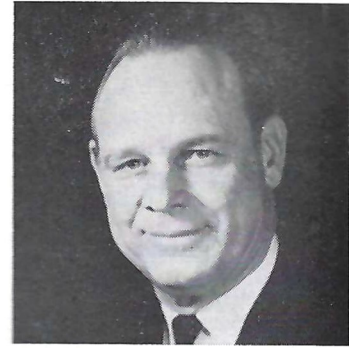

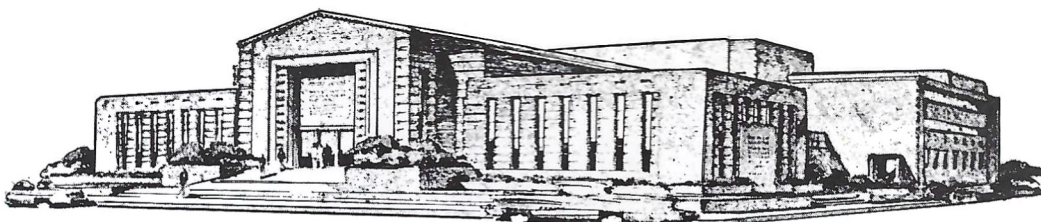

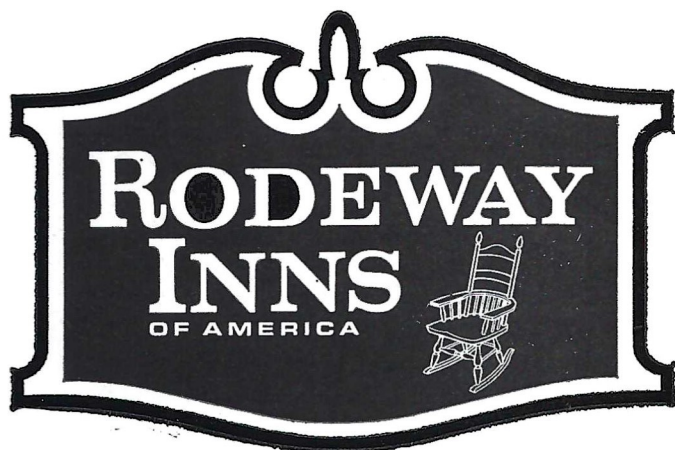

TONIGHT'S GAME 11th IN USM - FSU SERIES AND THIRD MEETING IN LADD STADIUM....

Clashing in Ladd Stadium for the third time, the Southerners of the University of Southern Mississippi and the Seminoles of Florida State University have had some close games and some lopsided ones in their 10 previous clashes.

The series began in 1952 at Tallahassee with the more-established Southerners bopping the fledgling Seminoles 50-21. Southern won again the following year, at Hattiesburg, by a 21-0 count. FSU's first two wins, each by one point, came in 1954 (19-18) and 1956 (20-19), both at Tallahassee and sandwiched around USM's 21-6 victory at Hattiesburg in '55. Southern won 20-0, at home again in '57.

After a four-year lapse, the series began again in 1960 — at Mobile — with USM taking a 15-13 thriller. Southern won 12-0 at Tallahassee in '61. Returning to Mobile in '63, the clubs battled to a scoreless tie. In 1964, at Tallahassee and with the Seminoles boasting the likes of quarterback Steve Tensi and split receiver Fred Biletnikoff, FSU won by a resounding 30-0 count. That was the last meeting of the two clubs until tonight.

Vega is all that.

But what sets Vega apart is that it's one little car that's good on long runs too.

One reason is its relatively large 140-cubic-inch overhead cam engine. It can cruise comfortably at turnpike speeds without straining, and with power to spare.

Vega is built low to the ground, and wide, so it takes curves without a lot of lean and hangs onto a windy highway like it weighed a whole lot more.

The steering is easy. Yet firm and reassuring on straight stretches.

What we're saying is, for an economy car, Vega sure feels a lot like a sports car.

Get into one soon and see. It'll give you a good run for your money.

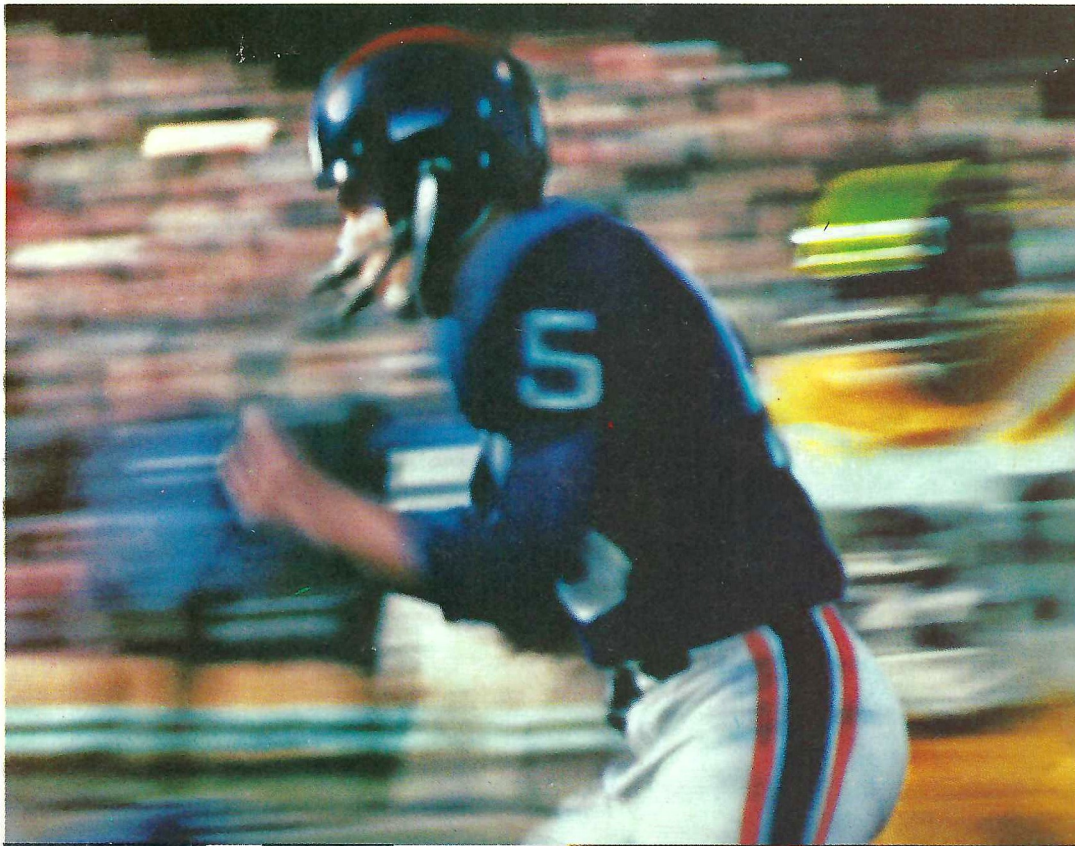
