1987 VOLLEYBALL OUTLOOK

Anticipation is in the air for head coach Cecile Reynaud and her Lady Seminoles. The excitement for any coach is the beginning of a new season and the prospect of preparing for the challenges to be met along the way. However, in 1987 Reynaud has many reasons to be optimistic about her team.

The Lady Seminoles are returning five letterwinners from the 1986 undefeated Metro championship team, all of whom have starting experience. If experience isn't the key to success, then seven talented freshman newcomers could be. Reynaud dubs this incom-

ing group of freshmen as "the best to hit Florida State."

"This younger core of athletes might be the most talented group we've had coming in at the same time," says Reynaud. "I am looking forward to seeing what they will do in combination with the junior experience already established on the team."

Of Reynaud's six returning players, three have garnered Metro Conference honors. These veterans helped establish Florida State as the number one blocking team in the nation last year by tallying 793 blocks for a 5.8 blocks-per-game ratio.

At middle hitter Florida State returns its most experienced player and the nation's eighth-ranked blocker in Julie Todd. Todd, who has been a starter since her freshman season, has also-established herself as a respectable middle attacker. Todd's stats don't stop on the court but continue in the classroom where she has established a high GPA, earning selection to the Metro Commissioner's list for three consecutive years.

"We will look for Julie to do outstanding things for us again this year," says Reynaud. "She is the most experienced player we have returning. She is equally as strong in the back as in the front row."

Two other athletes Reynaud will look to for great contributions are junior hitter Deanne Kaleta and sophomore setter Nancy Gaspadarek. Kaleta returns with impressive stats at the net, while Gaspadarek led last year's squad with 1,144 assists and was voted "Rookie of the Year" by the Metro coaches. In a game against North Carolina, Gaspadarek recorded 58 assists, breaking the school record of 52 set by Donna Krai in 1985. Gaspadarek also garnered all-Metro tournament honors.

Kaleta is a seasoned athlete herself, contributing 255 kills for a .202 attack ratio. She was named to the all-Metro tournament team chosen after the conference tournament last season.

"For our team to live up to its expectations we will have to rely on Deanne," says Reynaud. "She will be a determining factor in this team's success."

In the back row the quick-footed Maria Magoulas will be returning for her second season as a defensive specialist.

"Maria is a very hard worker and may just be one of the finest

defensive athletes Florida State has ever produced," says Reynaud.

While things do appear to be on track for the Lady Seminoles, they will miss two-time MVP and leading kill specialist Joan Morris. In her four-year stint at FSU, Morris led all spikers three times and was named Metro Tournament MVP twice.

"I believe the combination of young talent and veteran experience we have coming in will allow us to take up where we left off last season," Reynaud continues. "In fact, members of this new

group have the ability to start for us. If they don't, they will certainly push our experienced athletes to their fullest potential."

A big name on the newcomer's list is that of Maggie Philgence from St. Croix, Virgin Islands. At 5-10 with a vertical bound of 30 inches, Philgence will provide plenty of excitement at the outside hitter position.

In addition to 5-10 Marybeth Sutcliffe of Chicago, Reynaud has five in-state athletes on campus for their freshman seasons. Included in that group is Gabrielle Reece, a 6-3 middle hitter who will be the tallest player ever to compete for FSU. Reece hails from Seminole, Fla., and was a late signee.

"I definitely feel like we were lucky to get her," says Reynaud. "I saw her play in a summer tournament. During the entire match I was under the impression that she'd been recruited, but when I found out differently, we jumped at the chance to sign her."

Reynaud certainly added inches to her team when she hit the recruiting trail; every member of the 1987 freshman class except Jennifer Marrafino is over 5-8.

"One of the greatest attributes this recruiting class collectively possesses is the athletic skill and the potential to be trained to perform at a high Division I level," says Reynaud. "The majority of our newcomers are Florida athletes. They already have a sense of state pride and are looking forward to their careers at FSU."

Florida State proved to be a top 20 competitor last season when it defeated Cal-Berkley for the first time in Florida State history and then turned around to take a game from number one ranked Brigham Young University.

Strong competition continues on the 1987 schedule. FSU will face some of that stiff competition from the onset of the season; matches with Minnesota and Georgia are within two days of each other. Minnesota is a consistent top Big 10 performer while Georgia returns with a second place finish at the SEC championship. The schedule finishes just as tough as it begins with matches against Houston and Long Beach State, both potentially top 20 programs.

"We have our work cut out for us," says Reynaud. "We have the potential to explode, but developing talent is our main priority right now. I'm anxious to start putting the pieces together and I have reason to believe we're going to develop a pretty good picture."



COACHING STAFF

CECILE REYNAUD Head Coach

Cecile Reynaud begins her 12th season in the volleyball business as head coach of the Lady Seminoles. During her 11-year stint, she has coached FSU teams to a 328-139 record, a winning percentage of .700.

Reynaud's involvement with the sport runs the gamut from her position at Florida State to coaching experience on the national and international levels.

She served as head coach of the 1985 United States Junior National team which traveled and competed internationally in Japan and China. In 1986, she served as East Zone coordinator at the U.S. Olympic Sports Festival.

Coaching experience at the 1983 World University Games, national clinics and a numerous Metro Conference Championships are previous additions to her already impressive list of achievements. In eleven seasons under Reynaud, Florida State has won over 300 matches. Included in this record is a fourth place finish at the 1981 AIAW Nationals, three additional bids to the NCAA Championships, three regional titles and three Metro Conference Championships, not to mention numerous invitational team championships. In 1983, the Lady Seminoles reached a #15 ranking by the NCAA.

An authority on the game, Coach Reynaud has served as technical consultant for several volleyball films and also edited a book on power volleyball. She has also appeared as a guest speaker at various clinics across the nation.




She hosts the Cecile Reynaud Volleyball Camp each summer on FSU's campus. The camp annually attracts 300 participants from around the Southeast. Cecile also appears on the staff of several other camps on a yearly basis.

Named head coach in 1978, Reynaud first arrived at Florida State in 1976 following a standout athletic career at Southwest Missouri State University. Her outstanding playing and coaching career led to her induction into Southwest Missouri State's Hall of Fame in 1983.

Reynaud is currently a member of the USVBA Board of Directors, as well as an officer of the AVCA Board. She serves as awards chairperson and is responsible for the All-America, all-region and Coach of the Year selections for all divisions.

SHELLY BIRKHOLZ **Assistant Coach**

Shelly Birkholz enjoyed two successful years as a competitor for Florida State until suffering a knee injury her sophomore season which ended her playing career. Birkholz rejoined Florida State in 1986 as an assistant coach and now enters her second season at that same post.



A native of Roscoe, IL, Birkholz graduated from FSU with a degree in leisure services in May, 1986.


