# 1997 Outlook

The Florida State Lady Seminoles enter the 1997 season focused and full of enthusiasm following a spring season and summer consisting of hard work on the court and in the weight room. Seminole fans can expect a mentally and physically stronger, highly-motivated group of individuals who together should form a successful unit.

"I thought we trained very hard this spring," head coach Cecile Reynaud said. "We focused on physical conditioning, strength-training and agility and we developed more individual programs for some of the players. We changed our practices to make them a little bit different. It was the same type of routine but

we didn't spend a lot of time on the same activities over and over. We had a different focus every day." ters. They're great people, great volleyball players and I'd like to see them have a season that finds them on top in the ACC."

#### **OUTSIDES**

The outside hitter position will showcase a mix of the "old" with the "new." The position with probably the most depth will couple experienced, veteran players along with highly-regarded newcomers. Starting returnees Holly Schneider and LaToya Presberry, who will both be juniors, will anchor the corps. Presberry has been one of the squad's primary passers the past two years. She's a very explosive athlete and Coach Reynaud intends to use her in a variety of ways this season. Her 438 kills and 345 digs were tops

on the squad in 1996. Schneider, FSU's other primary passer, can hit a variety of sets. She performed at a consistent level

throughout last season and ranked second on the team in kills and digs. gery in January, Arnold looks to be back at full-strength at the start of the season.

"With Holly, LaToya and Laura all returning, I hope that we can get a little more movement in our offense this year and I think we'll be able to do that with the setting and passing that we've had," Reynaud said.

Junior Sarah Rickertsen, although not a starter, has seen a lot of playing time and has been a solid role player for the team.

"Sarah goes in when we need her and does a great job of blocking, passing and playing defense," Reynaud said.

Newcomers Jennifer Werrick and Kate Hemlepp will make an already strong area, even stronger. Werrick, who was named the Florida Player of the Year, should make an immediate impact. At 6-0, Werrick will be looked upon to help with blocking on the left side. Hemlepp was pegged a *Volleyball Magazine* All-American and was listed as one of the publication's "Fab 50" recruits. A left-handed player, she'll play on the right side. An excellent blocker as well, she has the ability to do a lot of things that opponents will have a hard time stopping.


"Jen is very athletic and has great ball control and we're looking for her to do a lot of things for us," Reynaud said. "Kate hits the ball hard, plays good defense, has good ball control and obviously will play a lot for us. She's going to be a key in our offense."

### MIDDLES

With the middle hitters healthy, this position could be one of the most dominating on the team. Susan Hawks and Su-



"As I look down the roster, it looks like a good team," Revnaud said. "To come off of a tough season and stay positive and continue to work hard is a tribute to all of their charac-



san Johnson should provide the leadership to the position, while Aisha Thornton, who gained valuable experience as a rookie, provides the strength.

Hawks, a junior, is considered to be the best blocker on the team. Johnson, a senior, represents versatility as she can play in the middle or on the right side. She has been a starter for much of the past two years and should see a lot of playing time this year. Thornton has the physical tools to dominate any match, against anybody. Her vast improvement from the beginning of the season to the end resulted in her selection to the ACC All-Freshman team.

"Susan Hawks has probably put on more muscle in the weight room this summer and spring than anyone else on the team," Reynaud said. "I think she is going to be very strong defensively at the net for us. We played her and Susan Johnson some on the right side this spring, to make sure we improved our blocking. Aisha worked very hard this spring and with the right set, she can do a lot of things offensively. With a couple of adjustments in the blocking department, she'll be able to shut anybody down and be very intimidating at the net."

### SETTING

Florida State will have the luxury of having two players who are capable of successfully filling the starting setter position. Junior Fiona Bolten, who sat out last year as a redshirt transfer from Kentucky, trained extremely hard the past year. Reynaud also notes Bolten's solid leadership skills which will be important to the team. Sophomore Kensy Zulueta saw action in 28 of 31 matches last season and was the squad's primary starter at the position. Zulueta also possesses a great serve and can play some solid defense in the back row.

"It's going to be a battle to see who starts," Reynaud said. "Both Fiona and Kensy are excellent setters and each will make a solid contribution to the team."

#### DEFENSE

Defensive specialists Christy Minko and Courtney Dipert return to hold down the defensive duties for the Tribe. Minko, a senior, is considered the team's "spark plug." She saw playing time in 28 matches last season and has been a really big part of the heart and soul of the team the past two seasons. Dipert played in 22 matches in her rookie campaign and will be relied on heavily in a reserve role this fall.

"Either one of those two can go in and replace probably one of the middles in the back row just to give them a little rest," Reynaud said. "They are both very exciting defensive players."

### **SCHEDULE**

Many of the Lady Seminoles will have a chance to play in front of their families and friends when Florida State heads north to compete in the Michigan Tournament and south to play in the Florida Atlantic Tournament. Combine these tournaments with a homeand-away series with rival-Florida and the always difficult ACC schedule, and the Tribe will once again enjoy a highly-competitive season of action. With three ACC teams advancing to NCAA play, the league, which was ranked as the third strongest volleyball conference in the country by the NCAA volleyball committee, will be as challenging as ever.

"As we look at the teams in the ACC, I think we have to be picked to finish in

the top half of the conference simply because we're not going to be the young team anymore," Reynaud said. "We've been the inexperienced team the past couple of years, and although we'll have just three seniors, our juniors have a lot of experience.

"Our goal is always to play to the best of our ability. We want to finally win the ACC. We've been tied for first in the conference and we've played in the championship match twice. We want to finish first!"



Facing new challenges. Having spent the past 21 vears at the helm of the Florida State volleyball program, head coach Cecile

Reynaud has indeed had her share of challenges along the way. Reynaud

remembers the days when team members packed their own lunches, car pooled to games and paid travel expenses out of their own pockets. She has experi-

enced the growth of women's athletics first She's seen hand. where it's been, where it is now and where it is headed and it is this unique perspective that keeps Revnaud coming back More for more. growth, more experience, more chills, more thrills ... each season is a new experience, a

new challenge.

With a career record of 539-260,

Reynaud ranks 13th nation-

ally in career victories among active Division I coaches. Highly respected among her peers, Reynaud's involvement in international competition was elevated to an even higher level

> when she was chosen to serve as the Deputy Competition Manager for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games.

As a coach, Reynaud has surpassed many milestones in her 21 year tenure at Florida State. Most recently, Coach Revnaud notched her 500th career victory in the first match of the 1994 season against Southern Illinois. This milestone victory places her among an elite list of coaches

in the 500 win club.

Looking back over 21 seasons of volleyball, post season play has become familiar to the Lady Seminoles. Florida State has made eight NCAA post-season appearances, six of which have been in the last 10 years and two appearances in the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship game in only six years of ACC competition.

A two-time Metro Conference Coach of the Year, Reynaud was also honored as Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Conference in 1992. She was also named Florida Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women Coach of the Year in 1982

and in 1989 she garnered AVCA South Region Coach of the Year accolades.

In May of 1996, Reynaud received the George J. Fischer Leader in Volleyball Award, presented at the USA Volleyball National Meetings in Dallas, Texas. This award recognizes long-time-significant contributions to volleyball programs and activities in the United States.

Reynaud's success directly correlates with the type of individuals she attracts to Florida State. This is evident on the court as well as in the classroom as reflected by the graduation rate of the student-athletes who have played for her. Among four-year volleyball letterwinners, all but two have earned their college degree, which is nearly a 98 percent graduation rate. These graduates have included two GTE Academic All-Americans and numerous honor roll students over the years. This past year, the volleyball team was recognized for having the highest team GPA among Florida State's 17 intercollegiate athletics teams.

In 1983, Reynaud first experienced the international level when she served as the assistant coach at the World University Games in Canada. In 1985, she was head coach for the United States Junior National Team which toured Japan and China. She has been on the AVCA All-America Committee and was the Zone Coordinator for 1986 and 1987 Olympic Festivals. She served as the commissioner for the Olympic Festival from 1988-92. Reynaud participated in the 1990 Goodwill Games as the technical secretary and is past-president of the American Volleyball Coaches Association. Reynaud is a current member of the Volleyball Hall of Fame selection committee. She has served 12 years on the USA Volleyball Board of Directors and three years on the Executive Committee.

As an expert of the game, Reynaud has been a technical consultant for two Power Volleyball films and the third edition of the book "Power Volleyball." She has co-authored numerous articles pertaining to women's athletics and continues to be active on the speaking circuit. Reynaud has been an instructor at more than 50 camps across the country and hosts her own each year which attracts hundreds of young volleyball players.

A 1975 graduate of Southwest Missouri State, Reynaud enjoyed an outstanding athletic career on the volleyball team and was twice named among the Outstanding College Athletes in America. In 1983, she was inducted into the school's Women's Athletics Hall of Fame.

Reynaud also has administrative experience at Florida State. She served as interim Assistant Athletics Director/Senior Women's Administrator for the 1994-95 school year.

In addition to an already challenging schedule, Reynaud has returned to Florida State as a student in pursuit of a Ph.D. in athletic administration and is scheduled to graduate this Spring.





Sherry (Cowling) Clouet enters her second season as the top assistant coach to Cecile Reynaud in 1997. A four-year veteran of the coaching staff at Florida State, Clouet's ties to the school date back to her playing days, finishing her career as a Lady Seminole in 1993.

Clouet's main duties involve recruiting for Florida State, monitoring the academic progress of the studentathletes and assisting in the day to day management of the team. Very involved with the Cecile Reynaud Volleyball Camp as well, she has served as camp director the past two summers.

After a standout senior season playing for Reynaud and receiving her degree in economics, Clouet taught history at an area high school and coached the volleyball team. Clouet joined the college ranks as the second assistant for FSU in 1994. During that time she was very involved in the Tallahassee Community and promoting youth volleyball. Clouet was honored with an award for her excellent community service throughout the year while at Godby High School.

Although her playing days as a Lady Seminole were few, Clouet's accomplishments while at FSU were many. In just one season of play at Florida State, Clouet established a new school record, since broken, when she registered 72 assists in a match against Duke. She was also honored as a GTE Academic All-American and named to the Ameri-Volleyball can Coaches Association All-South Region team.

In a single season of Atlantic Coast Conference action, Clouet was selected as an All-ACC member and to the ACC All-Tournament team. During the 1992 season Clouet was selected to the Gator Invitational, South Florida Invitational and Hofstra Invitational all-tournament teams.

The Miami, Fla., native began her career at Syracuse University where she played three seasons before transferring to Florida State. Clouet was also the setter for the silver medal-winning 1990 Olympic Festival team.

Clouet could not be any more involved with the sport she loves. Along with her FSU coaching duties, Clouet has coached with the Big Bend Juniors Club for three years, and has trained for the professional beach tour during summers.

Clouet completed her master's degree in December of 1995 in athletic administration.

She married Jason Clouet, a doctoral student at FSU, last spring.



International standout Wu, Dan became the newest member of Cecile Reynaud's staff when she was hired this summer after spending the 1996 season as an assistant coach at the University of Missouri.

Prior to her stint at MU, Wu played competitively for 16 years, including nine with the Chinese National Team. Her impressive playing résumé includes participation in three World Cups, two World Championships, including a title, and a bronze medal in the 1988 Olympic Games in Seoul, Korea.

Wu was named the Most Valuable Player in the Seoul Games, and also earned Outstanding Player honors in the 1989 and 1991 World Cups. In 1993, after being invited to her second World All-Star team, she was awarded the title of International Sports Master.

Wu, 30, received her two-year degree from Neijuang Shi Fang College in Sichuan Providence. She and her husband Han Jun became the parents of a son, David, in July.



A Management Information Systems major, Rombough will celebrate his 21st birthday at this season's ACC Tournament on November 23rd.

A native of Pensacola, Fla., Hoomes attended Pensacola Junior College. She and her husband Tim have one son Levon, 8.


