
TONIGHT'S PROGRAM COVER


Dr. Thomas F. Jones became the 23rd president of the University of South Carolina July 1, 1962.

Under his guidance, Carolina has made gigantic strides in many areas. The graduate school program has more than doubled . . . research facilities have been strengthened . . . a giant building program is in full swing . . . enrollment is booming.

The athletic program has not been forgotten in this surge forward to meet the challenges of the space age. When the University needed a football coach, Dr. Jones went out and landed a national champion, Paul Dietzel. Under Dr. Jones' leadership the building program produced Carolina Coliseum, a multi-million dollar academic-athletic complex that provides the University with a super coliseum for basketball and other events. "The Roost" is a brand new dormitory facility for student-athletes, and the George Terry Memorial Spring Sports Center is nearing completion.

Dr. Jones has said many times "the Fighting Gamecocks are an integral part of the University. Our pride in our athletes shows respect for their scholarly work in the classrooms and laboratories fully as much as it acknowledges their spirited performance in sports competition."

Dr. Jones came to South Carolina from Purdue University at Lafayette, Ind., where he was head of the School of Electrical Engineering. A native of southwestern Tennessee, Dr. Jones received his bachelor's degree from Mississippi State College, and the master's and doctor of philosophy degree from Massachusetts Institute of Technology.


THE ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE

The University of South Carolina is a charter member of the Atlantic Coast Conference which was formed May 8, 1953, when the seven larger members of the Southern Conference withdrew from the 17-member conference to form a more compact and workable organization.

Other charter members of the Atlantic Coast Conference are Clemson University, Duke University, the University of Maryland, the University of North Carolina, North Carolina State University, and Wake Forest University. The University of Virginia was admitted to membership December 4, 1953, to bring the Atlantic Coast Conference to its current membership of eight institutions.

The late Dr. James T. Penney, then faculty chairman of athletics at the University of South Carolina, was elected the first president of the Atlantic Coast Conference and the University is proud that Dr. Penney was chosen three times in the first nine years of the conference's existence to head the organization.

Dr. James A. Morris, then Dean of the College of Business and later Vice-President of Advanced Studies and Research, became faculty chairman following Dr. Penney's death in the spring of 1964. When Dr. Morris left the Univer-

sity, Dr. John C. Guilds, then head of the Department of English, was named faculty chairman in October 1968. Dr. Guilds now serves the University as Vice-Provost.

James H. Weaver, then athletic director at Wake Forest College, was chosen May 28, 1954, as first commissioner of the Atlantic Coast Conference and served in that capacity until his death in July 1970. Norvell Neve presently serves as Acting Commissioner. The Commissioner's office is in Greensboro, N. C.

The Conference sent football teams to 12 bowl games during the first 16 years of its existence with ACC teams appearing in the Orange Bowl five times, the Liberty Bowl twice, and the Sugar, Cotton, Bluebonnet, Gator and Peach Bowls once each. The Gamecocks appeared in the 1969 Peach Bowl.

The ACC Basketball Champion has advanced to the NCAA final round of four six of the past eight years. North Carolina, under present South Carolina Head Coach Frank McGuire, won the NCAA Title in 1957.

The ACC has sent a team to the National Invitational Tournament the past four years with the Gamecocks representing the Conference in 1969.



The University Of South Carolina

The University of South Carolina is dedicated to the intellectual and moral development of young men and women primarily of South Carolina, although the student body includes students from all 50 states and a number of foreign countries.

The University seeks to provide adequate facilities and a suitable atmosphere so that its students will learn both to live and to earn.

The University of South Carolina was chartered in 1801 by the General Assembly of South Carolina. The oldest state-established and fully state-supported institution of higher learning in the United States, it opened its doors January 10, 1805. Students were housed and met classes in two buildings, De-Saussure College and Rutledge College, which still serve their original purpose and which form the nucleus of the historic main campus.

During the ante-bellum era, the Uni-

versity was notable for the excellence of its faculty, for the size and quality of its research facilities, and for the distinction of its alumni.

The War Between the States and its aftermath shook these firm foundations, and while the University continued to provide a sound college education for the citizens of the state, it experienced great difficulty during the reconstruction period in regaining its national recognition. However, as the wealth and general progressive spirit of the state increased, the University, too, moved forward rapidly and is now accepted as an institution of high scholarly distinction.

The immediate past has been a period of unprecedented growth. The student body and physical plant have expanded rapidly. Even more important, the curriculum has been strengthened through the addition of accomplished teachers and research specialists.

Situated downtown in the state capital of South Carolina, the campus of the University is spacious, well-maintained and close to the principal governmental and shopping areas of Columbia, which has twice been named an All-America City. The main campus is comprised of approximately 130 acres and 75 permanent buildings. Recently completed have been a new Physical Sciences Center; a new Humanities Center; Capstone House, an 18-story honors residence hall for women which features the only rooftop revolving restaurant in the world; Carolina Coliseum; "The Roost," residence hall for student-athletes; and Bates House, a highrise multi-towered residence hall for men. Buildings in the planning stage include new quarters for the College of Business Administration and a new Law School.


Enrollment for the 1970-71 fall semester is expected to total 10,450 undergraduates, 500 law students, 1,900 graduate students, 450 evening students, and 650 two year students for a total of 13,950 on the Columbia campus. In addition, 2,350 will study at branch campuses for a total enrollment of 16,300.

Governor Robert McNair and Lt. Governor John C. West are graduates of the University. Seven of South Carolina's nine constitutional officers, all five members of the State Supreme Court, and four of the five U. S. district judges in the state are U. S. C. graduates. U. S. Senator Ernest F. Hollings is a graduate of the University's Law School, as are U. S. Reps. Albert Watson and James R. Mann, and Rep. L. Mendel Rivers also attended the University. Rep. John L. McMillan was a Gamecock football star, 1919-21.

The University's Graduate Educational Research Training Program was rated as one of the two best of its type in the nation by the U. S. Office of Education. It was judged in comparison with 80 other such programs at leading institutions throughout the country.

A nationally recognized Honors Program of challenging courses is available to the above average student. Seminars, colloquies and lectures by faculty and prominent scholars outside the University are included.

Divisions of the University include the College of Arts and Sciences, College of Business Administration, College of Engineering, College of General Studies, School of Education, School of Journalism, School of Law, School of Nursing, School of Pharmacy, and the Graduate School.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS and HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

Paul Dietzel, South Carolina's director of athletics and head football coach, is past president of the American Football Coaches Association as well as president of Atlantic Coast Conference Athletic Directors.

He was named Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year by members of the Atlantic Coast Sportswriters Assn., after leading the Gamecocks to the ACC championship, a 6-0 conference record and 7-4 overall in 1969.

Coach Dietzel is beginning his fifth season as the Gamecocks' head football coach, and his 16th as a head coach. He came to Carolina in April 1966 following four seasons at the U. S. Military Academy and seven years at Louisiana State University.

His 15-season record is 84 wins, 66 losses and four ties. At LSU, he won the national championship in 1958, won two Southeastern Conference titles and participated in the Sugar Bowl twice and the Orange Bowl once. Last year's Gamecocks went to the Peach Bowl.

While football is his life's work, Paul Dietzel has a variety of interests, the closest to his heart being his work with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. He is a past president of the FCA's board of directors. Skiing is his favorite form of physical activity.

Writing is also one of his avocations and he is author of a book, "Wing-T and the Chinese Bandits," and co-author of "Go, Shorty, Go." Two of his best known writings are a treatise on "Why Play Football?" and his poem, "Sissy." He is currently writing another book on football.

The Dietzel family . . . Paul, wife Anne, son Steve—a student at Carolina—and daughter, Kathy—who recently graduated from Irmo High School—are members of Columbia's Union Methodist Church and live in the suburban Whitehall community.

A native of Ohio, Paul Dietzel was born Sept. 5, 1924 and played on Mansfield's first junior high football team, which was undefeated, and after graduation from high school he enrolled at Duke University where he played freshman football.

His college career was interrupted by military service and after World War II, he enrolled at Miami University at Oxford, Ohio where he played for two seasons. He was elected captain of the unbeaten 1947 Miami team that participated in the Sun Bowl, was chosen Little All-America center, to the Coaches All-America team, and later to the all-time Miami team.

Paul Dietzel served in the Army Air Corps during World War II, receiving his wings in August 1944 at the age of 20. He served as a B-29 co-pilot in the South Pacific, flying 12 missions over the Japanese Empire.

While at Miami, Dietzel in addition to playing football worked as the butcher in the veterans store, a trade he had learned as a butcher's helper during high school days. He also served as president of three national honorary societies and graduated with a grade-point average of 3.46 of a possible 4.0.

An invitation to join the Plebe staff at West Point cancelled medical school plans and launched a coaching career. For seven years, Paul Dietzel served as an apprentice to some of football's all-time great coaches. These included Col. Earl (Red) Blaik at the U. S. Military Academy, 1948 and again, 1953-54; Sid Gillman at the University of Cincinnati, 1949-50; and Paul (Bear) Bryant at Kentucky, 1951-52. Dietzel played under Gillman, who was head coach at Miami before moving to Cincinnati, and a teammate at Miami was present, Notre Dame coach Ara Parseghian. Present Virginia head coach George Blackburn was a Miami assistant when Dietzel was a player and a member of Gillman's Staff at Cincinnati with Dietzel.

In 1955, at the age of 31, Paul Dietzel became one of the youngest head coaches in the history of the powerful Southeastern Conference when he left the Army staff for Louisiana State University. LSU had won but two conference games in the two previous years and for three rebuilding seasons, the Tigers won 11 while losing 17. But in his last four years at LSU, the Bayou Bengals won 35 and lost 7, including a national championship, two SEC titles and three bowl invitations. His seven-year LSU record was 46-24-3.

Dietzel was named National Coach of the Year in 1958. He has served as coach of the Gray squad twice in the Blue-Gray classic, as head coach of the victorious East team in the Hula Bowl in Hawaii, co-coach of the winning North Squad in the 1964 North-South Shrine game in Miami, Fla., and on the staff of the victorious East team in the 1966 and '67 East-West Shrine games in San Francisco, and on the Hula Bowl staff after the 1967 season.

In 1962, Paul Dietzel left LSU to return to West Point as head coach. In four seasons, his Army teams had a 21-18-1 record, before he moved to South Carolina in 1966.

It provides television fans with a bonus not even available to holders of 50-yard line tickets—the right now second look at what just happened, in color and often in slow motion.

"Instant replay" is probably the most appreciated and least understood feature of televised sports coverage. Here, from Ampex Corporation, inventor of video recording and supplier of "instant replay" equipment to all U. S. networks, is a brief description of the planning and equipment that go into bringing "instant replay" to the home screen.

Television action begins with the cameras. To cover a college football game, the American Broadcasting Company employs from four to seven color cameras, depending on the importance of the game. Cameras are located high above the field in the press box areas, on the sidelines, and in the end zone.

Even in the Goodyear blimp. Pictures from any of these cameras can be recorded for "instant replay."






Award-winning sportscaster Bob Fulton is at the Gamecock Football Network microphone this fall for the 16th season.

Fulton has broadcast Carolina football since 1952 except for a two-year absence when he handled play-by-play for Georgia Tech. He is a former major league baseball announcer, having worked with the Mutual Network's "Game of the Day" in 1954. Fulton did Southwest Conference games while working out of Little Rock, Ark., and was play-by-play announcer several times for the Bluebonnet Bowl, Sun Bowl and Gator Bowl games, as well as the Shrine Bowl all-star game at Charlotte, N. C.

Joining Fulton as color announcer for the 1970 season is Joe Petty, sports director of WIS-TV in Columbia and a veteran sportscaster.

WIS Radio is the Flagship station for the Gamecock Football Network and handles all arrangements. Stations wishing information on the Gamecock Network should contact Brent Hill, WIS Radio, P. O. Box 1476, Columbia, S. C., 29201, or call area code 803, 772-0256.

The Fighting Gamecocks are also seen on television throughout South Carolina each Sunday during the fall. Highlights of the previous day's game plus previews of the upcoming opponent with commentary by Coach Paul Dietzel and Joe Petty feature "Carolina Football", over WIS-TV Columbia, WFBC-TV Greenville and WCIV-TV Charleston. "Carolina Football" is followed on the same stations by the "Quarterback Show" on which Coach Dietzel answers live questions telephoned in by fans throughout the state. Fulton and Petty also appear on the "Quarterback Show."

Coach Dietzel also has a regular program on WIS Radio during the season and "Gamecock Report" with sports information director Tom Price is heard six times each week year-round on WIS Radio.

the enemy's 20 yard line. He will write Owens' jersey color and number "36" on a piece of paper. The associate director in the announcers' booth, who is in constant contact with the producer, notifies him that Owens is the man to watch.

The director is alerted, and he instructs the proper camera to cover No. 36 and at the same time tells engineering to record the output from the camera on the Ampex HS-100 color disc recorder. It may be a press box camera, an end zone cameras or a sideline camera, depending on where the play begins on the field and the anticipated path of the action.

With Owens on the move and the fans on their feet, the job of preserving the action for "instant replay" is being quietly done in one of the two mobile television vans located outside the stadium. It is here that recording and transmission equipment is located. Upon a signal from the director, the operator of the HS-100 disc recorder records the action from the camera which has been designated to follow Owens.

If Owens breaks clear for a touchdown, home viewers are treated to a thrilling re-run in slow motion. If a linebacker rushes in to stop Owens short of a first down, the producer may decide he has a significant defensive play worthy of "instant replay." If, on the other hand, the quarterback fakes to Owens and bootlegs around end, there will be no "instant replay" as his run has not been recorded.

In any event, the announcers are not notified until after a play has been recorded, to prevent them from alerting viewers that a play will be re-run when it has not been recorded. Even so, over-anxious announcers are sometimes guilty of asking for the "instant replay" of a play that has not been recorded.

In certain key plays, a split screen technique is used. This enables the network to focus on Owens with one camera, and the star linebacker who is assigned to stop him with another. Pictures from both cameras are recorded on the HS-100 and the two scenes shown on the same screen, giving viewers a closeup look at the ball carrier and the top defensive man. This "split screen" technique is popular in baseball to show both the pitcher and base runner. It can either be live or recorded.

So there you have it. An announcer anticipates a play, a camera is assigned to follow the designated player, and its pictures are recorded on an Ampex disc recorder. The producer likes what has



been recorded, notifies an announcer, and he tells the viewing audience that they'll see that thrilling touchdown gallop again in color—compliments of "instant replay."

"Instant replay" began as a keep-your-fingers crossed gimmick in the early 1960's using conventional videotape recorders. Today it is a precise, easily controlled electronic recording function using Ampex magnetic disc recorders specifically designed for sports "instant replay" recording and playback. First used by ABC Sports during the U. S. Skiing championship in March 1967, the "instant replay"

machine is widely used today on most major network sportscasts, including such top features as the World Series, college and professional football and the Olympic Games.

For the more technical minded, the HS-100 records up to 30 seconds of action on highly polished and plated metal discs. The operator can cue up any portion of the 30 second recording in just four seconds for immediate playback on the air. The recorded action can be played as many times as necessary, and can be played in variable slow motion down to stop action in both forward and reverse.

Below: During instant replay of an exciting pass play, ABC employs split-screen technique to allow viewers to watch action of both the passer and receiver. Such relays are often shown in slow motion so arm-chair spectators can analyze each element of the play. 

A QUARTER TON OF LEADERSHIP

It's probably a good thing that Jimmy Poston and Dave DeCamilla won't be squaring off against each other this fall as they are in the picture above, because if they did there would be a tremendous collision on each play.

Poston (75) and DeCamilla (76) are the Gamecock co-captains for the 1970 football season, and their pre-season selection in itself is an indication of the esteem in which these two premier linemen are held by their teammates. Since Coach Paul Dietzel came to South Carolina in 1966—until this year—senior game captains were selected by the coaching staff for each game until the traditional season finale with Clemson. The permanent captain or co-captains were elected the week of the final game.

Last spring, the 20 seniors on the 1970 squad asked Coach Dietzel if the captains could be elected at the close of spring practice. Dietzel agreed and in the balloting, Poston and DeCamilla were the overwhelming choices.

Poston, 6-4 and 260 pounds, is a good natured mountain man from Canton, N. C., who has been a Gamecock starter since midway through his sophomore year. He was a first team All-Atlantic Coast conference selection as a junior and was on most of the All-America candidate lists before the 1970 season began.

DeCamilla, 6-2 and 245 pounds, has a more serious nature and is from Hudson Falls, N. Y., and first enrolled at the U. S. Military Academy, transferring to Carolina after his plebe season. He has been a starter since the beginning of his sophomore season and last year was a first team All-Atlantic Coast Conference selection in addition to winning the Jacobs Blocking Trophy as the top collegiate blocker in South Carolina.

DeCamilla leads the offensive unit from his left tackle spot while Poston is

the defensive captain from the left tackle position.

DeCamilla is a graduate of Hudson Falls Central High School where his coach was Robert Ryan, now a member of the Gamecock staff as a football recruiter. Poston graduated from Pisgah High School at Canton where his coach was Boyd Allen.

DeCamilla is majoring in an Economics curriculum in the College of Business Administration while Poston's major is Physical Education in the College of Education. Both are high on the prospect lists of all the professional football scouts who scout the Gamecocks. Both are single. DeCamilla is a Catholic while Poston is Baptist.

The mountain man from North Carolina and the New Yorker come from widely different backgrounds, but they have a lot in common when it comes to providing leadership on the football field.

RITA SHALOSKY'S GERMAN SWEET CHOCOLATE PIE (Wife of top assistant Bill Shalosky)

1 pkg (4 oz) German's Sweet Chocolate	1/8 teaspoon salt
1/4 cup butter	2 eggs
1 2/3 cups (1 1/2 oz can) evaporated milk	1 teaspoon vanilla
1 1/2 cup sugar	1 unbaked 10 inch pie shell or 2 unbaked 8 inch pie shells
3 tablespoons cornstarch	1 1/3 cups coconut
	1/2 cup chopped pecans

Melt chocolate with butter over low heat, stirring until blended. Remove from heat. Gradually blend in milk. Mix sugar, cornstarch and salt thoroughly. Beat in eggs and vanilla. Gradually blend in chocolate mixture. Pour into pie shell. Combine coconut and nuts and sprinkle over filling. Bake at 375° for 45 minutes. Filling will be soft but will set while cooling. Cool at least four hours before cutting.

EMILY WHITE'S SOUR CREAM POUND CAKE (Football and spring sports secretary)

1 cup butter	1/4 teaspoon baking soda
3 cups sugar	1/2 teaspoon salt
6 eggs	1 teaspoon flavoring
1 cup sour cream	3 cups flour

Cream butter and sugar. Add slightly beaten egg yolks. Sift together flour, soda and salt. Add sour cream alternately with dry ingredients to mixture. Beat egg whites until stiff, then fold into batter. Bake at 350° until done. Do not overbake.

SUE FLOYD'S APPLE CAKE (Wife of administrative assistant Ralph Floyd)

2 cups sugar	1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
1 1/2 cups cooking oil	1 teaspoon salt
2 eggs	1 cup ground nuts
3 cups self-rising flour	3 cups grated apple

Beat eggs, sugar, oil together. Add remaining ingredients alternating dry ingredients with apple. Bake in three layer pans at 350° about 30 minutes. This cake may be stacked or served in single layers. Combine following ingredients for filling: 1 eight oz pkg cream cheese, 1/2 stick butter or margarine, 1 box confectioners sugar, 1 cup chopped nuts.

MACK BASKIN'S WHIP CREAM POUND CAKE (Wife of administrative assistant Weems Baskin)

6 eggs	3 cups sugar
1/2 lb butter	1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1/2 pint whipping cream	1 teaspoon lemon extract
3 cups plain flour	

Cream butter and sugar. Add vanilla and lemon. Add eggs one at a time. Add flour and cream (not whipped). Use waxpaper lined tube pan. Cook at 325° for 1 1/4 hours, starting in cold oven. Do not open door to oven during cooking time.

LINDA GRIFFITH'S ONE POUND CAKE

(Secretary to sports information director Tom Price)

1 cup butter or margarine	3 cups all purpose flour
1/2 cup Crisco oil (no substitute)	1 cup milk
3 cups granulated sugar	1 teaspoon vanilla extract
5 eggs	1 teaspoon lemon extract
	1/2 teaspoon baking powder

Combine all ingredients and place in well greased tube pan in cold oven, setting temperature for 350°. Bake for 1 1/2 hours.

BETH COOPER'S PEACH PETAL PIE (Secretary to head coach Paul Dietzel)

I No. 2 can (2 1/2 cups) peach pie filling	
About 10 quarter inch slices refrigerated slice and bake cookies	
1 teaspoon sugar	
Dash cinnamon	

Heat pie filling. Pour into 8 inch pie plate. Overlap cookies slices around edge of pie plate. Mix sugar and cinnamon together. Sprinkle over cookies. Bake in moderate oven 350° for 35-40 minutes or until cookies are done. Serve warm in sauce dishes with ice cream. Makes five servings.

MARIGENE LOVING'S OLD FASHION LEMON PIE (Wife of assistant basketball coach Bill Loving)

1 cup sugar	2 lemons and rind
1 tablespoon flour	3 eggs
1 stick margarine	

Melt margarine and add sugar. To this add flour, eggs and lemons. Pour in uncooked pie shell. Bake 25-30 minutes at 400°.

Carolina Basketball

Four returning starters, including All-America guard John Roche, and some talented sophomore prospects make the Gamecock basketball outlook for 1970-71 indeed bright.

Coach Frank McGuire, voted Coach-of-the-Year by the New York Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association, welcomes back the multi-talented 6-3 Roche, voted Atlantic Coast Conference Player-of-the-Year for the second straight time, as well as his towering front line of 6-10 Tom Owens, 6-10 Tom Riker and 6-8 John Ribock. This foursome, along with graduated captain Bobby Cremins, led the Gamecocks to a 14-0 regular season ACC mark and an overall record of 25-3, the most wins in the school's history.

Also available to Coach McGuire are the two top reserves off last year's squad, 6-7 Rick Aydlett and Bob Carver, a quick 6-2 guard. The top sophomore prospects up from last year's 12-4 freshman squad are 6-3 guard-forward Kevin Joyce, the team's leading scorer with a 25.3 average and 7-0, 250-pound center Danny Traylor, who led the team in rebounding and also scored at a 18.4 clip.

Giving the Gamecocks additional depth will be 6-2 guard Casey Manning and 5-11 guard Jimmy Powell, along with Dennis Powell, 6-0 guard returning from last year's squad.

Roche, a first team Academic All-America selection, was elected captain of the squad for the upcoming season after leading the varsity in scoring with a 22.3 mark. Owens was runnerup in scoring with his 15.9 average and led the ACC in rebounding for the second straight year with a 14.0 mark. Both Roche and Owens were first team All-ACC and Riker, who scored at a 13.8 clip, was a second team selection.

Senior Ribock hit for 5.2 points per game, while juniors Aydlett and Carver scored 5.5 and 3.5 respectively.



FROM DRAWING BOARD TO CAROLINA STADIUM



INTRODUCING THE CAROLINA BAND CLUB

The CBC, a non-profit organization, was chartered July 30, 1970 for the sole purpose of assisting the functioning and financing of the USC Bands. This includes the sponsorship of Carolina Band recordings and the solicitation of CBC memberships for the purposes of game travel, equipment, uniforms, and scholarships. CBC membership is extended to anyone who envisions the Carolina Band as a tangible symbol of excellence. Hundreds have joined and more are anticipated. Officers for 1970-71 are: Tom Smeltzer, Executive Secretary; Dr. W. E. Gause, Jr., President; Dr. W. O. Tanner, Vice President; Mrs. Nina Brooks, Secretary-Treasurer; and Robert Kneee, CBS Attorney.

In the second year as Director of Bands at USC, Ralph Wahl has inspired the Carolina Bands performances toward a gigantic collective effort in teamwork and ingenuity. His broad knowledge of traditional, jazz, marching, and contemporary wind music literature and exacting standards of performance have won acclaim across the nation. The ability to guide instrumentalist, his vast music teaching experience, an exciting marching band technique, and administrative qualities have been the trademark of this remarkable success. The Carolina Bands have received no less than six standing ovations in the past year.

Bands, adjudication assignments, lectures and clinics under Wahl's direction have been presented from Pennsylvania to California and from Canada to Georgia. Bands under his leadership have been heard and seen at the New York World's Fair, on regional and national television, the halftimes of the Green Bay Packers, Chicago Bears, Minnesota Vikings, Atlanta Falcons (November 1, 1970) and hopefully (finances pending) the New York Jet-Baltimore Colt game televised October 18th in New York. Other bands under his direction have appeared in Tennessee, Iowa, North Carolina, Maryland, and at numerous other concert tours and events.

Professor Wahl is skillfully assisted by Pat Wylie, new assistant director of bands. Wahl's duties at USC include the supervision of the Carolina Band staff, conducting the Symphonic Bands, the Wind Ensemble, and the Marching Band; as well as the responsibility for the Jazz Ensembles, Neophonic Orchestra, "Irish Red" Pep Band, and other USC band ensembles. Wahl is currently listed in "Who's Who in the United States."

WEAVER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

will be awarded annually to an outstanding ACC athlete who has distinguished himself by his academic record and leadership qualities.

"During Jim's early career as a coach and athletic director he derived much satisfaction from helping young men further their education," Mrs. Weaver said. "This was his motivating interest during his tenure as commissioner but on an abstract, administrative level. Florence and I are happy now that through the Jim Weaver Memorial Scholarship he can indirectly help young men again on a person to person basis."

The Atlantic Coast Conference has made a \$4,000 donation to the scholarship, \$500 in the name of each member institution. Other donations can be made through the conference office in Greensboro. The conference office will administer the scholarship.

Jim Weaver served as head football coach for five years and for 16 years as athletic director at Wake Forest prior to becoming the first commissioner of the ACC in 1954. He also coached at Centenary College, his alma mater, and at Nacogdoches, Tex., High School before returning to North Carolina in 1928 to coach at Oak Ridge Institute. He was a native of Rutherford College, N. C.



A graduate scholarship fund in memory of the late Jim Weaver, who served for 16 years as commissioner of the Atlantic Coast Conference, has been established. Weaver died on July 11 of an apparent heart attack while attending a meeting of the Collegiate Commissioners Association in Colorado Springs, Colo.

The scholarship was initiated by Weaver's widow, Kate, and daughter, Florence. It will be called the Jim Weaver Memorial Graduate Scholarship and
