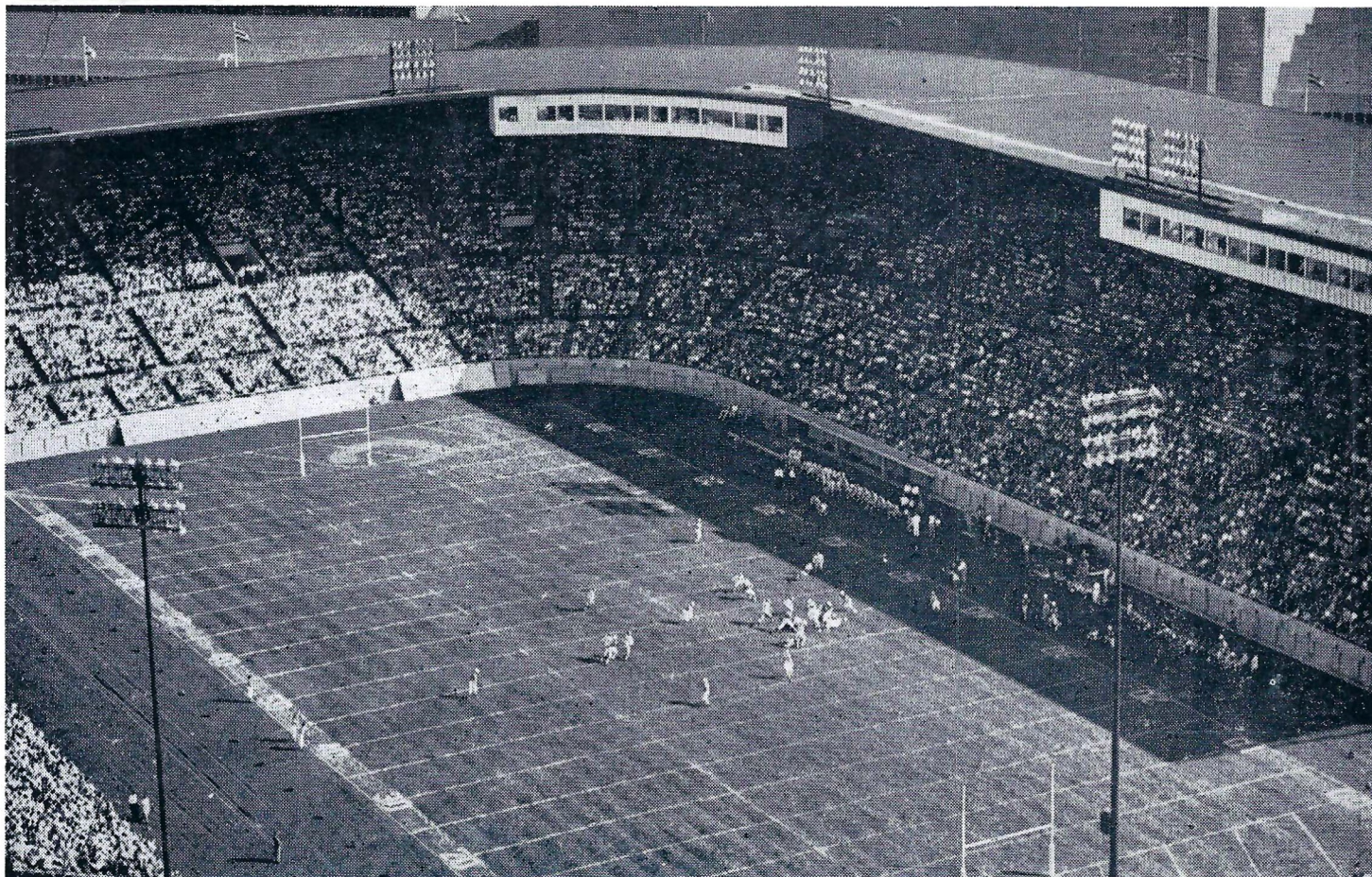

Florida State University's President, Dr. Robert M. Strozier, is a football enthusiast who is "playing" his second year for the Seminoles.

When Dr. Strozier came to Florida State in September, 1957, it was homecoming for the popular new president. Born in McRae, Ga., he was reared in Moultrie, Ga., and was graduated from Emory University. He earned his Ph.D. at the University of Chicago.

Located in Tallahassee, Florida State University is one of the fastest growing universities in the country. Already it is literally bursting at its seams with an estimated 10,000 students expected by 1960.

The campus consists of 297 acres, the older part of which overlooks the capital city.

The new portion of the campus follows a 50-year master plan developed by well-known architects. It stretches westward along Highway 90.

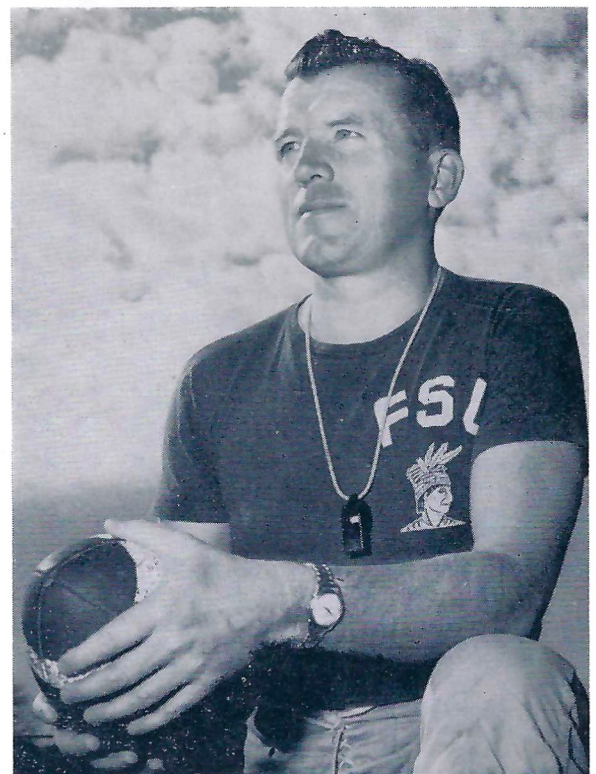
Growing by leaps and bounds, the campus has an 11-floor dormitory with three more just like it expected in the near future. A million dollar physical education plant is a year-and-a-half old as is the multi-million dollar library building.

New buildings completed this year are the School of Business and the School of Education, and a Geology addition.

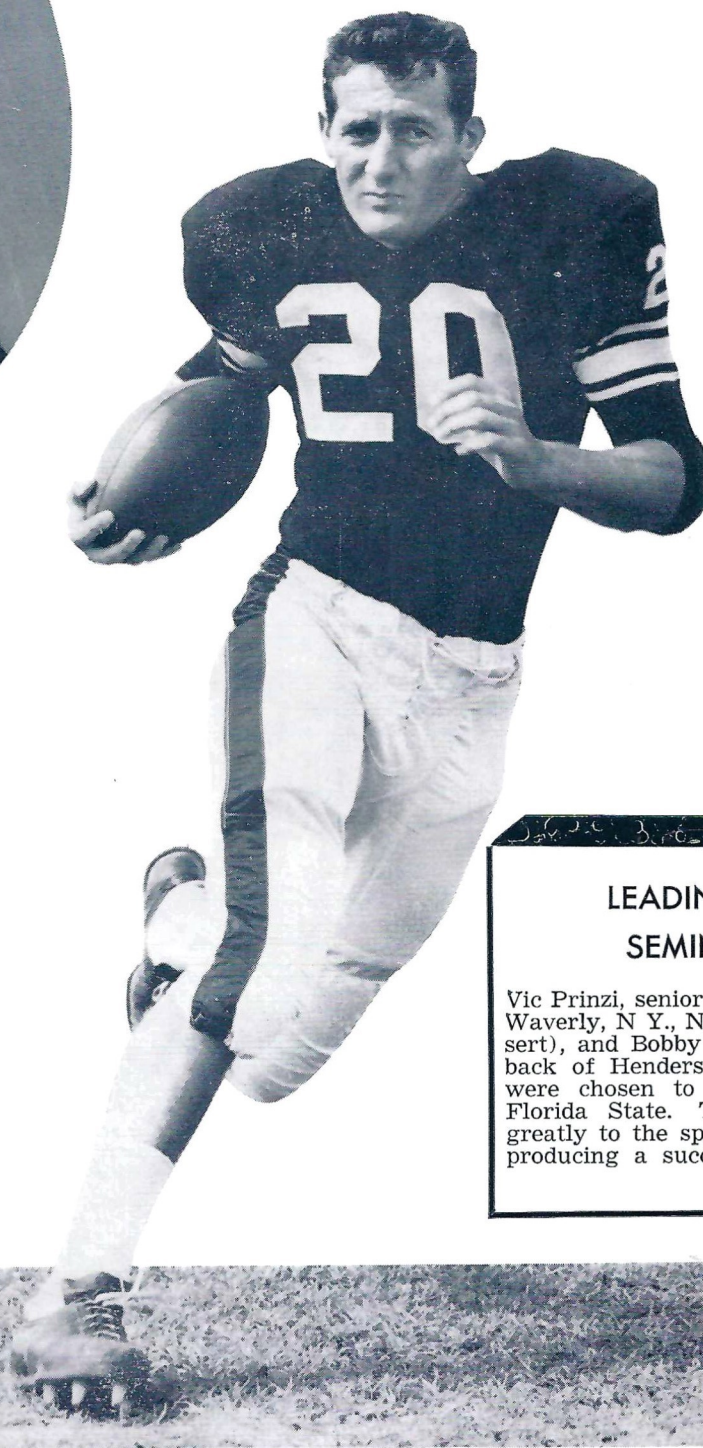
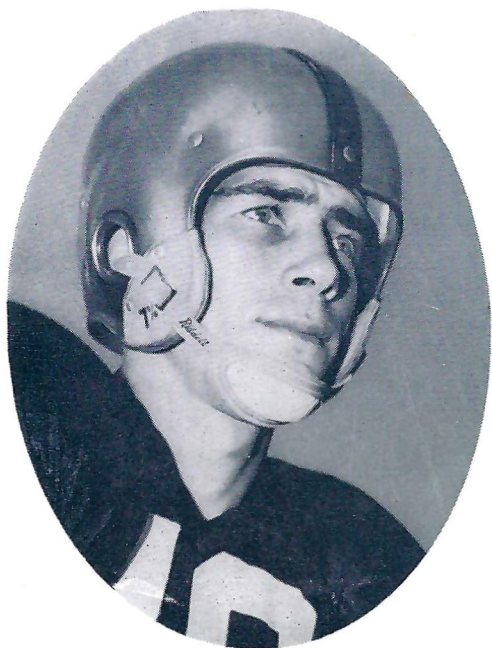
A recent act of the Legislature granted the University \$2,300,000 for developing basic nuclear studies which will put Florida State to the fore in the nuclear field.

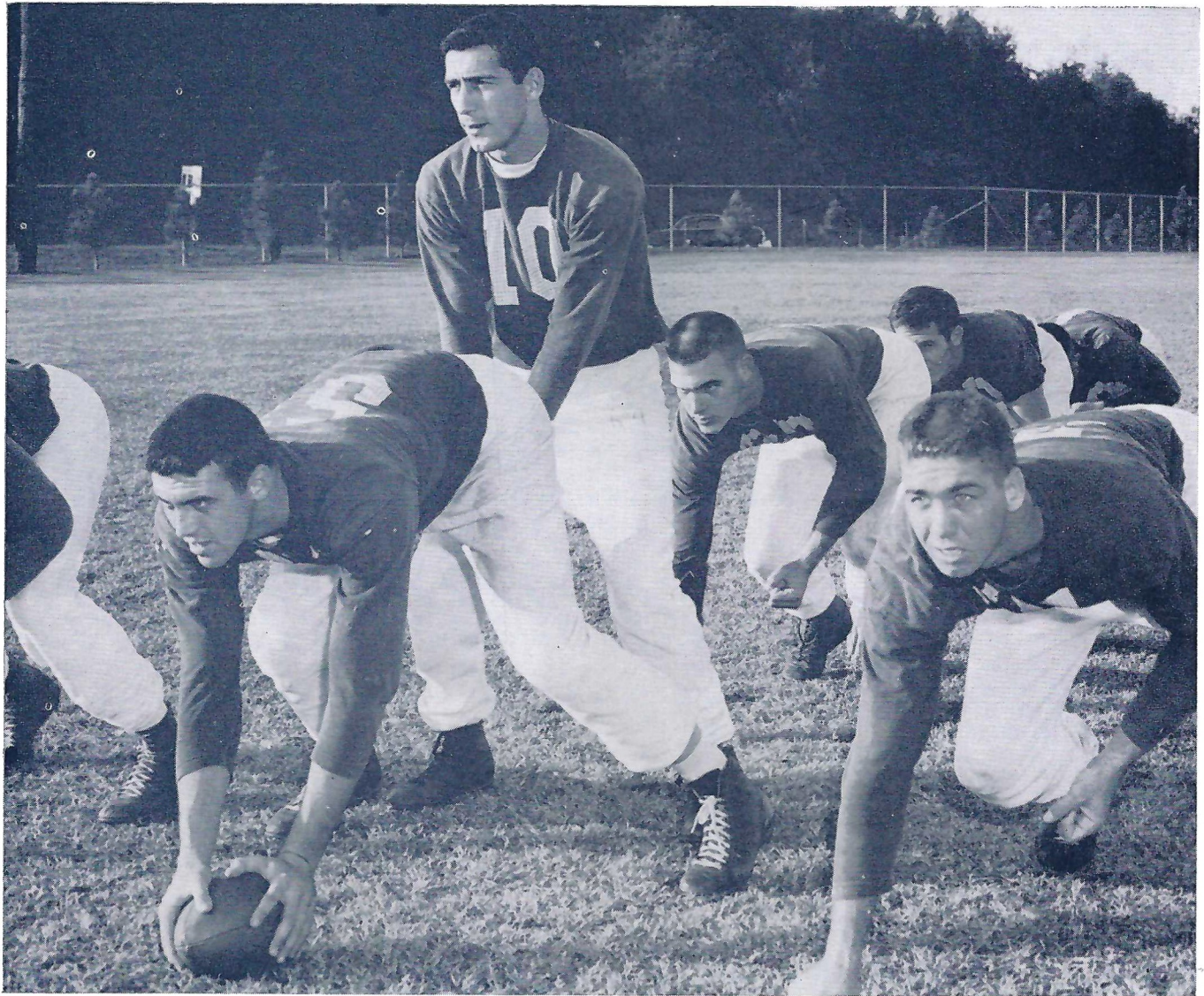

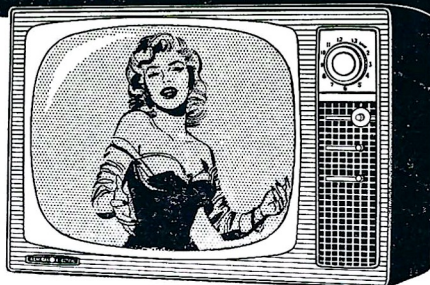

Solidifying its gains and establishing its position among the great universities of the area, Oklahoma State continues its timeless effort to meet the demands of the present and prepare for the future through education and research.

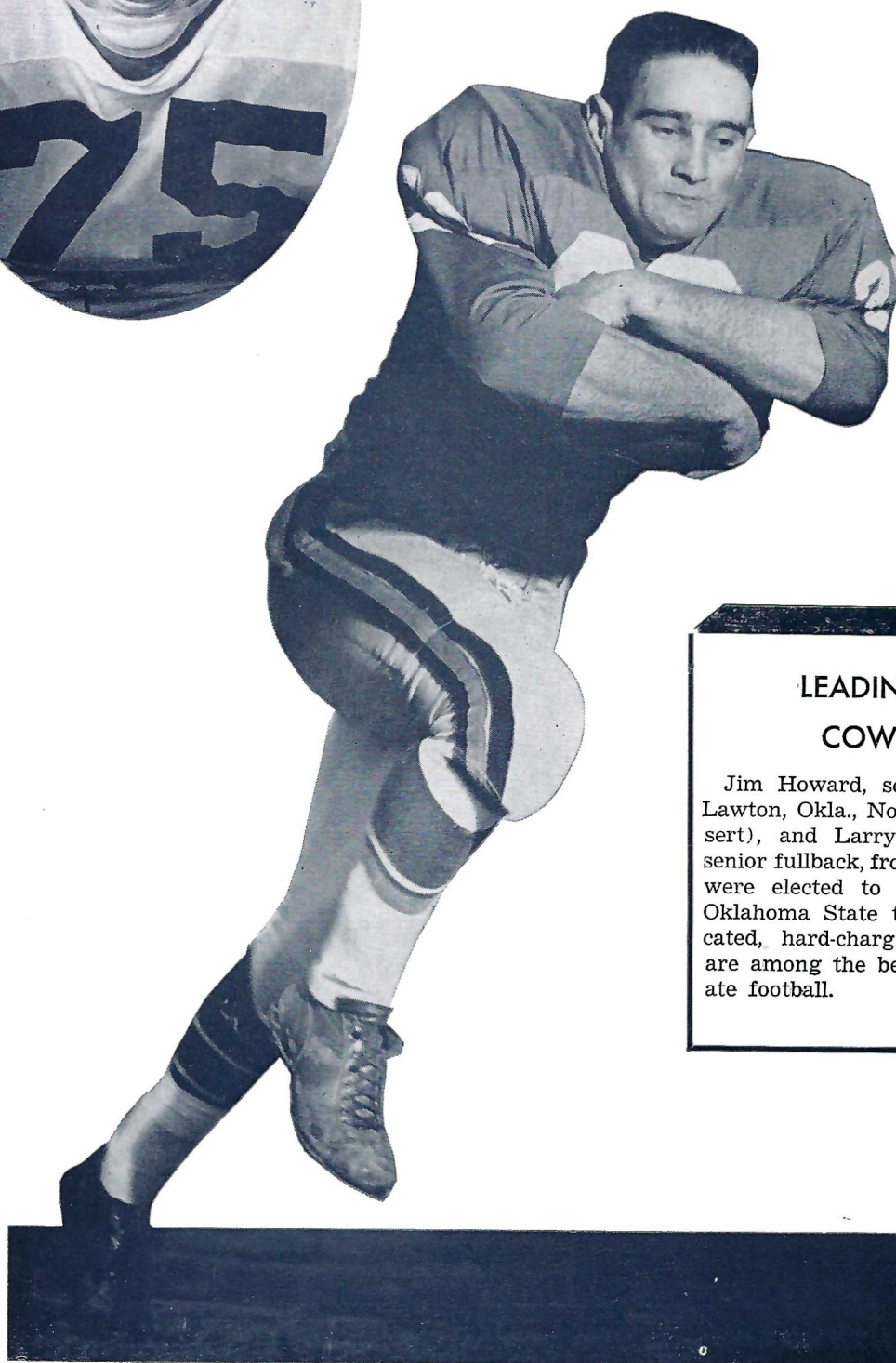

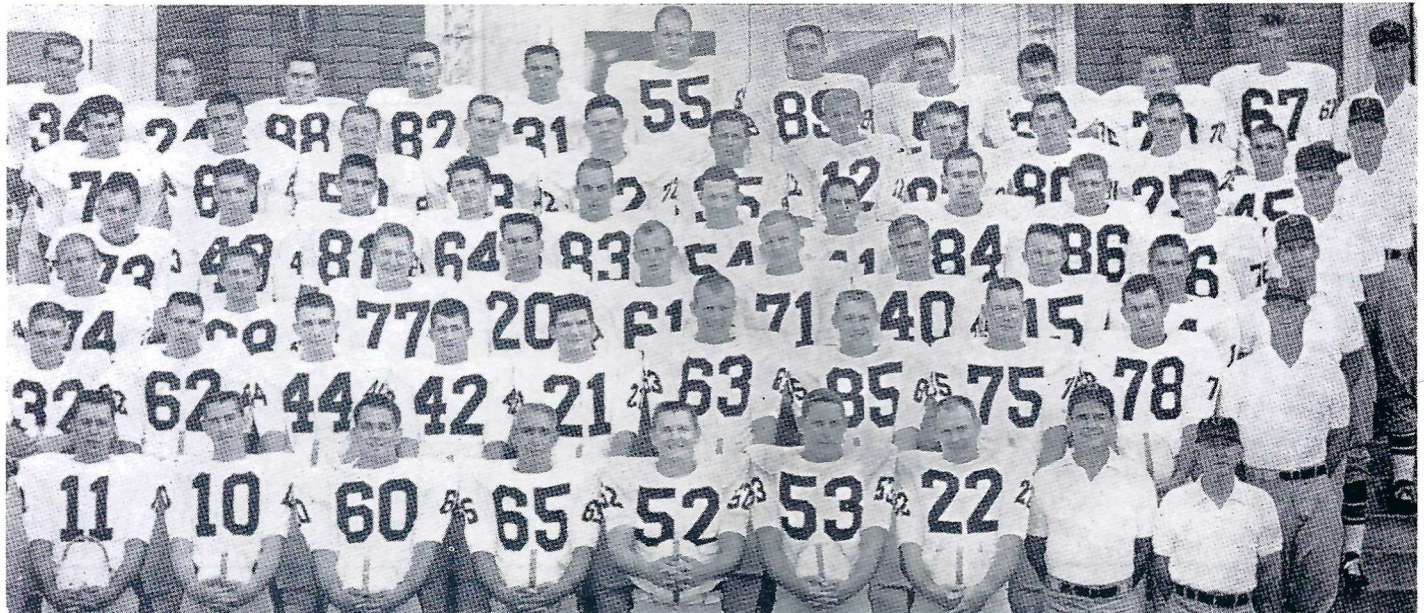
