
NOTE TO THE MEDIA

Indoor

The men's and women's track teams kicked off the 1999 indoor season at the Florida Intercollegiates in Gainesville. The men's team started the season off right with several first place finishers. Darius Jones (long jump), Joseph Lawrence (weight throw), and lain Harnden (200m) all took home first place while Jason Dean (pole vault), Mario Lowe (triple jump), and the 4x400m men's relay team all added second place efforts. Tonya Carter led the way for the Lady Seminoles in the season opener with a second place finish in the 55m with Shannon Steele (high jump) and true freshman Makiba Batten (shot put) contributing third place finishes for the

collegiate best in the pole vault while Samantha George ran the fastest 400m time in the ACC. George joined Ayana Townsend, Laura Gerber, and Fiona Norwood on the 4x400m relay team that also qualified for the NCAA Indoor Championships.

The ACC Indoors resulted in fourth place finishes for both the men's and women's teams. Dean continued to impress by taking home the ACC pole vault title. Darius Iones contributed in a multitude of ways by finishing first in the long jump, fifth in the pole vault, and seventh in the triple jump. Lawrence continued to shatter records by placing first in the weight throw with a new ACC record in the event. Freshman Lowe was impressive as well as he triple jumped an NCAA

Outdoor

The men's and women's teams started the outdoor season on the right foot with a strong showing at the FAMU Relays. First place finishers included Jason Dean (pole vault), Zyris Hill (long jump), Joseph Lawrence (discus), Chinette Johnson (triple jump), Shannon Steele (javelin), and Ayana Townsend (400m hurdles). In addition to the sound individual showings, the relay teams turned in strong performances as well with the men's and women's sprint medleys, and the women's distance medley all taking home first place.

The Seminoles next played host to more than 50

Lady Seminoles by taking home first place in their events. Nakeya Crutchfield (100m), Michaela Steele (high jump), Shelby Cannon (long jump), and Tonya Carter (100m) all turned in top five finishes for the women. On the men's side, Aaron Scheer finished first in the 1500m event while Darius Jones took home the pole vault title, recording the tenth best of all time by a Seminole competitor. Lowe (triple jump), Bland (high jump), Lawrence (hammer), and Danny Smith (800m) all finished in the top 10.

The men's and women's track teams split up the following weekend with select athletes going to the Texas Relays and others competing in the Jacksonville Invitational.

The Seminoles returned to Gainesville the following week for the Florida Invitational where Batten continued to impress in only her second collegiate meet by winning the women's shot put event. Lawrence paced the men by taking home the title in the men's weight throw. Their success paved the way for seven other Seminole competitors who finished the day among the top three in their respective events.

Next up for the Seminoles was the annual ACC/SEC Challenge where both teams finished in sixth place. Carter highlighted the day by placing first in the 55m with a personal best time of 6.91. On the men's side, Lowe placed first in the triple jump while Lawrence maintained his position as conference leader in the weight throw by breaking his old FSU record with a NCAA provisional qualifying mark. Five other Seminoles contributed with top three finishes.

At the lowa State Invitational, two more Seminoles recorded NCAA provisional qualifying marks. Dean established a new personal

provisional 51-5 to earn All-ACC honors.

On the women's side, true freshman Laura Gerber and the 4x400m relay team took home ACC titles. Carter had a strong showing as well by finishing second in the 60m and third in the 200m. Newcomers Batten and George both turned in second place efforts for the Lady Seminoles.

Carter was the highlight of the USA Indoor Track and Field Championship by making it to the semifinals of the 60m. Although she did not advance to the finals, she managed to hold her own against some of the best competition in the country including Olympian Gail Devers. The women's 4x400m relay team of Gerber, George, Johnson, and Norwood placed eleventh overall with a season best time. ACC Champion Lawrence finished fifteenth in the men's weight

Dean, Jones, Lowe, Lawrence, Carter, George, Gerber, Johnson, Norwood, and Batten were all named to the ALL-ACC team for their efforts during the indoor season. teams from across the country at the FSU Relays. The Lady Noles had several top finishers with Townsend (400m hurdles), the 4x100 relay team, and the sprint medley unit all placing first. Zuzette Mullings NCAA provisional mark in the long jump event earned her a first place finish and a spot in the FSU record books with the sixth best showing by a Lady Seminole and ACC Track Athlete of the Week honors for her efforts at the FSU Relays. The men fared well also with Steve Augustine (400m hurdles), Christian Bland (high jump), and Mario Lowe (triple jump) all won their events for the men. Lawrence's first place finish in the discus event was the second best performance in Seminole history. Darius Jones point total of 7,269 in the decathlon was good enough to earn him an NCAA provisional qualifying mark and a place in FSÚ history with the second best effort by a Seminole.

Next up for the Seminoles was a trip down to Gainesville for the Florida Relays. Laura Gerber (800m) and Samantha George (400m) led the way for the Lowe paced the Seminoles in Austin by recording an NCAA provisional mark in the triple jump, the fourth best in FSU history. Mullings was the top Lady Seminole competitor with a fourth place showing in the long jump in Austin. FSU picked up eight first place finishes at the Jacksonville Invitational with Dana Glover (800m), Shannon Steele (high jump), Taressa Davis (triple jump), Terita Norton (long jump), Chris Williams (long jump), Todd Crannell (pole vault), Marcus Odom (long jump), and the men's 4x400m relay team all finishing on top for the garnet and gold.

The Seminoles continued their season at the South Florida Invitational. With the women placing first overall and the men finishing second. The women were led by a pair of two event winners in Makiba Batten (shot put and discus) and Chinette Johnson (long jump and triple jump). Batten's efforts rewrote the FSU record books with her discus throw going down as second best all time and her shot put effort placing sixth. George had an impressive outing as well by recording an NCAA automatic qualifying time in the 400m. Michaela

Steele (high jump), Gerber (800m), Sara White (hammer), and Lindsay Adkins-Osborn (pole vault) all contributed first place points for the Lady Noles. Lawrence was the top performer for the men as he won both the discus and the hammer. He continued his assault on the FSU record books with his second best all time effort in the hammer event. Augustine (400m), Byron Taylor (400m hurdles), Bland (high jump), and Jason Dean (pole vault) all finished first in their events.

The Seminoles had several conference champions at the ACC Outdoors. George continued her dominance in the 400m event with a first place finish as Gerber took home first in the 800m while Johnson won the heptathlon competition. The women's

outing by recording a second place finish in the long jump and a third place effort in the 100m hurdles. On the men's side, Tavaris Spradley recorded season best times in the 100m and 200m events. Greg Jack won the javelin competition while Hill (400m), Bland (high jump), and Dean (pole vault) placed second in their respective events. The men's 4x100m relay team placed third at the meet.

The Seminole Twilight meet was a success for the Seminoles. The competition was highlighted by first place efforts from Townsend (100m hurdles), Johnson (400m), and Dean (pole vault). Batten crushed her previous Seminole bests in the throws by recording the second best mark in the discus and the

4x400m relay team claimed the conference crown while Shannon Steele placed second in the javelin event. Townsend picked up an NCAA provisional mark for her efforts in the 100m hurdles with Carter, Crutchfield, and Mullings finished second, third, and fourth respectively in the 100m event. Carter's time tied for fourth best all time in Seminole history while Crutchfield's mark went down as tenth best. Zyris Hill highlighted the men's efforts by claiming an ACC title in the long jump with the fifth best in Seminole history. The men's 4x400m relay team also took home a conference title and Lawrence had a strong showing with a second place effort in the discus and hammer events.

The Seminoles picked up several NCAA provisional marks at the University of Florida, Fresno State, and Illinois quad meet. Carter led the way with a first place finish in the 200m event, which was the tenth best time in Seminole history. The 4x400m relay team also picked up an NCAA provisional mark for their second place finish at the meet. Johnson had an impressive


sixth best effort in the shot put. Sara White's effort in the hammer event was the second best all time performance by a Seminole while Michaela Steele's high jump mark was good enough for sixth all time in Nole history. Hill and Mike Jennings ran the two fastest times by Seminoles in the 1999 season in the 400m dash. The men's 4x400m relay team also set their best time of the season with a second place finish in the event.

Five athletes represented Florida State at the NCAA Track and Field Championships. George advanced to the semifinals of the 400m dash competition, but failed to advance to the finals, finishing with the 13th fastest time of the final 18 competitors. The women's 4x400m relay team composed of Fiona Norwood, Townsend, Tangela Wobbleton, and Gerber finished in seventh place in their heat and failed to qualify for the finals.

FSU'S MIKE ONG TRACK

Mike Long Track will serve as the home of the Florida State track and field team for the 45th year with the start of the 2000 season. In its existence, the complex has grown and seen the Seminole track and field program rise to national prominence.

The Mike Long Track complex is recognized as one of the best outdoor facilities in the South. In addition to the



1,500 seat stadium, Florida State track and field athletes have the luxury of weight training in a 3,000 square foot strength and training facility adjacent to the track. It is used exclusively by Seminole track and field team members and features a variety of equipment for year-round strength conditioning. The facility also houses the FSU track and field coaches' offices and offers the latest in personilized training with the use of video cameras and a 48-inch television that allows athletes to review their technique.

Named after Mike Long, who is known as the father of Florida State track and field, the complex has attracted some of the top meets in the nation. Mike Long Track and the City of Tallahassee played host to the USA Track and Field National Junior Championships in 1988 and the AAU National Championships in 1991. Florida State and Mike Long Track also hosted the Atlantic Coast Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships in FSU's first year in the league, 1992. The USA Track and Field National Junior Championships returned to Mike Long Track in the Summer of '94. The British Olympic Team, who trained in Tallahassee for the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, used the facility for all their track and field practices and workouts over the summer. Each season, the school hosts several outdoor meets including the nationally known FSU Relays and last year, the Florida Intercollegiate Championships.





In his 21st season at Florida State, Terry Long begins his 12th in the role as the head coach of the Florida State men's and women's track teams. Following in his father's footsteps, Long continues the tradition nineteen seasons after his father, Mike, retired as head coach at Florida State. Terry Long has been associated with the Seminole track program since he was 13 years old, when Mike Long began his head coaching legacy at FSU in 1953.

A few years later, Long formally joined the program as a student-athlete and lettered for the Tribe for four seasons. During his career as an FSU athlete, Long set new school records in all indoor and outdoor hurdle events as well as running on school

The sport of track has certainly been a tradition in the Long family. In addition to FSU Hall of Fame member Mike Long, for whom school's track facilities are named, his three sons all became coaches.

In 1985, Long rejoined Florida State as the head women's track coach and coordinator of both the men's and women's track/ cross country teams. Following the retirement of men's coach Dick Roberts after the 1988 season, Long became the head coach of both the men's and women's teams.

As head coach and administrator of the programs, Long has continued a strong tradition of track success with 41 individuals

even the state of Florida. From 1978-85, he served as co-chairman of the USA Olympic Development Sprints Committee and was very active within the Olympic Development Elite Athlete Project. In 1984, he coached the USA men's team in the first World Indoor Games held in Paris, France and has led other USA teams in international competitions held in Japan and Israel. Additionally, Long has served as head coach and assistant coach of the South Team in the USA Olympic Festival and was head coach for the Athletic Attic, Bud Light Track America and Mazda Track club teams which won six USAT&F national championships.

Long completed his bachelor's degree in 1963 and his master's in 1965, both at FSU. Long began his head coaching career at Leon High School in Tallahassee before moving on to Delray Beach Atlantic High School and then Lakeland High School.


Long built his reputation as one of the nation's finest track coaches during 16 years of coaching at Seminole Community College, Sante Fe Community College and the University of Florida. While serving in the community college coaching ranks, Long produced over 200 allamericans and 56 national champions. His teams won 16 state track and cross country titles and he was named coach of the year three times. In 1982 and 1983, he guided the Sante Fe women's track team to back to back national championships. During his tenure at Seminole Community College, Long was inducted into the Florida Track Hall of Fame.

earning all-american honors. His athletes have set 11 new school records in men's track and 13 new school records in women's track. While in the Metro Conference, Long's men's and women's teams never lost a conference track championship. Since joining the Atlantic Coast Conference, Long has coached the men's team to the 1995 ACC Indoor title and has been named ACC Coach of the Year and NCAA District III Coach of the Year.


During his career, Long has coached numerous outstanding athletes. Notable among those athletes are Olympians Arthur Blake, World Champion and world record holder Kim Batten, two-time gold medalist Chandra Cheeseborough, Michelle Finn, Dennis Mitchell, Tom Reither, Esmerelda Garcia, Rey Robinson, and NCAA national champions Phillip Riley, Andrea Thompson, Janet Levy and Janet Davis.

Long has been extremely active in track outside of Florida State and

In 1977, Long cofounded one of the nation's premier high school postseason championship team meets at the Golden South Track Classic in Orlando, Fla. He also served as its meet director from 1977-79 and was inducted into the Golden South Hall of Fame in 1985. In 1988 and 1994, Long brought the USA National **Junior Track Championships** to Florida State and he also served as the meet director for the National AAU Track Championships hosted in Tallahassee in 1992.

Entering his 13th year with the Florida State track and field staff, Dennis Nobles is recognized as one of the top coaches in the country. Nobles graduated cum laude from Florida State's School of Physical Education while also starring on the FSU track team as a pole vaulter from 1979-81. He went on to obtain his master's degree from FSU in Exercise Physiology in 1983 and is currently an instructor with the FSU P.E. Department.

Following graduation from Florida State, he began his coaching career at Wayland Baptist College, an NAIA track powerhouse in Plainview, Texas.

While at Wayland Baptist College, he coached 17 All-Americans, two national champions, a pair of Olympic





Jim Long brings a lengthy track background to his 24th season with the Florida State program.

A former Seminole sprinter and son of former FSU head coach Mike Long, Jim came back to his alma mater in 1975 as an assistant coach. His return followed a successful stint as head track coach at Leon High School in Tallahassee. He has served as a clinician at the U.S. Olympic Development camp in Orlando, joining brothers Terry, head coach at Florida State and Curtis, his Western Kentucky mentor. Long was inducted into the Florida Track Hall of Fame in 1991.

During his years on the Florida State staff, Long has coached numerous NCAA All-Americans. One former All-American decathlete, Rohn Stark, became the NFL's all-time leader in punt yardage in 1996. Long has also coached two Olympic hurdlers in Kim McKenzie and Arthur Blake.



qualifiers and a national record holder. He also led the school to a national championship and two-runner up finishes. He returned to his alma mater in 1985 to accept a position as assistant coach. Nobles has since coached several All-Americans, another Olympian and a world record holder at Florida State. He is currently working towards his Ph.D in Athletic Administration.

His multi-event duties at FSU include coaching athletes in the javelin, high jump, long jump, triple jump and pole vault events. Last year, Nobles coached Chinette Johnson and Jason Dean to ACC titles in the heptathlon and pole vault respectively. He also guided Darious Jones to the indoor long jump title and Zyris Hill to the outdoor long jump crown. In 1997, Justin Johnston earned All-America status in the javelin for the third straight season under Nobles' guidance. In recent years, Nobles has been invited to participate in the elite women's javelin clinic in Long Beach, California.

Nobles is the proud parent of a daughter, Sally, age 15.




Harlis Meaders enters his sixth season on the Florida State coaching staff as the throws coach. A high school All-American in 1988, Meaders competed on the collegiate level at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill.

His collegiate track experience includes the shot put, the 35-lb. weight throw and the discus. While at UNC, Meaders was a threetime individual ACC champion and key member oft the 1992 ACC Outdoor Championship team. Meaders was also an NCAA qualifier in the discus throw and qualified for the 1992 Olympic trials. He holds the school record in the discus at North Carolina.

Meaders came to Florida State by way of Western Carolina University, where he served as the assistant track and field coach for three years and obtained his masters degree in physical education.

While at Western Carolina, Meaders coached three Southern Conference Champions and several other all-conference athletes in the throwing events for both men and women. Meaders

Batten will work with the sprinters and hurdlers under the watchful eye of longtime FSU track and field head coach Terry Long.


During her four years at Florida State, Kim Batten established herself as one of the finest track athletes in school history. Batten starred in multiple events for the Lady Seminoles including the long jump, triple jump, and the 100, 200 and 400-meter dashes. The nine-time All-American's top events were the 100 and 400-meter hurdles and she advanced to the NCAA Championships in each of her four years. Batten was named the Metro Conference's Most Outstanding Female Athlete in each of FSU's last three years in the league.

As a professional, Batten recorded some of the greatest honors achievable on the world track and field circuit. She set the world record in the 400-meter hurdles with a mark of 52.61 at the 1995

won the silver medal in the 400-meter hurdles.

Batten's name still fills the Florida State record book. She is the school record holder in the 100m hurdles, 400m intermediate hurdles and 55m intermediate hurdles. In the summer of 1998, Batten was elected into the FSU Hall of Fame.

ASST. DISTANCE COACH Paul Spangler (Alabama '98)



Paul Spangler begins his second season as the assistant coach for the men's and women's cross country and distance teams in 1999-2000.

Spangler came to Florida State after an accomplished four-year career at the University of Alabama. At FSU, he has assisted in the coaching of all distance runners while also handling the recruiting responsibilities for the women's program.

This former Seminole great set FSU records in four events during his career, the high hurdles, broad jump, 100-yard dash and 220-yard low hurdles. Bowman (pictured in uniform below, right) was a multi-talented athlete who competed in the high and low hurdles, broad jump, 100-yard and 200-yard dash, high jump, shot put and javelin. His season point record stood for over 25 years as did his single meet scoring record of 28 points against Howard College on May 13, 1950.

In the spring of 2000, Bowman will be a candidate to be inducted into the FSU Hall of Fame. He will be forever remembered as the first Seminole to ever win a sprint race as well as the first Seminole to ever win in the low hurdles. Bowman graduated from Florida State University in 1950 along with Bill Duncan and team captain Brick Bradford, who were all close friends and members of the first great FSU track and field team.



Warrick Dunn


