


In the world of collegiate golf, talent breeds success, but experience wins championships.

This year's Lady Seminole team not only has the talent to be successful, but the experience necessary to be one of the best teams in Florida State history. Complete with a potential All-American and a top five that has played in a total of 120 collegiate events, this year's team has set lofty goals for the 1998-99 season. As the Tribe enters the spring season with three top five finishes and sixth place finish in the fall, they are setting higher goals.

"Our goal that we set out for in the fall was winning one tournament," said head coach Debbie Dillman. "Now in spring season, we are looking to win at least one tournament and possibly two. That is going to be a very tall order with the tough schedule that we face."

"The state championship in April is a tournament that they are setting their sights on. We are just looking to play good golf as we approach Regionals in May. I am confident that we can make it to the Regionals this year if we play the way we have been playing."

The Lady Seminoles return the top five golfers from last year's squad that recorded four top five team finishes and one individual tournament victory.



Hoping to improve on a seasonbest tied for third place finish at the Lady Seminole Invitational last year, the Tribe will set their sights at visiting the victory podium on more than one occasion.

"Experience is very important in college golf," Dillman commented. "That experience gives them a sense of confidence in each tournament. There is a comfort level that they have each week and they combine that with the hard work that they do to be success-

ful. They get to a point where the little things don't sweat them anymore. They just focus on their golf."

"It is also very important that they have played most of these courses before. Each year we make a book and they are very familiar with these courses. Most of them have



played these for three or four years."

The goals continue to be the same for the Florida State women's golf program. This team will set out to qualify for regional play and a trip to the NCAA Championships. The road will be as difficult, if not more difficult, than last year considering that several of the top teams in the country play in FSU's district.

"We set several goals as a team and one of them is to make it to the championships," commented Dillman. "We also wanted to improve on some individual aspects of the game, like putting and overall scoring."

While last year's team featured only on senior, this year's team will have four. Amy Bond, Amy Spooner and Sarah Capie return for their fourth and final year at FSU, while Erika Iding will be playing in her third year with the Lady Seminoles. Sophomore Louise Wright will round out a top five lineup after playing as a true freshman.

The top player as the Lady Seminoles enter the fall season is senior Amy Bond. Bond, a native of Ocala, FL, has played in 29 events in her career and captured her first tournament victory last year at the Ryder-Florida State Championships. Bond led all Lady Seminoles last year with a stroke average of 76.7 and was selected as a member of the All-ACC team. Bond will contend for post-season honors again this year.

The bright spot of the summer for the Seminole golf program was Amy Spooner.
Spooner, a senior from Margate, FL, captured the U.S. Women's Amateur Public Links Championship in Hawaii in June.
Spooner, a three-year player for the Lady Seminoles, has one top 10 finish in her career, while recording three top 20 finishes last year.

Erika Iding enters her final year at Florida State after four top 20 finishes in eight events last year. Iding was third on the team with a stroke average of 78.0 and will be an integral member of this year's team. Iding transferred to Florida State after one year at the University of Arkansas.

The final senior is Sarah Capie of Carterville, IL. Capie

has played in 22 events as a Lady Seminole and has compiled a career stroke average of 77.7. Capie, a two-time Academic All-American, is also a three-time member of the ACC Honor Roll.


The biggest surprise of 1997-98 was the emergence of freshman Louise Wright. Wright, a native of Suffolk, England, came to FSU after a heralded career, but wasn't expected to make the immediate impact. Wright played in all five events of the spring, while finishing tied for 33rd at the Lady

Gator Invitational and the Lady Gamecock Classic.


Several young players will contend for playing time as the season goes on. The best candidate after fall workouts is freshman Alison Zimmer of Tallahassee, FL. Very experienced in amateur play, Zimmer will provide depth and will be a player of the future for the Seminole golf program. Junior Laura Kowalski and sophomore Stacy Burgin have played collegiate events and will continue to push the top five. Sophomore Kelley Winship and redshirt freshman Kristen Sanborn round out a roster that is talented from top to bottom.

The schedule will feature several important tournaments

for district rankings and will feature some of the top teams in the country. The Lady Seminoles will again travel

to several tournaments in the southeast as well as going to the Dominican Republic for a tournament. The season rounds out with the ACC Championships and hopefully a trip to the NCAA Regionals after a one-year hiatus.

One of the toughest tournaments for the year will feature some of the nation's best teams at the Lady Gamecock Classic. The University of South Carolina will be hosting the NCAA East Regional this year,

therefore attracting interest from several of the powers of the East.

"The Lady

need to play well in
those two tournaments to solidify
our position in the
rankings."

Florida State is a member of the District South that qualifies eight teams for the Regional

tournament in Columbia, SC. The committee in charge of selecting the teams will analyze

the results from both the fall and spring season. Criteria is used to determine the eight teams that are selected.

"The biggest difference between the fall and spring schedule is that the committee looks at the way you are playing at the end of the season," commented Dillman. "Last year we played extremely well in the fall, but we were beat by every team in the spring and, therefore, didn't qualify for regionals. We've got to have some key wins against tough teams in the spring to convince the committee."

This year's version of the Lady Seminoles golf team has the talent and experience to remain at the top of the collegiate golf world. With high expectations and lofty goals, this season should be one of the most exciting yet for Florida State University.

Lady Semimoles Head Golf Coach


Head Coach Debbie Dillman

In her 15th year at the helm of the Lady Seminole golf team, head coach Debbie Dillman will not rest on her laurels, although she has accumulated many over the years. The experienced and knowledgable coach has placed Florida State in a prominent position in collegiate golf.

The Davison, Michigan native grew up in an active golf family. Both of Dillman's parents were involved in country club management. Dillman captained her high school golf team for four

years and twice was runner-up at the Michigan State Championship. For three consecutive years she also captured the Flint Junior Golf Championship, considered one of the top junior tournaments in the state.

Dillman brought her talents down south to Tallahassee where she attended FSU as an undergraduate and played golf for the Lady Seminoles from 1979-82. During that time she also worked at Seminole Golf Course, enabling her to learn both the competitive and management sides of the sport.



Over the past 14 years, the Lady Seminoles have emerged as one of the perennial golf powers in the nation. With Dillman at the helm, the Seminoles have walked away from a tournament with the overall team championship 13 times. Under her coaching, nine Seminole golfers have captured 14 individual champion honors.

While members of the team have garnered many honors, Dillman herself has been honored as well. In the Seminoles' inaugural season in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Dillman's fellow coaches selected her as ACC Coach of the Year.

Dillman interests vary from the golf course to the farm. In her spare time she raises Tennessee Walking horses on her farm just outside of Tallahassee. She also has a daughter, Anne Lynn, who is five years old.




1997-1998 Review

The Lady Seminoles entered the season with the experience and talent in place to be successful in tournament play. With all five golfers returning from a year ago, expectations for 1997-98 season were high. Faced with a difficult tournament schedule and tough postseason competition, a trip back to Regionals and the NCAA Championships would prove to be difficult.

The Lady Seminoles were led much of the year by junior Amy Bond. Bond, a native of Ocala, FL, culminated her junior year with a tournament championship and an All-ACC selection. Bond led the Tribe with a stroke average of 76.5, while





playing in every tournament. She also captured her first tournament victory at Florida State with a one-stroke win over Riko Higashio of Florida at the

Ryder-Florida State Championships.

The top five for FSU was shuffled at the beginning of the year, before playing with the same five in four of the last five tournaments. Juniors Amy Spooner and Sarah Capie joined Bond as the only players to participate in each tournament. Erika Iding played in all but one tournament, the Lady Gamecock Classic in the spring.

The spring season brought to an end the career of senior Aguri Okura. Okura, a native of Osaka, Japan, played in five tournaments, including all four in


the fall. Okura finished her career with three top 10 finishes in 35 events, including a second-place finish at the Ryder-Florida State Championships in 1997.

Head Coach Debbie Dillman added a freshman to the line-up that provided immediate impact in the spring season.
Louise Wright played in five tournaments and finished with a stroke average of 79.6 in 14 rounds of play. A native of Suffolk, England, Wright's best finish was tied for 33rd at the Lady Gamecock Classic.

The Tribe started the fall season with the 22nd annual Lady Seminole Invitational at the Seminole Golf Course. Featuring 15 teams from across the Southeast, the Lady Seminole Invitational has become an







important tournament in district rankings. The Lady Seminoles finished tied for third with the University of Central Florida. Juniors Erika Iding and Sarah Capie led the Tribe, finishing tied for 12th with three-round total of 228. The University of Kentucky captured the tournament title, beating Mississippi State University by nine strokes.

In the following week, the Tribe traveled to Auburn, AL for the Auburn Tiger Invitational. The Lady Seminoles posted a firstround team total of 297 to give them a sixthplace finish among 12 teams, four strokes behind host Auburn University. Potential All-American candidate Amy Bond fired a 73 in the opening round of the tournament, forging her way to a tied for 16th place finish. The Lady Seminoles were once again led by Erika Iding. Iding, a native of Lansing, MI, carded a three-day total of 226 to finish tied for 14th with Christy Carter of Tulane University.

The Lady Seminoles had two weeks to prepare for the Beacon Woods Invitational at the Beacon Woods Country Club in Bayonet Point, FL. Iding led

the Tribe, finishing tied for 18th with a 234. Amy Bond and Aguri Okura both finished in the top 20, finishing tied for 20th.

The final tournament of the fall season was the very difficult Lady Paladin Invitational. A 21-team field faced the Lady Seminoles as they traveled to Greenville, SC for the annual event. The Tribe finished in 11th place out of 21 teams with a team total of 942. Amy Bond fired a final-round 77 to finish tied for 26th, while junior Amy Spooner finished tied for 33rd.

With the juggling of their line-up and the addition of a new player, the Lady Seminoles were poised to improve their performance in the spring. The Tribe opened the spring with the Lady Gator Invitational. Iding once again led the team, finishing tied for 21st at 224. Wright, playing in her first tournament, carded a three-day total of 228. She finished tied for 33rd.

After a week off, the Tribe ventured to Baton Rouge for the LSU Fairwood Invitational. A national field of 15 teams faced the Lady Seminoles at the Fairwood Country Club. Spooner recorded her first top 20 finish of the year to end in 17th place alone at 229. Bond went into the final round in a tie for 11th place, but struggled with a final-round 80 to finish tied for 22nd.

Highly regarded as one of the toughest tournaments in the spring, the Lady Gamecock Classic brought together 12 teams from the region. Dealing with a very long course and
