About the Spartans

The Shrine Cigar Bowl-bound Tampa Spartans need another win to tie their good record of last season when the Frank Sinkwich-coached club won seven games, lost only three, tied one and downed Florida State for the first time in four meetings by a 14 to 6 margin.

Now the Spartans, led by Head Coach Marcelino Huerta, former star University of Florida lineman and last year's line mentor, has a record of six wins, three losses and a tie to date and an important meeting coming up today with the same Florida State Seminoles. The only change this time is the game is being played at Tallahassee in Doak S. Campbell Stadium.

This is the make-or-break on the schedule for each club. The rivalry has budded into a big-time one. FSU held the upper margin in the series for the first three years of Don Veller's tenure at the school. Last year the Spartans worked hard to try and stop the Seminoles and they did before one of the largest crowds to ever see the two elevens clash.


Now the fifth game is scheduled in Tallahassee today and another big crowd with a host of fans from Florida's West Coast will be in the Capital City for the grid meeting. Tampa wants this game to give it a big boost into the Shrine Cigar Bowl Game against undefeated Lenoir Rhyne on Saturday night, December 13. The Seminoles, fattened by their kill of the Wofford Terrier last week would like to rack up victory number two over the red, black and gold-clad Spartans.

Tampa is better balanced this year with depth in the forward wall and a fleet of deceptive, sharp-running backs. The Spartans have been able to hit pay-dirt several times this season via the aerial route.

Sinkwich's 1950 club ran up 173 points against their opponents' 211, while winning five and losing four. Last year's aggregation hit pay-dirt for 289 points and allowed 126. This year, playing the toughest schedule in the school's history, the Spartans have tallied 216 points and allowed 160. Of this latter figure, powerful Mississippi Southern scored 52, McNeese State of Lake Charles, La., 40 and Chattanooga 30. The Spartans dropped all three of these games.

Captain of the 1952 squad is big Tom Mahin, 235-pound junior tackle who hails from Youngstown, Ohio. Tom is potentially Little All-America material, but so far hasn't been able to make the grade. He has improved lately and played a fine game two weeks ago against Catawba.

The Tampa co-captain is Senior Defensive Halfback



Vince Chicko, also from Youngstown, Ohio. Vince is the fellow who runs back the long punts and passes and keeps the fans on edge for just such a moment when he is in the game. Vince has been tackled twice this year by a twelfth man coming off the bench to hit him. It happened against Mississippi Southern and also by a McNeese man.


The Spartans' T-attack is propelled by Bill Minahan, a 175-pound freshman from Johnstown, Pa. Minahan played in Tampa last year with the Camp Lejeune Marines who met Brooke Army Medical Center in the Cigar Bowl game. Minahan is a slick artist with the pigskin and a deft handler with the oval. His running mates are Charley Harris, Endicott, N. Y., junior, and Bob Boucher, a junior from Pittsburgh. Both are fast, shifty and once given a bit of running room are hard to stop.

The big boy of the Tampa running attack is Al Leathers, Belle Glade freshman, who is a brother of Stetson's famous B. J. Leathers. Al has been the sparkplug of the Spartans' ground attack all year. He is fast and shifty and is capable of going all the way each time he runs with the ball from his fullback post. Tom Spack also sees action at the line-plunging role.

Tampa's forward wall is led by a candidate for Little All-America honors this year. He is Nick Waytovich, a 195-pound sophomore from Johnstown, Pa. This is the same fellow that caused FSU backs so much trouble in last year's game. He has been a standout all year in all of Tampa's games, even though he has been handicapped with an injured ankle. Waytovich plays mostly on defense but sees some action on offense.

The 1951 team had the best record at Tampa since Nash Higgins' 1934 eleven won eight games and lost four against some tough opposition. The Spartans had a real lean season in 1948 under Mike Gaddis when they did everything wrong and lost all eight of their games. FSU won this one 34-7. The 1949 score was 33-12 in favor of the Indians and the 1950 score was 34-19 on one of the coldest days in the history of Tallahassee. (It was to this writer.)


