About the Spartans

The Shrine Cigar Bowl-bound Tampa Spartans need another win to tie their good record of last season when the Frank Sinkwich-coached club won seven games, lost only three, tied one and downed Florida State for the first time in four meetings by a 14 to 6 margin.

Now the Spartans, led by Head Coach Marcelino Huerta, former star University of Florida lineman and last year's line mentor, has a record of six wins, three losses and a

tie to date and an important meeting coming up today with the same Florida State Seminoles. The only change this time is the game is being played at Tallahassee in Doak S. Campbell Stadium.

This is the make-or-break on the schedule for each club. The rivalry has budded into a big-time one. FSU held the upper margin in the series for the first three years of Don Veller's tenure at the school. Last year the Spartans worked hard to try and stop the Seminoles and they did before one of the largest crowds to ever see the two elevens clash.

Now the fifth game is scheduled in Tallahassee today and another big crowd with a host of fans from Florida's West Coast will be in the Capital City for the grid meeting. Tampa wants this game to give it a big boost into the Shrine Cigar Bowl Game against undefeated Lenoir Rhyne on Saturday night, December 13. The Seminoles, fattened by their kill of the Wofford Terrier last week would like to rack up victory number two over the red, black and goldclad Spartans.


Tampa is better balanced this year with depth in the forward wall and a fleet of deceptive, sharp-running backs. The Spartans have been able to hit pay-dirt several times

this season via the aerial route.

Sinkwich's 1950 club ran up 173 points against their opponents' 211, while winning five and losing four. Last year's aggregation hit pay-dirt for 289 points and allowed 126. Tampa's forward wall is led by a candidate for Little All-America honors this year. He is Nick Waytovich, a 195-pound sophomore from Johnstown, Pa. This is the same fellow that caused FSU backs so much trouble in last year's game. He has been a standout all year in all of Tampa's games, even though he has been handicapped with an injured ankle. Waytovich plays mostly on defense but sees some action on offense.


The 1951 team had the best record at Tampa since Nash Higgins' 1934 eleven won eight games and lost four against some tough opposition. fan in front of you.




