#### STRIPED SHIRTS AND WHISTLES!

About how often during the game does the average football fan realize that there are officials on the field? And how many fans have any knowledge at all of each official's duties? Usually the only time the hard working men with striped shirts and whistles are noticed is when one of them steps off a 15-yard penalty, signals a touchdown or conversion. But for 60 minutes of a game each official is tunning, shifting into institution, reversing the field to follow plays and constantly on the go.

Officials each have definite assignments and responsibilities while on the field, just as players on the team do. Here is the way they line up

REFEREE—His normal scrimmage position is behind the offensive team and he is primarily responsible for checking offensive formations, following the ball and play. Among the most common fouls he calls would be backs-in-motion, roughing kicker and passer.

UMPIRE—He stands directly behind the defensive line to check principally for fouls in line play and on punts or passes as the players move past him downfield. Some of the fouls he is most likely to call include illegal use of hands and arms, and ineligible men on forward passes.

HEAD LINESMAN—He takes a position on the scrimmage line, being primarily responsible for offside and other line plays. After the ball has been snapped he moves down his sideline to

cover passes and out-of-bounds. His foul responsibilities include largely off-side, pass interference and out-of-bounds.

FIELD JUDGE—He is located to observe downfield blocking, kicks and passes, serving as an assistant to the referee in that sector. He moves to the sidelines opposite the head linesman to cover out-of-bounds. He would call fouls most

often for pass interference, clipping and ineligible men down field for passes.

IN GENERAL, the referee's whistle controls the action. Each of the four officials will signal fouls by dropping a weighted red (or d-white) handkerchief to indicate the spot, so inding horn (except referee) and by giving the customary signal for the nature of the foul.

The horn, handkerchief or signal will NOT stop play, which continues until the ball is blown dead by the referee's whistle. This is important, inasmuch as it might happen that the play is of greater advantage to the offended team than the penalty, and the penalty may be waived.





#### MEET THE SEMINOLES

TACKLE HUGH ADAMS, who was named to several Little All-American teams last Fall, treasures still more the fact his teammates selected him to captain the 1949 eleven . . . Hugh is the inspirational type of leader who believes in setting a good example by his own play . . . tackle W. A. "DUB" KENDRICK is one of the most deceiving men on the Seminole line . . . small for a tackle at 185 pounds, Dub makes up for his lack of weight by agility and the fire of his charge . . . he loves best of all to play in the opponents' backfield . . . tackle ED FOX, only other letterman at this position, was injured during pre-season practice and will be lost for the first few games . . . tackle DWIGHT OSHA is a transfer from Wabash College where he was an outstanding freshman lineman last Fall . . . he is considered by the coaching staff as one of the most promising of the

newcomers . . . tackles BOB DUCKWORTH, BOB JOHNSON, ROSCOE BARBER and DAVID WATFORD are also first year men with the Seminoles and are being counted on to furnish the reserve strength so sorely lacking last Fall . . .

END NORMAN EUBANKS, the squad comedian, is a more than capable performer offensively and defensively . . . Norm proved last season he was the best pass target on the

Norm proved last season he was the best pass target on the team, usually coming down with the ball if it is thrown anywhere near him . . . he is used sometimes as safety man on defense because of his knack for breaking up or intercepting enemy passes . . . end TED HEWITT is also counted on to hold down two positions—end on offense and halfback on defense . . . it was Ted that intercepted a Stetson pass and ran it back 99 yards for the clinching

touchdown against the Hatters last Fall . . . ends LEONARD MELTON and CHRIS BANAKAS, lettermen, are defensive experts . . . Leonard will be remembered best for his great game against Troy last year soon after he was shifted to this position from halfback . . . Chris, a fine team man, may also be used some at guard this Fall . . . outstanding newcomers at end include CURTIS CAMPBELL, VIC SZCZEPANIK, LOUIS SUTTON, GEORGE EDMISTON, GLENN ALLEN and BOB McGINNIS . . .

GUARD BILL DAWKINS was rated by many along with Captain Adams as the Seminoles' outstanding lineman last Fall . . . Bill added about ten pounds to his weight this summer, which shouldn't hurt his effectiveness at all . . . guard BOB SCHMELZ played some great ball as a Freshman in 1948 and is being counted on to improve as a Sophomore . . he is at his best on defense . . . guard DAN McCLURE, a letterman in 1947, is a hard worker and should be a lot of help again this year . . . guard JERRY MORRICAL is probably the outstanding transfer on the Florida State squad . . he was a letterman at Indiana University in 1946, 1947 and 1948 . . . Coach Veller will use him at guard on offense, backing up the line or tackle on defense . . . guards LOREN MALTBY, GEORGE SPURLING, BOB TULLY, BOB WAFF and FRANK MARCUS, all newcomers, are expected to provide the depth this position needs . . .

CENTER JOE MARCUS, the Seminoles' "sixty minute man" of 1948, is back for his senior year . . . Joe took on added responsibilities just before the season opened, bringing his bride of one week with him when he reported for pre-season practice . . . center MONTE MAY, the other letterman at the pivot spot, will have help in relieving Joe this Fall from newcomers JOHN NEWLAND, RAULIE RAULERSON, RIN GROSSMAN and ED LOCKARD . . .

QUARTERBACK WALTER "FOEY" FOY may be called upon to do a lot more running with the ball this Fall, instead of being limited to blocking as he was most of last season . . . Coach Veller will use him at left half as well as at quarter, and he can go! . . quarterback MARVIN "WHITEY" URQUHART is another one of the two position men on the Seminole squad, often playing end on defense . . he does a capable job at either assignment. . . newcomer at quarterback TIFF GOZA, lacks experience .

LEFT HALFBACK KEN MacLEAN from nearby Quincy is big, fast and rated the Seminoles' outstanding offensive runner. Ken is a true triple threat back, being a fine punter and better than fair passer. a senior, he should have his greatest year. left halfback DICK PETERSON may be the passer Coach Veller has been so eagerly seeking for two years. he throws long and accurately, and also runs well when called upon to do so ... HARRY BRINGGER seems to be the best of the newcomers at this position.

RIGHT HALFBACK WYATT "RED" PARISH, the "Bonifay Flash," specializes in long touchdown jaunts . . . and is also a fine pass receiver . . . right halfback ERNIE REDDICK is the Seminoles' top punt return artist and probably the shiftiest back on the squad . . DAN M/DY and CHARLIE JOHNSON are the first year men being counted on to help . . .

FULLBACK BUDDY STRAUSS got off to a slow start last year because of injuries . . . Buddy worked hard to get in top condition for the 1949 campaign and is being counted upon to have his best season . . he likes to run right over the opposition, and often does . . . fullback RALPH CHAUDRON, the teams best punter, has high aims . . his card file records his ambition "to be a millionaire" . . . fullback BO MANUEL, like Chaudron, will be seeking his third letter as a Seminole, excelling defensively and punting . . . fullbacks JOHN QUINN, DICK TURK and IRWIN HANSON are rated by the coaching staff as outstanding prospects among the large crop of Freshmen backs . . . all three are hard runners, and Quinn will a so probably do some of the team's punting . .



### THE STETSON UNIVERSITY HATTERS

The Stetson University Hatters enter today's game with the Florida State University Seminoles sporting a record of three wins, one loss and one tie for the 1949 season. The Hatters have defeated Saufley Field 60-0, Millsaps College 16-6 and University of Tampa 40-14. The single loss was to Troy (Ala.) State Teachers College by a 10-0 score, and Stetson tied Milligan (Tenn.) College 13-13.

Stetson claims to have played the first intercollegiate football game in Florida. According to Stetson officials, the contest was played at De-Land in 1901 with the Hatters shutting out Florida Agricultural College of Lake City 6-0.

Fans who have seen the 1949 Stetson Hatters in action rate it as one of the most colorful teams ever to represent the DeLand school. Under tutorship of Coach Robert G. Trocolor, the Hatters use the "two platoon" system fast becoming popular over the country, and throw the ball around

a lot on offense. Many of Stetson's touchdowns this Fall have been on long runs by shifty backs, or on ground-gobbling pass plays.

Fans attending today's Florida State University-Stetson University football game will witness teams using two of the most modern forms of attack. The Hatters will run from an "unbalanced T" which Coach Trocolor is credited with inventing. And the Florida State Seminoles will counter with the "cockeyed T"—some orthodox T and some single wing—which Coach Don Veller introduced so successfully to Southern football last Fall and which has brought the Indians 11 victories in the 12 games they have played under his direction.


Everything points to a nip and tuck battle at the Gator Bowl Stadium this afternoon with the Dixie Conference football crown probably hanging in the balance.
