Florida State's 1992 volleyball season was a return to heights that the program had grown use to in previous seasons.

After a year's absence, the Lady Seminoles returned to the NCAA Tournament for their fifth appearance in the past six seasons and sixth in eight years. FSU also reached the 20 win plateau for the 16th time in 17 years under head coach Cecile Reynaud.

The 1992 campaign was also Florida State's best to date in its short history as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference. The Lady Seminoles stormed through the regular season conference schedule with a 6-1 record, a mark good enough to earn co-champion honors along with Duke for the regular season.

The Tribe also placed three players on the All-ACC team and three more on the league's All-Tournament team. Seniors Sherry Cowling and Bianca Stevens were first team all-conference selections while Luiza Ramos was a second team choice during the regular season. These three were also named to the All-Tourney group as well. Reynaud was honored as the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coach of the Year after guiding the Tribe to a 26-8 overall mark.


The Lady Seminoles participated in five tournaments throughout the season. FSU took two (the

South Florida Invitational and the Hofstra Classic), finished second in two (the Gator Invitational and the Florida State Classic), and placed third in the Golden Dome Classic at Notre Dame. Ironically, it was at the Notre Dame tournament that Florida State finished its lowest but began to play its best volleyball of the season.

After dropping a heart-breaking five-game match to 24th ranked Notre Dame and a tough four-game match to 3rd ranked Long Beach State, FSU bested Pittsburgh in five games for their only win of the tournament. The meeting with Pitt was the beginning of a season-high 13 match winning streak for the Tribe. FSU won 39 of 45 games during the run.

At the ACC Tournament, Florida State defeated Virginia in three games, then outlasted host Maryland in five games to advance to the finals against Duke. FSU dropped the championship match to the Blue Devils in five games but still received an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament. It was the first time in ACC history that two conference teams participated in the national tournament.

In the NCAA's, FSU was paired up with state rival Florida in the first round. The Lady Seminoles had their season ended in Gainesville as Florida, who advanced to the Final Four, won in three games 15-9, 15-3, 15-10.

25 YEARS OF F.S.U. VOLLEYBALL



The 1993 season marks the 25th anniversary of the first organized volleyball team at Florida State. The winning tradition well-established today began in 1968 with a group of physical education majors and a volunteer coach. It was not uncommon for this group of aspiring teachers and athletes to pay their own way to tournaments and share warm-up suits with several other women's teams.

The first team was led by assistant professor Martha "Pat" Moore, and after three years of revolving new head coaches, Dr. Billie Jones, who had coached the team one year in 1970 while a doctoral student, volunteered to take the reins for both the volleyball and the softball teams.

"It was a completely different kind of team then," said Dr. Jones, who was also teaching and advising students full-time. "Most of the women were from Florida and physical education majors. They were here because of Florida State's reputation. There was no recruiting or scholarships involved."

Between 1973-1975, the Lady Seminoles accumulated a 107-22 record (.829 win percentage). The teams played in five or six tournaments during the year, all on weekends. FSU made its AIAW national tournament debut in 1971, and revisited the tournament again two years later. Ironically, one of the teams FSU defeated at the 1973 championship was Southwest Missouri State where current head coach Cecile Reynaud was a star player.

Success continued for the Florida State volleyball teams as they competed for state, regional and national




Former Lady Seminole Gabrielle Reece enjoyed a stand-out career at FSU and is now a world-known model and professional beach ball player.

titles in the AIAW conference. They returned to the national tournament in 1974 and 1975. Popularity at home grew as well. Former basketball coach Hugh Durham and his wife Melinda were big volleyball fans and often seen at home matches in Tully Gym. The Florida State Seminoles, in just their first few years in existence, became well-known as a powerhouse in the up-and-coming sport of volleyball.


After 25 years, Florida State has built an impressive reputation on the national level. They made seven appearances in the AIAW national tournament prior to joining the NCAA and the Metro Conference in 1982. While members of Metro, the Lady Seminoles captured six conference titles and advanced to the NCAA first round six times.

In 1992, FSU joined the Atlantic Coast Conference and in just two short years finished with a share of the regular season championship. The team also revisited the National Championship Tournament for the seventh time since 1983.

In 25 years, the Lady Seminoles have made a name for themselves. Pride, tradition and success are all a part of the Florida State volleyball team today, just as it was yesterday and will be tomorrow.



25 YEARS OF F.S.U. VOLLEYBALL




