FSU again played some of the nation's best in 1998-99. The Seminoles played six games against Top 10 opponents and 14 games in all against teams that were ranked among the Top 25 during the season. FSU played 15 games against nine NCAA Tournament teams. Five of those nine teams were Top 4 seeds. Three of FSU's opponents, Louisiana Tech, Georgia and Duke, advanced to the Final Four with the Blue Devils advancing to the championship game.

# COULDN'T STOP COLEMAN

Prior to her season-ending injury on December 26th, Latavia Coleman had scored in double figures in all 10 games this season, but even more remarkable was her shooting accuracy of .547. The junior forward shot 50 percent or better in seven games. She was averaging a team-high 15.0 field goal attempts per game and was making 8.2 of them.

#### ACC HONORS

Sophomore Brooke Wyckoff and freshman April Traylor were among those who received all-conference honors. Wyckoff, who averaged 13.8 points and 8.0 rebounds in the regular season, was named the the ACC's Third Team. She ranked among the in the league in scoring (12th), rebounding (Tied, 5th), blocks (2nd) and steals (2nd). Traylor earned ACC All-Freshman Team accolades after averaging 12.8 points per game and scoring in double figures in 14 of the last 15 games.

FSU'S four-point loss to #17 Clemson was almost too close for comfort. FSU has been in nearly every game its played in this season. The Tribe lost eight games by 13 points or less this season, including four games nine points or under!

With 388 career assists in 108 games, point guard Jen Robinson is now Florida State's all-time assists leader. The previous record holder was Allison Peercy who played for FSU from 1992-95 and had 382 assists in 111 games.

# RECORD-SETTING PERFORMANCE

April Traylor's game-high 29 points vs. Florida was not only a career-high for the rookie, but her 22 free throw attempts set a new FSU record. The previous record was 19 attempts set by Tia Paschal in 1993 and also by Carla Williams in 1995.

#### TRAYLOR HONORED BY LEAGUE

Traylor was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Rookie of the Week for the week of Feb. 15. It is the second such honor this season for the Martinsville, Indiana native.

Traylor was unstoppable as she led all scorers with a career-high 29 points against the Lady Gators of Florida. Traylor also set a new FSU record in the effort with 22 free throw attempts. Along with her outstanding scoring, Traylor added five steals in her 37 minutes of play.

#### J-ROB RACKS 'EM UP

Jen Robinson was unstoppable in FSU's game vs. Georgia Tech on January 31st. The Albany, Georgia, native scored a career-high 31 points in 34 minutes of play in the contest. She connected on a career-high six

three-pointers and also led all players with five assists. Twenty four of her game-high 31 points came in the second half, including 19 in the game's final 7:39. With the 31 points, Robinson placed herself among an elite group—the Florida State 30-point Club. Only 12 other Florida State players have scored 30 points or more in a game. Teammate Latavia Coleman did it twice this season.

# AMAZING GRACEY

Senior Tamara Gracey was simply amazing in the North Carolina game in Chapel Hill. She went a perfect 9-for-9 from the field, 6-for-6 from the free throw line for a career-high 24 points and grabbed a career-high 13 boards.

# NOT TOO SHABBY

The Seminoles outrebounded UNC by 10 — 40-30 — its largest margin over an ACC opponent this season. FSU also had its best shooting percentage vs. an ACC opponent vs. North Carolina. In the first game, the Tribe shot .580 while in their second meeting, FSU went .563.

# TURNING IT UP

Senior guard Jen Robinson turned it up a notch this season. Not only did she help her teammates to score with a team-high 3.9 assists per game average, she did some of the scoring herself. Through 27 games, Robinson tallied double figures in 17 contests, including a careerhigh 31 points vs. Georgia Tech. In the first North Carolina game, she scored she scored 18 points. In that game Robinson was unstoppable, shooting 70 percent from the field while also recording six assists and five steals.

## WYCKOFF WAS FLYING HIGH

Sophomore Brooke Wyckoff went wild at Maryland with a career-high 28 points, leading both teams. She was 9-for-17 from the field and 9-for-11 from the free throw line. Against Wake Forest, she had one of her best overall games of the season. She scored a career-high 21 points and grabbed 13 rebounds — both game-highs. It was her sixth double-double of the season. All this plus three steals and two assists and blocks in 35 minutes of play.

#### BIG WIN

FSU's 44-point win over Western Carolina ranks ninth among FSU's Top 10 wins all-time. FSU's biggest win ever was by 84 points — a 100-16 win over West Florida in 1975-76.

# IS IT BROOKE OR "BLOCK" WYCKOFF?

Wyckoff, FSU's all-time leader in blocks with 144, had a team-leading 64 swats this season.

## SUTTON WAS SOMETHIN'

Angela Sutton had the Seminole fans on their feet in FSU's 83-74 win over South Florida. The 5-10 rookie guard played 28 minutes off of the bench and recorded her first career double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds. But that wasn't all! Sutton also tallied a game-high six steals in the game and had two assists. She shared rebounding honors with teammate Brooke Wyckoff.

# THE CENTURY MARK

Florida State's 101 points vs. North Carolina in their first meeting marked the first time since the 1991-92 season that the Tribe had hit the century mark in points. In that year, FSU did it twice within five days with 100 points vs. FAMU on February 24, 1992 and 104 points vs. Oral Roberts on February 29, 1992. In 1997-98, UNC scored 103 in its win over FSU.

# OVERTIME GAMES

The Carolina overtime contest was FSU's only OT game of the season and first since last year's game vs. Virginia on February 2nd, 1998. In that game, the Tribe fell 76-83 to the Cavaliers. Overall, FSU is 12-6 in overtime games since 1977-78.

# COLEMAN TIES ALL-TIME SINGLE GAME MARK

Latavia Coleman's 30 points vs. No. 3 Louisiana Tech and her 38 points. vs. No. 8 North Carolina places her among an elite group — the Florida State 30-point Club. Only 12 other Florida State players have scored 30 points or more in a game. Coleman tied the all-time mark for points in a single game with 38 vs. UNC. Tia Paschal set the mark with 38 points vs. North Carolina in 1993.

# SUTTON EARNS ACC ROOKIE

Angela Sutton was named the Atlantic Coast Conference co-Rookie of the Week on November 23rd.

Sutton scored 17 points, grabbed three rebounds, had two assists and three steals in just 16 minutes of play off of the bench in FSU's 30-point win over Long Beach State in the first round of the 1998 *Tallahassee Democrat* Seminole Classic. The rookie went 6-for-10 from the field and 5-for-8 from the charity stripe.

#### TRAYLOR PEGGED ACC FIRST ROOKIE

Freshman April Traylor was named this season's first Atlantic Coast Conference Rookie of the Week after leading the Seminoles to a 76-67 victory over Tulsa in the squad's season-opener.

Traylor scored a game-high 23 points on 8-of-15 from the field, including 2-for-3 from three-point range. She grabbed seven rebounds and posted a team-high six steals while also contributing two assists in 36 minutes of play.

## WITH ALL OUR HEART

Since Latavia Coleman went down for the season, the Seminoles didn't play totally without her. Each player and coach placed a garnet-colored heart sticker with the number 30 (Coleman's number) in gold on their shoes. The hearts symbolized Coleman's heart and dedication.

### PACKING THE STANDS

The Seminoles enjoyed their best-ever following in 1998-99. Nearly 1,100 people were on hand to see FSU play La. Tech! The Seminole faithful continued to pack the stands, increasing attendance by 30 percent while season ticket sales increased by 400 percent in the team's first season at the Leon County Civic Center.



# THE ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE

# The Tradition

Consistency. It's the mark of true excellence in any endeavor. However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 47th year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed the reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, ACC schools have captured 75 NCAA and AIAW championships, including 38 in men's competition and 37 in women's. In addition, 115 men and 26 women have earned the coveted title of NCAA champion.

If success is best measured in terms of wins and losses, then the ACC is unrivaled in NCAA history. The men's and women's programs have combined for 19 trips to the Final Four in the last 18 years, and 40 appearances overall. Following the North Carolina women's national championship season of 1994, the first-ever for the league, ACC men's and women's teams have claimed eight titles while finishing second on 12 occasions.

The league's women's basketball program ranks among the best in the country in terms of overall NCAA Tournaments. With 73 appearances and 98 wins, the conference is listed second best in total appearances and total wins

Over the years, ACC women's basketball teams have gained global recognition through their NCAA Tournament success and television exposure. The 1999-2000 schedule will feature 20 TV games on the league's regional sports network, four games on ESPN2 and one on Lifetime.

ACC Basketball is more than numbers though. The faces behind both programs account for 26 national player of the year honors and 18 national coach of the year awards. In women's play, the ACC has produced 27 first-team All-Americans and eight Olympians, including coaches and student-athletes.

The ACC also stands at the forefront of intercollegiate athletics in terms of academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. Since 1983, 259 women's basketball players have received ACC Academic Honor Roll recognition. The 1998-99 academic year included 38 selections. In addition, ACC basketball players have earned first-team Academic All-America honors six times. Eight players have earned ACC Postgraduate scholarships, while three others were named NCAA Postgraduate Scholars.

# 1998-99 In R*eview*

The 1998-99 academic year concluded with the league pocketing three more national team titles and seven individual NCAA crowns. In all, the ACC has won 32 national team titles in the last nine years. The past year, the ACC was the only Division 1-A conference to have a team play in the national championship game in men's and women's basketball and football.

The ACC's 1998-99 national champions were Mary-

land in women's lacrosse, Virginia in men's lacrosse and Duke in women's golf. In addition, the ACC had six other teams participate in national title games — Florida State in football and baseball, Virginia in women's lacrosse, Duke in men's and women's basketball and North Carolina in women's soccer. Overall, ACC teams posted a 66-45-1 (.595) mark in NCAA Tournament play.

The ACC placed at least one team in the Top 10 nationally in 15 of the 24 sports sponsored by the league.
Other records of note during the 1998-99 season include 76 teams competing at NCAA Championships, five bowl teams and 28 Top 10 showings.

Seven ACC teams, in seven different sports representing six of the nine member institutions, earned a No. 1 ranking during the course of the past academic year.

The ACC Academic Honor Roll record was broken for the 12th-straight year in 1998-99 as 1,552 student-athletes were recognized for their work in the classroom.

The Championships

The conference will conduct championship competition in 25 sports during the 1999-2000 academic year — 12 for men and 13 for women.

The first ACC championship was held in swimming on February 25, 1954. The conference did not conduct championships in cross country, wrestling or tennis during the first year.

The 12 sports for men include football, cross country, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball, tennis, golf and lacrosse. Fencing, which was started in 1971, was discontinued in 1981.

Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship meet being held in tennis at Wake Forest University, October 6-8. Conference championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, volleyball, field hockey, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf, lacrosse, softball and rowing.

# A History

The Atlantic Coast Conference was founded on May 8, 1953, at the Sedgefield Inn near Greensboro, N.C., with seven charter members — Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest — drawing up the conference by-laws.

The withdrawal of seven schools from the Southern Conference came early on the morning of May 8, 1953, during the Southern Conference's annual spring meeting. On June 14, 1953, the seven members met in Raleigh, N.C., where a set of bylaws was adopted and the name become officially the Atlantic Coast Conference.

On December 4, 1953, conference officials met again at Sedgefield and officially admitted the University of Virginia. The first, and only, withdrawal of a school from the ACC came on June 30, 1971 when the University of South Carolina tendered its resignation.


The conference operated with seven members until April 3, 1978, when Georgia Tech was admitted. The Atlanta school had withdrew from the Southeastern Conference in January of 1964.

The ACC expanded to nine members on July 1, 1991, with the addition of Florida State.
