











DON VELLER SEMINOLE GOLF COURSE AND CLUB

The par 73, 18-hole championship golf course recently underwent a 1.4 Million-Dollar renovation and reopened September of 2004. The spectacular changes modernized the course with 18 brand new USGA greens featuring the state of the art ultradwarf turf called TiffEagle. The architect for the project was Robert C. Walker of Atlantic Beach, FL. Mr. Walker was the former lead architect for Arnold Palmer Golf Design.

KILLEARN COUNTRY CLUB AND INN

The site of 21 PGA Tour and four LPGA Tour tournaments, Killearn Country Club's three nine-hole layouts offers a challenging yet fun golf experience. Killearn's three nine-hole course are played in three eighteen hole combinations. These courses are home to several championship events each year and have hosted the PGA Classic and the Sprint Central.

GOLDEN EAGLE COUNTRY CLUB

Golden Eagle Country Club combines gracious Southern Living and championship golf for those who expect the best. Golden Eagle's foremost attraction is its 18-hole golf course, designed by world renowned golf course architect Tom Fazio. It was rated "the most challenging course in Florida" by the United States Golf Association just six months after opening in December 1986. Golfweek Magazine has ranked Golden Eagle among the top 50 real-estate development courses in the Southeast.


CAPITAL CITY COUNTRY CLUB

Capital City Country Club is the oldest and most prestigious private club in Tallahassee. The club is nestled among rolling hills and ancient oak trees. The rolling, tree-lined 6,502 yard 18-hole golf course is as challenging as it is breathtaking. Nine holes of the original design were carved out by famed golf course architect A.W. Tillinghast who designed such American classics as Winged Foot and Medinah.

SOUTHWOOD GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB

SouthWood Golf Club opened its 18-hole golf course in 2003 to the delight of golfers in Tallahassee. The well-planned course was immediately one of the premier golf facilities in the Florida Panhandle and one of the nation's heralded new golf courses. SouthWood was the only club in Florida to be ranked as one of "America's Best New Courses" by Golf Digest.





SEASON PREVIEW 2010-11 WOMEN'S GOLF



Florida State women's golf is led by new head coach Amy Bond. She and the Seminoles are looking forward to a great season with high expectations of making it back to the NCAA Tournament. 2009 was the first time since 2006 the Seminoles made it back as a team to the final tournament of the year and their goal is to return this year. Senior, Macarena Silva said "I believe that I will need to lead by example and keep my game up, and that every one of us needs to keep improving. This semester will be very important for us to be able to get back to the NCAA."

The Seminoles are a well rounded team with post season veterans Maria Salinas, Hannah Thomson, Jessica Negron, and Macarena Silva. This team will have the skill to compete against the top teams in the nation throughout the fall and spring season.

Also returning from last year, senior Andrea Kaelin, junior Whitney Wenglasz, and sophomores Mary Beth Ramsay and Gen King are all great assets to the team and looking to grab a spot in the Seminole line- up.






MARIA SALINAS

2009-10 REVIEW 2010-11 WOMEN'S GOLF

FLORIDA STATE FINISHES IN 10TH PLACE AT NCAA Championship

The Florida State University women's golf team came home with a 10th place finish in the final standings at the NCAA Division I Championship held at the Country Club of Landfall in Wilmington, N.C. This marks the best national finish for the Seminoles since 1981 and the first top 10 finish in their history of playing in eight previous NCAA Tournaments. In doing so the Seminoles established a school record for fewest strokes (1.182), finishing 16 strokes better than 2004 team which finished in a tie for 19th. The Seminoles 10th place finish was three places better than their previous best 13th place finish in 1999.

FLORIDA STATE RANKED 14TH IN FINAL NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State finished the season ranked 14th in the final national rankings by GolfStat. The Seminoles began the season unranked in both polls, but entered both after a second place finish at the Cougar Classic and a first place finish in the team championship at the University of Kentucky Invitational.

SEMINOLES FINISH IN SIXTH PLACE AT CENTRAL

The Florida State women's golf team finished in a tie for sixth place at the 2010 NCAA Central Regional championship – a top eight finish that qualified them to play in the NCAA Championship finals. The Seminoles began the third round in 12th place, and three strokes outside of the cut line of the top eight teams that would advance to the finals. When the

round was complete, they had surpassed six teams and earned themselves a spot in the championship finals for the first time since 2006, and the ninth time in school history.

AGNEW AND SILVA EARN ALL ACC HONORS

Senior Lacey Agnew and junior Macarena Silva were named to the 2010 All-ACC Women's Golf Team as selected by the league's nine head coaches. It marks the 10th consecutive year that at least one Florida State player has been named to the All-ACC Women's Golf Team and the third time in team history that two players have made the list.

SEMINOLES' TOP TEAM RESULTS IN 2009-10

Florida State finished the 2009-10 season with an ACC-leading three tournament championships (Kentucky Invitational, Pinehurst Challenge and Bryan National Collegiate) to go along with an ACC-leading eight top five finishes. The Seminoles finished out of the top five only five times.
