

≡1988 SOFTBALL OUTLOOK:≡ COVERING ALL THE ANGLES

In the 1987 softball season, the Florida State Lady Seminoles burst upon the national scene with their first appearance in the Women's College World Series. In this, the 1988 season, FSU is covering all the angles to once again achieve that prominence.

Last season was a monumental one which set many precedents in FSU softball history. The team accomplished the highest ranking by an FSU fast-pitch team, won an FSU-hosted regional playoff leading to a College World Series appearance, tied a school-record 50 wins and produced the first fast-pitch All-American in short-stop Tiffany Daniels.

Letting bygones be bygones, 10th-year head coach JoAnne Graf is not one to rest on past accomplishments. "Last season was just the beginning," says Graf, who picked up her 400th career win along the way. "We became a national name in 1987 and moved into the top 10. Now our goal is to be in the top five. It will be a challenge to improve, but that's a challenge we're willing to face."

Working toward the goal, the Lady Seminoles are laden with talent. Five starters and the pitching duo of senior Julie Larsen and sophomore Debbie DeJohn, which ranked sixth in the nation, return to provide the backbone of the team. Florida State also produced a banner recruiting year, signing four talented west coast players.

"We've got talent to improve from last year," says Graf. "What we really have working for us this season is much more leadership. At times in the past, that has hurt us. With good leadership, it will provide the team with confidence in crucial situations."

With the intangibles covered, here is how the tangible aspects of the Lady Seminoles shape up:

INFIELD—FSU's infield will be an experienced one with three starters returning. Junior first baseman Lori Crouse returns after setting a school mark with 399 putouts last year. Junior Tiffany Daniels returns at shortstop after earning second team All-American honors and at third, senior Jill Bellamy is back after an impressive junior season at the hot corner. Giving the Lady Seminoles a shot in the arm at second base will be freshman Kelly Flaczinski. At a position where Florida State has been minus a solid starter for several years, Flaczinski has been awarded the position by her efforts during fall practice. Providing backup in the infield will be walk-ons Sherri Owens and Bonnie Evans. Seminoles also hope for the return of Debbie Smith, a member of the FSU 1986 squad.

OUTFIELD—Florida State's outfield suffered the loss of two starters but it has been revamped and should not skip a beat. Returning in left field will be the strongarmed Kari Keith. Centerfield will be occupied by Sandy Martinez, a quick junior college transfer from Rancho Santiago Community College in California. Splitting time in right field will be returner Daphne Russell and freshman Christy Larsen. Larsen will also be called on to play other positions where needed as well as pitch. In reserve, walk-on Shawnda Corbin is available along with Owens.



Lady Seminole Field will be the site of 14 home dates this season as well as the 17-team Lady Seminole Invitational, the weekend of March 18-20.

PITCHING—If it's pitching that wins in fast-pitch softball, the Lady Seminoles should have no problem in that department. Florida State returns both ends of its highly successful pitching tandem of 1987. Senior Julie Larsen and sophomore Debbie DeJohn combined for a national ranking of sixth in the NCAA leaders with an earned run average of 0.59. Individually, Larsen returned as one of the nation's strikeout leaders with 6.6 per seven innings and was also among the leaders with 25 victories and an 0.65 ERA. DeJohn burst upon the collegiate scene with a bang and was ranked 12th in the country with an ERA of 0.51. Her 25 wins were the most by an FSU freshman. Add to that combo freshman Christy Larsen, a highly successful high school pitcher, and it makes the FSU pitching corps even more powerful.

OFFENSE-If the combined average of the eight returnees in the FSU lineup is a measure of things to come, the Lady Seminole offensive attack will thrive. As a unit, the returnees combined for a .272 batting average, led by All-American shortstop Tiffany Daniels who set school records in nine offensive categories. Also adding offensive punch was Kari Keith, who hit .298, and a rejuvenated Jill Bellamy who turned in a .282 batting average. Graf has confidence in 1988's projected output from the plate. "We've got strong hitting from top to bottom in our lineup," she says. "Everyone on the team can hit well. Last year we slumped toward the end of the season. That's something we have to avoid, but it's not something that is planned." Florida State will get a boost in speed from junior college transfer Sandy Martinez and freshman Christy Larsen to add to the base stealing threat of Daniels and Keith. Graf also hopes for added power from outfielder Daphne Russell and freshman Julie Rice.

OVERALL—Coach JoAnne Graf is convinced that the future is bright for her 1988 squad. "The best thing about our team is the people we have in leadership roles," she says. "That will help up out in crucial situations and give the team someone to rally around. I am also pleased with the fact that our infield has worked together and has confidence in each other. Our pitching staff ranks up there with the best in the country; I would not trade it for any other. Although we lost some key people, we've got some new kids who are ready to contribute. We've got talent to improve from last year. Florida State will be one to keep an eye on in 1988."

COACHING STAFF

JOANNE GRAF **Head Coach**

Entering her 10th year at the helm of the Florida softball team, JoAnne Graf has guided the Lady Seminoles to an elite position among the country's best and has taken steps to insure FSU



a place in the national spotlight.

Graf, who claimed her 400th career win in 1987, is the proud owner of an .815 career winning percentage-all of her FSU teams have won better than 60 per cent of its games. In her last seven seasons, the Lady Seminoles have captured no less than 40 victories per season.

Since a switch to the game of fast-pitch softball, the Lady Seminoles have continued the winning softball tradition that saw FSU win back-to-back slow-pitch national titles in 1981 and 1982. The quest to achieve the same feat in the fast-pitch arena has been a successful one as Graf has a 183-38-4 record since 1984. Florida State made its initial appearance in the Women's College World Series in 1987 and Graf called that feat a starting point.

"Florida State has now become a top 10 team and is recognized nationally," says Graf. "It is now our goal to become a top five team. We are always trying to improve."

Graf, who was voted the South Region Coach-of-the-Year in 1986 after leading the Lady Seminoles to their first NCAA post season tournament, has seen 13 of her players elected to NCAA South All-Region teams. In 1987, Florida State produced its first All-American in shortstop Tiffany Daniels.

A 1975 graduate of Florida State, Graf returned to her alma mater after two years at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro where she earned her master's degree in physical education. Graf also worked in the athletic department as head coach for the University's men's and women's swim teams and assistant softball coach.

Graf, who serves as director of the Florida State softball camp each summer, is a former president of the Florida Collegiate Athletic Association. She is also a member of the NCAA Softball Committee and chairwoman of the NCAA softball advisory committee for the South region.

She is presently seeking her doctorate in administration.

ALICIA O'DONNELL **Assistant Coach**

Coach Alicia O'Donnell begins her second season for Florida State after taking on a much more detailed role than expected in her first season with the Lady Seminoles.

O'Donnell, originally hired as a graduate assistant to work with FSU's pitchers, was elevated to the position of assistant coach soon after her arrival. In addition to keeping the Lady Seminole pitching staff among the country's leaders, O'Donnell also took on first base coaching duties. Her efforts did not go unnoticed and the pitching corps ranked sixth in the country in 1987 with an 0.51 ERA.

Prior to her arrival at Florida State, O'Donnell worked with the pitching staff at Mississippi State until its softball program was discontinued. She enjoyed a successful collegiate pitching career at the University of LaVerne (CA), posting a 70-36 career record and was twice named team MVP. She also earned second team all-conference honors in the highly competitive Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC) her junior and senior years.

A graduate of LaVerne in Health, Physical Education and Recreation, O'Donnell is working towards a master's degree at FSU in the department of movement science.

SHERRI JENNINGS **Graduate Assistant**

Sherri Jennings joins the Lady Seminole coaching

staff in 1988 as a graduate assistant coach, working specifically with Florida State outfielders. Jennings, a native of

Pensacola, FL, played collegiate softball at Pensacola Junior College and Mississippi State University. During her sophomore season at PJC where she served as team captain, Jennings was named the Physical Education Department Athlete of the Year as well as the MVP of the state tournament. Continuing her success at Mississippi State, Jennings was team captain and MVP in both 1985 and 1986.

Jennings received her bachelor's of science degree at Mississippi State in fitness management and is currently working on a master's degree in physiology at FSU.




JILL BELLAMY, Senior, Third Base, Huntington Beach, CA




