# THIS IS FLORIDA STATE

t t nev ida sity

t the dawn of a new decade, Florida State University is trailblazing

toward a new century — exploring science through supercomputing, pioneering in Florida's growing film industry and scouting new avenues of cultural exchange in a world opening the paths to freedom.

Among the elite of super-computing since obtaining its first high-speed computer in 1985, FSU took yet another step in ultrafast computing in 1990 with the acquisition of two new supercomputers, the Thinking Machine Corp. Connection Machine and the Cray Y-MP4/432. Both computers can be accessed from hundreds of locations in the United States and Europe.

For many years FSU has extended its reach far beyond Florida through international study programs in England, Italy, Switzerland, Yugoslavia, France, Panama, Costa Rica and the Caribbean. In 1990, the University embarked on a program requiring all its students to take multicultural courses to expand their knowledge of the world and its variety of people and cultures.

Keeping pace with professional movie studios that have opened recently in Florida, Florida State is now the professional training ground for one of Florida's fastest growing industries, film production. FSU admitted its first film students to the new School of Motion Picture, Television and Recording Arts in fall 1989.

These far-reaching programs are but a few of the 276 graduate and undergraduate degree programs offered through Florida State's eight colleges — Arts and Sciences, Business, Communication, Education, Engineering, Human Sciences, Law, and Social Sciences and eight schools

— Criminology, Library and Information Studies, Music, Nursing, Social Work, Theatre, Visual Arts and Dance, and Motion Picture, Television and Recording Arts.

Florida State is a public, coeducational university and a senior member of the State University System, founded as an institution of higher learning in 1851 by legislative act. It began operating in Tallahassee with its first students in 1857.

The main campus is spread over 347 acres in Tallahassee; the University owns a total of 1,167 acres in Leon, Bay and Franklin counties. Within the state, FSU spreads west to its 20-acre campus in Panama City and south to its marine laboratory on the Gulf of Mexico and its film and theater professional-training programs in Sarasota. In 1990, through a generous gift to the Foundation, the University acquired the Appleton Art Museum in Ocala, which will become a study center for the visual arts.

With 1,549 members, the FSU faculty currently includes four members of both the National Academy of Sciences and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and has included four Nobel laureates. It is backed by 2,786 administrative, professional and support staff.


Library holdings at Florida State include 1.76 million book titles, 18,650 serials and 3.25 million microforms. The main library facility, the Robert M. Strozier Library, is linked via a computerized information system to other state university and national research libraries. The Paul A.M. Dirac Science Center Library places scientific resources close by the University's main science research complex.

Recent growth during Dr. Bernard F. Sliger's 13-year presidency at FSU includes the student union expansion, the building for the joint Florida A&M University/Florida State University College of Engineering, the Dirac Library, the Village Green

project at the College of Law and the FSU Panama City Campus. Currently under construction adjacent to Tully Gym is a \$12 million state-of-the-art student recreation center, which will include a multipurpose gymnasium and indoor pool. And Florida State is managing its growth through the planned University Center, an office and classroom complex to be built adjacent to Doak Campbell Stadium. The building is expected to meet many of FSU's administrative and classroom needs and provide a centralized location for many student services.

Florida State remains a growing institution — from its roots as the Seminary West of the Suwannee, through the early 20th century as the academically respected Florida State College for Women and its coeducational status as a university in 1947, to its modern development as an acclaimed research institution, a topranked competitor in intercollegiate athletics and as a standard-setter in the basic sciences and the performing arts. In all areas of teaching, research and service, Florida State University continues to be a pathfinder into the 21st century.

# 1991 WOMEN'S TRACK OUTLOOK



ith nine returning All-Americans, this could be

the year for the Florida State Lady Seminoles to once again return to the forefront of women's collegiate track.

After placing 13th at the Outdoor Championships in 1990 and also sporting a top twenty finish at the Indoor meet, 1991 looks to be a banner year at Florida State. In fact, in a simulated meet that included returnees from last year's outdoor meet, *Track and Field News* had the Lady Seminoles placing fifth overall in 1991. Coach Terry Long feels that is very possible, and could be even better.

With the likes of Kim Batten and Holly Kelly returning for their final campaigns, it is a sure bet the Lady Seminoles will be in the thick of things come championship time.

"Essentially, when you go into a national championship meet, your athletes have to be able to perform better than they have at any other meet," Long said. "If this can happen, we have an excellent chance of making a run at the title.

"Our goals are to challenge for the national championship on a regular basis. We have had some great recruiting classes recently. The talent level is excellent."

With several newcomers expected to challenge NCAA standards, and a group of returnees that have already proven to be among the best in the country, the future looks brighter than ever at Florida State.

Batten and Kelly have more experience at the championship level than most people have period, completing each season with a trip to the NCAA meet. Batten qualified in three individual events at the 1990 Outdoor meet and also ran with the fourth place 400m relay team that returns three members in 1991. She placed second in the 400m intermediate hurdles, setting school records in that event and the 100m hurdles in 1990. Kelly placed third in the high jump at both the indoor and outdoor championships.

Sprinter Patrice Verdun, long jumper and sprinter Trinette Johnson, and heptathlete Carmellia Shivers are returning All-Americans from the Outdoor Championships as well. Carrie Boyd, Angela Harris, Tracy Howze and Karla Severs return from an All-American Indoor 3,200m relay team a year ago.


Once again, the schedule will provide quite a challenge for the Lady Seminoles, with a large number of indoor invitational meets preceding a busy outdoor slate. The Lady Seminoles will once again be the favorite to defend their back-to-back Metro titles in 1991, hoping to close out their final year in the Metro with all three championships. Batten has twice been named the Metro Conference's most outstanding female athlete, and will look to repeat that feat.

Here's a closer look at the Lady Seminoles in each phase:

All-American Kim Batten will be looking to claim her third consecutive Metro Conference Female Athlete of the Year award.

SPRINTS - Sophomore Patrice Verdun will join a trio of freshman speedsters that have the FSU coaching staff excited about the 90's, hoping to stabilize a traditionally rich area at Florida State. With the return of Verdun, Batten and Johnson, Long will be needing just one replacement for his 4 x 100m relay team, and expects to find that in Sheryl Covington, a prep All-American from Winter Park, FL. The Lady Seminoles have been in the 4 x 1 final every year since 1982, with three national championships. Andy Lyons, Harris and Shivers will also be counted on for help in the 1,600m relay event. Natalie Douglas and Tracey Ray, a pair of freshman, are expected to have an impact.

HURDLES - Simply put, Batten's return almost assures Florida State of scoring nationally in these events. She led in the 55m indoor hurdles before hitting the fourth barrier a year ago. She placed second by just 5/100th's of a second a year ago in the intermediate hurldles, and she also set a school record in the 100m hurdles. Long feels quite confident Batten will challenge for the national title in each of these events. Shivers could also challenge NCAA standards in the 100m hurles and Candi Odom and Kim Mann add depth to this unit. Batten may benefit from a tremendous amount of depth in the sprint crew and be able to concentrate more in this area.

MIDDLE AND LONG DISTANCE - Indoor's, the Lady Seminoles return completely their 3,200m relay team that finished sixth nationally in 1990. Boyd is the lone senior of the bunch with Harris being a junior and Howze and Severs sophomores. This could be a strong area for years to come. Specialty coach Sue Addison expects this group, overall, to be quite

competitive. Boyd nearly qualified nationally in the 1,500 meters last year and Harris, Severs and Howze could add qualifiers in the 800, 1,500, and 3,000. Stacey Freshmen Bowrosen, Lisa Beck and Kerry Moloughney will also add depth to this fairly young group that gained some valuable experience during the cross country season.

JUMPS - School record holder Sonya Blades is gone, but Holly Kelly, Batten, Johnson and Shivers have proven consistent in this area and should make for a strong crew in 1991. Batten will head the triple jumpers while Johnson was the only freshman to advance to the NCAA meet last season in the

long jump, both indoors and outdoors, and promises a great future. Kelly is a three time qualifier and placed fourth indoors and third outdoors last year. The two time All-American is the top returning high jumper in the country. Shivers has the potential to qualify and Candi Odom, with continued improvement, could make an impact here.

THROWS-Tonya Grannemann returns to head the Lady Seminoles throwers. Javelin All-American Kari Keith is gone, but prep phenom Heidi Hargett could prove a capable replacement in her initial season. Kim Mann placed third in the Metro in the javelin throw, the top returnee in the conference. Grannemann set a new conference record in the discus and placed second in the shot. She is expected to challenge NCAA qualifying marks this season. Hargett promises to anchor a steady group of throwers in the future.

# **WOMEN'S BIOS**



Kim Batten

5-9, 117, Senior - 3L Rochester, NY, (East HS) Career Bests: 100m H (13.19, 1990 NCAA Champs.); 400m IH (55.45, 1990 NCAA Champs.); Triple Jump (42-4 3/4, 1990 Metro Champs.)

A versatile performer, Batten is unquestionably one of the finest to ever

attend Florida State...named the Metro's most Outstanding Female Athlete after both the 1989 and 1990 Championships...holds school records in both the 55- (indoor), 100- and 400-hurdles... As a Junior in 1990 - Advanced to the NCAA Championships for the third consecutive year, qualifying in three individual outdoor events and as a member of the 400m relay team...at the indoor meet, Batten placed fifth in the triple jump to earn her second All-American honor in that event...set a pair of school records and placed second nationally in the 400m hurdles at the NCAA Outdoor Championships...just missed earning an individual title in the 400 IH, nosed out by .05 by UCLA's Jeanine Vickers...Batten ran a PR of 55.45 after setting a PR in the trials and the Metro Conference finals...also set a school record in the 100 hurdles with a 13.19 at the NCAA meet...led the Lady Seminoles in scoring at the NCAA meet...ran the anchor leg of the 400m relay team that placed fourth nationally with a time of 44.43...once again named the Metro Conference's Most Outstanding Female Athlete...won the triple jump and both hurdle events at the conference meet...won the 100m hurdles at the FSU Relays with a meet record 13.50...helped FSU's 400m relay team to the top collegiate performance at the prestigious Sun Angel Relays (44.67)... As a Sophomore in 1989 named Metro's Most Outstanding Female athlete after winning the 100m Hurdles, 400m IH and the Triple Jump...earned her second trip to the NCAA Outdoor Championships at the Sun Angel Relays, where she jumped 6.34 (20-93/4)... As a Freshman in 1988 - Qualified for both the indoor and outdoor championships with a triple jump of 41-10 1/4 at the Florida All-Comers Meet...diversified into the 400m Hurdles and found early success, surpassing the NCAA standard with a 1:00.57 at the Florida Tri-Meet...became only the second Lady Seminole ever to qualify in a field and sprint event (the other was Esmeralda Garcia)...failed to score at the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Meets...Prep - went relatively unrecruited out of East H.S. in Rochester, NY, despite being a prep All-American...turned in the third best leap in the country in the triple jump as a senior with a jump of 40-6...joined former high school teammate Lisa Horton at FSU...started running track as a high school junior giving up a promising basketball career...Personal - born March 29, 1969...active in the "Say No to Drugs" campaign at Florida State...lists social work as college major.



Carrie Boyd

5-6, 130, Senior - 3L Garfield, TX (Berkner HS) Career Bests: 3,000m (9:46.11, 1990 Metro Championships); 1,500m (4:24.06, 1990 Metro Conference Championships)

Will return as the Lady Seminoles top distance runner in 1991...just missed qualifying in 1990 in the 1,500 and

3,000 meters...As a Junior in 1990 - An indoor All-American as a member of the two-mile relay team that placed sixth...won confer-

ence championships in the 3,000m (9:41.11) and the 1,500m (4:24.06) with PR's...As a Sophomore in 1989 - Metro champion in the 1,500m with a 4:34.16... As a Freshman in 1988 - PR'd in the 800m at the Georgia Open (2:13.17) and also in the 1,500m at the Florida Tri-Meet (4:29.19)...(Cross country) - won the Seminole and Clemson Invitationals, setting the course record at Clemson...As a Freshman (Cross Country) in 1987 - redshirted in track and field but had a great cross country season, finishing in the top five in all five meets...top performance came at the Carolina Invitational, where she set a course record of 17:43 in winning the meet...placed second at the Florida State Invitational with a time of 17:56....won the FSU-Georgia dual meet the following week...capped the season with a third place finish at the Metro Champion-ships...Prep - Won the Texas 5A 800m and 1,500m titles at L.U. Berkner HS...also turned in a second place finish in the state cross country championship...finished third at the TAC cross country nationals...a seven time letterwinner in high school...Personal - born October 29, 1967...a physical therapy major.


