

Seniors Katie Mosher and Sarah Wickstrom answer a few questions about the 2014 Season

This is your final year, can you explain how you're feeling right now?

Mosher: "We're both excited knowing that it's our last season and we want to go out with a bang. I think we have a lot of good players going in and we're just excited to get started and get some coaching and putting it all together."

Wickstrom: "I really want us to work hard and try to get back to the Final Four. We did it my freshman year and we haven't been there for the past few years and it makes us want to work that much harder. It's our last season, our last camp and we really want to make a push to get back there."

That Final Four Year (2011) was your first season, just talk about being a part of the program's history:

Mosher: "I grew up a Seminole fan and Sarah did too and just being able to come here and play for FSU is already a huge deal. Being able to change the direction of the program I think is a cool thing to be a part of, especially since we were just starting our collegiate careers. It's always good to come into a good program but to be one of the ones that was there to change it is pretty cool."

Wickstrom: "I agree. Well said."

This is your second year together as a captain duo, what are your plans for the season?

Wickstrom: "We have a great group of ladies here. We don't have to do too much, just keep everyone working and really that's it. We just need to do what we did last year and we know we'll have a fun year."

Mosher: "I do think we have a good group of girls and I think that makes it a lot easier as a captain to not have to deal with a lot of drama on and off the court, so having the group of girls we have, we're going to have fun."

Since this is such a great group, what is the biggest challenge from a captain's perspective?

Wickstrom: "Just staying focused. It's a long season. It's a lot of work. You can get to a point where you don't care as much because you're tired of long practices and traveling every weekend, but if we just play in the moment and forget about everything in the future, that's what we have to put our focus on."

Mosher: "We have eight new players this year and in the beginning we're going to have to blend that together in two weeks and that's challenging. We've built a lot of chemistry since we were around each other, but getting the coaching and techniques and getting our lineup set. Once we get that, we just have to keep our focus."

Traditionally, the poster is meant for the senior class, what does that mean to you to represent FSU Volleyball this season in that manner?

Mosher: "I'm excited. I've been here for five years and I am excited to see it and finally get the chance to be on it is going to be fun." Wickstrom: "You see it your freshman and sophomore years and you don't really think much of it and now it's here. It's surreal. It's very cool."

Despite the nine wins that were produced in the month of November to close out the 2013 season, FSU fell just shy of its fifth ACC title after posting a 17-3 record in conference. Following the 3-0 sweep of Georgia Tech on Nov. 29, the Seminoles huddled around a computer (with captain Katie Mosher pushing the refresh button) awaiting the result of the Duke vs. North Carolina match. Needing the Tar Heels to pull out the win, the Blue Devils were able to come back after fending off several match points in the fourth set to claim a 3-2 win and the ACC title. This season, the Seminoles will be eyeing their fifth ACC title.

In order to have a great team year in and year out, you have to be led by some of the best student-athletes. Entering their senior season and **second** year as a captain duo, Katie Mosher and Sarah Wickstrom plan to lead the squad to another fantastic season in their final year.

The Seminoles have won **28** straight- ACC matches in Tully Gym. Ever since the 3-2 loss to Miami on Nov. 26, 2010, FSU has been unbeatable on their home floor. They will look to defend that streak in 2014.



Prior to the 2014 season Florida State owns **28** wins over AVCA Top 25 teams in program history. In 2013, the Noles set a school record by defeating six Top 25 teams over the course of the season (Kentucky, Michigan, Western Kentucky, North Carolina, Duke, Florida). In addition the Seminoles grabbed their highest ranked win over No. 6 Florida in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

After setting a school record for appearing in five-consecutive NCAA Tournaments, the Seminoles will look to extend that streak to six in the 2014 season. The record breaks the streak of four that was set back during the 1987-90 squads that were led by Metro Conference legends Gabrielle Reece and Maggie Philgence.

After her junior season Sarah Wickstrom sits in **10th** place on the FSU All-time Set Assists list with a total of 2,140. If she has another senior year like 2013, she can climb as high as third while approaching the 3,000 mark.

Entering his 28th season as a head coach, FSU Head Coach Chris Poole has amassed a record of **706**-272 (.722) during his career. Poole enters his seventh season at FSU with a record of 156-42 (.788).

This season, the Seminoles will see a lot of new faces, **nine** to be exact. Nine is a little bit high to be a Poole-led squad, however some newcomers will look to take a redshirt in 2014 while others will be relied on to contribute right away.

The number of digs redshirt senior Katie Mosher needs in order to take over the top spot in the FSU All-Time Digs list. Mosher is looking to overcome Summer Weissing's mark of 1,859, which was set over the 2004-07 seasons.

The number of FSU players that participated in U.S. Collegiate National Team events this offseason. Junior Nicole Walch earned a spot on the top national team that played on the China Tour for two weeks. Seniors Katie Mosher and Sarah Wickstrom along with junior Mercedes Vaughn, went to Minneapolis, Minn. for the U.S. National Team Program (formally known as Senior A2 Team). They were among 36 of the top collegiate athletes in the country. It was the most athletes Coach Poole had participating in U.S. events at one time.

The FSU volleyball team was one of three Seminole squads that earned a perfect retention rate. The most recent APR is based on scores from the 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12 and 2012-13 academic years.

Florida State enters the 2014 season ranked No. 13 in the AVCA preseason poll. With that ranking, the Seminoles have been included in **43**-straight polls dating back to Sept. 9, 2011. During the 2011 season, FSU was not listed in the preseason poll before appearing in the first two polls (Aug, 29 - No. 25, Sept. 5 -No. 24), then dropping out a week later.







Senior setter Sarah Wickstrom earned a trifecta of excellent academic and community service awards in the 2012-13 year. The Stuart, Fla. native was named the team's Golden Torch award winner for classroom success, an All-ACC Academic Team member and a Golden Nole award recipient for outstanding devotion to the community. 



Florida State volleyball has a long-standing tradition of getting its student-athletes to where they want to go. Since early in the program's origin, both present and past student-athletes have enjoyed the chance to play the game across a worldwide stage



Carol Forsten (1981-84) · Australian National Team

Somerton Park, Australia native Carol Forsten was a fantastic outside hitter for the Seminoles in the early 1980s. The four-year letterwinner participated with the Australian National Team in the World Cup Competition in 1982, two years following her prestigious position as a captain for the Australian National High School all-star team in the 1979-80 year. Forsten, who also toured Latin America in 1981 and Japan in 1982 with Athletes-In-Action, was an academic all-district selection and an AVCA All-Region performer at Florida State in 1984. She finished her four-year career with 145 matches played.



Karyn Palgut (1982-86) • 1982 Olympic Festival

A three-sport athlete at Florida State, Palgut lettered in volleyball (four), basketball (one) and softball (two) from 1982-86. After a successful collegiate career at outside hitter that saw her named to the All-Metro Tournament team three times, including the distinction of MVP, Palgut competed in the 1982 Olympic Festival on the East team. Upon graduation, Palgut joined the U.S. Women's National Team for Handball and had a successful career. She participated in the Goodwill games, the Pan American Games (Gold Medal) and the 1988 and 1992 Summer Olympics receiving seventh and sixth place respectively. One of Palgut's best volleyball attributes at Florida State was her service game, recording 132 aces in her career.




Maggie Philgence (1987-90) • 1991 Olympic Festival

Hailing from the Virgin Islands, outside hitter Maggie Philgence became one of the most well-established Seminoles in program history. After her successful four-year career, Philgence was drafted to the South Team for the Olympic Festival in Los Angeles in 1991 where she helped lead her squad over the West to claim the gold medal. Philgence played her professional career with the international league in France and the Virgin Islands, and was inducted to the Florida State Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998. Philgence was a four-time all-region player, a three-time Metro All-Conference player and is Florida State's all-time leader in kills with 2,110. She has a hand in virtually every Top 10 category at Florida State.


Gabrielle Reece (1987-90) · Women's Beach League

Arguably Florida State's most well-known volleyball alumna, former middle hitter Gabrielle Reece is more than just one of the world's most famous models. From 1987-90, Reece terrorized oncoming attackers as she racked up 747 total blocks, including 240 solo. She was a two-time Metro All-Conference player and an AVCA All-Region performer who also enjoyed an exceptional career on the pro tour. In the Women's Beach Volleyball League, Reece was a two-time offensive player of the year (1994-95), the league's leader in kills for four straight years (1993-96) and the league's leader in blocks (1993). Reece also helped her team take first place in the first Beach Volleyball World Championships and participated in the FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour. The California native started earning her acclaim for modeling while attending Florida State, being named as one of the five most beautiful women in the world by Elle in 1989 and receiving the "Most Inspiring Collegiate Athlete" honor at the 1989 Dodge National Athletic Awards.



Franci Rard (1993) · AVP Tour

Outside hitter Franci Rard of Naples, Fla. spent one season at Florida State in 1993. Following her lone year, which included helping lead the Seminoles to their first-ever NCAA Tournament win over DePaul, Rard made a living on the AVP tour playing beach volleyball. Rard enjoyed plenty of success in the sand, but was known for battling back from fusion surgery for degenerative discs in 2000 as the procedure set her back nearly 2 ½ years before she could play competitively again. Rard was named to the All-ACC Tournament Team as well as the ACC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.




Norisha Campbell (1998) · USA Volleyball

A fine middle-hitter from Universal City, Texas, Norisha Campbell twice was an AVCA All-Region player as well as a two-time All-ACC performer in 2000 and 2001. Prior to her sophomore campaign, Campbell participated with the 1999 USA Junior National Volleyball Team that competed at the Junior World Championships in Saskatoon and Edmonton, Canada. In the tournament, she led the USA squad in hitting in its final match vs. the Czech Republic with 11 kills and four blocks. Campbell's career at Florida State was highlighted by her 1,289 kills and .320 hitting percentage. Aside from her experience with the junior national team, Campbell was selected to the 2001 USA National A2 Training program and then became the first Seminole ever to participate with the USA National Team in 2007. Campbell has also played professionally in Switzerland and Germany.

Alex Sevillano (1999-02) • AVO Pro Beach Tour

A native of Clearwater, Fla., former outside hitter Alex Sevillano spent her career at Florida State from 1999-2002. Following four years that included leading the Seminoles in digs in her last two seasons, Sevillano made her living on the pro beach tour from 2006-11. The four-time ACC Academic Honor Roll member started in the AVO Pro Beach Tour, then made her way to the National Volleyball League as well as Wide Open Volleyball. During her beach-playing career, Sevillano made stops in Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, New York and Texas.



Cecile Reynaud (1976-2001) • USA Volleyball

Known as an exceptional teacher, educator, motivator and coach of volleyball, Reynaud's global experience has been aplenty since building the Seminoles into a respectable volleyball program for 26 seasons. Reynaud was an assistant coach for the United States World University Games team in 1983, then served as head coach of the Women's Junior National Volleyball Team in 1985. In the summer 2012, Reynaud had the privilege of coaching at the Paralympic Games in London for the USA Women's Sitting Volleyball Team, and coachedthe USA Women's National Team at the Grand Prix in Japan in August 2013. Reynaud finished her FSU coaching career with 635 wins following her retirement in 2001, placing her in a group of just eight active coaches at the time who amassed 600 or more victories. In her 26 seasons, 98 percent of her four-year letterwinners at Florida State went on to earn their college degree, proving her immense focus on both volleyball education and classroom education. She was a four-time conference coach of the year who also served as Deputy Competition Manager for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta.



Makini Thompson (2005-07) • Jamaican National Team

Another great outside hitter to don the Garnet and Gold, Makini Thompson became Florida State's third All-American when she earned the national honor in 2006. In that same year, Thompson was also an AVCA All-Region performer and made the All-ACC Team in both 2006 and 2007. The 2006 season witnessed her putting down kills at an average of 3.95 per set. Thompson's post-FSU career included playing for the Jamaican National Team as well as Langenthal VBC in Switzerland at the professional level.

Jordana Price (2007-09) · VFM

Jordana Price was another substantial piece to Florida State's history-making 2009 team that made it all the way to NCAA Volleyball's version of the Elite Eight. The Mountain Home, Idaho native was a ferocious player who garnered a .312 hitting percentage from 2007-09 and led Florida State in total blocks in two of her three years. An AVCA Honorable Mention All-American and a two-time all-region performer, Price took a similar path to teammate Brianna Barry by playing for VFM in Switzerland and also playing for Team Florida WAVE. Price was an All-ACC Team selection in 2009 when she recorded a .355 hitting percentage and 161 total blocks.



Brianna Barry (2006-09) · VFM

Middle blocker Brianna Barry holds the distinguished honor as Florida State's first non-honorable mention All-American when she earned second-team honors as a senior. The Winter Springs, Fla., native had a tremendous career that was highlighted by leading the Seminoles to their first NCAA Regional Final appearance in 2009. In that season, Barry became Florida State's first ACC Player of the Year and finished with an astonishing .492 hitting percentage that is high atop the NCAA charts. Following her collegiate career, Barry played for VFM in Saignelégier, Switzerland from 2010-13, and also played for Team Florida WAVE. Barry was also an all-region and all-conference player in her Seminole years, and made the All-ACC Academic Team and the ACC Academic Honor Roll in each of her four seasons. She finished her college career with an outstanding .371 hitting percentage and 396 total blocks.



Mira Djuric (2007-09) • HPK

Outside hitter Mira Djuric from Belgrade, Serbia was a tenacious student-athlete with an entertaining serve that came at opponents fast. Djuric was another AVCA Honorable Mention All-American in 2009 and twice made the All-ACC Team in both her playing seasons in 2007 and 2009. In just two seasons she ended her Seminole career with 152 service aces, a Top five mark in school history at the conclusion of her senior season. Djuric also excelled offensively in the attacking game, delivering the most kills on her teams in 2007 and 2009. Prior to her enrollment at Florida State, Djuric was a member of the Serbian Junior National Team. She played professionally in Finland for HPK following her years at Florida State.

Stephanie Neville (2007-10) · Canadian National Team

Canadian-born outside hitter Stephanie Neville had four fine seasons for the Seminoles between 2007-10, always being a steady presence on the attack. The Cambridge, Ontario native ended her FSU career with a consistent .268 attack percentage which was highlighted by a .309 finish in the team's program-building 2009 year. As a senior, she was named to the All-ACC Team and earned a spot on the All-East Region Honorable Mention list after leading the Noles in kills. Prior to her enrollment at FSU, Neville had the honor of playing for the Canadian Youth and Junior National teams, adding to Florida State's growing list of student-athletes who spent time playing among their country's most competitive national teams. While at FSU, Neville was also an achiever in the classroom after earning a spot on the All-ACC Academic Team in both 2009 and 2010. She was also an All-ACC Academic Honor Roll recipient in all four seasons played.



Visnja Djurdjevic (2010-11) • Serbian Junior National Team

Versatile Visnja Djurdjevic became Florida State's first multiple All-American, earning the honor twice in her only two seasons as a Seminole. She was a two-time All-ACC Team member and was responsible for the biggest point in program history, a match-point service ace that gave Florida State a five-set win over Iowa State on Dec. 10, 2011, to send the Seminoles to the NCAA National Semifinals. Djurdjevic participated with the Serbian Junior National Team that twice won the Balkan Championships. She is now a volunteer assistant coach at Boston College.



Duygu Duzceler (2009-12) • Turkish Junior National Team

Turkish-born Duygu Duzceler became one of the most polished setters in program history as she was one of the guiding forces that began Florida State's unprecedented era. Duzceler never missed a match or even a set in her four-year career and was part of an NCAA Regional Final in 2009 and an NCAA National Semifinal in 2011. Her 134 career matches are just outside of the Top 10 list in school history, with the most recent player being Deanna Kaleta (137) in 1985-88. Duzceler helped make Florida State's attacking game exponentially better in her time in Tallahassee, helping a flurry of middle blockers and outside hitters earn All-America honors. Playing in a two-setter rotation, Duzceler still managed to record 2,915 assists for a Top 10 mark at Florida State. Shortly after her collegiate career, Duzceler signed a professional volleyball contract in Turkey.

Sareea Freeman (2009-12) · USA Senior A2 Team

In her time as a Seminole, middle blocker Sareea Freeman went from being a raw athlete to a highly-skilled player who was a dominating force by her senior season. The Fresno, Calif., native earned AVCA Honorable Mention All-America honors in 2012 and finished second nationally with a .438 hitting percentage that season. Heading into her big senior year, Freeman faced some great competition during the summer 2012 when she competed with teammate Sarah Wickstrom in the United States Senior Women's A2 Program in Columbus, Ohio against some of the nation's best collegiate athletes across the country. Freeman set a school record for most ACC Player of the Week awards in a career when she earned four, including three in her final season at Florida State. She ended her FSU career with an outstanding .356 hitting percentage and 393 total blocks. She is now an assistant coach at UAlbany.



Fatma Yildirim (2009-12) • Turkish National Training Team

A hard-working player, Fatma Yildirim showcased several of her abilities while at Florida State. She ended her career as an AVCA Honorable Mention All-American in 2012, and became just the fifth Seminole to earn both All-ACC Freshman Team and All-ACC honors. Prior to coming to Florida State, Yildirim was a member of the Turkish Junior National Team from 2005-08. One of the highlights of her three-year stint was helping the national team to the title at the 2006 Balkan Championships. Yildirim was a co-captain on the 2012 Seminole squad and was known as a role model for the way she conducted herself. Yildirim is currently training with the Turkish National Team in preparation for the FIVB U23 World Championship in October 2013.



Marija Milosavljevic (2010-12) • Serbian Junior National Team

Middle blocker/right-side hitter Marija Milosavljevic was a steady player at Florida State, winning the Seminole Warrior and Total Commitment awards after her senior year for the devotion she showed. Milosavljevic was on the team's NCAA National Semifinal run in 2011, her second year with the program. The Bajina Basta, Serbia native has been a member of both the Serbian Youth and National Teams, having a few successful years at the Balkan Championships. Milosavljevic has the skills to continue playing at the professional level.

Katie Mosher (2010-Present) • U.S. Collegiate National Team <u>Program</u>

Libero Katie Mosher participated in the U.S. Collegiate National Team Program in the summer of 2014 (which is formally know as the U.S. Senior A2 program). Mosher was part of the European Global Challenge title in the summer 2011 in Croatia by the USA Junior A2 Team. Mosher was also part of the A2 program in high school, competing with the Youth A2 National Team in 2009. The Fort Myers, Fla., native holds the single-season record for digs at Florida State in a season with 604 in 2011, a year in which she was named the team's most influential player. Mosher finished with 495 digs in 2012 and 506 in 2013.



Elise Walch (2011-2013) • USA Junior A2 Team

Elise Walch has played with USA Volleyball on a few occasions, most recently in 2011 when she helped the USA Junior A2 Team to the championship at the European Global Challenge in Croatia. She has also been a member of the 2008 and 2009 USA Volleyball Youth A2 Teams, and was placed on the 2010 USA Volleyball Junior National Training Team. The right-side hitter from Stuart, Fla., has produced some big-hitting matches for the Seminoles, including a dominant 12-kill performance against Miami as a sophomore when Florida State upended the nationally-ranked Hurricanes.



<u>Sarah Wickstrom (2011-Present) • U.S. Collegiate National</u> <u>Team Program</u>

Setter Sarah Wickstrom participated in the U.S. Collegiate National Team Program along with Katie Mosher and Mercedes Vaughn. She joined former teammate Sareea Freeman in the United States Women's Senior A2 Program in Columbus, Ohio during the summer 2012. Wickstrom helped the USA Blue team to a 4-1 record at the national tournament. Through her first three seasons at Florida State, the Stuart, Fla., native has been a part of an NCAA National Semifinal run in 2011, a second-round appearance in 2012 and a Sweet 16 berth in 2013. Following her freshman campaign, Wickstrom earned All-ACC Freshman Team honors. Prior to her arrival at Florida State, Wickstrom participated in the USA Volleyball Junior Olympics for several years and also played at USA Volleyball Beach Nationals.

Sarah Burrington (2012-Present) · USA Junior National Team

Middle blocker Sarah Burrington was named to the USA Volleyball Women's Junior National Team on June 14, 2013. The squad was composed of some of the very best collegiate athletes born in 1994 or 1995. The Ruskin, Fla. resident enjoyed a near two-week journey at the FIVB Women's U-20 World Championship in the Czech Republic. She helped Team USA to a 6-3 record which included scrimmages. Burrington redshirted for the Seminoles in her first season but enters her second year with big expectations.



Olivera Medic (2012-2013) • Serbia Senior National Team

Outside hitter Olivera Medic has been another great addition to the Serbian pipeline that the Florida State indoor volleyball program has grown. In 2012, she joined former teammate Fatma Yildirim as the only Seminoles to be named to more than one all-tournament team in 2012. The Subotica, Serbia native spent the summer of 2009 playing for the Serbian Senior National Team as she helped her national squad to a first-place finish in the Euroleague, defeating France in the semifinals and Turkey in the championship match. Medic also played on the Serbian Junior National Team and helped it to a second-place finish at the Balkan Championship.



Nicole Walch (2012-Present) • U.S. Collegiate National Team

Nicole Walch is beginning her junior season at Florida State but has already had a couple stints with USA Volleyball. Heading into her senior season at Martin County High School, Walch joined her sister Elise and fellow Seminole Katie Mosher in winning the European Global Challenge as a member of United States Junior A2 team in Pula, Croatia. Walch took her game to the next level in the summer 2013 when she played in the USA Volleyball senior A2 program in Dallas, Texas, against some of the best players remaining with collegiate eligibility. Walch was part of a 2012 squad that won its second consecutive ACC title and its third in the last four seasons. In 2014, she was selected to top the U.S. Collegiate National Team that played on the China Tour.




Milica Kubura (2014-Present) • Serbian Junior National Team

2014 SEASON OUTLOOK

Mosher Eyes the Top

For the past three seasons, the Seminoles had a strong defensive presence in Katie Mosher. Now a redshirt senior, Mosher looks to take over the top spot in the record books under career digs. The Fort Myers, Fla. native sits in third place on the list with 1,605. She needs 245 more digs to eclipse Summer Weissing's record that was set over the 2004-07 seasons.



In 2011, Mosher set the school record for digs in a single season (604), helping the Seminoles to their first-ever National Semifinal. Following the historic run, Mosher tallied 495 digs in 2012 before posting 506 in 2013. In addition to the top performance, she also holds the fourth and fifth best showings in school history.

Walch Dons Red, White & Blue

This summer, rising junior Nicole Walch competed with the top U.S. Collegiate National Team in China. Over the course of two weeks, Walch helped the Red, White & Blue to a record of 6-2 while traveling to several cities. Walch blogged about her experiences that included topics such as competition and sight-seeing.

Mid-Season Arrivals

With nine new members for the 2014 season, two ladies arrived in January. Hailing from Belegrade, Serbia, freshman Milica Kubura started learning the ropes early while Mercedes Vaughn began her redshirt junior season after transferring from the College of Southern Idaho. From Folcroft, Pa., Vaughn spent two seasons at the University of Tennessee before transferring out.

Both ladies will be eligible for the start of 2014

and are expected to contribute.

Finding the Right Fit

This season, the Seminoles welcome five ladies that have transferred from other schools. In addition to Vaughn, Karlie Hauer, Katie Horton, Kiara Wright and Karyn Israel are all hoping to find a fit with Florida State.

Both Karlie Hauer and Karyn Israel are junior transfers from the University of Minnesota. Hauer is an outside hitter while Israel is a setter.

Horton will start her sophomore season in the Garnet and Gold following her rookie season with Ohio University where she helped the Bobcats to their 10th MAC title in 11 seasons. The Wesland, Mich. native ranked second on the team in kills (312) and points (368).

Wright joins the Seminoles for the start of her junior season after serving two years with Southern California. A native of Houston, Texas, Wright was one of the most highly touted recruits out of high school in 2012, ranking 13th according to ESPN. Wright is also a talented high-jumper and will join the FSU track & field team for the 2015 spring season.

Poole's 700th Win

Chris Poole will begin his 28th season as a head coach in 2014 and he takes the helm after achieving a benchmark win in 2013. On Nov. 17, 2013, Poole coached his 700th win as the Seminoles cruised to a 3-0 triumph over Notre Dame in Tully Gym.

With a 706-272 overall record, Poole has the 10th best record among active NCAA Division I coaches in the country.

Back to the Grind

The 2014 schedule sure lives up to the Coach Poole standard. It's tough. For the first time in school history, the Seminoles are invited to kick off the season as a part of the AVCA Showcase along with Iowa State, Stanford and Nebraska. FSU will face No. 7 Nebraska on Aug. 29 in Lincoln, before heading to Ames to take on Iowa State on Aug. 31.

After the Showcase, the Seminole will return home to face the 10th-ranked Gators in Tully Gym.

All told, FSU will open the year with 11 non-conference matches, facing eight opponents that played in the 2013 NCAA Tournament.

FSU is set to face North Carolina, Clemson, NC State and Miami twice in conference play.

2014 SEASON OUTLOOK

With the departure of beloved associate head coach Gokhan Yilmaz to a head coaching position at Charlotte, Coach Poole announced the hiring of Ghanna "Anna" Khrystenko in early March of 2014. A native of Ukraine, Khrystenko brings a lot of playing and coaching experiences to the table. In 2008, Khrystenko was named as the Chairman of the Athletic Commission for the Ukrainian Volleyball Federation and was a member of the Executive Committee and National Olympic Committee.

As a player, she earned a plethora of honors during her 15-year professional career before stepping into an ambassador role for the sport in her country.

Khrystenko will working heavy in recruiting while coaching her specialty – blocking.

Noles Participate in U.S. Programs

Prior to the 2014 season, the Seminoles sent three ladies to Minneapolis, Minn. to participate in the 2014 U.S. Collegiate National Team Program, formally known as the USA Senior A2 Team. Katie Mosher, Sarah Wickstrom and Mercedes Vaughn all represented FSU at the 36-player event.

Noles Ranked 13th in AVCA Preseason Poll

The Florida State indoor volleyball team has been selected 13th in the annual American Volleyball Coaches Association Preseason Poll.

The preseason Top 25 ranking is the fifth time in school history Florida State has been nationally-ranked before the season has gotten underway. In 1998, the Seminoles were chosen 24th in the opening poll, then were picked 15th in the preseason in 2010. In 2012, the Seminoles were ranked 12th in the preseason - which was the highest preseason ranking in school history.

After being the only ACC school ranked in the preseason top 25 in 2013, the Seminoles are joined by North Carolina (No. 20) and Duke (No. 21) in the 2014 preseason poll.

According to the preseason poll, the Seminoles will face three other ranked teams to start off the 2014 season - Nebraska (No. 7), Florida (No. 10) and American (No.24). In addition, FSU will face Iowa State and Marquette, which are two schools that received votes.

Florida State continues its school-record streak of being in the AVCA Top 25 poll. Including their current No. 13 ranking, the Seminoles have now

been ranked for 42 consecutive weeks. The last time Florida State was outside the Top 25 poll was on Sept. 12, 2011. The previous long stretch of AVCA Top 25 appearances for the Seminoles came at 24 straight weeks from Sept. 7, 2009 to Oct. 25, 2010.

Ready for a Showdown

Who doesn't love a rivalry match? When it comes to Florida State vs. Florida, there's always excitement. In 2013, the Seminoles lost 3-0 in the O'Connell Center on Sept. 17. Although it was a sweep, FSU dropped the first set 25-20, before falling 26-24 and 25-23 in the final two.

However, the Seminoles got their chance for revenge when they drew the Gainesville Regional in the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time in school history.

This time, FSU would pull off the biggest upset in school history by knocking out the sixth-ranked Gators, 3-2. Not only was it the highest-ranked win, it was the first time since Oct. 9, 1990 FSU defeated UF inside the O'Connell Center. In fact, each Seminole listed on the roster was not born yet at the time of the last win.

Florida comes to town for the home-opener on Sept. 4 at 6 p.m.

The First EVER

FSU has made a habit of leading the ACC when it comes to monumental accomplishments. In 2011, the Seminoles became the first team to advance to the Final Four and yet another ACC first has been achieved by Chris Poole's squad in 2014.

Florida State becomes the first team in ACC history to receive an invitation to the AVCA Showcase - a preseason tournament that features tradition powerhouse volleyball schools.

HEAD COACH CHRIS POOLE



The transformation has been thorough and quick.

When Chris Poole inherited the Florida State volleyball program in the summer of 2008, he took over a team that had failed to reach the 20-win plateau in five-straight seasons and hadn't been to the NCAA Tournament since 2002. It was a program looking for answers; a program looking to get back to the winning ways it had grown accustomed to in the 1980s and early '90s.

Six years later, Poole has made his mark, grabbing his 700th career win while revitaling a program that has built itself into a national contender. In Poole's first six seasons he has guided the Seminoles to an NCAA National Semifinal (2011), an NCAA Regional Semifinal (2010), and two trips to the NCAA second round (2010, 2012).

In 2013, Poole helped the Seminoles to a school-record setting six AVCA top-25 wins (Kentucky, Michigan, Western Kentucky, Duke, North Carolina, Florida), including two of the biggest wins in school history. On December 6, 2013, Poole guided the Seminoles to a 3-2, NCAA Second Round victory over No. 6 Florida lifting them to the NCAA Champaign Regional Semifinal. It marked the first time since 1990, FSU defeated UF inside the O'Connell Center. Florida State also picked up a 3-2 win over No. 7 Michigan on Sept. 14, 2013.

The Seminoles finished second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with an overall record of 26-8, while finishing the year ranked 11th in the AVCA poll and 12th in the RPI. FSU was led by AVCA All-America honorable mention players, Ashley Neff, Nicole Walch and Elise Walch. Neff earned All-ACC First Team honors, while both Walch sisters and Katie Mosher were awarded All-Second Team accolades.

On Nov. 17th in a 3-0 victory over Notre Dame, Poole picked up his 700th career win, becoming one of the most winningest active division I coaches in the country (10th-706 wins).

In 2012, the Seminoles won their third Atlantic Coast Conference title under Poole and the program's fourth overall. Florida State finished with

a remarkable 28-4 overall record, earning backto-back conference crowns for the first time in the ACC since Maryland achieved the feat in 2003 and 2004. The Seminoles tied a previous school record with the 2011 squad by defeating five AVCA Top 25 opponents, and one of just three teams (Southern California, Western Kentucky) who have garnered 28 wins or better in the last two seasons (2011 and 2012).

In Poole's fifth season Florida State obliterated the school record for consecutive wins at home, reaching 27 matches before falling to Purdue in the NCAA Second Round. Florida State also achieved a 16-match win streak and won 19 consecutive sets overall in the 2012 season to reflect its stellar play. The Seminoles finished 18th in the final AVCA Poll and 12th in the final RPI, while being led by AVCA Third-Team All-American and ACC Player of the Year Ashley Neff as well as honorable mention All-Americans Sareea Freeman and Fatma Yildirim.

Poole's most memorable year thus far came in 2011, when he led the Seminoles to their first-ever NCAA National Semifinal appearance in what was a startling year to say the least.

In 2011, FSU earned its third ACC title while finishing with a 28-7 overall record and an 18-2 mark within the conference. The Seminoles entered the NCAA Tournament as a No. 12 national seed and began the Field of 64 by defeating Albany and Cincinnati in Tully Gym. From there, FSU upset No. 5 Purdue in four sets in the Sweet 16 and defeated fourth-seeded Iowa State in five sets in the Elite Eight in Minneapolis to achieve a feat that many deemed unthinkable when Poole and his staff first arrived.

FSU became the first ACC volleyball team to ever advance to the final round of four, where it eventually lost to NCAA champion UCLA in the national semifinal at the Alamodome in San Antonio. FSU was the only team in the final four that had gotten through its regional in which both Sweet 16 and Elite Eight opponents were nationally-seeded. In his five seasons leading the Seminoles, Poole has compiled 11 of FSU's 12 NCAA postseason wins, showing a 11-5 mark in championship play.

As a result of FSU's historical 2011 campaign, Poole helped the Seminoles achieve their highest national ranking ever as they finished at No. 7 in the final AVCA Poll. FSU also finished with the seventh-best RPI in the nation. Poole capped his incredible season by being named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second time as well as the AVCA East Region Coach of the Year. He coached AVCA Second-Team All-American Jekaterina Stepanova to a career year as well as AVCA Honorable Mention All-Americans Visnja Djurdjevic and Neff.

The Seminoles earned 21 wins in Poole's first season in 2008 and then followed that up with an incredible 2009 campaign. FSU not only

posted a 31-3 overall record, but under Poole's tutelage the 'Noles captured their first outright regular-season Atlantic Coast Conference championship in school history (second overall) and made it to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever.

In addition to those program firsts, Poole's Seminoles also set the school standard for most conference wins in a season with 19 and ACC wins in a row with 16, which was then tied by the 2011 team. A national ranking of No. 11 in the entire country was the highest ever for a Florida State volleyball team at the time and its No. 3 national seed in the Big Dance continues to be the highest ever. Poole's 2012 team reached the program's highest AVCA ranking at No. 6 on Sept. 3. 2012.

For his squad's multiple successes, Poole garnered ACC Coach of the Year and AVCA Division I East Region Coach of the Year honors in 2009.

He also coached a handful of players that generated quite a few accolades. Brianna Barry became the first Seminole to ever be named the ACC's Player of the Year and she also garnered AVCA Division I Second-Team All-American honors. Barry, an ESPN The Magazine Academic All First-Team member, was joined by Jordana Price, Mira Djuric and Rachael Morgan on the 2009 All-ACC Team - a record at FSU for most players on that list in one season. Price, Djuric and Morgan also each achieved an AVCA Division I Honorable Mention All-American nod. Poole also coached an ACC All-Freshman Team performer in Yildirim.

The 2010 season featured several roadblocks for the Seminoles, ranging from life-altering misfortunes off the court to devastating injuries that inhibited the team's continuity. Despite all the hardships, the gutsy FSU squad finished 22-11, including 12-8 within the ACC. Several program feats were accomplished - making back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in over a decade, advancing to the second round of the NCAA Championship in consecutive years for the first time in school history and finishing with at least 20 wins for the third straight season.

Veterans Jenna Romanelli and Stephanie Neville capped off their four-year careers in excellent fashion. Junior outside hitter Djurdjevic was one of the top transfers in the country, being named an AVCA Honorable Mention All-American and an AVCA Honorable Mention All-East Region member. She joined Neville as members of the All-ACC Team as well.

The fact that Poole has breathed life in the FSU volleyball program should come as no surprise as he brought a wealth of knowledge and experience to the school after heading the program at the University of Arkansas for 14 accomplished seasons.

Poole started Arkansas' volleyball program in



1994 and was not only successful, but led the Lady Razorbacks to 11 Southeastern Conference Western Division titles. Add to that 11 postseason appearances - two NIVC and nine NCAA - along with an SEC Tournament title and numerous individual player honors.

Upon arriving in Fayetteville, Ark. in 1993, Poole personally handled every element of building the program from buying the first pieces of equipment, hiring the assistants and recruiting the players, to renovating the court and building locker room facilities.

With head coaching stints at Arkansas, Arkansas State and Arkansas Tech, Poole earned a 550-230 career record in 21 seasons prior to his hiring at FSU and had been named conference coach of the year seven times and was pegged the South Region Coach of the Year in 1997.

During his 14 seasons at Arkansas, in which he compiled a 316-161 record, Poole produced two AVCA All-Americans, three AVCA honorable mention All-Americans, 24 players with 44 All-SEC honors, three SEC Freshmen of the Year and 25 AVCA All-District/All-Region honorees. In addition to the success on the court, Poole's Arkansas teams excelled in the classroom as well with 67 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, 10 CoSIDA All-District selections, two H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete finalists and one McWhorter winner.

Poole certainly made his mark in the SEC as he guided Arkansas to a 159-65 record in the SEC regular season for a 71 percent league-winning mark. Poole and the Lady Razorbacks were even more impressive against the Western Division, winning 11 of 14 titles.

Poole spent an entire year away from competition preparing for the Razorback's inaugural season in 1994 and it was time well spent as he led Arkansas to a 19-17 overall record, a 10-5 SEC mark and an SEC Western Division title with a perfect 10-0 divisional record in the first year of competition. The Lady Razorbacks finished third overall in the league that year and played well enough to earn a postseason bid to the National Invitational Volleyball Coaches tournament in Kansas City where they finished seventh in a field of 20 teams. Poole was selected as the 1994 SEC Coach of the Year while two of his players earned All-SEC honors and one player earned All-District honors.

Poole's ability to build a program was proven first with Arkansas Tech then at Arkansas State. He took over days prior to the 1987 season at ASU and his first team showed the effects with an 8-24 record. But with one season under Poole's careful tutelage, virtually the same team was 41-1 the next year, launching a five-year run of winning seasons for the Lady Indians.

His 1988 team had a 33-match win streak, longest in the nation, and posted a school-record 41-1 overall mark. The next year, ASU had a 34-match win streak, notched a Lady Indian record with 43 wins (43-6 overall) and was ranked


ninth in the South Region.

In his last season at ASU, the Lady Indians were 41-6 and received an automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament in 1992. ASU entered the 32-team NCAA field with the most wins of any team, but lost a tough four-game match to the Northwest Region's top-seeded team, Long Beach State.

Prior to ASU, Poole was an assistant and later head coach at Arkansas Tech. In two seasons as head coach at ATU, he posted a 53-20 record, winning the Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference title in 1985 as co-head coach and finishing runner-up as head coach in 1986. He started his collegiate career in 1983 as a graduate assistant for the nationally ranked Arkansas Tech Golden Suns. Tech was 58-9 with a perfect 24-0 conference mark in two seasons with Poole as an assistant coach.

A native of Heber Springs in north-central Arkansas, Poole is a 1983 graduate of Arkansas Tech and earned a master's degree from there in 1989. He is a member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association and has served on the AVCA's All-American, All-South Region and AllSouth Region Ranking committees and is also an AVCA Top 25 voter.

Poole and his wife, Toni, a former Arkansas State track and field standout, have two children, son Joshua and daughter Taylor.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH RYAN McGUYRE



Ryan McGuyre carries a strong reputation in the collegiate volleyball circuit and has enjoyed much success on several levels entering his second year as the Associate Head Coach for the FSU indoor volleyball team.

"Ryan has a tremendous background in coaching and has proven to be very successful in women's volleyball," head coach Chris Poole said. "Overall, he has trained players at the highest level and has beaten the best programs in the nation. His ability to juggle coaching both men's and women's volleyball at the same time in years past is also a reflection of his great work ethic, discipline and time management."

During the his first year at FSU, McGuyre's main responsibilities required running the on court training in practice in addition to domestic recruiting.

In his first season, McGuyre helped the Seminoles to a berth in the NCAA Champaign Regional Semifinal following a 3-2 upset over fifth-seeded Florida in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. It was the first win for FSU in the O'Connell Center over Florida since 1990.

McGuyre brought a great wealth of knowledge to FSU prior to his first season. The former California Baptist head coach and Maryland assistant has educated at the collegiate, high school and club level since 1995 and adds another well-versed dimension to an FSU coaching staff that secured consecutive ACC titles (2011, 2012) and regular appearances in the NCAA Tournament including a recent NCAA National Semifinal berth in 2011.

As a head coach for California Baptist from 2002 to 2011, McGuyre managed virtually every aspect of the program. He was fully responsible for the overall development and organization of both the men's and women's volleyball programs, guiding the women's team to national championships in 2004, 2005 and 2011. He also won the men's national championship in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2010 and 2011.

While building a perennial contender out West, McGuyre earned several coach of the year honors. He was a two-time NAIA National Tournament Coach of the Year in 2004 and 2005 and finished as the 2010 American Volleyball Coaches Association Coach of the Year for his efforts with the women's program. That same year he also earned Golden State Athletic Conference Coach of the Year.

More national accolades followed McGuyre in his time at California Baptist. After the school's transition to the National Christian Collegiate Athletic Association, he was honored as the NC-CAA DI National Coach of the Year following the women's team's national title in 2011. His strong efforts were not just recognized on the women's side, winning the Tachikara NAIA National Coach of the Year on the men's side in 2005 and an AVCA National Coach of the Year in 2010.

McGuyre has been a part of nine national championships and 541 collegiate wins throughout his decorated coaching career. On the women's side, he has coached 18 NAIA All-Americans and 15 Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athletes. In the men's program, he had 19 players named to the NAIA Men's Invitational All-Tournament team and five named AVCA/NAIA All-America in the first two seasons it was awarded.

Part of his extensive experience includes time spent at two ACC institutions in NC State (1998-99) and Maryland (2012) where he helped haul in talented recruiting classes.

During his time in the coaching realm, which also includes a three-year stint at Biola University from 1999-2001, McGuyre has helped defeat two top-ranked teams and a host of other formidable opponents including USC, UCLA, Stanford, Pepperdine, Long Beach State, UC-Santa Barbara, Penn State, California-Irvine and Hawaii.

At Biola, McGuyre reached the NAIA regional playoffs each season and accumulated 60 victories as the head women's volleyball coach.

He coached three NAIA All-Americans, six NAIA All-America Scholar-Athletes and seven GSAC Scholar-Athletes.

In his most recent stop at Maryland, McGuyre handled an array of duties as the assistant volleyball coach. He assisted heavily in recruiting as well as practice and game planning, and was involved in video and statistical analysis. The 2012 Terrapins made a large improvement in nearly every major statistical category and added seven more victories compared to their 2011 campaign.

While involved at California Baptist, McGuyre was the vice president of the NAIA Volleyball Coaches Association from 2009-10. He was also a volunteer assistant coach for the USA Volleyball Men's National Team in 2006, helping run practice drills as well as charting, video analysis and game planning for opposing countries.

A graduate of Biola University in 1998, McGuyre earned his Bachelors of Arts degree in social science with an emphasis in secondary education and a minor in biblical studies. He and his wife, Jennifer, have three children in Tryston, Kitana and Ryder.

Jennifer was a standout volleyball player at the University of Hawaii, helping the Rainbow Wahine to a 121-16 overall record in her four seasons from 1996-99. During her time there, Hawaii reached the NCAA Finals in her freshman season and also went to the NCAA Regional Finals and Semifinals.

She was a member of the U.S. National Team in 2002 and earned All-Western Athletic Conference honors in her senior season at Hawaii. Prior to her husband's move to Maryland, she was an assistant coach with him at California Baptist as well as at Biola.

ASSISTANT COACH GANNA KHRYSTENKO



Ganna "Anna" Khrystenko is tremendously dedicated to the sport of volleyball. She has enjoyed success as both a player and a coach at the most elite level in Europe. She brings that wealth of knowledge and experience to FSU while entering her first season as the Assistant Coach for the indoor volleyball team.

"We are very excited about having Anna join our volleyball program," Poole said. "She has extraordinary volleyball experience at a very high level. Anna played 15 years of professional volleyball in Europe as a middle blocker. Coach McGuyre has done a great job since joining our team in August and I was trying to look for someone that could combine the best qualities that our former coaches, Holly (Watts) and Gokhan (Yilmaz), had for our program."

Khrystenko arrived in Tallahassee in March (2014) and will assist heavily in international recruiting while coaching in her area of expertise - blocking.

The native of Ukraine, Khrystenko played five seasons on the Ukrainian National Team while playing professional in her country from 1995-2008. During a three year junior career (1995-1997) she gained valuable international experience by competing at a pair of Junior World Championships and European Championships.

Khrystenko won a plethora of accolades as a player, including a four-time Ukrainie Championship, where she was awarded the 'Best Blocker' multiple times. She is a four-time winner of the Cup of Ukraine and was seen in the Elite Eight of the European CEV Cup and Top Teams Cups. In 2002 where she was awarded the 'Best Server' for the Top Teams Cup.

She helped Ukraine take fifth place at the World University Games in 2003.

Following her athletic career, Khrystenko began coaching in 2008 as a manager of the Ukraininan Girls' Team before being promoted to assistant coach of the Junior Team in 2009. During that time, Khrystenko essentially served as a general

manager of the club by selecting coaches and players for the teams while working with advanced volleyball development in her country.

Her role in the Ukraine expands further than just a coach. In 2008, Khrystenko was named as the Chairman of the Athletic Commission for the Ukrainian Volleyball Federation and was a member of the Executive Committee and National Olympic Committee as well. She also spent five years as a General Volleyball Manager at the Ukrainian Government.

Recently, Khrystenko took her career to the United States in December of 2013 where she had been coaching the USA NY AAU Volleyball teams, which are based out of New York and are members of the New England Amateur Athletic Union.

Khrystenko is married to Alexander Khrystenko and the couple have a three-year old son, Ivan.

2013 SEASON ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Finished 2013 with an overall record of 26-8 while advancing into the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the third time in school history.
- Florida State finished the year ranked No. 11 in the AVCA poll, which was the highest for the team in 2013. In addition, the Seminoles were 17th in the RPI. The Seminoles have now seen 40 consecutive-weeks inside the AVCA Top 25, stretching their school record that was previously held at 24 weeks.
- Defeated a school record six AVCA Top 25 opponents in 2013, which broke the top mark of five which was set by the 2012 and 2011 squads. The Seminoles defeated No. 6 Florida, No. 7 Michigan, No. 12 North Carolina, No. 13 Duke, No. 16 Western Kentucky and No. 17 Kentucky.
- Finished 6-4 against AVCA Top 25 opponents in 2013.
- Earned an NCAA Tournament bid for the fifth consecutive season, setting a school record. Florida State previously earned four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 1987-90 before stringing together five straight from 2009-13. The Seminoles had never been to the NCAA Championship five consecutive times as members of the ACC.
- Under Head Coach Chris Poole, Florida State is now 11-5 in the NCAA postseason in five appearances
- The Seminoles grabbed four of their best wins in school history during the 2013 season.
- FSU grabbed its highest ranked win by way of a 3-2 upset over No. 6 Florida on Dec. 6 in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Not only did FSU advance into its third-ever Sweet 16, it ended a 23-year drought in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center as the Seminoles captured their first win over the rival in Gainesville since Oct. 9, 1990.
- Prior to its victory over No. 6 Florida, FSU's top win was a 3-2 win over No. 7 Michigan at the Texas A&M Tournament. Facing a 2-0 deficit at the break, the Seminoles rallied to win three-straight sets early in the year to top the seventh-ranked Wolverines. Nicole and Elise Walch each contributed 22 kills, becoming the first tandem to score 20 plus kills in a match since Makini Thompson (24) and Mirja Djuric (24) did the feat on Nov. 3, 2007 against Duke.
- The Seminoles have put together 28 consecutive wins over ACC opponents while playing in Tully Gym. The last ACC loss inside Tully Gym was on Nov. 26, 2010 to Miami (3-2).
- Recorded six consecutive 3-O sweeps at Tully Gym from Nov.3-29. In that time span Florida State swept NC State, Notre Dame, Wake Forest, No. 13 Duke, Clemson and Georgia Tech.
- The Seminoles won 19 consecutive sets overall, starting with their 3-1 win over Miami in Coral Gables, Fla. on Nov. 13. The program record is 35 consecutive sets won in 1981
- Senior Ashley Neff became one of the best blockers in school and ACC history by becoming the first player in conference history to lead in blocking for three straight seasons.
- Ashley Neff closed out her Seminole career with 612 total blocks, climbing to third place on the FSU All-Time blocks list.
- Ashley Neff became the first Seminole in history to earn an All-America honor for the third straight season. She was an honorable mention in 2013.
- Went 5-3 in televised/webcasted matches according to the league's TV partnership, defeating Syracuse, Pittsburgh, Miami,

- Georgia Southern and No. 6 Florida in front of regional and national audiences.
- Had four student-athletes in Ashley Neff (First), Nicole Walch, Elise Walch and Katie Mosher (Second) named to the All-ACC Team. It was the first time in school history that FSU had four named to the list (due to conference expansion).
- Had three student-athletes in Ashley Neff, Nicole Walch and Elise Walch named to the AVCA All-East Region Team
- Nicole Walch was named as the ACC Player of the Week twice during the month of November.
- Four Seminoles earned All-Tournament honors from three different events. Nicole Walch and Olivera Medic were named to the Long Beach State All-Tournament Team, while Ashley Neff and Elise Walch made the list at the Four Points by Sheraton Seminole Invite. Both Nicole and Elise Walch were named to the Texas A&M All-Tournament Team.
- Nicole Walch was named to the NCAA Champaign Regional Team after she posted a 16-kill, 16-dig performance against Wisconsin in the Regional Semifinal.
- In the 3-0 win over Notre Dame on Nov. 17, Coach Poole captured his 700th career victory as a head coach. He now has 706 wins in his career and he remains in 10th place on the All-Time Wins list among NCAA DI active coaches.
- Ashley Neff finished her career on four FSU All-Time lists, ranking fourth in hitting percentage (.332), ninth in solo blocks (97), second in block assists (525) and third in total blocks (612).
- With one season remaining, Katie Mosher sits in third place on the FSU All-Time Digs list with 1,615. The top spot is occupied by Summer Weissing with 1,859 which was set back during 2004-07 seasons.
- Katie Mosher's 506 digs in 2013 are the fifth-most in school history. Mosher also owns the top (604), fifth and sixth best digging performances in FSU history.
- Sarah Wickstrom climbed into the all-time ranks in career assists. She now sits in 10th place with a total of 2,140. Keep in mind FSU runs a 6-2 system, calling for two setters.
- Ashley Neff's 174 block assists in 2013 is the fifth best performance in school history. Neff owns the third, fourth and fifth best performances in the category in school history.
- Ashley Neff's .362 hitting percentage in 2013 ranks ninth on the school's single-season list. She also holds the fifth best total.
- Florida State finished in the AVCA Poll from start to finish in 2013 for the second time in program history (preseason to postseason)
- Florida State posted 28 blocks in the 3-2 win over North Carolina on Nov. 1. It was the best blocking performance under Coach Poole and the best in the ACC in 2013.
- Florida State finished 19th nationally with a .266 hitting percentage.
- Florida State finished 22nd nationally with 2.75 blocks per set.
- \cdot Ashley Neff finished 18th nationally in blocks per set (1.39) and 21st with a .380 hitting percentage.
- Had four student-athletes in Sarah Wickstrom, Katie Mosher, Sarah Burrington and Nicole Walch named to the All-ACC Academic Team.

THE ACC

The Tradition

Consistency. It is the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now, in its 62nd year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed the reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, ACC schools have captured 136 NCAA team championships, including 71 in women's competition and 65 in men's. In addition, NCAA individual titles have gone to ACC student-athletes 156 times in men's competition and 107 times in women's action. Given the ACC's strong history and the strengthening of its ranks with the additions of Notre Dame, Pitt and Syracuse in 2013, followed by Louisville in 2014, those numbers – and the league's longstanding tradition of excellence – appear destined to only grow greater in the years ahead.

In 2013, Atlantic Coast Conference football enjoyed one of the most successful seasons in history by any Conference. With Florida State winning its third national championship with a perfect 14-0 record, and Clemson winning the Discover Orange Bowl, the league became only the second in history to win the national title and record a second win in a BCS bowl game. For the third time in its history, the ACC set an NCAA record for bowl participation as 11 of its 14 teams earned bids to bowl games. The ACC also finished with 11 football teams sporting winning records, the most for any league since 1932 when the old Southern Conference was a 24-team league.

The ACC also became the first Conference to have student-athletes win the Heisman Trophy (Jameis Winston, FSU), the Nagurski Trophy (Aaron Donald, Pitt), the Outland Trophy Award (Donald), the Lombardi Award (Donald), the Chuck Bednarik Award (Donald), the Doak Walker (Andre Williams), the Lou Groza Award (Roberto Aguayo, FSU), the Rimington Award (Bryan Stork, FSU) and Davey O'Brien Award (Winston) in the same year. The league had 42 players selected in this year's NFL Draft, including four who were the first players chosen at their positions. And for the eighth straight year the ACC led all conferences in football in the APR and for the eighth time in nine years in the GSR (graduation success rate).

2013-14 Review

The 2013-14 academic year saw ACC teams capture five more national team titles and nine individual NCAA crowns. In all, the ACC has won 67 national team titles over the last 17 years and has won two or more NCAA titles in 31 of the past 33 years. A total of 207 ACC teams placed took part in NCAA post-season play in 2013-14, including a record 193 in NCAA championships. League teams compiled a 151-82-4 (.646) mark in NCAA championship dual competition.

Academically, the member institutions of the Atlantic Coast Conference again led the way among Power 5 conferences in the latest "Best Colleges" rankings released by US News & World Report. ACC member institutions combined for an average rank of 48, marking the seventh straight year that the ACC led all FBS conferences.

The Championships

The conference will conduct championship competition in 27 sports during the 2014-15 academic year-13 for men and 14 for women. The first ACC championship was held in swimming on February 25, 1954. The conference did not conduct championships in cross country, wrestling or tennis during the first year.

The 13 sports for men include football, cross country, soccer, basketball, fencing, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball, tennis, golf

and lacrosse. Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship meet held in tennis at Wake Forest University. Championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, field hockey, soccer, basketball, fencing, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf, lacrosse, softball and rowing, with volleyball deciding its champion by regular season play.

A History

The Atlantic Coast Conference was founded on May 8, 1953, at the Sedgefield Inn near Greensboro, N.C., with seven charter members - Clemson, Duke,



Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest - drawing up the conference by-laws.

The withdrawal of seven schools from the Southern Conference came early on the morning of May 8, 1953, during the Southern Conference's annual spring meeting. On June 14, 1953, the seven members met in Raleigh, N.C., where a set of bylaws was adopted and the name became officially the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Suggestions from fans for the name of the new conference appeared in the region's newspapers prior to the meeting in Raleigh. Some of the names suggested were: Dixie, Mid-South, Mid-Atlantic, East Coast, Seaboard, Colonial, Tobacco, Blue-Gray, Piedmont, Southern Seven and the Shoreline.

Duke's Eddie Cameron recommended that the name of the conference be the Atlantic Coast Conference, and the motion was passed unanimously. The meeting concluded with each member institution assessed \$200.00 to pay for conference expenses.

On December 4, 1953, conference officials met again at Sedgefield and officially admitted the University of Virginia as the league's eighth member. The first withdrawal of a school from the ACC came on June 30, 1971, when the University of South Carolina tendered its resignation. The ACC operated with seven members until April 3, 1978, when the Georgia Institute of Technology was admitted. The Atlanta school had withdrawn from the Southeastern Conference in January of 1964.

The ACC expanded to nine members on July 1, 1991, with the addition of
