THE BUILDING PROCESS

As with the constructing of any large project, careful planning is essential. First there is developing the idea, then there is the drawing up of blueprints, next is the gathering of materials and finally, construction begins. And as any contractor knows, building a strong, solid foundation doesn't happen over night. It's a step-by-step process, that depending on the size of the project, can take years. It's a scenario all too familiar for Lady Seminole head coach Marynell Meadors, her coaching staff and the Florida State women's basketball program.

After enjoying four straight winning seasons, including two consecutive seasons of NCAA appearances in the early '90's, signs of struggle began to appear and it was time for Meadors and crew to start the rebuilding process. And like with any construction project, the first phases are not fun for anybody. But once the project is completed, how soon we forget what it took to get there. Although the women's basketball 'Noles have struggled the past couple of years, it has all been a part of the building process. And the 1995-96 'Noles are ready to put the first phases of this project behind them and get their feet dirty, as construction begins.

With two very successful recruiting seasons under their belt, the FSU women's basketball coaches are ready to put their efforts to work. The 1995-96 version of the Lady Seminoles will feature one senior, four sophomores and seven freshmen. No one player has played more than one season in the garnet and gold, so "young" will defi-

nately be a word that enters everyone's mind when it comes to thinking about this year's Florida State women's basketball team. But as head coach Marynell Meadors explains, that can be an advantage.

"We are just going to have to live with our youth," Meadors said. "But quite honestly, I love young players."

They are eager to learn and they are so emotional on the court. They're just excited to play and are not afraid to play hard."

The team returns three starters from last year's 8-22 season in forwards Carla Williams and Latrice McLin and center Lysa Moorefield. Williams averaged 10.9 points and led the team on the boards, grabbing over seven rebounds per game. She emerged as a team leader with her solid, consistent play and work ethic. After an injury sidelined junior forward Katina Cobbins midway through the season, Williams stepped up her own game, to help fill the void left by Cobbins' absence.

"Pound for pound, ounce for ounce, Carla has by far exceeded every expectation we had for her," Meadors said. "She is a wonderful individual with a tremendous work ethic and we are looking for her to be leader for this young group."

McLin and Moorefield averaged 7.7 and 6.6 points respectively. Forward Wendy Hampton (4.9 ppg) played in all 30 games and was a threat from outside while guard Aletha Penn (1.2 ppg) served in a backup role to senior Allison Peercy but still played in 28 games.

Despite the experience that the five returnees gained in 1994-95, all the starting positions are really up for grabs. With the addition of seven newcomers, expect some new dimensions to the Florida State women's basketball program.

First and foremost is the addition of height, which

will strengthen the 'Noles inside game. Freshmen Kristy White (6-4, F/C) and Arleshia Davidson (6-2, F) and redshirt freshman Leslie Waugh (6-3, F/C) along with Moorefield (6-1, F/C), will give Florida State a look it hasn't had in recent years.

"Our height is going to give us an opportunity to have an inside/outside game and that inside game will definitely have height that teams will have to defend with their post players," Meadors said. "In the past, we really couldn't match up with a lot of teams, but I think we are going to be in a situation this year where it's not going to be so easy for teams to match up with Florida State."

The 'Noles do not return any starters from the back court, but should still enjoy depth at the guard positions with four newcomers and one returnee.

"I think we will have tremendous depth at the guard positions," Meadors said. "Mehgan Heaps (Fr., 5-8, Lancaster, PA) and Jen Robinson (Fr, 5-8, Albany, GA) can both play the point and sophomore Aletha Penn can step in if we need her, but her natural position is the two."

Jennifer Miller (Fr., 5-8, Charleston, WV) and walk-on Kristy Parker (Fr., 5-6, Richland, MI) will also provide added depth in the back court.

With the graduation of Percy (12.0 ppg), last year's leading scorer, Florida State will be looking for some offensive power. The 1995-96 club shouldn't have any problem putting numbers on the scoreboard though as the seven newcomers combined averaged 19.1 points per game in their senior seasons. And although the 'Noles nearly doubled their opponents in three point baskets last year (FSU-102, OPP-66), look for the FSU backcourt to be highly productive from beyond the arc. Heaps, who was the three-point basket champion at both the Lancaster Lebanon Shootout and the Pennsylvania Roundball Classic, and Robinson should both provide Florida State with a consistent three-point threat.

With the players assembled for the upcoming season, Meadors is looking forward to being able to coach her style of basketball.

"We are finally going to be able to get the number of players and the talent level up to where I can coach the style at which I like to coach," Meadors said, "and

that's press, run and great half court man to man defense. With the depth we'll have, we'll be able to push the ball the floor."

And with a new style of basketball, look for Florida State to have a much improved team.

"I look for us to have a winning season," Meadors said, "and I think we are moving in that direction. This team has a lot of heart and they are close to one another. The players want to be respected by the other teams in the league and they are going to strive to make that happen. The returnees know what's expected of them and I think they will share that with the newcomers."

One thing's for certain, despite the losing record in 1994-95, things were accomplished that will enable the 'Noles to enjoy success in the coming years.

"I thought it was a very successful year considering our tremendous amount of injuries," Meadors said. "Even though we weren't winning, we never lost our spark of enthusiasm. We never really let ourselves get down. And having a positive attitude and sticking together in a difficult season creates a great deal of stability and unity which transforms into successful results down the road." 🏀


women's basketball, and 10th at FSU, with all the excitement and enthusiasm of her first season. And it is exactly that attitude that has placed Meadors at the top of her profession. One thing's for certain though, although Meadors has coached women's basketball for 25 years, every year has been a new, exciting and challenging experience for her. And with seven newcomers added to an already young squad, the 1995-96 season will be no different. In fact, it could be one of her most challenging seasons yet.

In her nine seasons at the helm of the Lady Seminole program, the Tennessee native has twice guided Florida State into NCAA post-season

play. After amassing a 21-8 record during the 1989-90 regular season, Meadors' squad received an at-large bid to the national championship tournament, marking just the second appearance in the program's history and its first since the 1982-83 season. In the 1990-91 season, the Lady Seminoles captured an automatic berth after winning the Metro Conference Tournament and advanced into the NCAA's second round for the first time ever. For these accomplishments, Meadors was named the Metro Conference Coach of the Year in 1990 and the league's Co-Coach of the Year in 1991.

Since Florida State's entry into the Atlantic Coast Conference four seasons ago, Meadors has produced first and second team All-ACC players. Competing in one of the premier women's basketball conferences in the nation, Tia Pascal became FSU's first All-ACC selection when the second team All-American was voted to the squad following the 1992-93 campaign. Christy Derlak, who had ranked as the ACC's third leading scorer, followed suit the next season when she was named to the second team.

Before arriving at Florida State, Coach Meadors spent a successful 16 years at Tennessee Tech where she built the program from scratch. During her tenure there, Meadors amassed 363 wins becoming the first women's coach to win 300 games at one institution. She also had 16, 20-plus winning seasons, advanced her team into post-season play 12 times, won four Ohio Valley Championships and was twice named coach of the year in that conference. In 1992, Meadors' accomplishments were recognized as she was inducted into the Ohio Valley Conference Hall of Fame and


Meadors has been instrumental in strumming up community support for Lady Seminole basketball. She instituted the weekly Marynell Meadors Basketball Show where she reviews past games and previews upcoming opponents as well as started booster programs and the Little 'Nole Club.

In the off season, when Meadors is not on the recruiting tour, she enjoys golfing in the Florida sunshine. 🏀

the Tennessee Tech Hall of Fame.

Most impressive is Meadors success on the international level. Three of Meadors' former athletes have gone on to compete in the International League in Europe and Meadors herself has spent two summers in Taiwan. In 1992, she was the assistant coach for the Jones Cup Senior women's team which won a gold medal, and in 1993 she served as head coach for the bronze medaling junior national team which competed in the same Jones Cup Tournament. In 1989, Meadors stayed state-side as head coach of the Olympic Festival's North team which also won a gold medal.

Meadors has served on several selection committees during her coaching career. Since 1976, she has

Fourth Year, Luther College '85


Assistant Coach Mark Schmidt begins his fourth season as a member of the Lady Seminole coaching staff. He serves as the coordinator for recruiting, supervisor of fall conditioning, and assistant in game coaching as well.

A 10-year coaching veteran, Schmidt began his stint as an assistant after relinquishing his post as the head coach at the University of Hartford. During his two years at Hartford, Schmidt implemented a tough denial defense, one that complements the press and run style that Meadors brought to Florida State.

Schmidt was head coach of the women's basketball program at the University of Tulsa from 1985-87. He then spent three seasons at the United States Military Academy at West Point as an assistant coach to former professional player Lynn Chiavaro.

Schmidt helped Chiavaro form one of the stingiest defenses in the nation at Army. The Lady Knights finished among the top three nationally in Division II scoring defense during each of Schmidt's three seasons at the New York state school.

A 1985 graduate of Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, Schmidt received his degree in physical education and is in the process of finishing his master's degree in athletic administration from the University of Tulsa. He and his wife, Mary Jo, were married in May of 1992.

Second Year, Illinois '88


Jonelle Polk begins her second season as an assistant to head coach Marynell Meadors. She comes to FSU after a three year stint as an assistant in charge of conditioning and post player development at Northern Illinois University.

Prior to becoming a collegiate coach, Polk spent three years playing professionally in both Italy and France. She began her playing career at Peoria Manual High School in Illinois where she graduated 13th out of a senior class of 289. Polk lettered four years in basketball and track before moving on to the University of Illinois.

In her four years with the Illini, Polk accumulated 933 rebounds and 1,984 points to become the Fightin' Illini's all-time leader in both categories. The two-time All-Big Ten selection scored 627 points in 1986-87 to place second on the Illinois single season scoring list. She was also a member of the United States' pre-Olympic National Selection Team in 1987. Polk was selected to the University of Illinois All-Decade Team for the 1980's.

Polk became a member of a very elite group of women in 1992 when she dunked a basketball during the Gus Macker three-on-three tournament in Rockford, Ill.

She graduated from the University of Illinois with a bachelor of science degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences with an emphasis on mathematics and economics.







Third Year, Maryland '93


Lily, Pennsylvania native Sue Panek begins her third year as an assistant coach with the Lady Seminoles. No stranger to the Atlantic Coast Conference, Panek enjoyed a successful four-year career as a forward at the University of Maryland which included a Final Four and Final Eight finish. At Florida State, Panek's primary responsibilities include preseason and postseason conditioning, team travel, administrative duties as well as scouting and assisting with the coaching of the guards.




