BRAND ATTRIBUTES

Brand Attributes are a set of characteristics that represent the essence of the Florida State brand. These attributes identify personality traits and serve as a filter for all of the components of the identity system. When you experience the Florida State brand, we want you to be reminded of:

RESPECT | INTEGRITY STRENGTH | PRIDE CHARACTER | FIGHT PASSION | LEADERSHIP FAMILY | TRADITION



The Seminole logo is indisputably iconic and unique to Florida State Athletics. It signals a consistent foundation-honoring the brand equity that has been built across decades of competition while creating distinction and reinforcing the brand for the next generation. The mark is strong, youthful and bold paying off the true attributes of a Seminole Warrior. It purposefully incorporates the Florida State color palette, and with the head held high it expresses our position with purpose and conviction.

The Seminole logo is the primary representation of the brand and is used as the main identifying device for athletics. Reinforcement of the primary identity will build equity in Florida State Athletics. In primary or secondary colors, the Seminole logo works well across all media. With a flexible approach to palettes and logo staging, the Seminole logo now comes alive with renewed spark and energy.

SEMINOLE PATTERN

In the early 1900s, a new decorative technique was developed by Seminole women, now commonly known as patchwork. Early patterns included blocks and bars of alternating color with occasional sawtooth designs that were sewn directly into garments. Patchwork was rapidly adopted as a standard means of embellishing the Seminoles' traditionally vibrant clothing. These authentic and meaningful patterns live on through today's Seminole natives, and are now an official element of the performance apparel palette for Florida State Athletics.

FSU and Nike were determined to incorporate meaningful symbolism into their uniforms and designers included Seminole lore in each element. The Seminole symbols for Fire, Arrow and Man on Horse (top to bottom, repeating) were the inspiration for this unique pattern.

FSU LOGO

The FSU Logo is a stylistic ligature. At the origin of typographical ligatures is the simple running together of letters in manuscripts. In writing and typography, a typographic ligature occurs where two or more letters are joined as a single glyph.

The FSU Logo was created from the custom unconquered alphabet. It works closely in support of the primary identity to represent Seminole Athletics. This type-based mark gives the identity flexibility while staying consistent with the main look and feel.



SEMINOLE SPEAR

Perhaps the most spectacular tradition in all of college football occurs in Doak Campbell Stadium when a student portraying the famous Seminole leader, Osceola, charges down the field riding an Appaloosa horse named Renegade and plants a flaming spear at midfield to begin every home game. Together, Osceola and Renegade highlight a pre-game ritual, considered to be one of the most popular in the nation.

Florida State's trademark helmet with the Seminole spear is well known throughout all of college football. This design was first introduced during Bobby Bowden's first year as head coach in 1976. Prior to that season, FSU had used a variety of different helmets ranging from gold with a garnet FSU, solid gold with garnet and white striping, an image of the state of Florida with STATE running down it, and various others. The refined spear now reflects the same visual language as the other elements of the identity system.

THE SEMINOLE TRIBE OF FLORIDA THE UNCONQUERED PEOPLE

As a people, few have prevailed over more trying circumstances than the Seminole Indians of Florida. Over the course of almost two centuries, Florida's Seminoles endured three wars with the U.S. government, resisted numerous efforts to relocate them to federal reservations in the West, and ultimately made their home in one of the world's most inhospitable environments, the Florida Everglades. That they have not only survived, but thrived – all the while maintaining their fierce independence and rich culture – is a tribute to their courage and perseverance. This is their story.

Long before European explorers ever visited the area now known as Florida, native peoples had been living here for thousands of years. In fact, as many as 100,000 members of four Indian nations – the Apalachee, the Tequesta, the Timucua and the Calusa – were living in highly organized settlements throughout the peninsula when the Spanish first arrived in 1513.

The native peoples' lack of resistance to smallpox, yellow fever and other "European" diseases, as well as later slaving raids from the English colonies of Georgia and South Carolina, eventually decimated their numbers. By the mid-18th century, the Indian nations of Florida had ceased to exist.

In their place, groups of Indians from a confederation of tribes collectively referred to as the Lower Creeks began moving into Florida from Alabama and Georgia. They had been pushed out of their former homes by the encroachment of white settlers, as well as by conflicts with other tribes. It was around this time that the name "Seminoles" first appeared; there are several possible explanations as to its origins.

When the first English speakers began arriving in Florida in 1763, they found many Creeks living as yat'siminoli, or "free people," across the northern part of the Florida peninsula. ("Yat'siminoli" was a term used in the Mikisúkî, or Miccosukee, language, which still is spoken today.) The settlers may have simply ignored the Indians' separate tribal affiliations and called them all Seminolies, or Seminoles.

Others believe that the Seminole name comes from the Spanish word cimarron, meaning "wild men" or "unconquered." The Indians may have been given this name because they had escaped from slavery in the English-controlled colonies to the north.

With the end of the American Revolutionary War in 1784, English-speaking settlers began moving southward in ever greater numbers, buying or seizing land from the native inhabitants. By 1813, some of the Creek tribes in Alabama rose up against the white settlers and the Indian tribes that supported them. This conflict, known as the Creek War of 1813-14, proved disastrous to all of the tribes. U.S. troops led by Gen. Andrew Jackson crushed the uprising and forced a treaty on the Creeks that took more than 2 million acres of land from them. Several thousand Creek warriors and their families migrated south into Spanish Florida, where they and the Seminoles increased their resistance to white settlement.

In 1814, such conflicts escalated into the first of three Seminole wars. Over the next four years, Jackson illegally entered Spanish Florida numerous times to burn Seminole villages and kill resistance leaders.

With the end of the First Seminole War in 1818, many Indians moved further into Florida. By 1820, the year before Spanish Florida became a U.S. territory, there were at least 5,000 Seminoles, Creeks and Mikisúkî people living here. However, a series of federal treaties failed to protect their rights and, in 1835, war broke out again.

The Second Seminole War (1835-42) proved to be the longest, most costly, and the last of the U.S. wars of Indian removal fought east of the Mississippi River. It also would be the first guerilla-style war faced by U.S. troops. Led by the fierce warrior Osceola, the Seminoles were aided by runaway slaves, who received protection from their allies in return for a portion of the agricultural staples that they grew. These so-called "Black Seminoles" also had a reputation as fierce

THE SYMBOL: SEMINOLES

Florida State would play two games in 1947 before students demanded the school acquire a symbol. While details conflict, most believe the account of a poll of the student body is accurate. The Florida Flambeau reported that Seminoles had won by 110 votes over Statesmen. The rest of the top contenders (in order) were Rebels, Tarpons, Fighting Warriors and Crackers.

In the 1950s, a pair of students dressed in Native American costumes and joined the cheerleaders on the field which eventually evolved into the majestic symbol of Osceola and Renegade that FSU now enjoys. Today, the Seminole Indian Tribe participates in many campus activities.

fighters, and were equally determined to preserve their freedom.

The fighting ended in a stalemate in 1842, and an uneasy peace lasted for 14 years. In 1856, however, Seminole leader Billy Bowlegs and his followers were provoked by U.S. soldiers. They retaliated, and the ensuing series of skirmishes became known as the Third Seminole War (1856-58).

When U.S. troops once more withdrew – again with no treaty or victory – the Seminole Wars finally ended. All told, more than 3,000 Seminoles had been forcibly removed from Florida to the Western territories of Arkansas and Oklahoma. As few as 300 remained in Florida, and they took refuge within the dense swamps of the Everglades. However, their place in history was assured as the only American Indian tribe never to have signed a peace treaty with the U.S. government.

From the 1920s onward, as the development boom exploded in South Florida, the Seminoles lost more and more of their hunting lands to tourists and settlers. They became agricultural workers in the vegetable fields of South Florida, and also ran tourist attractions, wearing their colorful patchwork clothing, producing souvenirs and wrestling alligators.

On Aug. 21, 1957, the Seminole Tribe of Florida was established through a majority vote of Florida's Seminole Indians. This vote gave the Seminoles federal recognition as a self-governing tribe with a constitutional form of government. The Seminole Tribe of Florida now has almost 3,000 members living on five reservations across the peninsula at Hollywood, Big Cypress, Brighton, Immokalee and Tampa.

The Seminoles work hard to be economically independent. Tourism and gaming profits pay for infrastructure and schools on their reservations, while citrus groves, cattle agriculture, aircraft production, tobacco sales, land leases and aquaculture are other significant sources of revenue.

Having persevered through two centuries of adversity, the Seminole Indians of Florida have earned the right to call themselves "the unconquered people." Their indomitable spirit is one that Florida State University proudly seeks to emulate in all of its endeavors.


Brian PENSKY

Head Coach 3rd Season

In his first season as the head coach at Florida State, Pensky helped lead the Seminoles back to the College Cup for the 13th time in program history with a 17-3-3 record. The Noles won their ninth ACC Tournament Championship and fifth ACC Regular Season Championship. It marked just the third time in program history that the Noles won both the regular season and tournament championships.

The Noles were dominant all throughout the 2022 season, outscoring opponents 64-20 with 11 shutouts in 23 games. The 64 goals scored in a season were the sixth most in a season in program history. The Noles also scored 28 goals in 10 ACC games, the second most against ACC opponents in a season in program history. FSU was selected as the number one overall seed in the 2022 NCAA Tournament for the 11th time in school history and shut out three of its first four opponents in the NCAA Tournament on the way to the College Cup.

In his first season at FSU, Pensky coached three All-Americans (Jenna Nighswonger, Cristina Roque and Jody Brown), nine All-ACC members and the ACC's Goalkeeper of the Year (Roque).

"Florida State's soccer program is regarded as one of if not the best in the country and rightfully so," said Pensky. "The opportunity to be a part of this great program with its remarkable tradition is an honor. What Mark (Krikorian) did here over the last 17 years is unparalleled in our game. Simply put, he has been the best in the business."

"But it is more than just the soccer program that attracted me. The status of the university as a top-tier public institution academically is just as impressive as its athletic history. And, I have coached in the ACC and I know the strength of the league is second to none in the country.



"I take over the program with endless humility and understanding of the task at hand."

Tennessee's 2021 SEC Championship highlighted a season in which the Vols finished with a 20-3-0 record and advanced to the NCAA Round of 16. Pensky was named the SEC Coach of the Year following the season and the entire UT coaching staff was recognized as the Southeast Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

"After getting a great deal of input from our soccer studentathletes, we set out to attract the very best coach in the country to lead what has become the premier program in the country. I am very pleased to announce that in Brian Pensky we have found the person whose talent and drive match our consistently high expectations for FSU soccer.

"Coach Pensky is a proven winner both in the ACC which we consider the nation's best conference and the SEC. He has built programs and sustained consistent, high-level success proving his abilities time and time again.

"I am excited about the future of our program under Coach Pensky and we welcome him and his family to Florida State."

After leading Tennessee to its second consecutive SEC Eastern Division championship in 2021, Pensky was selected as the SEC Coach of the Year. He then deftly guided Tennessee to its first SEC Tournament championship since 2008 and a trip to the NCAA Round of 16. The 2021 squad went undefeated in Regal Stadium, opening the season with seven straight shutouts to set a new single-season shutout record of 633:53 en route to a record of 20-3-0 for the program's first 20-win season. Redshirt sophomore Jaida Thomas and senior Wrenne French both received All-America honors, and newcomer Taylor Huff was named SEC Freshman of the Year. Senior Mackenzie George earned First Team All-SEC honors while redshirt sophomore Thomas, Huff, and French were named Second Team All-SEC. Tennessee landed three on the SEC All-Freshman Team with Huff, Jordan Fusco, and Claire Rain each making the list. Following the season, UT's coaches were named Southeast Region Staff of the Year by United Soccer Coaches.

During the fall of 2020, Pensky guided Tennessee to an SEC East Title, going 4-1-1 in divisional play and 4-3-1 overall in conference play. In the spring, the Big Orange recorded four more wins, three of which were shutouts, to finish the season with an 8-6-1 record and mark the sixth-straight winning season. Newcomer Jaida Thomas was named to the 2020 SEC All-Freshman Team and junior Mackenzie George earned Second Team All-SEC honors.

In 2019, Pensky led UT to a 9-6-3 record overall. The Vols posted an 8-2 record at Regal Soccer Stadium that included shutout wins over SEC East rivals Florida, Georgia and Kentucky. Following the 2019 season, seniors Maya Neal and Katie Cousins became the fourth and fifth players in program history to earn four All-SEC honors with first and second-team accolades, respectively. MA Vignola was named also a first-team all-conference selection after leading the team with nine goals and five assists. Goalkeeper Lindsey Romig was named to the SEC All-Freshman team, becoming the fifth Tennessee player to accomplish that feat in the past six years.

Pensky's Vols ascended to new heights in 2018, reaching the NCAA Quarterfinals for the first time in program history. Tennessee finished 16-3-3 overall, good for the program's highest winning percentage (.795) and fewest losses (3) in a single season. UT earned consensus top-10 status following the historic campaign, rounding out the year with a No. 6 ranking from TopDrawerSoccer.com, No. 7 from the United Soccer Coaches and No. 8 in the NCAA RPI.

Tennessee's stout defensive unit limited opponents to a program-best 15 goals on the season, while the Vols' 12 shutouts tied a Tennessee record that has stood since 2003. UT netted 44 goals on the offensive end, marking the first time Tennessee scored 40-plus goals in back-to-back seasons since 2002-03.

Several Vols claimed individual postseason accolades, highlighted by Bunny Shaw (second team) and Katie Cousins (third team) earning All-America distinction from the United Soccer Coaches. Shaw, Cousins and Maya Neal were selected First Team All-Southeast Region, while MA Vignola took home a Second Team all-region nod.

Shaw headlined SEC postseason awards, becoming the second Tennessee player ever to be named SEC Offensive Player of the Year (Kylee Rossi, 2006-07). The forward from Spanish Town, Jamaica led the league with 0.87 goals per game, 2.13 points per game and seven game-winners. Shaw, Cousins and Neal each repeated as First Team All-SEC honorees, while Vignola and Erin Gilroy were voted Second Team All-SEC.

Pensky coached UT to a 15-4-2 record in 2017, returning to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2012. The team scored 47 goals - the third-most in program history - and posted 10 shutouts. Following the campaign, Pensky was awarded a contract extension through the 2021 season.

Five players were named United Coaches All-Region and/or All-SEC following the 2017 season. Katie Cousins became the program's sixth All-American and second under Pensky's tenure with a third-team selection from the United Soccer Coaches. Michele Christy was tabbed CoSIDA Academic All-America with a 4.0 GPA in chemical engineering.

In 2016, Pensky helped the Vols return to the SEC Tournament after narrowly missing out in 2015. The Big Orange finished 5-5-1 in SEC play, earning the No. 7 seed in the conference tournament. Tennessee defeated Ole Miss, 2-0, in the first round of the SEC Tourney before being eliminated by No. 2 seed Auburn, 3-1, in the quarterfinals.

The Vols were strong once again defensively, posting eight shutouts and a 1.45 goals-against average for the season. Three players (Hannah Wilkinson, Rylie O'Keefe & Maya Neal) earned NSCAA All-South Region and All-SEC accolades. Wilkinson posted career highs with 11 goals, 10 assists and 32 points to move into second and third, respectively, on UT's career goals and points charts.

Pensky led the Vols to their fifth winning season in the past six years and 15th overall in 2015. Tennessee went 7-5-6 despite losing several key players to injury early in the season, including the team's active leader in goals and points, Hannah Wilkinson. UT went undefeated in non-conference play (4-0-3) and finished in a three-way tie for ninth in SEC play (3-5-3).

Redshirt-senior goalkeeper Julie Eckel capped off a great career by earning All-SEC first-team honors. She led the SEC with eight shutouts and became the Vols' career leader in saves (335) and save percentage (.817). The Cordova, Tenn., native also finished her career as the program's all-time leader among goalkeepers in games played (81), games started (79) and minutes played (7,411:14).

In 2014, Pensky led Tennessee on an impressive late-season surge with four-straight wins in a 10-day span (Oct. 26 – Nov. 5), advancing the Big Orange to the SEC Tournament semifinals for the eighth time in program history. Tennessee defeated No. 21 Missouri, 3-0, at home on Oct. 26 before Cheyenne Spade's 108th-minute goal in the regular-season finale at Ole Miss punched UT's ticket to the SEC Tournament. Tennessee rallied back from a 2-0 deficit in the first round of the SEC Tournament to defeat Alabama, 3-2. In the SEC Tournament quarterfinals, Tennessee played No. 8 Florida to a 1-1 tie and advanced on penalty kicks, 5-4. Hannah Wilkinson and Allie Sirna earned NSCAA All-Region and All-SEC Tournament honors and Carlyn Baldwin was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

Pensky led UT to its third-consecutive and 14th overall winning season in 2013 with a record of 8-7-4. The team notched three wins over ranked opponents, including triumphs over eventual conference champions Texas A&M (SEC champion) and UCF (Conference USA champion). Strong leadership from the team's upperclassmen helped continue UT's tradition of excellence on the field, in the classroom and in the community. Senior forward Caroline Brown and junior back Allie Sirna garnered All-SEC honors and NSCAA Scholar All-Region accolades. Brown also earned Capital One Academic All-America second-team honors, making her the only two-time Academic All-American in UT history.

In Pensky's first year at Tennessee, the squad went 14-5-3 and made its 10th appearance in the NCAA Tournament. UT also outperformed preseason league expectations, finishing third in the SEC after the team was picked 11th in the SEC Preseason Coaches' Poll in August. The team's 0.69 goalsagainst average set a new program record and the Lady Vols

recorded 11 shutouts. UT also produced the longest shutout streak in school history with 533:22 of scoreless defense from Aug. 19 through Sept. 9. Tennessee finished at No. 18 in the final NCAA Women's Soccer RPI and the Lady Vols ranked 25th in the final Soccer America poll of 2012.

Sophomore forward and Pensky recruit Hannah Wilkinson was named a third-team NSCAA All-American and a first-team All-SEC selection in 2012. She became the fifth Lady Vol to be named an All-American (first, second or third team) and the fourth Lady Vol to garner NSCAA All-America honors.

Senior back Ali Hall was also an All-SEC and NSCAA All-South Region selection after leading one of the best defensive units in Tennessee soccer history.

Pensky was named head soccer coach at the University of Tennessee on Jan. 26, 2012 by vice-chancellor and director of athletics Dave Hart. Pensky took the helm at Tennessee after seven years as the head coach of the women's soccer program at the University of Maryland.

In 2010, Maryland earned the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, and Pensky was named both National Coach of the Year by Soccer America and ACC Coach of the Year. He served as the head coach of the Maryland women's soccer team from 2005-11 and posted a 67-52-20 overall record. While at the helm in College Park, Pensky led the Terrapins to their most successful three-year run in program history, with a 44-14-9 record and a .724 win percentage over the last three seasons.

Pensky guided Maryland to NCAA Tournament appearances in each of the last three consecutive seasons, including Sweet 16 appearances in both 2009 and 2011.

Along with 2011 national champions Stanford and Florida State, Maryland was one of only three programs that finished ranked in the Top 11 from 2009-11 in the NSCAA Coaches Poll, finishing 10th in 2010 and 11th in both 2009 and 2011. In 2010, Pensky guided Maryland to its best season in program history with an 18-2-3 (.848) overall ledger and a school-record 7-2-1 mark in the ACC. Additionally, co-captain Caitlin McDowell earned the 2010 ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year

Award.

Playing in a highly competitive conference, Pensky guided the Terps to their second-ever ACC Championship match in 2011. The Terrapins advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 with victories over Auburn and La Salle in the NCAA Tournament before falling to Oklahoma State. Additionally, during Stanford's 25-0-1 national championship season in 2011, the lone blemish was a 0-0 tie against Maryland on Aug. 26, 2011.

From 2009-11, Maryland posted a 15-10-5 record in the ACC, the first time the Terps recorded three consecutive seasons of .500 or better in conference play in program history.

Under Pensky's reign, Maryland defeated five top-10 programs including the Terps' first-ever victories over the most-storied program in college soccer history, North Carolina. The Terps defeated the 20-time NCAA Champions in 2010 and 2011.

The Terrapins had two players drafted by the Women's Professional Soccer (WPS) league: goalkeeper Mary Casey in 2010 by Los Angeles, and All-American forward Jasmyne Spencer in 2011 by Philadelphia. Spencer was twice a member of the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List, awarded annually to the national player of the year. She also became the fifth Maryland player to earn All-ACC accolades three times.

Before guiding the women's team, Pensky served as an assistant coach with the Maryland men's program, helping those Terrapins to three consecutive College Cup berths (2002-04). Working with head coach Sasho Cirovski, Pensky helped the Terps to a 57-14-3 record (.791 win percentage). The men captured the ACC Tournament title in 2002 and the regular-season crown in 2003. In 2004, CollegeSoccerNews. com named Pensky one of the top assistant coaches in the nation.

Prior to working under Cirovski for three seasons, where he was involved in all facets of the program, Pensky was an assistant at Loyola College in Maryland, where he helped the Greyhound women's team win the 2001 MAAC Conference Tournament and earn a bid to the NCAA Tournament in his one season with the program. He came to Loyola after spending three years as an assistant coach with the George Washington University women's soccer program.

Pensky holds a bachelor's degree in economics from Emory University in Atlanta (class of 1991), as well as an "A" license from the United States Soccer Federation, an NSCAA Premier and NSCAA goalkeeping diploma.

Pensky and his wife, Abby, have three children - boy-girl twins Will and Alex and their youngest son, Ben.



Bobby Shuttleworth came to Florida State after finishing a 14-year career in the MLS and has been named an assistant soccer coach by head coach Brian Pensky. Shuttleworth started his MLS career in 2009 after playing collegiately at Buffalo. During his 14-year career, he spent time with four different MLS clubs, most recently with Atlanta United in 2022. He made a total of 238 regular season and playoff appearances and ranks 13th all-time among MLS goalkeepers in regular season games played (232).

Shuttleworth finished his career with 81 wins in 14 seasons and recorded 53 clean sheets during his time in the professional ranks. He started his career with the New England Revolution where he played eight seasons. Shuttleworth played in 127 matches with 124 starts during his time with New England. In 2014 the Revolution finished fifth in the league standings and Shuttleworth helped lead them to the MLS Cup Final.

He then played two seasons with Minnesota United, a season with the Sacramento Republic and two seasons with the Chicago Fire before ending up in Atlanta for the 2022 season.

Shuttleworth's name is plastered all over the University of Buffalo's record book as he is first in career goals-against average (.80) and third in career wins (21). He finished the 2008 season with a .63 GAA good for second-best in school history and his .94 GAA in 2007 is good for 10th best in school history.

In his first season as an assistant coach at Florida State, Shuttleworth helped lead the Seminoles back to the College Cup for the 13th time in program history with a 17-3-3 record and was named part of the 2022 Atlantic Region Staff of the Year. The Noles won their ninth ACC Tournament Championship and fifth ACC Regular Season Championship. It marked just the third time in program history that the Noles won both the regular season and tournament championships.


The Noles were dominant all throughout the 2022 season, outscoring opponents 64-20 with 11 shutouts in 23 games. The Seminole defense finished the season with a 0.86 Goals Against Average with Shuttleworth in charge, tied for the 13th best season in school history. Under Shuttleworth's instruction, Cristina Roque was named the ACC's Goalkeeper of the Year and Third Team All-American.

In his first season as an assistant coach at Florida State, Brunner helped lead the Seminoles back to the College Cup for the 13th time in program history with a 17-3-3 record and was named part of the 2022 Atlantic Region Staff of the Year. The Noles won their ninth ACC Tournament Championship and fifth ACC Regular Season Championship. It marked just the third time in program history that the Noles won both the regular season and tournament championships.

The Noles were dominant all throughout the 2022 season, outscoring opponents 64-20 with 11 shutouts in 23 games. The 64 goals scored in a season were the sixth most in a season in program history. The Noles also scored 28 goals in 10 ACC games, the second most against ACC opponents in a season in program history. FSU was selected as the number one overall seed in the 2022 NCAA Tournament for the 11th time in school history and shut out three of its first four opponents in the NCAA Tournament on the way to the College Cup.

In his first season at FSU, Brunner coached two All-Americans on the offensive side of the ball (Jenna Nighswonger and Jody Brown).

Before joining the Richmond United/Strikers, Brunner spent nine years with Prince William SI. He started out on the Strikers' full-time girls ECNL coaching staff, before serving as the Richmond United Director of ECNL Operations. He coached multiple Richmond United ECNL Girls Teams, and holds his US Soccer A License, US Soccer Talent Scout License, and US Soccer National Youth License. Aaron was also the ECNL National Selection Director and is US Soccer National Coaching Education Instructor.

Prior to the Strikers, he was named the 2009 National Youth Coach of the Year, USYSA Region I Coach of the Year, and VYSA State Coach of the Year while at PWSI. He also coached for Seacoast United where he was also named NHYSA State Coach of the Year.

Brunner played at the University of New Hampshire and earned a BA in Psychology. He has a wife Kristin and their two children, Owen and Sophie.

2023 SEMINOLE SOCCER TEAM

SEMINOLE QUICK HITS

Florida State earned a bid to the NCAA Tournament as a No. 1 national seed. It marked the 24rd consecutive appearance in the NCAA postseason for the Seminoles and their 19th straight time as a national seed in the NCAA Tournament, FSU is one of eight schools all-time at the Division I level to post a streak of 24 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, four of those schools are on active streaks, including three from the ACC, led by North Carolina's 42 straight dating back to 1982.

Florida State is 93-20-17 in its last 130 games against teams in the ACC, including ACC Tournament and NCAA Tournament matches. The Seminoles have an impressive 20-2-4 record in their last 18 ACC Tournaments, earning titles from 2013-2016, 2018, and 2020-2023.

The 2023 Seminoles finished with 231 points on 75 goals and 81 assists. Defensively, FSU allowed a 0.61 goals-against average and conceded only 14 total goals. Florida State tallied 14 shutouts in its 23 matches. The Noles have had at least eight shutous in the last 19 seasons.

Florida State finished with a 9-0-1 record in the ACC to earn a second straight ACC Regular Season Championship. They went on to win their tenth ACC Tournament Championship. The Noles were led offensively by senior Onyi Echegini and freshman Jordynn Dudley who combined for 30 goals and 14 assists. Taylor Huff had an outstanding first season at FSU, leading the Seminoles with 14 assists. Seniors Beata Olsson and Jody Brown combined for 14 goals and 23 assists.

After another successful season, Onyi Echegini was recognized as one of the top players in the country. Echegini was named a finalist and won the MAC Hermann trophy after leading the team with 16 goals, the highest in the ACC. Echegini and Dudley were named First Team All-Americans by the United Soccer Coaches. Taylor Huff and Jody Brown picked up Second Team All-American honors while Cristina Roque took a second-straight Third Team All-American honor. Florida State dominated the ACC awards with Onyi Echegini earning ACC Offensive Player of the Year, Jordynn Dudley earning ACC Freshman of the Year, and Head Coach Brian Pensky earning his first ACC Coach of the Year honor.

Jordynn Dudley and Mimi Van Zanten were also named to the ACC All-Freshman Team.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Seminole Soccer Complex has provided guite the home field advantage for the Florida State soccer program with an all-time record of 245-32-14 (.865) in 25 seasons.

FSU has compiled eight home unbeaten seasons in program history - 2001 (8-0-0), 2006 (11-0-2), 2012 (14-0-0), 2013 (16-0-1), 2015 (12-0-1), 2016 (8-0-1), 2020 (4-0-0), 2021 (12-0-1), 2023 (11-0-0)

FSU has compiled home winning streaks of 21 (2011-13), 18 (2008-09) and 16 (2022-Present) straight home victories - the three longest home winning streaks in school history.

The Seminoles posted a 36-game home unbeaten streak from 2014 to 2017, which was just one game short of the 37-game home unbeaten streak set from 2011 to 2014.





LEAH GALLEGOS 2003 - SOCCER BUZZ

Leah Gallegos made Florida State history in 2003 becoming the first Seminole to garner first team All-America honors. The distinction was well deserved as she played a vital role in leading Florida State to its first College Cup appearance scoring golden goals in back-to-back overtime victories over Auburn and West Virginia in the second and third rounds, respectively. Gallegos started all 26 games for the Garnet and Gold

in 2003 finishing her sophomore campaign with 39 points on 18 goals and three assists. It was a record breaking season for the Los Angeles, Calif., native as she established single-season school records for goals (18), gamewinning goals (7), multi-goal games (5), shots (109) and shots on goal (60). She tied an FSU single-game record on October 27 with four goals and eight points in a win over Florida Atlantic. Following her second year at Florida State, Gallegos had scored more goals in her first two seasons (25) than any other player in school history. She went on to garner first team All-ACC accolades, while becoming the first Florida State player to receive All-America honors from the NSCAA (Third Team).



VIOLA ODEBRECHT 2005 - SOCCER BUZZ

In just one season, Viola Odebrecht made a lasting impression at Florida State joining former Seminole Leah Gallegos as the only Seminole to be named a first team All-American by any organization. Odebrecht started 24 games in 2005 finishing second on the team in game-winning goals (5), third in goals (9), points (26) and shots (50) and tied for third in assists with eight. It did not take long for the German junior

with eight. It did not take long for the German junior midfielder to make herself feel at home scoring the first goal of the 2005 season, the game-winner, in a 4-0 victory over Southern California in what was her first collegiate game. Odebrecht tallied three multi-point games including her first career hat trick as Florida State defeated Virginia Tech 3-0. She led a Seminole offensive attack that established new single-season marks for goals and points. Along with Selin Kuralay and India Trotter, Odebrecht formed the first Seminole trio to tally nine or more goals in one season for the first time in program history. Odebrecht earned a spot on the All-ACC first team and was a Soccer Buzz Player of the Year finalist. She also performed in the classroom as a member of the ACC All-Academic Team and ACC Honor Roll honoree.



SELIN KURALAY 2005 - SOCCER AMERICA 2006 - SOCCER BUZZ

Selin Kuralay earned the distinction as Florida State's first two-time, first team All-American claiming such honors from Soccer America and Soccer Buzz in 2005 and 2006, respectively. Kuralay had the most productive offensive season of any first-year Seminole in team history in 2005 with 41 points on 16 goals and nine assists. The Australian native recorded

either a game-winning goal (6) or game-winning assist (3) in nine of Florida State's school record 20 wins in 2005. She tallied five multi-goal games as a sophomore, while becoming the quickest player in FSU history to reach 10 goals doing so in the ninth game of the season. Kuralay finished the season becoming just the second player at Florida State to lead the team in every offensive category including points, goals, assists, game-winning goals, shots and shots on goal. In 2006, Kuralay led FSU in goals (13), points (29), shots (108) and game-winning goals (5) in 26 games. She began the season registering either a goal or an assist in the first five games. Kuralay was a two-time, first team All-ACC honoree. In 2006, Kuralay joined teammate India Trotter as FSU's first semifinalists for the MAC Hermann Trophy presented to the nation's top collegiate player. The Seminole forward was also a two-time Soccer Buzz Player of the Year finalist.



KELLY ROWLAND 2006 - NSCAA

Kelly Rowland earned first team All-America honors from the NSCAA in her final season at Florida State. She finished her Seminole career appearing in 95 games while establishing a school record for consecutive starts with 87, a mark that stands to this day. Rowland led the Seminoles to three College Cup appearances including trips in her final two seasons. During her senior campaign, Rowland tallied 14 points

on five goals and four assists in over 2,200 minutes of action. She finished second on the team with four game-winning goals including the lone tally in a 1-0 shutout victory over Illinois in the third round of the NCAA Tournament. Rowland will forever be part of Florida State history as she assisted on the first Seminole goal in College Cup play finding India Trotter for a goal against Notre Dame in 2006. The Seminole defender was a two-time, second team All-ACC honoree and was named to the 2006 ACC and NCAA All-Tournament teams. Rowland earned a spot on the 2006 ACC All-Academic Team and was a two-time ACC Academic Honor Roll honoree. The Wallingford, Pa., native was the recipient of the ACC Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Scholarship in 2006.



INDIA TROTTER 2006 - NSCAA & SOCCER AMERICA

India Trotter garnered first team All-America honors from the NSCAA and Soccer America as a senior in 2006. After receiving second team NSCAA All-America honors in 2005, Trotter became the first two-time NSCAA All-American in school history. In her final season at Florida State, Trotter registered 19 points on eight goals and three assists in 26 games. She led the Seminoles to three appearances in the College

Cup including trips in her final two seasons and was named to the NCAA All-Tournament team in 2003, 2005 and 2006. Among her eight goals during her senior year, two came against 2006 National Champion North Carolina. Trotter will forever be part of Florida State history as she scored the first Seminole goal in College Cup play finding the back of the net against Notre Dame in 2006. She finished her career as Florida State's all-time leader in games played and the leading scorer in the NCAA Tournament tallying more goals, points and game-winning goals than any Seminole in postseason play. In 2006, Trotter joined teammate Selin Kuralay as FSU's first seminalists for the MAC Hermann Trophy presented to the nation's top collegiate player. As a member of the All-ACC first team in 2006, the Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., native became FSU's first three-time All-ACC honoree. Trotter was also named one of four finalists for the Honda Award in 2006.



MAMI YAMAGUCHI* 2007 - NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR; SOCCER BUZZ, SOCCER AMERICA, NSCAA

Mami Yamaguchi became the most decorated player in Florida State soccer history in 2007 as the winner of the MAC Hermann Trophy, presented to the top female player in NCAA Division I soccer, and the school's first consensus first team All-American. Yamaguchi claimed the top individual honor after leading the

country in points (66), while finishing second in goals (24) and assists (18). She concluded the season as the only student-athlete in the nation to rank in the top 10 in three major offensive categories including points per game, goals per game and assists per game. In the 2007 NCAA Tournament, she paced the Seminoles with three goals and eight assists as her assist total set the all-time postseason school mark. The junior forward played a vital role in leading the Seminoles to their first appearance in the national championship game that same year. Yamaguchi began the 2007 season registering a point in her first 10 games, while setting the school record by scoring at least one goal in seven consecutive contests. She finished the season registering a point in 22 of 26 games for the Seminoles. By year's end, Yamaguchi held the FSU single-season records for points, goals and assists. She also set the school record for points in ACC play with 15. During the 27-game schedule in 2007, Yamaguchi registered 12 multi-point performances to lead the ACC. She tallied three hat tricks that year to become the first Seminole to register three three-goal games in a career. In 2007, the Tokyo, Japan native was also recognized as the NSCAA Player of the Year and the ACC Offensive Player of the Year as well as earning first team All-ACC recognition.

VIII: & SUCCER



AMANDA DACOSTA 2008 - NSCAA & SOCCER BUZZ

Amanda DaCosta joined Leah Gallegos and Sanna Talonen as the only student-athletes in Florida State history to earn All-America honors as a sophomore. DaCosta finished the season fifth on the team in points with four goals and six assists. The Katonah, N.Y., native was involved in six game-winning situations in 2008 with two game-winning goals and a team-high four game-winning assists. She notched the first

multi-goal game of her career in the season opener against UCF scoring two first half goals, while tying a career-high with four points. The sophomore midfielder finished the season with three multi-point performances. She was fourth on the team in shots with 43 as she tallied at least one shot in 18 straight contests. DaCosta went on to receive first team All-ACC accolades in 2008 marking the only Seminole to repeat as an all-conference honoree from 2007. She was also named a MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List candidate and a finalist for Soccer Buzz Player of the Year, while adding second team MVP honors to her list of accolades in 2008.



SANNA TALONEN 2008 - SOCCER AMERICA & SOCCER BUZZ

Sanna Talonen joined Leah Gallegos and Amanda DaCosta as the only student-athletes in Florida State history to earn All-America honors as a sophomore. Talonen had a stellar season in 2008 finishing the year as the team leader in points (36), goals (16) and game-winning goals (6) en route to earning first team All-ACC accolades. At one point during the year, Talonen registered a goal in six straight games, the

second longest streak in school history. She wreaked havoc away from home in her two seasons at Florida State notching 32 career points on the road, while 11 of her 16 goals in 2008 came away from home. On the career charts, Talonen sits first all-time at FSU in game-winning goals (12) and multi-goal games (9). She also set the single-season school record for points and goals in ACC play with 19 and nine, respectively. With two goals and an assist against Mississippi Valley State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, Talonen became the all-time leader at Florida State for points (22) and goals (10) in postseason play. The Finnish native was named a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy and finalist for Soccer Buzz Player of the Year in 2008, while being named a first team MVP and a second team All-American by Soccer America and the NSCAA, respectively.



TIFFANY McCARTY* 2009 - NSCAA, SOCCER AMERICA & TOPDRAWERSOCCER; 2011 - SOCCER AMERICA

Tiffany McCarty was named a consensus first team All-American by the NSCAA, Soccer Amercia and TopDrawerSoccer.com in 2009 following an outstanding sophomore campaign. The Laurel, Md., native finished the season with 41 points on 17 goals and seven assists. She led the team in goals, shots

(67) and a shots on goal percentage of .716, while closing out the year as the ACC leader in goals scored and second in points. She set the single-season record for points in ACC play in 2009 with 20 on eight goals and four assists. McCarty was tabbed ACC Offensive Player of the Year joining Mami Yamaguchi as the only two Seminole student-athletes to earn the honor. At the time, she became just the sixth player in conference history to earn both Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year accolades and is just the second player in the ACC to win Player of the Year honors a year after being named Freshman of the Year (Lindsay Tarpley, North Carolina, 2002-03). In 2011, McCarty set career-highs for points (42), goals (18), shots (80) and GWGs (41), while becoming the school's all-time career leader in points, goals and shots. The speedy forward finished ranked in the top 10 in the ACC in four offensive categories. She started all 26 games in 2011 and played a key role in leading FSU to its fifth College Cup appearance and its first ACC Championship.



TONI PRESSLEY 2010 - SOCCER AMERICA

Toni Pressley earned first team All-America distinction by Soccer America in 2010. The Melbourne, Fla., native finished the season with 10 points on four goals and two assists, while serving as the leader on the Seminole backline. Pressley kicked a team high three game-winning goals, including the game-winning goal against USF in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. She finished the year as

an All-ACC first team member, while garnering third team All-America honors from the NSCAA and fourth team accolades from TopDrawerSoccer. com. Pressley helped lead the Seminoles to the top ranked defense in the ACC allowing a conference low 14 goals during the regular season including five against league foes. After making it to the NCAA Quarterfinals for the third time in her career, the Seminole defense finished the season with the third lowest goals against average in school history at 0.85 allowing only 20 goals in 23 games of action.



BECKY EDWARDS 2008 & 2009 - NSCAA

Becky Edwards became FSU's second two-time, first team All-American by the NSCAA. The Downingtown, Pa., native had a breakout year in her final season at Florida State in 2009 starting all 25 games for the Seminoles in 2009. Edwards finished third on the team in points (18) recording career-highs in points, goals (5) and shots (46). She tied a career-high with eight assists, a mark she established as a freshman

back in 2006. The senior captain finished her Seminole career tied for fifth all-time in appearances with 95, while sitting sixth in career starts with 89. Edwards tallied 20 assists over her four year career, tied for sixth all-time at FSU, including eight game-winners. She earned first team All-ACC accolades as a senior and became the school's first CoSIDA Academic All-American earning third team honors in 2009. In 2008, Edwards appeared in 17 games while making 12 starts and tallied three points on a goal and an assist in over 1,300 minutes of action. Edwards played an integral role in the Seminole backline which gave up just 15 goals all season, the fewest allowed in school history. She was also part of the defensive unit that put together four consecutive shutout victories in league play for the first time in school history. The Seminole defense finished the 2008 season ranked ninth nationally in shutout percentage (.609) and 18th in goals against average (0.632). Edwards went on to claim a gold medal in 2008 as a member of the U.S. U-20 Women's National Team that captured the FIFA Youth World Cup in Chile.



INES JAURENA 2012 - NSCAA & SOCCER AMERICA

Ines Jaurena became the 12th Seminole to earn first team All-America accolades as she earned the honor from both the NSCAA and Soccer America in 2012. The French native started all 24 games in the backline for Florida State in leading the Seminoles to the College Cup for the second consecutive year and sixth time overall. FSU's defense ranked as one of the nation's best in 2012 finishing the year ranked in the top 40 in

shutout percentage (2nd - 0.708), goals against average (12th - .619) and save percentage (36th - .839). The Seminoles set the school-record for shutouts (17) and the lowest goals against average (0.62), while tying the record for the fewest goals allowed with 15. Offensively, Jaurena ranked sixth on the team with 11 points on four goals and three assists including a career-high three game-winning goals. She tallied the second most minutes played on the team with 2,114. The senior defender wrapped up a stellar playing career at Florida State as a three-time all-conference honoree earning first team All-ACC accolades in 2011 and 2012. Along with her first team All-America recognition, Jaurena was named a finalist for the Honda Award and a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy in 2012.



KASSEY KALLMAN* 2013 - NSCAA, SOCCER AMERICA & TOPDRAWERSOCCER

In 2013, Kassey Kallman was named a first team All-American by the NSCAA, Soccer America and TopDrawerSoccer.com becoming just the third Seminole in program history to be recognized as a consensus All-American. Kallman added ACC Defensive Player of the Year accolades and garnered Most Valuable Player honors in leading Florida State to its

second ACC Championship title in three years. She was also honored as a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy and a finalist for both the Honda Award and the Senior CLASS Award. A three-time all-conference honoree, Kallman was named to the All-ACC first team for the second straight year. She started all 28 games in leading Florida State to a berth in the national championship game for the second time in school history. The senior defender was part of the Seminole backline that finished the season ranked in the top 25 nationally in goals against average (11th - .551) and shutout percentage (23rd - 0.536). She also guided FSU to 15 shutouts as the Seminoles closed out the 2013 campaign allowing just 16 goals, the third fewest allowed in school history.



DAGNY BRYNJARSDOTTIR* 2013 - SOCCER AMERICA 2014* - NSCAA, SOCCER AMERICA & TOPDRAWERSOCCER

The fourth two-time, first team All-American in Florida State history, Dagny Brynjarsdottir earned the distinction following a spectacular senior campaign that resulted in the Seminoles' first national championship in program history. The Icelandic native

finished the 2014 season leading the Seminoles in points (38), goals (16) and shots (87), all single-season career-highs, in 23 matches en route to earning consensus first team All-America honors. Brynjarsdottir was also the runner-up for the MAC Hermann Trophy, a finalist for the Honda Sports Award and garnered ACC Offensive Player of the Year, first-team All-ACC and ACC Tournament MVP accolades. She went on to become the first Seminole to claim Soccer America Player of the Year and NSCAA Scholar Player of the Year honors. As a junior, Brynjarsdottir started 25 matches in guiding Florida State to a national runner-up finish. She led the team in points (33), goals (14), shots (74), shots on goal (37) and game-winning goals (7). In 2013, Brynjarsdottir also went on to garner first team All-ACC and ACC All-Tournament honors and was recognized as a first team All-American by Soccer America and on TopDrawerSoccer.com's Best XI second team.



KRISTIN GRUBKA* 2014 - NSCAA, SOCCER AMERICA & TOPDRAWERSOCCER

Kristin Grubka was named a consensus first team All-American by the NSCAA, Soccer America and TopDrawerSoccer.com after leading the Seminoles to their first national title in school history in 2014. Grubka anchored Florida State's defensive efforts that did not concede a goal in six NCAA Tournament

matches while finishing the year ranked in the top five nationally in goals against average (2nd - 0.341) and shutout percentage (4th - 0.731). The Seminoles allowed just nine goals in 2014 with two coming against ACC competition. Both marks set school records for the fewest goals allowed and the fewest goals allowed in league play. FSU also went on to set the school record with 19 shutouts. For her efforts, Grubka was named a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy and was recognized as the ACC Defensive Player of the Year. She also garnered first team All-ACC honors during her senior campaign. Grubka concluded her Florida State career as the school's all-time career leader in appearances with 104, while establishing a new program record with 89 consecutive starts.



CHEYNA WILLIAMS 2014 - SOCCER AMERICA

Cheyna Williams was named a first team All-American by Soccer America in 2014 as she made an immediate impact during her first season at Florida State. Williams finished the year ranked second on the team in points (34), goals (14) and shots (76) and tied for first with five game-winning goals. During FSU's postseason run that culminated in the program's first national championship, Williams was lights out with

a team-best 13 points on six goals and one assist. She scored both goals in FSU's 2-0 victory over Stanford in the national semifinals and then assisted on the game-winning goal in the 83rd minute against Virginia in the national championship game. The Hampton, Ga., native ranked in the top 35 nationally in game-winning goals (t-27th), goals (t-29th) and points (t-32nd), while ranking in the top 10 in the ACC in eight offensive categories. Williams was also recognized as a third team All-American by the NSCAA and was named the College Cup's Most Outstanding Player on Offense.



MEGAN CONNOLLY 2015 - NSCAA

Megan Connolly became the first Florida State freshman to earn First Team All-America honors in 2015 as the Ireland native burst on to the collegiate scene, leading the Seminoles with 28 points on nine goals and 10 assists. She missed three games due to international appearances with the Ireland National Team, but still placed in the Top 10 of the ACC in six different categories, including assists (2nd - 10),

points (6th - 28) and goals (T-10th - 9). Connolly was named TopDrawerSoccer National Freshman of the Year, ACC Midfielder of the Year, ACC Freshman of the Year, a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy and also received several weekly accolades from the conference and TDS. She scored at least one point in 14 of 22 matches on the season, including four points on one goal and two assists against No. 7 Clemson, two goals against UCF and three points each with a goal and an assist against No. 3 Texas A&M and Louisville.



CASSIE MILLER* 2016 - NSCAA, TOPDRAWERSOCCER

Cassie Miller received All-ACC Second Team honors for the third consecutive season in 2016 as the redshirt junior led the conference, and finished fifth nationally, in both shutouts (13) and goals-against average (0.398). Her 0.866 save percentage ranked No. 18 overall in the NCAA, and third in the ACC, including key penalty kick saves in a victory over No. 4 Duke in the regular season and versus No. 6 Duke and No. 10 UNC

in the ACC Tournament as the Noles captured their fourth conference crown in a row. Miller is the second FSU goalkeeper to be named an All-American, joining Kelsey Wys who was selected to the third team in 2012.



DEYNA CASTELLANOS 2019 - TOPDRAWERSOCCER

Deyna Castellanos received her third consecutive All-ACC First Team honor in 2019. As a senior, she led the Seminoles in both goals (12) and assists (11) as she racked up 35 points in 2019. Castellanos led the conference in shots per game, while finished eighth in points per game and sixth in goals per game. She finished the season in the top-30 in the country in game-winning goals, shots per game, shots on goal per game, total points, and assists. Castellanos left Florida State second

all-time in points, goals and shots on goal. She leads FSU in shots, and game winning goals. She was named ACC Midfielder and Offensive Player of the Year for the first time in her career and was selected as a second team All-American by the United Soccer Coaches

Malia Berkely helped anchor the Seminole defense in 2019, while she finished first on the team in minutes with 2,214, missing only eight minutes the entire season. She helped lead the Seminole defense to 10 shutouts in 2019, including two in the NCAA Tournament. She recorded two goals and four assist

coming up from the centerback position as an offensive threat. She was named a MAC Hermann Award Semifinalist and to the All-ACC First team. She was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Year and was a part of the United Soccer Coaches All-Atlantic Region First Team. Berkely was a part of the TopDrawerSoccer Best XI Third Team.

Berkely started all 11 games in the fall of 2020 for the Seminoles, helping them to their seventh ACC Tournament title. She anchored the defensive backline from her center-back position that held opponents to six goals in 11 games. The Seminoles recorded seven shutouts in the fall, including shutouts in the first four games of the season. Berkely was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Year and to the All-ACC First Team in the fall. She became the first player in ACC history to win back-to-back Player of the Year honors. Berkely was also named a MAC Hermann Trophy finalist.



JAELIN HOWELL 2020 - UNITED SOCCER COACHES 2021 - UNITED SOCCER COACHES

Howell has started in all 16 games for the Seminoles during the 2020 season as their starting holding midfielder. She has helped anchor a backline that has recorded 10 shutouts in 16 games and only allowed eight goals all season. Howell has also made her presence known on the offensive end as she

has scored five goals to go with a pair of assists. She was named the ACC's Midfielder of the Year and to the All-ACC First Team in the fall. Howell was announced as the Seminoles second every MAC Hermann Award Winner. The MAC Hermann is presented annually to the most outstanding male and female players of the year.

Howell was named a First Team All-American after playing in all 25 games during the 2021 season, starting in 23 of them at the holding midfielder position. She was named the MAC Hermann Award winner for the second straight season becoming the sixth player to win the award twice. Howell was also named the Honda Award winner. She won her second national championship as she made her third appearance in the national championship game in four years. Jaelin helped anchor a backline that recorded 14 shutouts in 25 games and only allowed 13 goals all season. Howell also made her presence known on the offensive end as she scored three goals to go with four assists. She scored the game-winner in the semifinals against Rutgers in the 71st minute. The Lone Tree, Colorado native was named to the United Soccer Coaches All-Atlantic Region First Team and was named a United Soccer Coaches First Team All-American both for the second consecutive season. Howell was also named to the TopDrawerSoccer Best XI First team and was rated the No. 2 player in the country by TopDrawerSoccer in the end of season top-100. Howell was named to the All-ACC First Team and the ACC's Midfielder of the Year for the second straight season. She is the first student-athlete to earn the honor twice. She also helped lead the Seminoles to their eighth ACC Tournament title. Howell capped off her senior season by helping lead Florida State to its third national title in soccer and the second during her four-year career at FSU. Howell was picked second overall in the NWSL Draft by Racing Louisville.



EMILY MADRIL 2021 - UNITED SOCCER COACHES

Madril was named a First Team All-American, after being named a Second Team All-American a season ago. She has started in all 25 games during the 2021 season for the Seminoles as their starting centerback. Madril played in all but 19 minutes for the Garnet and Gold. She has helped lead the Seminoles' defense to 14 shutouts in 25 games. The Noles only allowed

13 goals all season, allowing only 52 shots on goal. She has also helped the Seminoles on offense, scoring three of FSU's 66 goals this season. Madril was named to the AII-ACC First Team and was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Year.



JENNA NIGHSWONGER 2022 - UNITED SOCCER COACHES

Nighswonger put together one of the best seasons in school history in 2022. Nighswonger started 22 out of the 23 games for the Seminoles and recorded six goals while adding an ACC-leading 16 assists. Her 16 assists were the second-most assists in FSU history. Nighswonger was named to a First Team All-ACC honoree, a MAC Hermann Trophy Finalist and a

Honda Sport Award Finalist. Nighswonger was also named the United Soccer Coaches Scholar Player of the Year and the ACC Scholar Athlete of the Year. Nighswonger helped the Seminoles to another ACC Championship as she tallied a goal and an assist in the title game against North Carolina earning her ACC Tournament MVP. Nighswonger ended her career with 34 career assists which was also the second-most in school history. Nighswonger ended her career with 72 points which was the ninth-most in school history.

As parents of FSU graduates, Marion and Lou adopted FSU and this scholarship serves as a lasting memory of their love and admiration for this University.



Enthusiastic Tallahassee business leaders formed the first Seminole Boosters organization in the summer of 1951. Their purpose was to support an ambitious Seminole football program rapidly growing in popularity. A brand new stadium and increasing program costs motivated the Boosters to make fundraising their first priority, a priority that remains their primary purpose.

Today, Seminole Boosters, Inc. is one of the leading collegiate athletic fundraising organizations in America. Contributors account for more than \$13 million in annual funds, plus at least \$10 million per year in capital gifts. The Seminole Boosters Scholarship Endowment has nearly \$50 million under management, and the Boosters are involved with a wide range of enterprises including affinity programs, logos & licensing, gameday parking, concessions, the University Center Club, skybox management and the construction of athletic facilities.

Florida State Athletics provides each of our men's and women's teams with the maximum number of scholarships allowed by the NCAA. In addition to the field competitors, scholarships are also provided to student trainers, managers and graduate assistants who are vital to an athletic program.

The last 20 years have seen a threefold rise in the cost of athletic scholarships at Florida State. Today, more than \$350,000 is needed to permanently endow a Florida State athletic scholarship. Most of the top public universities with whom Florida State competes and to whom we are compared, have endowed all of their athletic scholarships.

Established in 1986 under the direction of William M. Parker of Clearwater, the Seminole Boosters Endowed Scholarship Program is the final step toward perpetual funding of all scholarships for student-athletes at Florida State. Those individuals who contribute to the endowment fund for athletic scholarships at Florida State University gain membership in the Seminole Heritage Foundation.

Thanks to the efforts of former FSU President Talbot "Sandy" D'Alemberte, Les and Ruth Akers, Charles and Diane Morris, Hunter McIntosh, Brent Sembler and Louis and Marion Taormina an effort has now begun to ensure the endowment of the Florida State soccer program.

RICHARD McCULLOUGH University President

Richard McCullough became the 16th president of Florida State University on Aug. 16, 2021, bringing more than 30 years of academic research and leadership experience to the role as well as a commitment to innovation, entrepreneurship, and diversity, equity and inclusion.

Prior to joining FSU, McCullough had served as vice provost for research and professor of materials science and engineering at Harvard University since 2012. In this role, he oversaw the development, review and implementation of strategies, planning, and policies related to academic research. In addition, he led an office of Foundation and Corporate Engagement and assisted in the oversight of more than 25 interdisciplinary institutes, centers and initiatives across the university.

During his tenure, McCullough successfully built and launched the new Harvard Data Science Initiative, a collaboration between 12 of the university's schools and more than 120 faculty, which led to the creation of three new master's programs and many new undergraduate courses.

McCullough developed and launched a new structural biology program and cryo-electron microscope facility that partners Harvard Medical School with three Boston-area hospitals. He also led the development of a new \$100 million, multi-institution collaboration to build the Advanced Biological Innovation and Manufacturing Center and Facility, which will be a hub for medical research and education, as well as economic and workforce development.

Previously, McCullough spent 22 years at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh, where he began his academic career as an assistant professor of chemistry in

1990 and became the Thomas Lord Professor of Chemistry in 2009. He was promoted to head of the chemistry department in 1998 and then served as dean of the Mellon College of Science from 2001 to 2007 before becoming the university's vice president for research.

McCullough, who holds multiple patents and is the founder of two companies, has a rich background in entrepreneurship and innovation. At Carnegie Mellon, he developed a vibrant innovation ecosystem, including the Greenlighting Startups Initiative that exponentially increased the generation of university spin-out companies and corporate engagement. In 2013, he was elected a fellow of the National Academy of Inventors.

A staunch champion of diversity, McCullough created a diverse pipeline of Black/ African American, Laxtinx and other underrepresented minority academics from both his research lab and as the founding creator of the Future Faculty Workshop: Diverse Leaders of Tomorrow, an annual workshop that helps diverse postdoctoral fellows and students obtain academic jobs. Now in its 15th year, the workshop has facilitated placing more than 50 underrepresented minority professors in the United States.

McCullough is the author of numerous peer-reviewed articles and serves on the editorial boards of several academic journals, including Advanced Materials. He has been an innovation, entrepreneurship, and technology transfer advisor to Oxford University, Princeton University and Washington University at St. Louis.

A first-generation college student from Mesquite, Texas, McCullough attended Eastfield Community College before earning a bachelor's degree in chemistry from the University of Texas at Dallas in 1982 and a doctoral degree in organic chemistry from Johns Hopkins University in 1988. McCullough also spent two years as a postdoctoral fellow at Columbia University in New York.

He and his wife, Jai Vartikar, have two children, Jason and Dylan, daughter-in-law, Sarah Christian, and two granddaughters, Gladys and Archer.
