida with a Southern accent. Best known as Florida's capital, Tallahassee is an intimate neo-metropolitan city where the power of state government, the academic and the artistic are complemented by subtle, old-fashioned charm. It is the perfect two- or three-day diversion for the more than 41 million annual visitors to Florida and 13 million residents. Tallahassee touts a menagerie of sights including one of the world's deepest freshwater springs, site of America's first Christmas, a wildlife habitat, Capitol buildings, fascinating museums of history, sprawling plantations, highly acclaimed fishing and hunting adventures and nearby beaches. Spirited area festivals range from celebrations of Tallahassee's spectacular spring and swamp stomps to genuine rattlesnake roundups and seafood festivals. With the Gulf of Mexico just 20 miles south and the Georgia border only 14 miles north, Tallahassee rests between the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains and the juncture of Florida's panhandle and peninsula. Nearer in miles to Atlanta than to Miami, Tallahassee more closely resembles its Southern neighbors than Florida in topography,

how Tallahassee was chosen as the state capital is rich in history. In 1823, two explorers set out – one on horseback from St. Augustine and the other by boat from Pensacola – to find a permanent, central



location for the Legislature to convene. The two met at a beautiful site that the Creek and Seminole Indians called tallahassee - derived from the words talwa (meaning town) and ahasee (meaning old). The rendezvous point remains Florida's capital. The "old town" has undergone many changes, but one thing remains the same – it is still a government town fiercely proud and dedicated to preserving its heritage. The Capitol buildings, both old and new, epitomize Tallahassee's perseverance. The 22nd floor of the New Capitol provides a panoramic scope of a sophisticated Southern city awash in a sea of flowering azaleas, snowy dogwoods, towering pines, fragrant magnolias, and hundreds of shimmering lakes, springs, swamps, rivers and sink holes. Special legislative viewing galleries are open during the legislative session. Below, in the shade of giant live oaks, proudly stands the Old Capitol, originally constructed in 1845 and restored to its 1902 splendor complete with





red-and-white candy-striped awnings, a dome adorned with stained glass, antique furnishings and political memorabilia. Across from the Old Capitol are the 40-foot twin granite towers of the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial, and the blue stone Union Bank, Florida's oldest surviving financial institution. The nostalgic Old Town Trolley, a replica of the turn-of-thecentury street car, carries passengers through restored Adams Street Commons to numerous other historical downtown shops for free - unheard of even 100 years ago. Minutes from downtown lies the governor's Mansion, which resembles the home of Florida's military hero Andrew Jackson; and the 52-acre natural animal habitat and 1880's farm of the Tallahassee Museum of History and Natural Science, which provide the rare chance to walk and talk with native Florida animals. Tallahassee remains firmly linked with the past as evidenced by the unearthed 1539 winter encampment of Spanish Hernando de Soto, the site of the first Christmas celebration in America. Visitors travel back through time as they stand in the shadow of a giant 12,000-yearold American Mastodon at the Museum of Florida History or explore other historical spots including The Knott House that Rhymes, The Columns, San Luis Mission, Lake Jackson State Archaeological Site, Natural Bridge Battlefield, First Presbyterian Church, Brokaw-McDougall House,

Goodwood Plantation and Adams Street Commons. Nearby, alligators lazing in the sunshine and anhinga "snake birds" perched on twisted cypress branches are seen at Wakulla Springs, one of the world's deepest freshwater springs and site of many underwater scenes in the "Tarzan" movies with Johnny Weissmuller and Maureen O'Sullivan. Safaris aboard glass-bottomed and jungle cruise boats whisk visitors within arm's length of "The Other Florida." Outdoor enthusiasts enjoy adventures including boating and fishing on area lakes, rivers, ponds and the Gulf – just 30 minutes away. Lakes Seminole, Jackson and Talquin are renowned in the bass fishing world for yielding the "big ones." And dense forest offer an abundance of prize-winning game. Local wildlife areas such as the Florida National Scenic Trail, St. Marks National Wildlife Refuge and Apalachicola National Forest are among many spots for camping, picnicking, swimming, biking and exploring. Appealing to the strokes of different folks, Tallahassee also features 99 holes of golf on six courses and a proliferation of tennis centers. Sideline athletes cheer the national-ranked college teams of Florida State Seminoles, Florida A&M Rattlers and Tallahassee Community College Eagles along with the area's professional teams; the Tallahassee Tiger Sharks of the East Coast Hockey League and the Tallahassee Scorpions' indoor soccer team. And always a sure bet are the nearby greyhound races. A sport of sorts, shopping at two regional malls and many specialty centers offer many "playing options" - from popular chains to curiosity and antique shops. Tallahassee is teeming with entertainment from stadium seating in its multiplex cinemas to live theatre, Jazz- and Shakespere-in-the-Park, poetry reading in coffee houses and eating establishments that cater to the broadest range of cultural palettes. Cultural interests are further sparked by widely-acclaimed museums and galleries and more elaborate entertainment at the 14,000-seat Tallahassee-Leon County Civic Center. Tallahassee is a collaboration of power-play politics and classical character splashed with a twist of Southern beauty and charm. Tallahassee is Florida with a Southern accent.
