


33 WENDY BRAYE CATCHER - FRESHMAN ARVADA, CO



# Review of 1993 Season

Returning six starters in the field and their top two pitchers, FSU opened the season ranked sixth in the nation. The Tribe began the year with 21 straight wins, four shy of the school record set the previous year. Heading into the College World Series, the 1993 club had the second best record in school history (52-7, .881 winning percentage).

After dropping their first game at the regional to Kansas, 1-0 in 10 innings, FSU rallied to win three straight games and advance to the CWS for the fourth straight season and fifth time in seven years. The Tribe survived a 15 inning marathon with Iowa, outlasting the Hawkeyes 5-3 to advance to the championship round. Florida State beat Kansas twice on Sunday to move on to Oklahoma City. Toni Gutierrez blasted a three-run homer to spark a five-run eighth inning in taking a 5-0 first-game win. FSU advanced to the Series when Laurie Shepard singled home Jennie Dillmore in the bottom of the seventh of game two for a 2-1 win.

The Tribe also won their second straight Atlantic Coast Conference Softball title when they defeated Virginia 4-2 in the final. The win was also Coach Dr. JoAnne Graf's 700th in her career at Florida State. The championship capped a remarkable day for the Lady Seminoles. After losing the day's first game 1-0 to Virginia, FSU dropped to the losers bracket. In their first elimination game, Florida State whipped Georgia Tech 11-0. Then sophomore Heather Feltmann provide the day's most dramatic moment when she hit the first home run of her career, a two-run shot in the top of the eleventh inning, to give FSU a 2-0 victory over Virginia and push the tourney to a final game. Senior, Toni Gutierrez pitched a complete game and hit a home

run to give the Tribe a 4-2 win and its second straight ACC crown.

As always, Florida State's schedule was demanding but the Lady Seminoles responded with an 14-5 record against teams ranked in the nation's Top 20 and a 3-2 mark against teams in the CWS field.

Florida State was eliminated after two games in the College World Series. Oklahoma State defeated the Lady Seminoles 5-2 in game one and Connecticut beat FSU 2-1 in the second game.

Records, both NCAA and school, were claimed by several Lady Seminoles last season. Junior Rebecca Aase extended her NCAA record for consecutive victories to 50 games before finally losing 6-4 to South Carolina. The pitching staff of Aase, Gutierrez, and Marla Looper put together a string of 124 2/3 scoreless innings, including 17 straight shutouts, to break the previous NCAA mark of 72 innings set in 1992 by Connecticut.

Five all-time school records were established and one was equaled. Senior right fielder, Susan Buttery set Florida State's career records in at-bats (767), runs scored (170), and hits (245) during the course of the season, while senior center fielder, Leslie Barton broke the all-time mark in stolen bases (66) and runs batted in (131) and tied the record for doubles (23).



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

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
