THE ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE

C

onsistency. It's the mark of true excellence in any endeavor. However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 42nd year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed a reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, Atlantic Coast Conference schools have captured 52 NCAA and AIAW championships, including 29 in men's competition and 23 in women's. In addition, 87 men and 22 women have earned the coveted title of NCAA champion.

The conference had an immediate impact on the national college football scene in the fall of 1953 when the University of Maryland captures the first of what is now four national football championships for the ACC.

Over the past 13 years, the ACC has captured more national football titles (three) than any other conference. The Big Eight is second with two, followed by the PAC-10, Western Athletic and the Southeastern with one each. Clemson laid claim to the league's second national title in 1981, Georgia Tech followed suit in 1990 while Florida State pocketed national title No. 4 a year ago.

If success is best measured in terms of wins and losses, then the ACC is unrivaled in NCAA history. The men and women's basketball program have combined for 13 consecutive trips to the Final Four, and 34 appearances overall. Following North Carolina's women's national championship season of 1994, the first ever for the league, ACC teams have claimed eight titles while

finishing second on ten occasions.

The league's women's basketball program ranks among the best in the country in terms of overall NCAA Tournament records. With 58 wins in 49 appearances, the conference is listed second best in total wins and total appearances.

On the men's side, North Carolina, the nation's all-time winningest team with 1,598 wins, has won NCAA championships in 1957, 1982 and 1993. N.C. State walked away with the coveted crown in 1974 and 1983, while Duke won back-to-back titles in 1991 and 1992.

Over the years, ACC basketball teams have gained global recognition through their NCAA Tournament exposure. More than 155 regular season games, plus all of the men's conference tournament and the semifinals and finals of the women's tournaments will be televised. Conference teams will be seen on all three major networks, ESPN and the Prime Network.

ACC basketball is more than numbers through. The faces behind the men's and women's programs account for 22 national player of the year honors and nine national coach of the year awards, including Dawn Staley's player recognition in 1991 and 1992, and coach's distinction for Maryland's Chris Weller (1992), Virginia's Debbie Ryan (1991) and N.C. State's Kay Yow (1990). The ACC has produced 14 first-team All-Americans, 29 Olympians, including coaches and players. N.C. State's Yow headed up the 1988 gold-winning Olympic team, assisted by Sylvia Hatchell of North Carolina. Maryland's Vicky Bullet was a member of the 1988 and 1992 Olympic teams.

The ACC also stands at the forefront of intercollegiate athletics in terms of academic accomplishments of its student athletes. That accomplishment is nowhere better reflected than in the CFA Academic Achievement Award, given annually to the CFA member institution with the highest graduation rate among members of its football team. Eight times over the past 14 years, an ACC member school has claimed the award.

This past year, Duke University captured the coveted award for the second straight year and sixth time

overall. In addition, the ACC had six of the 20 CFA members who reported graduation rates of 70 percent or better.

Since 1983, 150 women's basketball players have received ACC Honor Roll recognition. The 1993-94 academic year included 22 selections. In addition, ACC basketball players have earned first-team Academic All-America honors 47 times.

THE 1993-94 SEASON IN REVIEW

The 1993-94 academic year will be remembered as one of the best in the 41 year history of the ACC. Conference teams have captured five national titles and participated in the national title game in four other sports. In all, the ACC has won 18 national team crowns in the last four years.

The 1993-94 national champions from the ACC were Florida State in football, Virginia in men's soccer, North Carolina in both women's soccer and women's basketball, and Maryland in field hockey.

The four NCAA runners-up were Duke in men's basketball, Virginia in men's lacrosse, Maryland in women's lacrosse and Georgia Tech in baseball. Overall, ACC teams were 65-39-1 (.623) in NCAA Tournament play.

Overall the ACC placed at least one team in the top 10 nationally in 14 of 23 sports sponsored by the league. Other conference records of note established during the 1993-94 campaign include an ACC-record 82 teams competing at NCAA Championships, five bowl invitations, and 29 Top-10 showings.

The University of North Carolina captured the inaugural Sears Directors' Cup, an all-sports award presented by Sears and the National Association of Directors of Collegiate Athletics honoring the Division I school with the best performance in 22 men's and women's sports. Three other conference schools finished in the top 25 rankings for the award — Clemson, Virginia and Florida State.

An all-time high 12 ACC teams (in eight different sports) representing seven of the nine member institutions, earned a No. 1 ranking during the course of the 1993-94 academic year.

The ACC Academic Honor Roll record was broken for the eighth straight year as 1,176 student-athletes were recognized for their work in the classroom.

THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The conference currently conducts championship competition in 23 sports, including 12 for men and 11 for women.

The first ACC championship was held in swimming on February 25, 1954, while the league's inaugural basketball tournament took place on March 4-6, 1954, at

cross country, wrestling or tennis during the first year.

The 12 sports for men include football, cross-country, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball, tennis, golf, and lacrosse. Fencing, which was started in 1971, was discontinued in 1981.

Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship held in tennis at Wake Forest University, October 6-8. The first women's basketball tournament was held February 9-11, 1978 at the University of Virginia. Championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, volleyball, field hockey, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf, and softball.

THE HISTORY

The Atlantic Coast Conference was founded May 8, 1953, at Sedgefield Inn near Greensboro, North Carolina. The conference's seven charter members from three states included Clemson University, Duke University, University of Maryland, University of North Carolina, North Carolina State University, University of South Carolina and Wake Forest University.

The withdrawal of the seven schools from the Southern Conference came early on the morning of May 8, 1953, during the annual spring meeting of the conference. On June 14, 1953, the seven members met in Raleigh, N.C., where a set of bylaws were adopted and the name Atlantic Coast Conference was officially recognized.

Dr. James T. Penney of the University of South Carolina was elected temporary chairman and became the ACC's first president when the schools met again on June 14, 1953. Professor F.W. Clonts of Wake Forest was named vice president and Dr. Oliver Cornwell of North Carolina was elected secretary-treasurer.

On December 4, 1953, the Conference again met at Sedgefield Inn and officially admitted the University of Virginia to the league. Virginia began active champion-

ship participation with the 1953-54 basketball season.

The ACC Set up office at the King Cotton Hotel in Greensboro, N.C., on July 1, 1954. The office was moved to 338 North Elm Street on July 1, 1966 and then to 2100-N West Cornwallis Drive in April of 1980. The conference moved to its current site at 6011 Landmark Center in 1989.

The first and only withdrawal of a member from the ACC occurred on June 30, 1971 when the University of South Carolina tendered its resignation. The Conference continued with seven members until April 3, 1978 when Georgia Institute of Technology was admitted. The Atlanta, Ga., school became a playing member of the ACC on July 1, 1979, but did not become eligible for the football championship until the 1983 season. The Conference expanded to nine teams with the admittance of Florida State University on September 15, 1990. The Seminoles became a playing member of the ACC on July 1, 1991, but did not become eligible for the football championship until the 1992 season.

THE COMMISSIONERS

The office of the commissioner was established at a meeting at the Sedgefield Inn on May 7, 1954. Three weeks later on May 28, at a special meeting in Raleigh, James H. (Jim) Weaver, the athletic director at Wake Forest, was elected the league's first commissioner.

Weaver served as commissioner until his death on July 11, 1970. Norvell Neve was named acting commissioner on July 23, 1970 and served until March 1, 1971, when Robert C. (Bob) James assumed the duties of commissioner. James served the ACC for more than 16 years until his death on May 11, 1987. Eugene F. (Gene) Corrigan, a former assistant to Weaver and later athletic director at Virginia, became the third ACC commissioner on July 21, 1987. Corrigan resigned as athletic director at Notre Dame to take the ACC post. ♦
