

THE NATION'S NEWEST SPORT

- The NCAA added Beach Volleyball to its list of championship sports in 2016. It became the 90th and newest national championship sport recognized by the NCAA.
- The Seminoles reached the finals at the NCAA Championship in Gulf Shores, Ala. for the second time in May 2018, finishing with a school-record 33 wins as the national runner-ups.
- · Florida State introduced what was then called sand volleyball as its 20th varsity sport in the spring of 2012 and competed as an emerging NCAA sport for four seasons.
- The sport changed names from sand to beach volleyball as it is known as the latter at all other levels of play throughout
- Beach volleyball is the fastest-growing NCAA sport with 99 colleges and universities sponsoring the sport as of January 2018.

AN ELITE PROGRAM

- Since the inception of the program in 2012, Florida State has advanced to the AVCA Championships in each of its first five seasons and the first three NCAA Championships in 2016, 2017 and 2018
- · Florida State is one of just two beach volleyball programs (along with Pepperdine) to have played in every AVCA and NCAA Championship tournament (2012-18).
- The Seminoles finished as the National Runners-up in the 2018 NCAA Championship, advancing through the winner's bracket and taking down No. 5 USC. No. 1 UCLA and No. 3 Hawaii before falling to the Bruins in the finals. It marked the team's second Runner-Up finish after competing in the championship match of the inaugural NCAA Championship in 2016.
- Since 2012, FSU has been recognized with 13 AVCA Beach

All-America honors from 10 different players. The Seminoles' ten All-Americans are tied for the third most nationally.

- Through its first six seasons, Florida State boasts an alltime mark of 159-34 (.824 winning percentage), including a program record 33 dual match victories in 2018.
- FSU has recorded 57 wins against ranked opponents dating back to the 2013 campaign, including 18 earned in the 2018 season
- One of those ranked wins came against then-No. 3 Hawaii in California in March. FSU was one of only two teams to defeat the Rainbow Wahine last season, as the Seminoles and UCLA beat them twice. FSU snapped Hawaii's 32-match win streak with a 4-1 defeat at the NCAA Championship.
- The Noles took down No. 2 Pepperdine for the first time in school history, 3-2, in Tallahassee during the 2017 season.
- FSU earned the No. 1 overall seed at the 2016 NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship after claiming the Coastal Collegiate Sports Association (CCSA) conference title.
- The Seminoles gathered their third-consecutive CCSA Conference title in 2018.

NOLES IN THE CCSA

- Florida State became a charter member of the Coastal Collegiate Sports Association for beach volleyball prior to the start of the 2016 season.
- The Coastal Collegiate Sports Association expanded to 12 members in 2019, welcoming TCU and Southern Miss to a league that also includes Florida State, UAB, College of Charleston, Florida Atlantic, Florida International, Georgia State, LSU, South Carolina, Tulane and UNC Wilmington.
- Florida State is the only school to sponsor beach volleyball in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

ATTRACTING TOP TALENT

- Fourth-year head coach Brooke Niles earned Third Team All-America honors in indoor volleyball at UC Santa Barbara before moving on to a successful professional beach volleyball career. She was named 2009 AVP Beach Defensive Player of the Year and spent four seasons as a member of the USA Beach National Team.
- Niles was named the 2016 AVCA Coach of the Year as she piloted the Seminoles to a school-record 32 dual-match victories, the CCSA league championship and a No. 1 seed in the inaugural NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship.
- Assistant coach Angela Rock joins the staff full-time in 2019. As one of the most decorated beach volleyball players, Rock brings a wealth of coaching experience to the team on top of a 27-win professional beach career. She competed as an outside hitter for Team USA at the 1988 Olympic Games in Seoul, South Korea and was named Team USA's "Most Valuable Player" in 1985.
- Volunteer assistant coach Jon Justice steps into a leadership position on the team for the first time in 2019. Seminoles fans may recognize his name from his gold medal finish at the USA Volleyball Collegiate Beach Championship last season with partner Adam Wienckowski, as the two donned the Garnet and Gold throughout the competition and onto the FISU World University Championship in Munich, Germany.
- FSU Beach Volleyball has historically attracted some of the nation's best players to the program. Among those include 2016 AVCA All-American Sarah Putt and AVCA High School Beach All-American First Team selection Kate Privett.



Through its first seven seasons, Florida State boasts an all-time mark of 159-34 (.824 winning percentage), including a program-record 33 dual match victories in 2018.

Florida State advanced to the AVCA Championships in each of its first five seasons and the NCAA Championship in 2016, 2017 and 2018.

FSU is just one of two beach volleyball programs (along with Pepperdine) to have played in the first four AVCA Championships (2012-15) and the first three NCAA Championships (2016-18).

Since 2012, FSU has been recognized with 13 AVCA Beach All-America Honors from 10 different players. The Seminoles' 10 All-Americans are tied for the most all-time.

Brooke Niles was named the 2016 AVCA Coach of the Year as she piloted the Seminoles to a CCSA Championship, the top seed in the NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship and a school-record 32 dual match victories.

50 YEARS

OF WOMEN'S INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS
AT FSU



While women's athletics had held a rich tradition in Tallahassee since the early 1900's when Florida State was the Florida State College for Women, the 2018-19 season marks the 50th Anniversary of a continuous women's intercollegiate program at FSU.

Since volleyball took the floor in 1968 as the first-ever women's intercollegiate sport for the Seminoles, FSU has been a national leader in promoting and supporting women's athletics.

Florida State has won seven national championships over the last 50 years. Softball earned back-to-back AIAW (Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women the precursor to the NCAA) national titles in 1984-85 and captured the 2018 NCAA Title just months ago. Golf won the AIAW national title in 1981, and track & field the NCAA National Championship at the 1984 outdoor meet and 1985 indoors. Soccer won the 2014 NCAA National Championship.

A year-long celebration will launch with the "Garnet And Golden Celebration" on September 2. All event dates and details will be posted at **Seminoles.com/50th** and on social media utilizing the hashtag #GarnetAndGolden.



SEMINOLE BEACH VOLLEYBALL COURTS



Completed in 2011, the Seminole Beach Volleyball courts was one of the first facilities to be built specifically for collegiate beach volleyball. Located north of the Seminole Soccer Complex and JoAnne Graf Field between Mike Long Track and the Spirit Way Parking Garage, the facility is wrapped in Florida State University graphics and logos highlighting the enormous success of the FSU Beach Volleyball team during the sport's first six years. The Seminole Beach Volleyball Courts remain one of the premier facilities in the nation.

There are three entrances where patrons can enter the facility, with seating for approximately 150 people on the bleachers at sand level. The multi-level parking garage adjacent to the courts can also be used for spectator viewing. Spectators are encouraged to bring their own lawn chairs to the event as well. The courts are also equipped with permanent lighting to allow matches to be played at night.

The Seminole Beach Volleyball Courts were built using two types of sand. The lower level of sand is more powdery to allow precipitation to filter through to the drainage system. The upper level of sand is more dense, allowing student-athletes a competitive playing surface each time out.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL LOCKER ROOM



- Tully Gymnasium is the home of the Florida State beach volleyball team, housing the coaches' offices, team lounge and locker room. Renovations to the Seminoles' new locker room were completed in January of 2016 thanks to the support of the FSU Athletics Department and Seminole Boosters.
- The locker room features individual lockers for each studentathlete identified with their own personal name plate, individual shower stalls and bathrooms. The lockers include plenty of storage for both hanging clothes and folded items along with power outlets that also feature USB ports.
- The team lounge provides amble space to hold team meetings, watch film or to give the beach volleyball student-athletes a quiet place to study. The lounge is equipped with a 64 inch HD-television screen, couches and chairs for plenty of comfort.
- A satellite workout facility is located just outside the beach volley-ball office in Tully Gym featuring state-of-the-art equipment. The Tully Gym weight room is a clean and spacious 4,500 square foot facility equipped with mondo-rubber flooring, 10 squat racks, and houses 10 platforms for Olympic lifting. With an iPad on every rack and a change of facility design, Florida State continues to improve each of its strength and conditioning facilities.

The FSU Beach Volleyball program joined the Coastal Collegiate Sports Association (CCSA) as a charter member prior to the spring 2016 season.

CCSA Beach Volleyball began play in the spring of 2016 with eight founding members: University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB), Florida Atlantic University, Florida International University, Florida State University, Georgia State University, Louisiana State University (LSU), the University of South Carolina and Tulane University. The CCSA announced the addition of College of Charleston and UNC Wilmington to the sport of beach volleyball, expanding the conference to 10 members for the spring 2017 champion-

The CCSA, which was formerly known as the Coastal Collegiate Swimming Association at the Division I level, rebranded to include beach volleyball for the upcoming season.

Beach Volleyball became the 90th championship sponsored by the NCAA in 2015-16 after being officially recognized as an NCAA sport for 2011-12. The first NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship in Gulf Shores, Alabama, was hosted by CCSA member UAB. The creation of CCSA Beach Volleyball provides student-athletes the opportunity to compete for conference honors and championships. The NCAA does not currently offer automatic qualification (AQ) into the beach volleyball championship for conference winners (a two-year championship history is required), but the CCSA will be in position to qualify for an AQ should they be offered in 2018.

The CCSA formed in 2007 as a partnership among swimming and diving programs in the Atlantic Sun Conference, Big South Conference, Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference and Southern Conference to provide championship opportunities for men's and women's swimming and diving student-athletes. Conference growth in swimming and diving now shows 15 institutions with competitors from eight separate Division I multisport conferences. With the addition of beach volleyball, the Coastal Collegiate Sports Association now has 22 member institutions with participants from 11 different NCAA Division I multisport conferences.

Entering her third season with the program, head coach Brooke Niles has shaped Florida State beach volleyball into one of the most elite teams in the country, establishing the Seminoles as a national contender every year and a fixture in the AVCA Beach Top-20. In only three seasons with Niles at the helm, the Seminoles have earned two NCAA National Runner-Up titles and secured three consecutive Coastal Collegiate Sports Association (CCSA) conference championships.

Niles has led the Seminoles to 30 AVCA Top-10 wins in her three seasons, and since taking over the program prior to the 2016 season, Florida State has gone undefeated against every East Coast team without a single loss to a CCSA team since joining the conference.

Since establishing the program as a powerhouse in the NCAA beach volleyball community, the Seminoles have seen a number of top performers come through the program to play for Niles. She has led six AVCA All-Americans (Julie Brown and Jace Pardon in 2016, Leigh Andrew and Brooke Kuhlman in 2017, and Vanessa Freire and Tory Paranagua in 2018), one CCSA Pair of the Year (Brown/Pardon, 2016) two CCSA Freshmen of the Year (Nikki Esposito in 2016 and Francesca Goncalves in 2017), and 14 All-CCSA performers (Brown/Pardon in 2016, Paranagua/Pellitteri in 2016, Andrew/Kuhlman in 2017, Freire/Paranagua in 2018, Horton/Luke in 2018).

The team's academic performance has flourished under Coach Niles, as the team continually records one of the best GPAs across the athletics department every year. Current senior Macy Jerger became the team's the first two-time CCSA All-Academic Team honoree in 2018, securing the CCSA Scholar-Athlete of the Year award in both 2017 and 2018. Julie Brown, Jace Pardon and Katherine Plessy were all named to the CCSA All-Academic team in 2016. Hailey Luke became the first Seminole to be named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll five times, while Niles has seen 53 ACC Academic Honor Roll awards earned by 31 different athletes. One of her players has earned the ACC's Weaver-James-Corrican Postgraduate Scholarship every year of her tenure, with Katherine Plessy winning in 2016, Leigh Andrew in 2017 and Vanessa Freire in 2018.

2016

Niles led the Seminoles to unprecedented heights during the program's first season as an official NCAA Championship sport. Her first year in Tallahassee was highlighted by a series of program firsts including a school-record for dual-match victories (32), a conference championship, the top-seed in the inaugural NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship and a national runner-up finish. Florida State hit the ground running under Niles, winning its



first 14 matches, all on the road, with eight of those victories coming against ranked foes including five ranked in the top-10. One of those wins came against then-No. 2 Southern California in Los Angeles as the Seminoles snapped the Women of Troy's 19-match home win streak. FSU went on to earn the No. 1 overall seed at the NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship after claiming the 2016 Coastal Collegiate Sports Association (CCSA) Conference title.

The Seminoles finished the 2016 campaign as the national runner-up at the NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship in Gulf Shores, Ala. after posting a 3-2 record at the tournament. FSU went on to set the single-season school record for victories in a season with 32 and ranked in the Top 5 of the AVCA national poll all year. Along with their 14-match win streak, the Seminoles also put together a school-record 17-match win streak which saw Florida State outscore the opposition 71-10. At season's end, Florida State registered 19 victories over ranked schools, while posting an 11-3 mark against teams ranked in the Top 10.

Niles was recognized for her outstanding effort in her first season at the helm of the Seminole beach volleyball program as she was named National Coach of the Year by the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA).

2017

In her second year under the helm Niles continued the winning tradition of Florida State beach volleyball. The team finished with the second most wins in school history and the third most in the country (29). Niles and the Noles secured back-to-back CCSA Championships after they defeated FIU 3-0 in 34 minutes. Florida State reached their second consecutive NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship appearance and sixth straight post season appearance, tied for most of any school.

The Seminoles finished the 2017 season in fourth place at the NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship in Gulf Shore, Ala. after going 2-2 at the tournament. The Noles defeated a school record 22 ranked teams during the 2017 season including 13 wins over top-

10 teams and three over top-5 teams. The 2017 season saw the Garnet and Gold defeat Pepperdine for the first time in school history as they took down the second-ranked wave in Tallahassee.

Under Niles, Florida State garnered two AVCA All-Americans, six CCSA All-Conference selections, a league-best three student-athletes named to the CCSA All-Academic team in 2016, the CCSA Scholar Athlete of the Year (Macy Jerger) in 2017, the CCSA Pair of the Year in 2016 (Julie Brown/Jace Pardon) and 10 Seminoles who earned a spot on the CCSA Academic Honor Roll.

2018

Niles set the bar even higher in her third season, scheduling 13 dual matches against a ranked opponent in the regular season and finishing with a program-record 33 wins. Florida State reached its third consecutive NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship appearance, and seventh-straight postseason appearance, making FSU one of only two programs to make every NCAA and AVCA National Championship (along with Pepperdine).

The Seminoles went undefeated to make it to the finals of the NCAA Championship for the first time, taking down No. 1 UCLA, No. 3 Hawaii and No. 5 USC along the way. FSU fell to No. 1-overall UCLA in the finals for the team's second NCAA Runner-Up finish under Niles.

FSU tallied 14 wins against AVCA Top-20 opponents in 2018, picking up four wins against higher-ranked teams. Through her three seasons at the helm, the Seminoles have remained undefeated against every East Coast team, and have not lost to a CCSA team since joining the conference in Niles' first year.

Niles saw two more All-Americans in her third season, as Tory Paranagua and Vanessa Freire became the program's 12th and 13th All-Americans. Four Seminoles were named to the CCSAAll-Conference team, Macy Jerger earned her second consecutive CCSA Scholar-Athlete of the Year recognition, and the program placed 19 on the ACC Academic Honor Roll.

Florida State University athletics announced the hiring of U.S. beach volleyball professional Brooke Niles as the Seminoles beach volleyball head coach on June 16, 2015. Niles, a California native who earned All-America honors as a player, has coached at the collegiate, junior college, club and high school levels working with both indoor and sand volleyball teams.

Niles, who earned a law and society degree from UC Santa Barbara in 2003, was a third-team All-American while playing for the Gauchos where she also was a three-time All-Big West selection and named conference freshman of the year. Following her playing career at UCSB, Niles spent three years as an assistant indoor coach at her alma mater before beginning a successful professional beach volleyball career in 2007 that saw her win numerous pro tournaments along with being named the AVP Beach Defensive Player of the Year in 2009.

While climbing to a Top 5 ranking in the National Volleyball Beach League and spending 2010-13 as a member of the USA Beach National Team, Niles was a first alternate for the USA 2012 London Olympic Beach National team.

The Woodland Hills native returned to coaching in 2010 at Oxnard Junior College with the indoor team. In 2012 she began coaching professional beach volleyball teams competing on the FIVB World Tour from the USA, Costa Rica and the Netherlands. Most recently Niles coached at Mira Costa High School in California and she was the director, founder and head coach of The Beach Team Club in Hermosa.

"I'm very excited that Brooke to joined our volleyball family," said FSU Volleyball Head Coach Chris Poole. "She played beach volleyball and indoor volleyball at the highest level. She has also coached indoor volleyball at a Top 10 level in the NCAA Division I and she has coached and trained with some of the best beach players in the world. The references we got from National Team level players/coaches and Gold Medalist were outstanding. She had a very impressive resume and made an impact on everyone during her visit."

"Brooke will lead the squad in a fantastic way and help the ladies grow and learn in so many ways," said Kerri Walsh a three-time Olympic gold medalist in beach volleyball. "Her competitiveness is truly an asset as it leads her to work hard and push for excellence. She practices what she preaches and this to me is what coaching/teaching is all about."

Niles is married to Nick Lucena, a Florida State graduate, professional beach volleyball player on the AVP Tour and Olympian in the 2016 Olympics in Rio. They have two children, Gunnar and Cole.



ANGELA ROCK

FIRST SEASON • SAN DIEGO STATE (1986)



Head coach Brooke Niles announced the hiring of Angela Rock ahead of the 2018-19 season. Rock, a former assistant coach at UC Santa Barbara with Niles, and one of the most successful players in beach volleyball history, joins the team in a full-time position this season after serving as a volunteer assistant coach in the Seminoles' run for a National Championship last spring.

Rock is an Olympian, a 27-time professional beach volleyball winner, a member of the San Diego State Hall of Fame and the author of Angela Rock's Advanced Beach Volleyball Tactics.

Rock joins the Seminoles from Saint Mary's College, where she led the Gaels beach volleyball team to a program-record 19-10 finish in 2017. She coached Payton Rund at SMC, who later transferred to Florida State for the 2019 spring season. Rund and her partner, Lindsey Knudsen, took down USC's No. 1 pair of Kelly Claes and Sarah Hughes in 2017, breaking their 102-match winning streak.

Prior to SMC, Rock served as the head volleyball coach at Southwestern College in Southern California for eight years and taught exercise science as a tenured professor. She also gained head coaching experience at Cuyamaca College in 2015 and at the University of Alaska-Fairbanks in 1999 – where she led the Nanooks to their first Pac-West Conference Tournament. Rock

From 1987 to 2000, Rock established herself as a major force on both the Women's Professional Volleyball Association (WPVA) and Federation de International Volleyball (FIVB) tours. She ranks third in WPVA history in career earnings and won 21 events, including

12 titles in 1991 when she was voted the tour's "Best Hitter". The previous year, Rock coaxed Gregory out of retirement as the two partnered for a tournament in Laguna Beach, Calif. In addition, she served as a player representative to the governing bodies for both the FIVB and WPVA.

The pinnacle of Rock's international career was playing outside hitter for Team USA at the 1988 Olympic Games in Seoul, South Korea, where the Americans placed seventh. During her four years as a member of the United States National Team, Rock also participated in the 1986 Goodwill Games and World Championships as well as the 1987 Pan American Games. She was named Team USA's "Most Valuable Player" in 1985. Rock returned to the Olympics in 1996 as the coach and trainer for American beach volleyball duo Holly McPeak and Nancy Reno. From 1997-2000, Rock played with partner Karrie Poppinga, the mother of current FSU beach volleyball player Avery Poppinga.

Collegiately, Rock played on NCAA Final Four teams at San Diego State in 1981 and 1982 before earning First Team All-American recognition in 1984. Rock - who also competed in track and field for the Aztecs as a javelin thrower - was inducted into the SDSU Hall of Fame in 1991. She earned her bachelor's degree in psychology from San Diego State before completing an M.S. in education from National University.

Coach Rock graduated with a degree in psychology from San Diego State University where she participated on two NCAA Final Four Volleyball teams in 1981 and 1982 and received First Team All American honors as an outside hitter on the Aztecs Women's NCAA Volleyball Team in 1984. In recognition for her outstanding play, Rock was honored and inducted into the SDSU Hall of Fame in 1991. Rock then went on to earn her MS in Education from National University and MS in Physical Education from Azusa Pacific University.

2018 Florida State Beach Volleyball Team

AN ELITE PROGRAM

- » Florida State remained in the AVCA Top-10 for the entire 2018 season, with its highest ranking coming in at No. 4. The Seminoles had been ranked in the top four for 23 straight weeks, dating back to week one of 2016 (March 7).
- » The program captured its 12th and 13th All-American honors in 2018, which is tied with the most among any beach program.
- » Florida State is one of just two programs to have made every AVCA/NCAA Championship since the sports inception in 2012 (along with Pepperdine).
- The Seminoles' second-place finish in 2018 is the program's third National Runner-Up finish in its seven years of competition.
- » FSU stayed undefeated at home throughout the season, and is now 32-1 in Tallahassee.

NOLES GO 33-7 IN 2018

- » Florida State finished the season with a program-record 33 wins, just passing the previous record of 32 set by Coach Niles in her first season (2016).
- » 25 of FSU's 40 matches were against opponents ranked in the AVCA Top-20.
- The Garnet and Gold won 19 matches against ranked opponents, including two wins over No.1-overall UCLA in the second round of the NCAA Championship.
- » The Noles went 9-7 against opponents ranked in the Top-10.
- Florida State played 24 different pairs with 16 different athletes in 2018, and saw
 19 different lineup combinations over the course of the season.

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK CCSA CHAMPS

- » The Noles earned their third-straight CCSA Championship in 2018 with a 3-0 defeat over No. 8 LSU.
- » The Garnet and Gold went a perfect 10-0 against conference opponents during the regular season, and only surrendered one point in six matches of the CCSA Tournament. By dropping only one flight of 28, the team's 2018 conference championship stands as its most efficient title run in the last three years.
- » The Seminoles remain undefeated against conference opponents (both regular and postseason) since joining the league in 2016.

2018 SEASON IN REVIEW

» Florida State's Katie Horton and Hailey Luke were named the MVP of the Tournament after going 6-0 at the No. 2 position over the weekend. Sara Putt and Macy Jerger earned All-Tournament honors after their perfect weekend in the No. 3 position.

POSTSEASON DOMINANCE

- » FSU's historic postseason run in 2018 included handing USC its first ever loss in the NCAA Championship, becoming the first No. 4 seed to knock off the top-seeded team (UCLA) in the Championship, and the first team to make it to the finals through the winners bracket since USC did it in 2016.
- » The Seminoles ended a 31- and 32-dual win match streak for UCLA and Hawaii, respectively, in the 2018 Championship.
- » Florida State is one of just two programs (along with Pepperdine) to have made every AVCA/NCAA Championship since the sport's inception in 2012.
- » Florida State's second-place finish in 2018 is the program's third National Runner-Up finish in its seven years of competition.
- » FSU is one of only three programs in NCAA beach volleyball history to have won three straight conference championships (along with Pepperdine and Hawaii). All three of those teams have gone undefeated in their respective conference tournaments since 2016.

SENIOR IMPACT

- Four of the Seminoles' most consistent starters were seniors, with team captains and AVCA All-Americans Tory Paranagua and Vanessa Freire finishing out the last half of the season in the No. 1 position, while former indoor volleyball stars Hailey Luke and Katie Horton dominated the No. 2 position for a majority of the season.
- Luke and Horton clinched five matches together, including a win in the second position that gave FSU a historic win over No. 4
 USC in the NCAA Championship.
- Paranagua and Freire saw a 10-match win streak as a pair in the No. 1 position, bookended by a pair of wins against FAU's Scarbourough/Silva on April 6 and April 20.
- All four competed in the USAV Collegiate Beach Championships, facing each other in the semifinals. Luke/Horton advanced and earned a second place finish in the tournament.

NAMES IN THE RECORDS BOOK

- Paranagua became the fourth player in program history to reach 100 overall wins, while her partner became the fifth to reach
 the milestone. Paranagua now holds the FSU record for most dual wins in a career with 99, followed closely by Freire with 96.
- Horton led the team in 2018 with 39 total wins (34 dual), bringing her to a program-record 30 career wins in the No. 4 position.
 Her partner, Luke, finishes her career with the record for most wins in the No. 5 position with 42 23 wins ahead of Nikki Esposito in second place (19).

AWARD WINNERS

- Florida State saw two AVCA All-Americans in 2018. Senior captains Vanessa Freire and Tory Paranagua became the program's ninth and tenth All-American honorees, bring FSU to 13 total All-American honors.
- Freire won the Weaver-James-Corrigan Award, which is the ACC's Postgraduate Scholarship. She was also a finalist for the NCAA's prestigious Woman of the Year award, making her one of only a handful of Noles to attend the awards ceremony in Indianapolis. Ind.
- The Noles earned four weekly honors in 2018, with Sara Putt and Francesca Goncalves earning the VolleyMob Pair of the
