



#### THE NOLES ARE READY TO BE "ON TARGET" THIS SEASON

\*Florida State volleyball head coach Chris Poole answers a few questions about the logic behind the 2013 season theme as well as the poster\*

1. The slogan for this upcoming season is "On Target." What made you choose this as the theme specifically for this season?

I originally came up with the "Eye on the Target" when I was thinking about where the program was when we arrived and how our staff set a plan in motion to build a Top 15 program. We knew the level of players we wanted to recruit and we knew that our staff was very experienced and capable of providing strong leadership and training for the players. We just kept our eye on the target and didn't panic that first season. Eventually the slogan was shortened to "On Target" and I think it represents both keeping our focus on the big picture as well as expressing our feeling that we are most certainly on target with what we wanted to achieve when we arrived in the summer of 2008.

#### 2. Explain how the idea of the Hunger Games came into play with designing this poster?

I'm a big movie person and many great movies have a theme. The Hunger Games was about the sacrifice a family member makes for a sibling. And eventually the wit, strategy and determination to outsmart and outplay every one in the games is what made the lead character special. Our players sacrifice a lot for each other and for themselves. Being a college athlete is not easy. It takes a lot of discipline, character and time management to handle all the responsibilities in academics and athletics. These girls sacrifice their time and freedom to be part of something bigger than just themselves. It is not easy to build a program. It certainly isn't easy to maintain a top program. Our players have to keep their focus and be "on target" to be successful.

#### 3. How much thought really goes into developing a theme for each season?

Every team is different. Even if you return the same players, they are constantly changing, because they are constantly maturing. I've had the awesome opportunity for 30 seasons to help young ladies grow and mature during a very important time in their lives. Each team has been special for different reasons and each year as we finish spring season, there is something that stands out that is unique about a team or individuals on the team. We have young ladies that have made a dramatic improvement in their physical and mental preparation this year. They truly have kept their eyes "on target" and it is the team that will reap the benefits for their sacrifice and commitment.

4. Looking at this year's volleyball poster and thinking about each one you've had since being at FSU in 2008, where might this rank? Most of the posters have been created from an original ideal I had during the off season. Our marketing people take the idea and help to create something unique to our volleyball program. This poster is definitely "on target" for what was going through my mind during the spring. I'm very pleased with the design and I think it captures what I had in my mind.

#### 5. How appealing do you think it is bringing in a popular concept such as The Hunger Games into the poster?

The *Hunger Games* was a hot movie and many people are excited about the release of the second and third movies as well. I feel like Florida State Volleyball is a hot product right now. We are getting tremendous support locally, but we are also getting tremendous recognition nationally. A lot of great players have us on their list and we just had the No. 3 recruiting class in the nation for 2012.

6. Finally, what will Florida State have to do this season in order to be "On Target" with its goals and expectations in 2013?
This is a team with great notential. To stay "On Target" we will have to remain healthy which will allow us to play up to our fullest note

However, each season a team is faced with obstacles and adversity that can destroy a season. We need to show our maturity and not let adversity determine our outcome.

## NUMBERS TO KNOW

The Seminoles and rival Miami staged a memorable showdown at Tully Gym last season, as Florida State earned a 3-1 victory (25-20, 22-25, 25-14, 29-27) to secure its **fourth** ACC title. While the ACC has not hosted a conference tournament since 2004, both teams entered the regular-season finale with identical 17-2 conference records to create a de facto ACC title match. The capacity crowd of 1,563 was brought to its feet on the match's final point off a kill from Sareea Freeman to seal the title.

It had been **eight** years since an ACC volleyball school won back-to-back championships, but Florida State snapped that drought with its latest ACC championship in 2012. The Seminoles are now back-to-back defending ACC title holders (2011 & 2012), the first by a conference school since Maryland won consecutive crowns in 2003 and 2004. FSU has now won three ACC titles in the last four seasons, winning in 2009 in addition to its two most recent seasons.

Talk about an incredible two-year run in conference play! Florida State has finished 18-2 in ACC competition each of the last two seasons. That equals a 36-4 two-year record and a .900 winning percentage. Florida State's impressive two-year record is the fourth-best in ACC history, trailing only Maryland (32-0 in 1996-97), Georgia Tech (31-1 in 2003 and 2004) and Duke (40-4 in 2006-07). Helping the Seminoles was a recent senior class in 2012 led by Duygu Duzceler, Fatma Yildirim, Sareea Freeman and Marija Milosavljevic.

The strive for five will be one record-setting goal this season, as in **five** consecutive NCAA Tournament berths. Currently, Florida State has found its way to NCAA postseason play in the last four seasons since 2009, tying a school record held from 1987-90 during the dominant Metro Conference era with volleyball legends Gabrielle Reece and Maggie Philgence. As members of the ACC, FSU's four-year postseason streak shatters the previous best of two years in 1992-93 and 1997-98.

As mentioned before, FSU's run of dominance in the ACC is a major highlight to the 2012 senior class of Duygu Duzceler, Sareea Freeman, Fatma Yildirim and Marija Milosavljevic. The talented quartet guided the Seminoles to 109 overall wins as members of the ACC, the highest total by a senior class in school history with all four years of participation in the ACC. Only the 2011 senior class featuring Jekaterina Stepanova, Visnja Djurdjevic, Rachael Morgan and Patty Figueiredo is the other ACC class on the Top 10 list with 102 wins.


In order to make headway in your conference, you have to be led by some of the best student-athletes out there. The ACC Player of the Year has been given to a Seminole **two** times in the last four seasons. Current senior middle blocker Ashley Neff took home the award as well as AVCA Third-Team All-America honors in 2012 for the championship squad. In 2009, another middle blocker in former Nole Brianna Barry won the ACC Player of the Year for the school's second ACC title team. Barry was then named second-team All-America.

### **LEADERS ON AND OFF THE COURT**






Former player Amanda Saxton received a special honor at the 2011 NCAA Final Four banquet, taking home the Elite 89 Award. The honor recognizes the true essence of the student-athlete by honoring the individual who has reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level in his or her sport, while also achieving the highest academic standard among his or her peers.

Florida State volleyball has a long-standing tradition of getting its student-athletes to where they want to go. Since early in the program's origin, both present and past student-athletes have enjoyed the chance to play the game across a worldwide stage




### Carol Forsten (1981-84) • Australian National Team

Somerton Park, Australia native Carol Forsten was a fantastic outside hitter for the Seminoles in the early 1980s. The four-year letterwinner participated with the Australian National Team in the World Cup Competition in 1982, two years following her prestigious position as a captain for the Australian National High School all-star team in the 1979-80 year. Forsten, who also toured Latin America in 1981 and Japan in 1982 with Athletes-In-Action, was an academic all-district selection and an AVCA All-Region performer at Florida State in 1984. She finished her four-year career with 145 matches played.




### Karyn Palgut (1982-86) • 1982 Olympic Festival

A three-sport athlete at Florida State, Palgut lettered in volleyball (four), basketball (one) and softball (two) from 1982-86. After a successful collegiate career at outside hitter that saw her named to the All-Metro Tournament team three times, including the distinction of MVP, Palgut competed in the 1982 Olympic Festival on the East team. Upon graduation, Palgut joined the U.S. Women's National Team for Handball and had a successful career. She participated in the Goodwill games, the Pan American Games (Gold Medal) and the 1988 and 1992 Summer Olympics receiving seventh and sixth place respectively. One of Palgut's best volleyball attributes at Florida State was her service game, recording 132 aces in her career.



### Maggie Philgence (1987-90) • 1991 Olympic Festival

Hailing from the Virgin Islands, outside hitter Maggie Philgence became one of the most well-established Seminoles in program history. After her successful four-year career, Philgence was drafted to the South Team for the Olympic Festival in Los Angeles in 1991 where she helped lead her squad over the West to claim the gold medal. Philgence played her professional career with the international league in France and the Virgin Islands, and was inducted to the Florida State Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998. Philgence was a four-time all-region player, a three-time Metro All-Conference player and is Florida State's all-time leader in kills with 2,110. She has a hand in virtually every Top 10 category at Florida State.




### Gabrielle Reece (1987-90) • Women's Beach League

Arguably Florida State's most well-known volleyball alumna, former middle hitter Gabrielle Reece is more than just one of the world's most famous models. From 1987-90, Reece terrorized oncoming attackers as she racked up 747 total blocks, including 240 solo. She was a two-time Metro All-Conference player and an AVCA All-Region performer who also enjoyed an exceptional career on the pro tour. In the Women's Beach Volleyball League, Reece was a two-time offensive player of the year (1994-95), the league's leader in kills for four straight years (1993-96) and the league's leader in blocks (1993). Reece also helped her team take first place in the first Beach Volleyball World Championships and participated in the FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour. The California native started earning her acclaim for modeling while attending Florida State, being named as one of the five most beautiful women in the world by Elle in 1989 and receiving the "Most Inspiring Collegiate Athlete" honor at the 1989 Dodge National Athletic Awards.



### Franci Rard (1993) - AVP Tour

Outside hitter Franci Rard of Naples, Fla. spent one season at Florida State in 1993. Following her lone year, which included helping lead the Seminoles to their first-ever NCAA Tournament win over DePaul, Rard made a living on the AVP tour playing beach volleyball. Rard enjoyed plenty of success in the sand, but was known for battling back from fusion surgery for degenerative discs in 2000 as the procedure set her back nearly 2 ½ years before she could play competitively again. Rard was named to the All-ACC Tournament Team as well as the ACC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.



### Norisha Campbell (1998) - USA Volleyball

A fine middle-hitter from Universal City, Texas, Norisha Campbell twice was an AVCA All-Region player as well as a two-time All-ACC performer in 2000 and 2001. Prior to her sophomore campaign, Campbell participated with the 1999 USA Junior National Volleyball Team that competed at the Junior World Championships in Saskatoon and Edmonton, Canada. In the tournament, she led the USA squad in hitting in its final match vs. the Czech Republic with 11 kills and four blocks. Campbell's career at Florida State was highlighted by her 1,289 kills and .320 hitting percentage. Aside from her experience with the junior national team, Campbell was selected to the 2001 USA National A2 Training program and then became the first Seminole ever to participate with the USA National Team in 2007. Campbell has also played professionally in Switzerland and Germany.



### Alex Sevillano (1999-02) **AVO Pro Beach Tour**

A native of Clearwater, Fla., former outside hitter Alex Sevillano spent her career at Florida State from 1999-2002. Following four years that included leading the Seminoles in digs in her last two seasons, Sevillano made her living on the pro beach tour from 2006-11. The four-time ACC Academic Honor Roll member started in the AVO Pro Beach Tour, then made her way to the National Volleyball League as well as Wide Open Volleyball. During her beach-playing career, Sevillano made stops in Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, New York and Texas.



### Cecile Reynaud (1976-2001) - USA Volleyball

Known as an exceptional teacher, educator, motivator and coach of volleyball, Reynaud's global experience has been aplenty since building the Seminoles into a respectable volleyball program for 26 seasons. Reynaud was an assistant coach for the United States World University Games team in 1983, then served as head coach of the Women's Junior National Volleyball Team in 1985. In the summer 2012, Reynaud had the privilege of coaching at the Paralympic Games in London for the USA Women's Sitting Volleyball Team, and coachedthe USA Women's National Team at the Grand Prix in Japan in August 2013. Reynaud finished her FSU coaching career with 635 wins following her retirement in 2001, placing her in a group of just eight active coaches at the time who amassed 600 or more victories. In her 26 seasons, 98 percent of her four-year letterwinners at Florida State went on to earn their college degree, proving her immense focus on both volleyball education and classroom education. She was a four-time conference coach of the year who also served as Deputy Competition Manager for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta.



### Makini Thompson (2005-07) Jamaican National Team

Another great outside hitter to don the Garnet and Gold, Makini Thompson became Florida State's third All-American when she earned the national honor in 2006. In that same year, Thompson was also an AVCA All-Region performer and made the All-ACC Team in both 2006 and 2007. The 2006 season witnessed her putting down kills at an average of 3.95 per set. Thompson's post-FSU career included playing for the Jamaican National Team as well as Langenthal VBC in Switzerland at the professional level.



### <u>Jordana Price (2007-09) • VFM</u>

Jordana Price was another substantial piece to Florida State's history-making 2009 team that made it all the way to NCAA Volleyball's version of the Elite Eight. The Mountain Home, Idaho native was a ferocious player who garnered a .312 hitting percentage from 2007-09 and led Florida State in total blocks in two of her three years. An AVCA Honorable Mention All-American and a two-time all-region performer, Price took a similar path to teammate Brianna Barry by playing for VFM in Switzerland and also playing for Team Florida WAVE. Price was an All-ACC Team selection in 2009 when she recorded a .355 hitting percentage and 161 total blocks.



### Brianna Barry (2006-09) - VFM

Middle blocker Brianna Barry holds the distinguished honor as Florida State's first non-honorable mention All-American when she earned second-team honors as a senior. The Winter Springs, Fla., native had a tremendous career that was highlighted by leading the Seminoles to their first NCAA Regional Final appearance in 2009. In that season, Barry became Florida State's first ACC Player of the Year and finished with an astonishing .492 hitting percentage that is high atop the NCAA charts. Following her collegiate career, Barry played for VFM in Saignelégier, Switzerland from 2010-13, and also played for Team Florida WAVE. Barry was also an all-region and all-conference player in her Seminole years, and made the All-ACC Academic Team and the ACC Academic Honor Roll in each of her four seasons. She finished her college career with an outstanding .371 hitting percentage and 396 total blocks.



### Mira Djuric (2007-09) - HPK

Outside hitter Mira Djuric from Belgrade, Serbia was a tenacious student-athlete with an entertaining serve that came at opponents fast. Djuric was another AVCA Honorable Mention All-American in 2009 and twice made the All-ACC Team in both her playing seasons in 2007 and 2009. In just two seasons she ended her Seminole career with 152 service aces, a Top five mark in school history at the conclusion of her senior season. Djuric also excelled offensively in the attacking game, delivering the most kills on her teams in 2007 and 2009. Prior to her enrollment at Florida State, Djuric was a member of the Serbian Junior National Team. She played professionally in Finland for HPK following her years at Florida State.



### Stephanie Neville (2007-10) • Canadian National Team

Canadian-born outside hitter Stephanie Neville had four fine seasons for the Seminoles between 2007-10, always being a steady presence on the attack. The Cambridge, Ontario native ended her FSU career with a consistent .268 attack percentage which was highlighted by a .309 finish in the team's program-building 2009 year. As a senior, she was named to the All-ACC Team and earned a spot on the All-East Region Honorable Mention list after leading the Noles in kills. Prior to her enrollment at FSU, Neville had the honor of playing for the Canadian Youth and Junior National teams, adding to Florida State's growing list of student-athletes who spent time playing among their country's most competitive national teams. While at FSU, Neville was also an achiever in the classroom after earning a spot on the All-ACC Academic Team in both 2009 and 2010. She was also an All-ACC Academic Honor Roll recipient in all four seasons played.



### Visnja Djurdjevic (2010-11) • Serbian Junior National Team

Versatile Visnja Djurdjevic became Florida State's first multiple All-American, earning the honor twice in her only two seasons as a Seminole. She was a two-time All-ACC Team member and was responsible for the biggest point in program history, a match-point service ace that gave Florida State a five-set win over lowa State on Dec. 10, 2011, to send the Seminoles to the NCAA National Semifinals. Djurdjevic participated with the Serbian Junior National Team that twice won the Balkan Championships.




### <u>Duygu Duzceler (2009-12) • Turkish Junior National Team</u>

Turkish-born Duygu Duzceler became one of the most polished setters in program history as she was one of the guiding forces that began Florida State's unprecedented era. Duzceler never missed a match or even a set in her four-year career and was part of an NCAA Regional Final in 2009 and an NCAA National Semifinal in 2011. Her 134 career matches are just outside of the Top 10 list in school history, with the most recent player being Deanna Kaleta (137) in 1985-88. Duzceler helped make Florida State's attacking game exponentially better in her time in Tallahassee, helping a flurry of middle blockers and outside hitters earn All-America honors. Playing in a two-setter rotation, Duzceler still managed to record 2,915 assists for a Top 10 mark at Florida State. Shortly after her collegiate career, Duzceler signed a professional volleyball contract in Turkey.

### Sareea Freeman (2009-12) • USA Senior A2 Team

In her time as a Seminole, middle blocker Sareea Freeman went from being a raw athlete to a highly-skilled player who was a dominating force by her senior season. The Fresno, Calif., native earned AVCA Honorable Mention All-America honors in 2012 and finished second nationally with a .438 hitting percentage that season. Heading into her big senior year, Freeman faced some great competition during the summer 2012 when she competed with teammate Sarah Wickstrom in the United States Senior Women's A2 Program in Columbus, Ohio against some of the nation's best collegiate athletes across the country. Freeman set a school record for most ACC Player of the Week awards in a career when she earned four, including three in her final season at Florida State. She ended her FSU career with an outstanding .356 hitting percentage and 393 total blocks.

### Fatma Yildirim (2009-12) Turkish National Training Team

A hard-working player, Fatma Yildirim showcased several of her abilities while at Florida State. She ended her career as an AVCA Honorable Mention All-American in 2012, and became just the fifth Seminole to earn both All-ACC Freshman Team and All-ACC honors. Prior to coming to Florida State, Yildirim was a member of the Turkish Junior National Team from 2005-08. One of the highlights of her three-year stint was helping the national team to the title at the 2006 Balkan Championships. Yildirim was a co-captain on the 2012 Seminole squad and was known as a role model for the way she conducted herself. Yildirim is currently training with the Turkish National Team in preparation for the FIVB U23 World Championship in October 2013.

#### Marija Milosavljevic (2010-12) - Serbian Junior National Team

Middle blocker/right-side hitter Marija Milosavljevic was a steady player at Florida State, winning the Seminole Warrior and Total Commitment awards after her senior year for the devotion she showed. Milosavljevic was on the team's NCAA National Semifinal run in 2011, her second year with the program. The Bajina Basta, Serbia native has been a member of both the Serbian Youth and National Teams, having a few successful years at the Balkan Championships. Milosavljevic has the skills to continue playing at the professional level.



### Katie Mosher (2010-Present) • USA Junior A2 Team

Libero Katie Mosher was part of the European Global Challenge title in the summer 2011 in Croatia by the USA Junior A2 Team. Mosher was also part of the A2 program in high school, competing with the Youth A2 National Team in 2009. The Fort Myers, Fla., native holds the single-season record for digs at Florida State in a season with 604 in 2011, a year in which she was named the team's most influential player. Mosher finished with 495 digs in 2012 and was honored as the team's Complete Trust award recipient.



### Elise Walch (2011-Present) • USA Junior A2 Team

Elise Walch has played with USA Volleyball on a few occasions, most recently in 2011 when she helped the USA Junior A2 Team to the championship at the European Global Challenge in Croatia. She has also been a member of the 2008 and 2009 USA Volleyball Youth A2 Teams, and was placed on the 2010 USA Volleyball Junior National Training Team. The right-side hitter from Stuart, Fla., has produced some big-hitting matches for the Seminoles, including a dominant 12-kill performance against Miami as a sophomore when Florida State upended the nationally-ranked Hurricanes.



### Sarah Wickstrom (2011-Present) • USA Senior A2 Team

Setter Sarah Wickstrom joined former teammate Sareea Freeman in the United States Women's Senior A2 Program in Columbus, Ohio during the summer 2012. Wickstrom helped the USA Blue team to a 4-1 record at the national tournament. Through her first two seasons at Florida State, the Stuart, Fla., native has been a part of an NCAA National Semifinal run in 2011 and a second-round appearance in 2012. Following her freshman campaign, Wickstrom earned All-ACC Freshman Team honors. Prior to her arrival at Florida State, Wickstrom participated in the USA Volleyball Junior Olympics for several years and also played at USA Volleyball Beach Nationals.



#### Sarah Burrington (2012-Present) • USA Junior National Team

Middle blocker Sarah Burrington was named to the USA Volleyball Women's Junior National Team on June 14, 2013. The squad was composed of some of the very best collegiate athletes born in 1994 or 1995. The Ruskin, Fla. resident enjoyed a near two-week journey at the FIVB Women's U-20 World Championship in the Czech Republic. She helped Team USA to a 6-3 record which included scrimmages. Burrington redshirted for the Seminoles in her first season but enters her second year with big expectations.



### Olivera Medic (2012-Present) - Serbia Senior National Team

Outside hitter Olivera Medic has been another great addition to the Serbian pipeline that the Florida State indoor volleyball program has grown. As a junior at FSU she finished second on the team with 3.06 digs per set and 2.42 kills per set. She joined former teammate Fatma Yildirim as the only Seminoles to be named to more than one all-tournament team in 2012. The Subotica, Serbia native spent the summer of 2009 playing for the Serbian Senior National Team as she helped her national squad to a first-place finish in the Euroleague, defeating France in the semifinals and Turkey in the championship match. Medic also played on the Serbian Junior National Team and helped it to a second-place finish at the Balkan Championship.



### Nicole Walch (2012-Present) • USA Senior A2 Team

Nicole Walch is beginning her sophomore season at Florida State but has already had a couple stints with USA Volleyball. Heading into her senior season at Martin County High School, Walch joined her sister Elise and fellow Seminole Katie Mosher in winning the European Global Challenge as a member of United States Junior A2 team in Pula, Croatia. Walch took her game to the next level in the summer 2013 when she played in the USA Volleyball senior A2 program in Dallas, Texas, against some of the best players remaining with collegiate eligibility. Walch was part of a 2012 squad that won its second consecutive ACC title and its third in the last four seasons



## **2013 SEASON OUTLOOK**

#### Going for a Three-Peat

Florida State once again begins the 2013 season with a target on its back as defending ACC champions for the second consecutive year. The Seminoles earned the conference crown in 2011 then successfully defended it in 2012 by emerging victorious in a winner-takes-all match against Miami.

The Seminoles are looking to become the first ACC team to win three consecutive conference championships since North Carolina accomplished the feat from 1999-2001. Duke (1991-94) and North Carolina (1980-83) are the only ACC schools to record four straight conference titles.

Since the regular-season champion was determined to be the league winner beginning in 2005, Florida State is the only ACC school to win consecutive titles.

### **Burrington has a Summer Blast**

Redshirt freshman middle blocker Sarah Burrington had a funfilled summer that was highlighted by a trip to the Czech Republic with the USA Volleyball Women's Junior National Team. For two weeks, Burrington blogged about her enjoyable time spent playing against elite competition at the FIVB U20 World Championship, as well as the sight-seeing and eating that her group did.

Overall, Burrington and the USA squad finished 6-3 which includes scrimmages. Head coach Chris Poole and his coaching staff are hoping the Ruskin, Fla., native's unforgettable experience will add to her tremendous upside that will be on display in 2013.

#### The Month to Remember

While October signifies the "scariest" time of the year with Halloween peaking at the end, the month has been anything but frightening for Florida State over the last few seasons.

Since the 2011 year that saw the Seminoles earn a trip to the NCAA National Semifinals, Florida State is 18-0 in the month of October. The last loss for FSU in the year's 10th month was in fact on Halloween (Oct. 31) of 2010, falling at Virginia in five tough sets.

October is typically filled with ACC opponents and the same holds true in the upcoming season. The Seminoles face Georgia Tech, Clemson, Notre Dame, Duke and Wake Forest in road matches while hosting Maryland, Pitt and Miami during the month this year.

#### Walch Workin' Hard

The 2013 season is a big year for right-side hitter Elise Walch. The Stuart, Fla., native begins her senior season and shows a noticeable improvement in her athleticism after working extremely hard all offseason.

Walch, who is joined on the team by her sister Nicole, got after her workouts with strength and speed coach Caitlin Quinn as well as trainer Amanda Robinson shortly after the 2012 season ended. The good-natured player with a fierce attacking game is much quicker and touches much better in the air than she ever has since coming to FSU in 2011.

Although nothing is guaranteed going into a season, Walch has put herself in great position to have her best season as a Seminole. Her enormous dedication to getting in great shape could go a long way toward enhancing her overall game.

#### Walch Workin' Hard Part II

Elise Walch isn't the only Walch who has made strides heading into the 2013 season. Sophomore outside hitter Nicole Walch played at the USA National A2 Tournament in Dallas from June 29-July 3 against some of the top college-level talent in the nation, and more than held her own.

Nicole guided the Team Gold squad to the tournament championship on July 3, ultimately falling to Team White. Through her five matches played, Walch often led her team in kills and was a primary focus on the offensive end. Taking after her sister with a hard-working attitude this offseason, Nicole could propel herself to a breakout season in her second year at Florida State.

#### Poole Looking for Win No. 700

Longevity has been kind to Florida State volleyball head coach Chris Poole, who begins his 27th season as head coach as well as his sixth at Florida State. Entering the year with a 680-264 overall record, Poole is just 20 wins away from joining a special coaching group with 700 wins.

Poole also got his 600th win in his second season at Florida State, when the Seminoles defeated Alabama A&M in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on Dec. 5, 2009. His progress can be seen in how much faster his milestone wins have come - Poole's 500th career win came at Arkansas on Nov. 19, 2004 before claiming his 600th five years later. He now has an opportunity to get win No. 700 just four seasons later as he continues his resurrection of the Seminole volleyball program.

#### Moving up the Record Books

Middle blocker Ashley Neff and libero Katie Mosher were the only two members of the 2010 freshman class at Florida State. Nearly four years later, both student-athletes have made an enormous impact that will leave their names etched in the Florida State record books.

Neff, a senior from Kennesaw, Ga., is eighth in school history with 438 total blocks, sixth with a .320 career hitting percentage and fifth with 378 block assists. In her two blocking categories, Neff ranks as the highest of any FSU volleyball student-athlete who played in the rally-scoring era (2001-present) as before points were counted only on serves and allowed more opportunities for kills, blocks, digs, etc. If Neff continues at her current pace, she could be just the sixth Seminole to record 600 or more total blocks for her career. Included in Neff's career totals is merely a half season of playing time in 2010 when she had planned to

redshirt but was forced into action because of injuries.

Mosher still has two years of eligibility remaining after redshirting her first season in 2010. The Fort Myers, Fla. native is seventh in school history with 1,099 career digs, just 761 digs away from breaking former Nole Summer Weissing's school record of 1,859. After recording 604 digs in 2011 then 495 last season, Mosher is on pace to become the school's all-time leader in digs.

#### Not Feeling as Green

Sophomore right-side hitter Mara Green was known as an exceptional leaper at the front of the net, starring for her high school as a middle blocker with great touching ability. A leg injury sustained heading into her freshman year at Florida State may have hampered her game a little, but it appears she is getting back to full strength.

After having offseason surgery in May 2013, Green is on the fast recovery back to her normal self. Exhibiting the pep in her step that was last seen as a senior in high school, the Mc-Donough, Ga., native looks to make a significant contribution to the Noles and remain healthy for the season.

While she stepped up big in some matches as a freshman, Green is ready to raise the level of her attacking and aid in the team's blocking game in 2013.

### **Another Tough Schedule**

It just wouldn't be a Chris Poole-led squad without having a large share of difficult matches. The 2013 season plans to be no different as Florida State faces 11 teams either ranked in the AVCA Top 25 preseason poll or receiving votes.

The non-conference opponents in the poll include No. 7 Michigan, No. 9 Florida, No. 17 Kentucky, No. 21 Western Kentucky, No. 23 Ohio State, Illinois (49 votes), Long Beach State (30 votes) and Texas A&M (20 votes).

The ACC opponents include North Carolina (68 votes), Miami (41 votes) and newcomer Notre Dame (6 votes). Altogether, 13 of Florida State's 31 matches will feature a team that is part of the AVCA Preseason Poll.

#### Noles Ranked 18th in AVCA Preseason Poll

The Florida State indoor volleyball team has been selected 18th in the annual American Volleyball Coaches Association Preseason Poll.

The preseason Top 25 ranking is the fourth time in school history Florida State has been nationally-ranked before the season has gotten underway. In 1998, the Seminoles were chosen 24th in the opening poll, then were picked 15th in the preseason in 2010. Last year, the Seminoles were ranked 12th in the preseason.

The back-to-back Atlantic Coast Conference champions were the only team in the league to earn a Top 25 spot. Rival North Carolina sits just outside the preseason poll with 68 votes, while 2012 league runner-up Miami shows 41 votes. Fellow ACC team Notre Dame added to the conference's total with six additional

Florida State continues its school-record streak of being in the AVCA Top 25 poll. Including their current No. 18 ranking, the Seminoles have now been ranked for 27 consecutive weeks. The last time Florida State was outside the Top 25 poll was on Sept. 12, 2011. The previous long stretch of AVCA Top 25 appearances for the Seminoles came at 24 straight weeks from Sept. 7, 2009 to Oct. 25, 2010.

#### Welcome Coach Mac!

With the departure of beloved associate head coach Holly Watts, who became the head coach at UTEP, the Seminoles welcome new associate head coach Ryan McGuyre. He joins fellow associate head coach Gokhan Yilmaz and head coach Chris Poole to create a formidable staff.

McGuyre carries a strong reputation in the collegiate volleyball circuit and has enjoyed much success on several levels. The former California Baptist head coach and Maryland assistant has educated at the collegiate, high school and club level since 1995, and has made his mark in the women's game by coaching several All-Americans while earning national championships and coach-of-the-year awards out West.

The newest member to the FSU staff has been a part of nine national championships and 541 collegiate wins throughout his decorated coaching career.

On the women's side, he has coached 18 NAIA All-Americans and 15 Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athletes. In the men's program, he had 19 players named to the NAIA Men's Invitational All-Tournament team and five named AVCA/NAIA All-America in the first two seasons it was awarded.

#### Ready to Go

Two redshirt freshmen in middle blocker Sarah Burrington and outside hitter Leah Mikesky have a chance to emerge as prime contributors for the Seminoles this season.

While Burrington developed her game even more this summer and comes in with much raw talent, Mikesky has also improved and will compete for a spot at outside hitter. The Schulenburg, Texas native is known as an extremely athletic performer who provided quite a challenge to the every-match starters in practice last year.

If Florida State can get consistently strong performances from the two redshirt freshmen who helped make up their highly-touted 2012 recruiting class, the Seminoles will have a solid chance to three-peat in the ACC.





## HEAD COACH CHRIS POOLE



The transformation has been thorough and quick.

When Chris Poole inherited the Florida State volleyball program in the summer of 2008, he took over a team that had failed to reach the 20-win plateau in five-straight seasons and hadn't been to the NCAA Tournament since 2002. It was a program looking for answers; a program looking to get back to the winning ways it had grown accustomed to in the 1980s and early '90s.

Five years later, Poole and associate head coach Gokhan Yilmaz have made their mark and revitalized a program that has built itself into a national contender. In Poole's first five seasons he has guided the Seminoles to an NCAA National Semifinal, an NCAA Regional Final and two trips to the NCAA Second Round.

In 2012, the Seminoles won their third Atlantic Coast Conference title under Poole and the program's fourth overall. Florida State finished with a remarkable 28-4 overall record, earning back-to-back conference crowns for the first time in the ACC since Maryland achieved the feat in 2003 and 2004. The Seminoles tied a school record with the 2011 squad by defeating five AVCA Top 25 opponents, and are one of just three teams (Southern California, Western Kentucky) who have garnered 28 wins or better in the last two seasons (2011 and 2012).

In Poole's fifth season Florida State obliterated the school record for consecutive wins at home, reaching 27 matches before falling to Purdue in the NCAA Second Round. Florida State also achieved a 16-match win streak and won 19 consecutive sets overall in the 2012 season to reflect its stellar play. The Seminoles finished 18th in the final AVCA Poll and 12th in the

final RPI, while being led by AVCA Third-Team All-American and ACC Player of the Year Ashley Neff as well as honorable mention All-Americans Sareea Freeman and Fatma Yildirim.

Poole's most memorable year thus far came in 2011, when he led the Seminoles to their first-ever NCAA National Semifinal appearance in what was a startling year to say the least.

In 2011, FSU earned its third ACC title while finishing with a 28-7 overall record and an 18-2 mark within the conference. The Seminoles entered the NCAA Tournament as a No. 12 national seed and began the Field of 64 by defeating Albany and Cincinnati in Tully Gym. From there, FSU upset No. 5 Purdue in four sets in the Sweet 16 and defeated fourth-seeded lowa State in five sets in the Elite Eight in Minneapolis to achieve a feat that many deemed unthinkable when Poole and his staff first arrived.

FSU became the first ACC volleyball team to ever advance to the final round of four, where it eventually lost to NCAA champion UCLA in the national semifinal at the Alamodome in San Antonio. FSU was the only team in the final four that had gotten through its regional in which both Sweet 16 and Elite Eight opponents were nationally-seeded. In his five seasons leading the Seminoles, Poole has compiled nine of FSU's 10 NCAA postseason wins, showing a 9-4 mark in championship play.

As a result of FSU's historical 2011 campaign, Poole helped the Seminoles achieve their highest national ranking ever as they finished at No. 7 in the final AVCA Poll. FSU also finished with the seventh-best RPI in the nation. Poole capped his incredible season by being named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second time as well as the AVCA East Region Coach of the Year. He coached AVCA Second-Team All-American Jekaterina Stepanova to a career year as well as AVCA Honorable Mention All-Americans Visnja Djurdjevic and Neff.

The Seminoles earned 21 wins in Poole's first season in 2008 and then followed that up with an incredible 2009 campaign. FSU not only posted a 31-3 overall record, but under Poole's tutelage the 'Noles captured their first outright regular-season Atlantic Coast Conference championship in school history (second overall) and made it to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever.

In addition to those program firsts, Poole's Seminoles also set the school standard for most

conference wins in a season with 19 and ACC wins in a row with 16, which was then tied by the 2011 team. A national ranking of No. 11 in the entire country was the highest ever for a Florida State volleyball team at the time and its No. 3 national seed in the Big Dance continues to be the highest ever. Poole's 2012 team reached the program's highest AVCA ranking at No. 6 on Sept. 3, 2012.

For his squad's multiple successes, Poole garnered ACC Coach of the Year and AVCA Division I East Region Coach of the Year honors in 2009.

He also coached a handful of players that generated quite a few accolades. Brianna Barry became the first Seminole to ever be named the ACC's Player of the Year and she also garnered AVCA Division I Second-Team All-American honors. Barry, an ESPN The Magazine Academic All First-Team member, was joined by Jordana Price, Mira Djuric and Rachael Morgan on the 2009 All-ACC Team - a record at FSU for most players on that list in one season. Price, Djuric and Morgan also each achieved an AVCA Division I Honorable Mention All-American nod. Poole also coached an ACC All-Freshman Team performer in Yildirim.

The 2010 season featured several roadblocks for the Seminoles, ranging from life-altering misfortunes off the court to devastating injuries that inhibited the team's continuity. Despite all the hardships, the gutsy FSU squad finished 22-11, including 12-8 within the ACC. Several program feats were accomplished - making back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in over a decade, advancing to the second round of the NCAA Championship in consecutive years for the first time in school history and finishing with at least 20 wins for the third straight season.

Veterans Jenna Romanelli and Stephanie Neville capped off their four-year careers in excellent fashion. Junior outside hitter Djurdjevic was one of the top transfers in the country, being named an AVCA Honorable Mention All-American and an AVCA Honorable Mention All-East Region member. She joined Neville as members of the All-ACC Team as well.

The fact that Poole has breathed life in the FSU volleyball program should come as no surprise as he brought a wealth of knowledge and experience to the school after heading the program at the University of Arkansas for 14 accomplished seasons.

Poole started Arkansas' volleyball program in 1994 and was not only successful, but led the Lady Razorbacks to 11 Southeastern Conference Western Division titles. Add to that 11 postseason appearances - two NIVC and nine NCAA - along with an SEC Tournament title and numerous individual player honors.

Upon arriving in Fayetteville, Ark. in 1993, Poole personally handled every element of building the program from buying the first pieces of equipment, hiring the assistants and recruiting the players, to renovating the court and building locker room facilities.

With head coaching stints at Arkansas, Arkansas State and Arkansas Tech, Poole earned a 550-230 career record in 21 seasons prior to his hiring at FSU and had been named conference coach of the year seven times and was pegged the South Region Coach of the Year in 1997.

During his 14 seasons at Arkansas, in which he compiled a 316-161 record, Poole produced two AVCA All-Americans, three AVCA honorable mention All-Americans, 24 players with 44 All-SEC honors, three SEC Freshmen of the Year and 25 AVCA All-District/All-Region honorees. In addition to the success on the court, Poole's Arkansas teams excelled in the classroom as well with 67 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, 10 CoSIDA All-District selections, two H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete finalists and one McWhorter winner.

Poole certainly made his mark in the SEC as he guided Arkansas to a 159-65 record in the SEC regular season for a 71 percent league-winning mark. Poole and the Lady Razorbacks were even more impressive against the Western Division, winning 11 of 14 titles.

Poole spent an entire year away from competition preparing for the Razorback's inaugural season in 1994 and it was time well spent as he led Arkansas to a 19-17 overall record, a 10-5 SEC mark and an SEC Western Division title with a perfect 10-0 divisional record in the first year of competition. The Lady Razorbacks finished third overall in the league that year and played well enough to earn a postseason bid to the National Invitational Volleyball Coaches tournament in Kansas City where they finished seventh in a field of 20 teams. Poole was selected as the 1994 SEC Coach of the Year while two of his players earned All-SEC honors and one player earned All-District honors.

Poole's ability to build a program was proven first with Arkansas Tech then at Arkansas State. He took over days prior to the 1987 season at ASU and his first team showed the effects with an 8-24 record. But with one season under Poole's careful tutelage, virtually the same team was 41-1 the next year, launching a five-year run of winning

seasons for the Lady Indians.


His 1988 team had a 33-match win streak, longest in the nation, and posted a school-record 41-1 overall mark. The next year, ASU had a 34-match win streak, notched a Lady Indian record with 43 wins (43-6 overall) and was ranked ninth in the South Region.

In his last season at ASU, the Lady Indians were 41-6 and received an automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament in 1992. ASU entered the 32-team NCAA field with the most wins of any team, but lost a tough four-game match to the Northwest Region's top-seeded team, Long Beach State.

Prior to ASU, Poole was an assistant and later head coach at Arkansas Tech. In two seasons as head coach at ATU, he posted a 53-20 record, winning the Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference title in 1985 as co-head coach and finishing runner-up as head coach in 1986. He started his collegiate career in 1983 as a graduate assistant for the nationally ranked Arkansas Tech Golden Suns. Tech was 58-9 with a perfect 24-0 conference mark in two seasons with Poole as an assistant coach.

A native of Heber Springs in north-central Arkansas, Poole is a 1983 graduate of Arkansas Tech and earned a master's degree from there in 1989. He is a member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association and has served on the AVCA's All-American, All-South Region and All-South Region Ranking committees and is also an AVCA Top 25 voter.

Poole and his wife, Toni, a former Arkansas State track and field standout, have two children, son Joshua and daughter Taylor.

## ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH GOKHAN YILMAZ



Gokhan Yilmaz is heading into his sixth season at Florida State after joining the staff in 2008 following two seasons as an assistant coach for the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks under current FSU coach Chris Poole. Yilmaz was promoted to an associate head coach position with Florida State in the spring 2013.

Yilmaz's primary role is the team's training coordinator where he is in charge of the day-to-day training while working to enhance the skills of all players. Yilmaz has also taken on an expanded recruiting role to help establish Seminole volleyball at the regional, national and international level.

He was instrumental in implementing Florida State's quick attack in 2012 that allowed it to finish 14th nationally with a .276 hitting percentage. Using the standout offensive play of middle blockers Sareea Freeman and Ashley Neff, the Seminoles put together one of the best offenses in the nation as they finished with a 28-4 overall record and a second consecutive ACC title. Both players ended their seasons a All-Americans, and outside hitter Fatma Yildirim joined them on the All-ACC Team as well as being an All-American herself.

Yilmaz played a significant part in FSU volleyball's historic 2011 season in which it reached its first NCAA National Semifinal in the school's 44-year history. Yilmaz has proven to be an extremely effective instructor in drawing up match plans for the opposition, which is part of his daily teachings to his student-athletes. The knowledgeable coach's strategies for scouting the opposition, teaching the fundamentals to his team and motivating his student-athletes has made him a tremendous asset to the FSU coaching staff.

In 2011, Yilmaz helped several FSU players fulfill their individual goals. Outside hitter Jekaterina Stepanova became just the second non-honorable mention All-American in school history by earning AVCA Second-Team honors, while Visnja Djurdjevic joined Neff in earning AVCA Honorable Mention All-America honors. In addition, three Seminoles in Neff, Djurdjevic and Stepanova made the All-ACC Team while freshman setter Sarah Wickstrom was an all-conference freshman.

In the recruiting realm, Yilmaz helped make an enormous splash with the signing of four players ranked in the Top 53 of the PrepVolleyball.com 2012 senior class rankings.

The standout athletes include middle blockers Sarah Burrington and Mara Green and outside hitters Nicole Walch and Leah Mikesky. All four players showed great signs of progression in their first season, and made up the third-best recruiting class in 2012 according to PrepVolleyball.com.

His efforts on the road were rewarded with a strong 2009 recruiting class that included two National Team-level players from his home country of Turkey and an up-and-coming middle blocker from California. Outside hitter Fatma Yildirim and setter Duygu Duzceler made the transition to American volleyball from Turkey and became key contributors as true freshmen in 2009 with Yildirim even earning

ACC All-Freshman team honors. Freeman has also made great strides in her first three years after playing behind veteran stars Brianna Barry and Jordana Price in 2009.

That 2009 class became arguably the most successful in school history, amassing 109 victories in four years, an NCAA National Semifinal, an NCAA Regional Final, two second-round appearances and three ACC titles.

As for the 2010 recruiting class, Yilmaz once again landed a group of talented prospects that continue to push the program to new heights. In addition to Americans Ashley Neff and Katie Mosher, Yilmaz helped in the signing of junior college All-American transfers Jekatarina Stepanova (Riga, Latvia) and Patricia Figueiredo (Rio de Janeiro, Brazil) from Missouri State University-West Plains. Both JUCO transfers aided the Seminoles tremendously in a return run to the NCAA Championship.

Yilmaz continued his splendid recruiting efforts for the 2011 season by helping land standout setter Wickstrom of Stuart, Fla, who became an All-ACC freshman.

The 2013 class figures to be no different in term's of success with Orlando-area standouts Hailey Luke and Isabel Carmona inking their NLI's. Both players look to follow a strong pedigree of recent accomplishments attained in Yilmaz's recruiting classes.

Already one of the top minds in collegiate volleyball, Yilmaz took advantage of an enormous honor in the spring 2013 when he was a guest at the Turkish National Team Coaches Classic alongside some very prestigious volleyball coaches worldwide. His expertise on the game that has consumed much of his life allowed him to focus on three sections at the coaches clinic - the differences in American and Turkish volleyball systems, player selection and four-year planning in collegiate volleyball and USA volleyball development.

Besides teaching and coaching along with some of the game's best at the clinic in Turkey, Yilmaz seized an opportunity for some publicity. He appeared on a live, volleyball-specific television show that was an hour long. The show featured a discussion about Yilmaz's career in Turkey and his path to the United States as well as his success at Florida State.

A bonus to the TV appearance was having on a few of Yilmaz's former players from Turkey who played for him when they were between 12 and 18 years old. The two young men have now made it to the professional ranks and are participating with the Turkish Men's National Team, showing Yilmaz much gratitude for how much he taught them growing up.

Yilmaz had a busy spring in 2009 after being selected as an assistant coach for the Florida Region Girls Junior National Team. This allowed him to make inroads in the Florida recruiting base and gave him a chance to work with plenty of young talent.

While at Arkansas with Poole and former FSU associate head coach Holly Watts, Yilmaz went to work on re-energizing practices as the training coordinator for the Lady Razorbacks. He was also involved with recruiting by making trips both nationally and internationally to spread the Lady Razorbacks' name.

Yilmaz's first exposure to Arkansas came in the spring of 2005 when he worked with the Lady Razorbacks as a volunteer coach. Prior to Arkansas, Yilmaz was at Northwood, where he helped the Timberwolves to a regional semifinal n 2005 with a 23-11 overall record. They were conference runners-up with a 14-4 mark that same season. Northwood was 16-11 and had three players selected to the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic all-conference team in 2006.

Also at Northwood, Yilmaz coached a first team All-American and Regional Player of the Year in Gorana Maricic, as well as four other All-Conference players. Yilmaz was also in charge of camps, recruiting and training for the Timberwolves.

Yilmaz got his coaching start in the United States as an assistant at Cameron University from 2003 to 2004 and at Western New Mexico from 2002 to 2003. Before coming to the states, Yilmaz worked for various club programs in Istanbul, Turkey, as well as with the Turkish National Team. While working with the Turkish National Team, Yilmaz guided multiple age groups to eight National Titles. He also worked with the Turkish Junior National Team during the 1999 and 2000 seasons. He has also worked with national team coaches from Cuba, Russia and Bulgaria, assisting in their practices and working in the physical training aspect of the game.

Yilmaz received his bachelor's degree in European Studies in 2002 from Istanbul University and completed his master's degree in Sports Psychology while coaching at Cameron in 2005.

## ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH RYAN MCGUYRE



Ryan McGuyre begins his first season as associate head coach for the Florida State indoor volleyball program. Upon his welcoming to Tallahassee, McGuyre carries a strong reputation in the collegiate volleyball circuit and has enjoyed much success on several levels.

"Ryan has a tremendous background in coaching and has proven to be very successful in women's volleyball," head coach Chris Poole said. "Overall, he has trained players at the highest level and has beaten the best programs in the nation. His ability to juggle coaching both men's and women's volleyball at the same time in years past is also a reflection of his great work ethic, discipline and time management. We are excited for Ryan and his family to join the Florida State Volleyball family."

McGuyre brings a great wealth of knowledge to an already experienced Florida State coaching staff that also includes associate head coach Gokhan Yilmaz. The former California Baptist head coach and Maryland assistant has educated at the collegiate, high school and club level since 1995 and adds another well-versed dimension to an FSU coaching staff that has secured consecutive ACC titles and a recent NCAA National Semifinal appearance in 2011.

As a head coach for California Baptist from 2002 to 2011, McGuyre managed virtually every aspect of the program. He was fully responsible for the overall development and organization of both the men's and women's volleyball programs, guiding the women's team to national championships in 2004, 2005 and 2011. He also won the men's national championship in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2010 and 2011.

While building a perennial contender out West, McGuyre earned several coach of the year honors. He was a two-time NAIA National Tournament Coach of the Year in 2004 and 2005 and finished as the 2010 American Volleyball Coaches Association Coach of the Year for his efforts with the women's program. That same year he also earned Golden State Athletic Conference Coach of the Year.

More national accolades followed McGuyre in his time at California Baptist. After the school's transition to the National Christian Collegiate Athletic Association, he was honored as the NCCAA DI National Coach of the Year following the women's team's national title in 2011. His strong efforts were not just recognized on the women's side, winning the Tachikara NAIA National Coach of the Year on the men's side in 2005 and an AVCA National Coach of the Year in 2010.

McGuyre has been a part of nine national championships and 541 collegiate wins throughout his decorated coaching career. On the women's side, he has coached 18 NAIA All-Americans and 15 Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athletes. In the men's program, he had 19 players named to the NAIA Men's Invitational All-Tournament team and five named AVCA/NAIA All-America in the first two seasons it was awarded.

Part of his extensive experience includes time spent at two ACC institutions in NC State (1998-99) and Maryland (2012) where he helped haul in talented recruiting classes.

During his time in the coaching realm, which also includes a three-year stint at Biola University from 1999-2001, McGuyre has helped defeat two topranked teams and a host of other formidable opponents including USC, UCLA, Stanford, Pepperdine, Long Beach State, UC-Santa Barbara, Penn State, California-Irvine and Hawaii.

At Biola, McGuyre reached the NAIA regional playoffs each season and accumulated 60 victories as the head women's volleyball coach. He coached three NAIA All-Americans, six NAIA All-America

Scholar-Athletes and seven GSAC Scholar-Athletes.

In his most recent stop at Maryland, McGuyre handled an array of duties as the assistant volleyball coach. He assisted heavily in recruiting as well as practice and game planning, and was involved in video and statistical analysis. The 2012 Terrapins made a large improvement in nearly every major statistical category and added seven more victories compared to their 2011 campaign.

While involved at California Baptist, McGuyre was the vice president of the NAIA Volleyball Coaches Association from 2009-10. He was also a volunteer assistant coach for the USA Volleyball Men's National Team in 2006, helping run practice drills as well as charting, video analysis and game planning for opposing countries.

A graduate of Biola University in 1998, McGuyre earned his Bachelors of Arts degree in social science with an emphasis in secondary education and a minor in biblical studies. He and his wife, Jennifer, have three children in Tryston, Kitana and Ryder.

Jennifer was a standout volleyball player at the University of Hawaii, helping the Rainbow Wahine to a 121-16 overall record in her four seasons from 1996-99. During her time there, Hawaii reached the NCAA Finals in her freshman season and also went to the NCAA Regional Finals and Semifinals.

She was a member of the U.S. National Team in 2002 and earned All-Western Athletic Conference honors in her senior season at Hawaii. Prior to her husband's move to Maryland, she was an assistant coach with him at California Baptist as well as at Biola.

## **2012 SERSON ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

- Earned the program's fourth ACC title, including the third in the last four seasons, with a 3-1 victory over Miami on Nov. 23
- Florida State's 2012 ACC championship marked back-to-back titles, the first time a team has accomplished the feat in the league since Maryland in 2003 and 2004
- Won the Atlantic Coast Conference with an 18-2 conference record for the second consecutive season. Florida State has now gone 36-4 in the ACC over the last two seasons, which is the fourth-best two-year record by any team in ACC history
- Defeated five AVCA Top 25 opponents in 2012, which ties the 2011 squad for the top mark in program history. The Seminoles defeated No. 10 Iowa State, No. 11 Florida, No. 15 Tennessee, No. 21 Ohio State and No. 23 Miami
- Finished 5-2 against AVCA Top 25 opponents in 2012
- Earned an NCAA Tournament bid for the fourth consecutive season, tying a school record. The other string of years where Florida State earned four straight NCAA Tournament berths was from 1987-90. The Seminoles had never been to the NCAA Championship four consecutive times as members of the ACC
- Under Head Coach Chris Poole, Florida State is now 9-4 in the NCAA postseason in four appearances
- Florida State earned a national seed for the third time in the last four seasons, hosting as a No. 9 national seed
- The Seminoles obliterated the school record for longest home win streak at 27 matches. Until falling to Purdue in five sets in the NCAA Second Round on Nov. 30, 2012, Florida State had not lost a match at Tully Gym since Nov. 26, 2010. The Seminoles remain undefeated in Tully Gym in regular season matches since the 2010 season
- Won 24 consecutive sets at home before falling in the second set to Miami on Nov.
   23. Before that, Florida State did not lose a set at home since falling in the second set to Duke on Sept. 30
- Recorded seven consecutive 3-0 sweeps at Tully Gym from Oct. 5-Nov. 18. In that time span Florida State swept North Carolina, NC State, Florida, Virginia, Virginia Tech, Maryland and Boston College
- Florida State has finished 18-0 in the month of October over the last two seasons
- For the second straight year in a row, Florida State enjoyed a 16-match win streak. This year's streak lasted from Sept. 14-Nov. 2 before falling at North Carolina in 3-1 fashion. The win streak is tied for the fourth-longest in program history, with number one being 21 straight wins by the 1981 team
- The Seminoles won 19 consecutive sets overall, starting with their five-set comeback at Georgia Tech on Oct. 19 and ending with their second-set loss at UNC on Nov. 3. It is the seventh longest in program history and the longest since the 1998 team won 23 straight sets. The program record is 35 consecutive sets won in 1981
- Florida State's senior class consisting of Duygu Duzceler, Sareea Freeman, Marija Milosavljevic and Fatma Yildirim combined to win 109 matches in their careers. The total is the highest ever for an FSU senior class that played all four years in the ACC, and is the seventh-most by a senior class in school history
- Through the regular season, Florida State finished 8-3 against the Top 50 RPI opponents in the nation. Those wins included Florida (12), North Carolina (14), Iowa State (18), Tennessee (21), Miami (22), Ohio State (25) and NC State twice (43)
- Has been in the Top 25 poll for 27 consecutive weeks. The previous longest streak in school history was by the 2009 and 2010 teams at 24 straight weeks
- On Sept. 3, Florida State reached a record ranking at No. 6 in the AVCA poll following its 6-0 start
- Went 6-2 in televised/webcasted matches according to the league's TV partnership, defeating Georgia Tech, Clemson, Florida, NC State, Duke and Miami in front of regional and national audiences
- Won the Comcast Lady Vol Classic championship on Aug. 25, defeating Tennessee, lowa State and Cincinnati in one of the toughest early-season tournaments of the season
- $\bullet$  Defeated Georgia, FIU and Florida A&M to win the Florida State Invitational on Sept. 1
- Defeated Florida by a 3-0 score on Oct. 24 to snap a 21-match losing streak to the

- Gators. It marked the Seminoles' first win over their rival since Oct. 31, 1994
- Garnered the ACC Player of the Year in junior middle blocker Ashley Neff, who is the second Seminole to earn the conference honor.
- Had three student-athletes in Ashley Neff, Sareea Freeman and Fatma Yildirim named to the All-ACC Team
- Had three student-athletes in Ashley Neff, Sareea Freeman and Fatma Yildirim named to the AVCA All-East Region Team
- Senior middle blocker Sareea Freeman broke the program record for most ACC Player of the Week honors in a career with four. Freeman was honored three times this season
- A Seminole was named an ACC Player or Co-Player of the Week five times this year, marking a school record. Sareea Freeman earned the honor three times, while Ashley Neff and Fatma Yildirim earned the honor once apiece
- Olivera Medic, Duygu Duzceler and Ashley Neff (MVP) were named to the Comcast Lady Vol Classic All-Tournament Team
- Olívera Medic, Sareea Freeman and Fatma Yildirim were named to the Florida State Invitational All-Tournament Team
- Fatma Yildirim and Katie Mosher were named to the Flo Hyman Collegiate Cup All-Tournament Team
- Duygu Duzceler finishes her career with 134 matches played, never missing a
  match or even a set. She fell just three matches short of being placed on the Top 10
  list, which is filled with former student-athletes from the 1970s and 1980s
- Duygu Duzceler finishes her career seventh in school history with 135 service aces. Her 2,915 career assists rank sixth in school history
- Sareea Freeman's .356 career hitting percentage ranks third in school history. Her 393 total blocks are 10th on the school's career list, while her 341 block assists are sixth
- Sareea Freeman's .438 hitting percentage in 2012 ranks second in school history
- Katie Mosher's 1,099 career digs are seventh in school history. With two years of eligibility left, Mosher is on track to break the all-time school record of 1,859 held by Summer Weissing
- Katie Mosher's 495 digs in 2012 are the fifth-most in school history
- Ashley Neff's 438 total blocks rank eighth in school history, while her 378 block assists are fifth
- Ashley Neff's 184 total blocks in 2012 are the 10th-most in school history. Neff now has two spots in the single-season Top 10 in total blocks
- Ashley Neff's .380 hitting percentage in 2012 ranks fifth on the school's singleseason list
- Florida State has finished the last two seasons (2011, 2012) with 28 wins apiece. The only other schools to finish with 28 wins or better in the last two years are Southern California and Western Kentucky
- Ashley Neff earned AVCA Third-Team All-America honors, while Fatma Yildirim and Sareea Freeman earned honorable mention All-America honors
- Sareea Freeman was one of three student-athletes who was named NCAA.com Players of the Week on Oct. 31
- Florida State finished 18th in the final AVCA Poll, marking the third time in the last four years the Seminoles have ended the season nationally ranked
- Florida State finished in the AVCA Poll from start to finish in 2012 for the first time in program history (preseason to postseason)
- The Seminoles finished the season with the 12th-highest RPI in the nation
- Florida State finished eighth nationally with an .875 winning percentage
- Florida State finished 14th nationally with a .276 hitting percentage
- Florida State finished 20th nationally with 2.76 blocks per set
- Sareea Freeman finished second nationally with a .438 hitting percentage
- Ashley Neff finished seventh nationally in blocks per set (1.61) and 21st with a .380 hitting percentage
- Had two student-athletes in Olivera Medic and Sarah Wickstrom make the All-ACC Academic Team



- The Seminoles' top-ranked win according to the AVCA Poll occurred on four occasions, defeating eighth-ranked Florida twice (Sept. 7, 1993 & Oct. 31, 1994), Illinois (Sept. 4, 2009) and Purdue (Dec. 9, 2011).
- Head Coach Chris Poole owns 13 nationally-ranked wins as FSU's head coach. He has more in his first four seasons than the program had in the prior 27 seasons before his arrival (9).

## THE ACC

#### The Tradition

Consistency. It is the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now, in its 61st year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed the reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, ACC schools have captured 131 NCAA championships, including 69 in women's competition and 62 in men's. In addition, NCAA individual titles have gone to ACC student-athletes 150 times in men's competition and 106 times in women's action. Given the ACC's strong history and the strengthening of its ranks with the additions of Notre Dame, Pitt and Syracuse in 2013, followed by Louisville in 2014, those numbers – and the league's longstanding tradition of excellence – appear destined to only grow greater in the years ahead.

#### 2012-13 Review

The 2012-13 academic year saw ACC teams capture four more national team titles and seven individual NCAA crowns. In all, the ACC has won 62 national team titles over the last 16 years and has won two or more NCAA titles in 30 of the past 32 years. A total of 119 ACC teams placed in NCAA post-season competition in 2012-13. League teams compiled a 120-74-2 (.617) mark against non-league opponents in NCAA championship dual competition.

The ACC's new membership further bolsters the league's already-strong academic standing among NCAA Division I conferences. The ACC's member institutions, effective July 1, 2014, rank first among BCS automatic qualifying conferences in the latest US News & World Report's "Best Colleges" list. ACC schools averaged a ranking of 55.73 and were the only conference with eight schools ranked among the top 50 (five public, three private). The ACC is also the only conference with 11 schools ranked among the top 70.

Since becoming a 12-team league in 2005, the ACC has had 64 teams go to bowl games, had 51 players drafted in the first round and 312 players taken overall in the NFL Draft – totals that rank second nationally among all conferences. The league's current 14 schools who will compete for the 2012 ACC football title have combined for 13 national championships, posted a 5-3 record in 2012 bowl games and led the nation in football APR last year for the seventh straight year and in football GSR (graduation success rate) for the seventh time in the last eight years.

#### The Championships

The conference will conduct championship competition in 25 sports during the 2013-14 academic year; 12 for men and 13 for women. The first ACC championship was held in swimming on February 25, 1954. The conference did not conduct championships in cross country, wrestling or tennis during the first year.

The 12 sports for men include football, cross country, soccer, basketball, swimming,

The 12 sports for men include football, cross country, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball, tennis, golf and lacrosse. Fencing, which was started in 1971, was discontinued in 1981. Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship meet held in tennis at Wake Forest University.

Championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, field hockey, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf, lacrosse, softball and rowing with volleyball deciding its champion by regular season play.

#### A History

The Atlantic Coast Conference was founded on May 8, 1953, at the Sedgefield Inn near Greensboro, N.C., with seven charter members - Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest - drawing up the conference by-laws.

The withdrawal of seven schools from the Southern Conference came early on the morning of May 8, 1953, during the Southern Conference's annual spring meeting. On June 14, 1953, the seven members met in Raleigh, N.C., where a set of bylaws was adopted and the name became officially the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Suggestions from fans for the name of the new conference appeared in the region's

newspapers prior to the meeting in Raleigh. Some of the names suggested were: Dixie, Mid-South, Mid-Atlantic, East Coast, Seaboard, Colonial, Tobacco, Blue-Gray, Piedmont, Southern Seven and the Shoreline.

Duke's Eddie Cameron recommended that the name of the conference be the Atlantic Coast Conference, and the motion was passed unanimously. The meeting concluded with each member institution assessed

\$200.00 to pay for conference expenses.

On December 4, 1953, conference officials met again at Sedgefield and officially admitted the University of Virginia as the league's eighth member. The first withdrawal of a school from the ACC came on June 30, 1971, when the University of the ACC came on June 30, 1971, when the AC

June 30, 1971, when the University of South Carolina tendered its resignation. The ACC operated with seven members until April 3, 1978, when the Georgia Institute of Technology was admitted. The Atlanta school had withdrawn from the Southeastern Conference in January of 1964.

The ACC expanded to nine members on July 1, 1991, with the addition of Florida State University.

The conference expanded to 11 members on July 1, 2004, with the addition of the University of Miami and Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. On October 17, 2003, Boston College accepted an invitation to become the league's 12th member starting July 1, 2005.

The ACC added its 13th and 14th members on Sept. 18, 2011, when Pittsburgh and Syracuse accepted invitations to join the conference. The two schools officially joined the ACC on July 1, 2013. Notre Dame also officially joined the ACC on July 1, 2013, after announcing on Sept. 12, 2012 its intention to enter the league for competition in all sports but football, bringing the membership of the conference to 15. The Fighting Irish will play five games with ACC schools each year. On July 1, 2014, Louisville will enter the ACC from the Big East Conference. The ACC will remain a 15-member conference, as Maryland plans to join the Big Ten.
