

FSU'S HEAD FOOTBALL COACH TOM NUGENT

Tom Nugent, originator of the "I" formation, the typewriter huddle, the double quarterback, and recognized as one of the nation's most imaginative young football coaches, picks up the reins this fall for his second campaign as headmaster of Florida State University football fortunes.

Nugent came to State last year from a highly-successful four-year tenure as boss man of VMI's colorful Keydets of the Southern Conference. In four seasons at the Lexington, Va., institution, Nugent injected new life into the VMI eleven. His record there was a respectable 19-18-2.

Nugent took over the Seminoles in 1953 and did the near-impossible. Starting with only 13 holdovers and an entirely new system, Nugent built a team that won half of its 10 games, the last three in a row.

Nugent's coaching record dates back to his college days. After starring on the Ithaca College eleven three seasons and graduating in 1936, Nugent coached the Ithaca frosh while doing graduate work.

A native of Lawrence, Mass., Tom became head coach of football, basketball, and baseball at Essex Training School in his hometown. Three seasons produced two undefeated teams.

The Air Force summoned Nugent in 1941. But Tom and football soon joined forces again. He was named head coach of the Rosecrans (Mo.) Air Base Flyers. Other duties included writing, directing, and presenting shows for the entertainment of troops. Nugent was then—and still is quite a song and dance man. He's a showman, as his formations and style of play of his teams attest.

After his discharge in 1946, Nugent was appointed head coach at Williamsburg, Va., High, coached four undefeated athletic teams there in '46, then moved to Hopewell, Va., High. Three years of high school coaching produced a record of 24 wins, 4 losses for Nugent.

Then came Nugent's big chance—head coach at VMI. Armed with the same optimistic outlook and that "Nugent

Golden Touch," Tom stepped into the VMI job. It wasn't long before VMI hit the headlines, sharing the Southern Conference title with Maryland in 1951, when the Keydets won seven and lost three.

Tom and Mrs. Nugent (Peg) have six children: Tommy 11, Kerry 10, Peggy 8, Terrance Daniel 5, Pattie 4, and Timothy David, four months.

ABOUT ABILENE CHRISTIAN

By HEAD COACH GARVIN BEAUCHAMP

Abilene Christian's 1954 football team should be better than last year's, but such improvement does not mean the Wildcats are likely to improve on the 7-3-0 record established by the '53 team.

The reason, of course, is that our '54 opposition is tougher. The Abilene Christian schedule is unquestionably the most ambitious ever undertaken by this West Texas school of approximately 1,650 enrollment.

Personally, I look for our game tonight with Coach Tom Nugent's team to be among our three toughest of the season—along with Memphis State and Mississippi Southern. I know Tom is building Florida State into a power, and I respect his ability. We should have another good game this year.

The question remains: How good is Abilene Christian this year?

Our running game will be improved if we can find capable replacement for guard Byron (Sonny) Cleere, four-year veteran. Cleere's speed and downfield blocking finesse were vital to the Wildcat attack last year. Our defense against running plays will probably be weaker because of the loss of another four-year stalwart, 275-pound E. J. (Tiny) Moore, our middle guard on the 5-3-2-1 setup.

The loss of Cleere and Moore, our two starting guards last year, will be hard to replace because of their particular specialties.

Otherwise, nine of last year's starters return. The tentative squad consists of 26 lettermen, five squadmen and about 20 freshmen.

I am optimistic, all right, when it comes to talking about my '54 team, but I'm realistic, too, and recognize that to achieve a record equal or superior to last year's 7-3-0 would require our boys to play "above their heads" several notches, plus a sizable hunk of those necessary "breaks."
