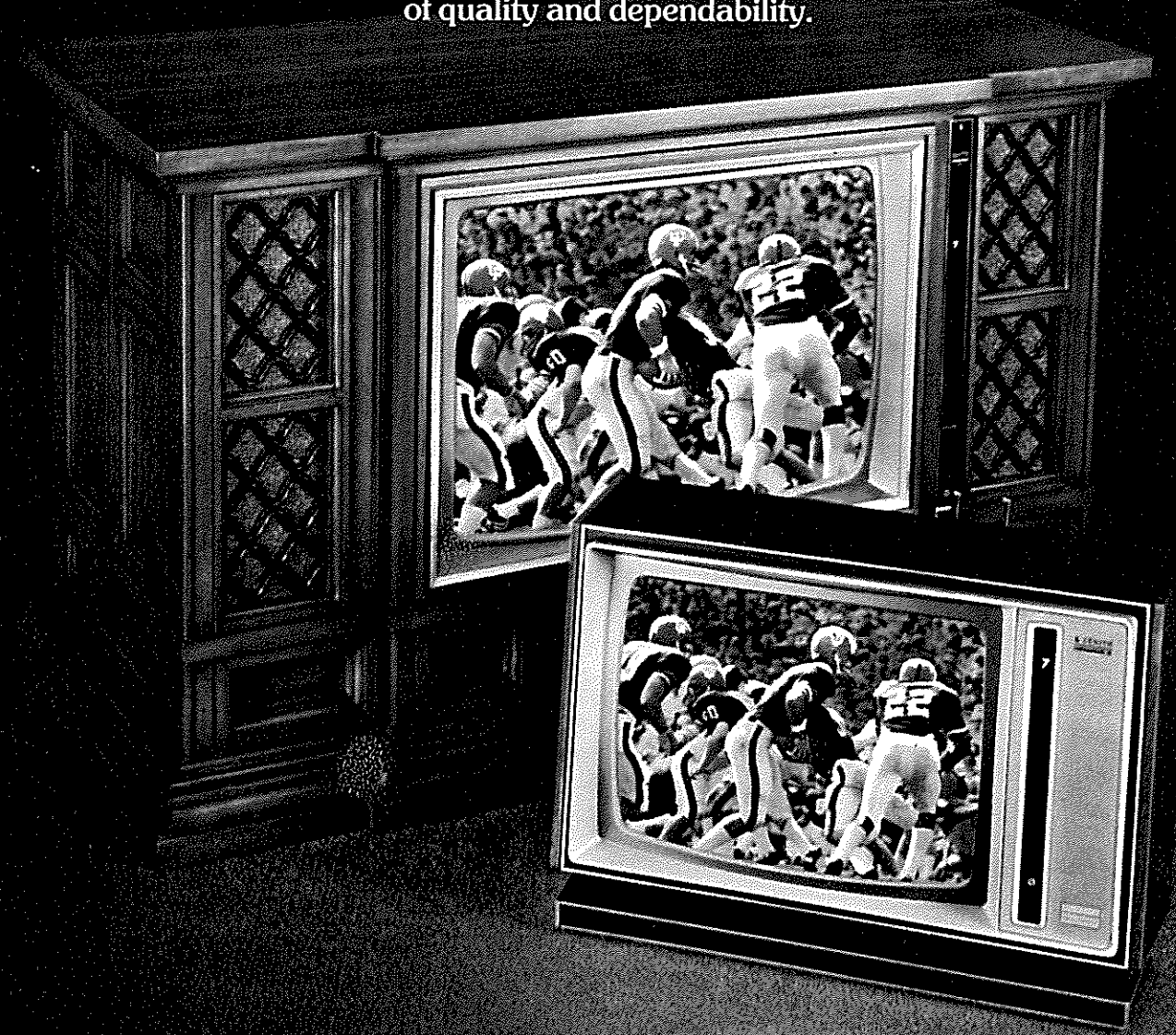

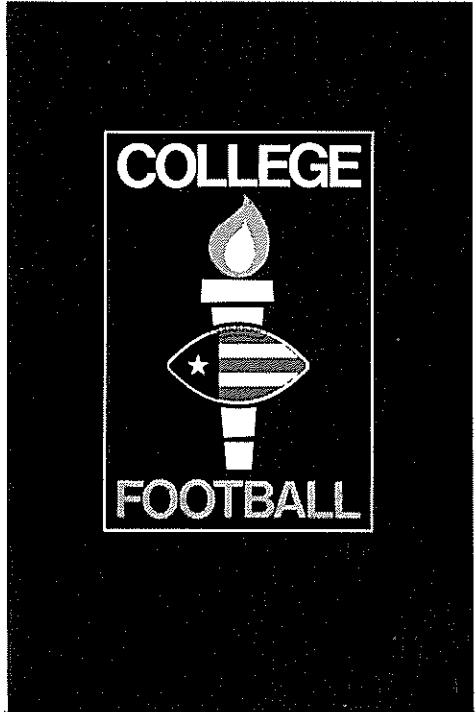
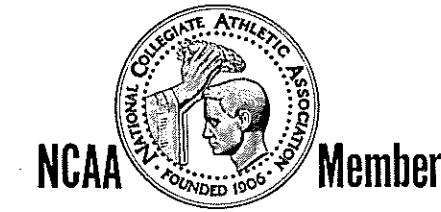

Founded in 1845 under the motto, "Pro Ecclesia, Pro Texana" (for church, for state), Baylor was born an ugly duckling at a small Texas town called Independence. But the duckling developed into a swan as Baylor emerged from a one-teacher, one-building enterprise at Independence to become the largest Baptist university in the world at Waco.

The university, Texas' oldest in continuous existence, was named after Judge Robert Emmet Bledsoe Baylor, supreme court justice of the Republic of Texas, a Kentucky native who was a veteran of the War of 1812 and member of the Kentucky Legislature before moving to Texas. Judge Baylor founded his university along with the Rev. James E. Huckins, native of New Hampshire who became principal of the first public school to be opened in Texas at Galveston; and the Rev. William M. Tryon, native of New York City who became chaplain of the Congress of the Republic of Texas.

These three men had a dream that came true—to establish a Baptist university where their children would be well-educated in a Christian tradition.

Today, Baylor is owned by the Baptist General Convention of Texas, and, of its 7,000-plus students, about 70 per cent are Baptists. It is located off Highway IH 35 on the banks of the Brazos River in Waco, a city of about 100,000 persons in Central Texas, about half the distance between Fort Worth-Dallas and Austin.

Baylor offers 16 degrees and 43 major areas of concentration. In Waco, Baylor maintains a College of Arts and Sciences and six schools: business, education, graduate, law and music. The Baylor system also operates the School of Nursing and the Medical Center in Dallas and an affiliated unit for graduate education in health care at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio.

Baylor has one of the oldest environmental studies programs in the nation. Its academic program further is enhanced by such Baylor extras as the Armstrong Browning Library, which houses an internationally famous collection of materials relating to the works of

Robert and Elizabeth Barrett Browning; the Texas Collection, among the largest collections of Texas history in existence; the Strecker Museum of Natural History, with continuous exhibitions concerning several areas of the sciences; and the Moody Memorial Library with more than 600,000 volumes.

About 100 student organizations offer the Baylorite opportunities to get involved in service, social, religious, professional and honorary capacities. Religious activities are directed through the Office of Religious Activities that sponsors the Baptist Student Union. Cultural events such as concerts and recitals sponsored by the music school; drama by the Baylor Theater; and films, rock concerts and entertainers sponsored by the Baylor Student Union, round out Baylor's social scene.

Sports at Baylor thrive. As a member of the Southwest Conference, the Bears play some exciting football in Baylor Stadium. Also offered are basketball, track, baseball, tennis, swimming, golf and others. New to the Baylor scene is the Baylor Recreation Center on the banks of the Brazos River, which offers all kinds of water sports. Plans for the marina recreational area include a golf course, swimming pool and nature trails.

Several special features of Baylor have made it unique and state-renowned. Each spring All University Sing, a grandiose musical production involving Baylor clubs, attracts packed audiences. Also in the spring, Bear Downs, an annual 50-mile bicycle race, is sponsored to raise money for scholarships by Baylor Student Foundation, an organization of students who work in the areas of public relations, student recruitment and scholarships.

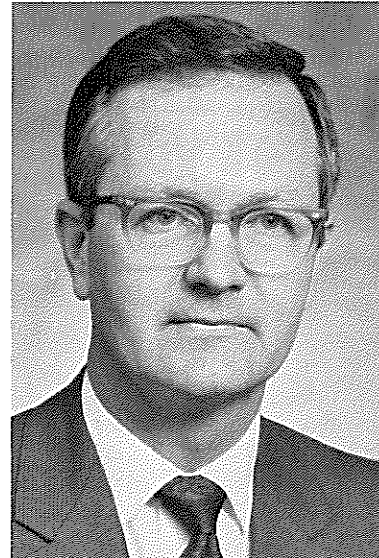
Baylor offers a lot without costing a lot. Baylor's tuition fees are among the lowest in the nation for private schools, and its financial aid program is the highest volume program in the Southwest, based on per capita enrollment. Also, Baylor employs more students in on-campus jobs than any other school in the Southwest.



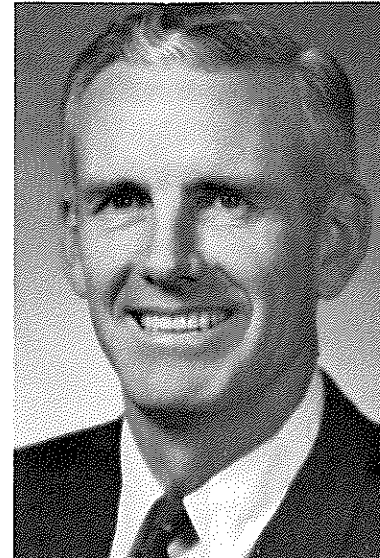

## ATHLETIC DIRECTC



Baylor Athletic Director Jack Patterson has been a busy man since returning to the campus in January, 1971 from the University of Texas where he had been "on loan" as track coach and assistant athletic director for the past eight years.

The quiet, but personable West Texas native who has put a first class label on Baylor's athletic facilities so that they are equal to the best in the South, has brought into the Baylor program a dynamic young football coach who has the Bears on the way to the top, and in general has accomplished miracles in a short time.

Patterson replaced an institution as athletic director at Baylor—the veteran Bill Henderson—after once serving the school seven seasons as track coach. He won three Southwest Conference championships for the Green and Gold, then moved to Austin where he repeated the feat at the University of Texas and served as assistant athletic director.

When the Baylor opportunity opened up, Patterson was the No. 1 choice, and he came back "home."

New and improved office facilities, new and improved athletic dining facilities, AstroTurf . . . all of these things can be attributed to the administration's plan to revitalize the athletic image under Patterson.

"Coach Pat" graduated from Rice in 1930 . . .

From "Grant Who" to the unanimous choice as Southwest Conference "Coach of the Year" in less than a year marks the progress of Baylor University's dynamic young coach who rekindled the flames of competition on the campus with pride as his theme.

Grant Garland Teaff and a dedicated coaching staff in just one season have changed Baylor's football image from one of a loser to one of a winner . . . a team that can and will compete with the best on the gridiron.

The achievement of turning a 3-28 program for the past three years into a first division finish in the Southwest Conference provided Teaff with top honors throughout the nation, but more importantly served as a notice to the athletic world that "The Bears Are Back."

Writers from all over the South have championed Teaff's achievements.

Typed Orville Henry in the Arkansas Gazette: "Baylor has no immediate discernible strengths and it has no depth in its playing squad. What the Bears are doing is playing smart, cool-headed football in an enthusiastic way. They really shouldn't beat a good team, but they encourage the other teams to beat themselves which is the foundation for all winning football."

Burle Pettit of the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal: "Teaff's first year has been anything but what his friends and advisers predicted. The Bears have been winning and the fans have been flocking to the stadium in droves. It makes one wonder just how far Grant and his youthful coaching staff may bring this situation in the years ahead. Already they've cleared the biggest hurdle. They removed almost overnight a loser's stigma that had been mounting for years."

Bob Galt, Dallas Times-Herald: "If you really want to try to squeeze blood out of a turnip, call Grant Teaff. Any guy who can have the Baylor Bears playing .500 ball six games deep into the season may be capable of just about anything. Truly amazing."

And, finally from Jim Trinkle of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram: "Basically Teaff's success at Baylor may be attributed to a couple of words. He cares."

The 39-year-old lay speaker took over as head coach at Baylor on Dec. 23, 1971 and immediately told followers of the Green and Gold that he couldn't promise them a single victory, but did vow that whenever the Bears left the field they would have put forth an effort that the alumni, students, coaches, and players themselves would be proud of.

## HEAD COACH GRANT TEAFF

He did just that. Coming into the Texas game Teaff's surprising Bears were a Cotton Bowl contender and through three quarters of that contest, they had visions of the big win. Then Texas muscle came through for a narrow victory, but a stadium record of 48,394 fans stood and cheered on the rejuvenation of a fighting team.

When the curtain came down on the 1972 season Teaff's team had posted a 5-6 record, the best at Baylor since 1966. Not bad for a team picked to go winless.

Doing the unexpected is Grant Teaff's trademark. At 25 he was the youngest head coach in the nation at McMurry College, his alma mater. When he left to become recruiting coordinator and end coach at Texas Tech, McMurry was nobody's pushover. After three-year tenure at Lubbock, Teaff was chosen to rejuvenate the program at Angelo State University where he had played when it was known as San Angelo College. He immediately came up with two 6-4 seasons and capped it off with a 7-3 including an upset win over defending national champion Texas A&I when Baylor called.

In the first nine months of Teaff's tenure he traveled some 50,000 miles, spoke "eyeball to eyeball" to some 50,000 persons in 183 appearances, not counting radio, television and newspaper interviews. He was in pulpits throughout the South as a Baptist lay speaker . . . he spoke to grade school groups . . . Baylor social clubs . . . wherever he could further the cause of Baylor University.

"I felt a tremendous love for Baylor University. Being Baptist, Baylor was always foremost in my mind, and I want to contribute to the entire university, not just the football program."

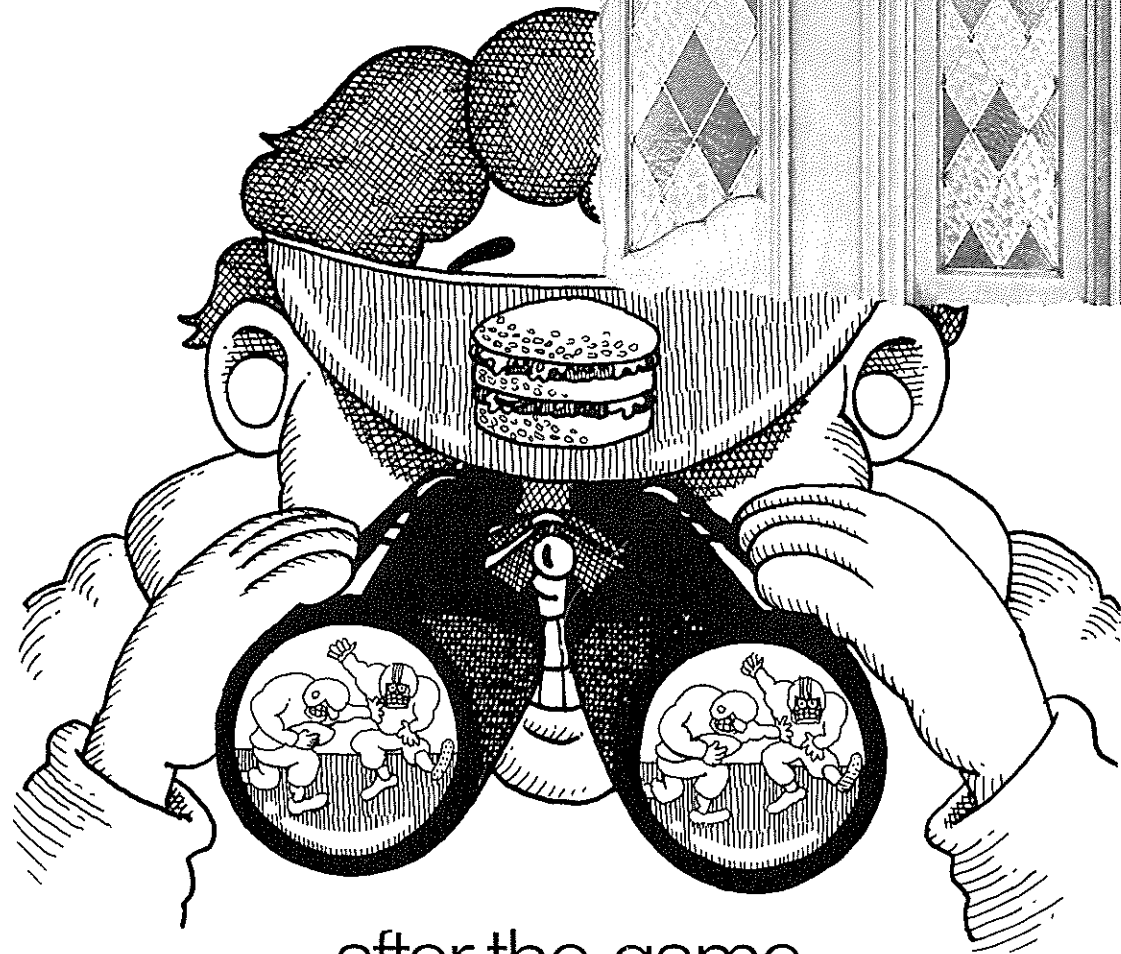
"Baylor University is a great university. It has great tradition. It is unique unto itself. There is no reason in the world Baylor University cannot compete on the gridiron just as it does in the academic world."

Teaff was an outstanding athlete at Snyder High School, being awarded the Carl Herod trophy his senior year. He played two years of junior college ball at San Angelo College, then was an All-Texas Conference linebacker at McMurry. Upon graduation he was assistant coach at Tom S. Lubbock High in Lubbock one season, then returned to his alma mater as assistant football coach and head track coach.

Teaff is married to former Texas Tech cheerleader Donell Phillips of Plainview. The couple have three daughters, Tammy 15, Tracy 12, and Layne 7.

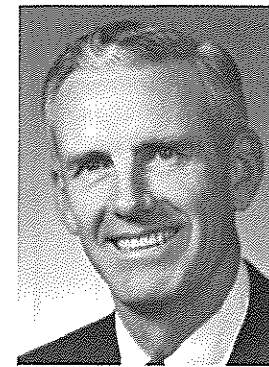

West Texas. He moved to San Angelo for three years during which the school won the state championship in football. He then returned to Merkel as coach of all sports in 1944 and one year later went to the University of Houston where he had a successful 11-year tenure as track coach and football aide. His sprint relay teams won national acclaim and in 1956 he was called to Baylor to head up the track program.

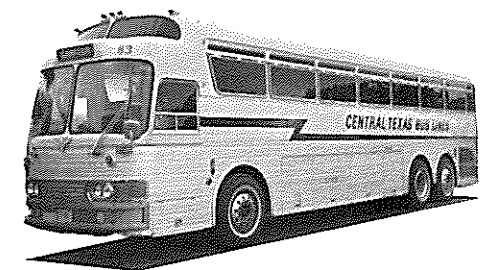
During his first Waco stay Patterson's teams established 38 school records and captured three SWC crowns. He moved to Texas in 1963 and won his first title there in 1966. He closed out his coaching career with back-to-back championships in 1968 and 1969.

"I don't guess I'll ever get completely away from the field," Patterson said when he accepted the athletic director's position. "But, I can still glory in the work that my associates are doing and hope that by working together we can restore the Green and Gold to its rightful place in the athletic world."

In a short time Patterson has made great strides. But, to those who have known him for any length of time, this was no surprise. He's always been a champion.

Patterson is married to the former Lois Whiteley and points with pride at his two children, Mrs. David Sibley of Dallas and Dr. Jack C. Patterson, a dentist stationed with the Air Force at Langley AFB, Va. . . and a young grandson, Jack C. Patterson III.

## Academic and Athletic Scholarship Program

*Baylor University's future progress depends to a great extent upon the success of its athletic program. A school without an interesting, successful athletic program declines in enrollment and in interest of its ex-students.*

From a financial standpoint Baylor has the most disadvantageous position of any school in the Southwest Conference, because of (1) small area population (2) low per capita income (3) high tuition (4) it is surrounded closely by other Conference and pro teams. The cost of operating a major college athletic program is over 10 times as much as it was in 1940, only 31 years ago.

*Under the Baylor Stadium agreement, it is impossible for the Baylor athletic department to make a profit, because all excess income goes to retire stadium bonds which will not mature until 1980.*

Over the past ten years the income from Baylor's Academic-Athletic Scholarship program has kept the Baylor athletic department from having sizeable deficits. Without this scholarship program, we would have to cut back all of our athletic program drastically and probably would cease to be athletically of major college caliber.

*The income from this scholarship program amounts to what we would make from two bowl games. Regular season ticket sales will not come close to paying the freight!*

In order that these scholarships may conform to the purpose intended, to recognize qualities in academics, leadership, character and athletic ability, only 68 athletes a year are provided these awards. However, with constantly increasing athletic costs, we do not wish to limit the number of scholarships donated by Baylor friends and Exes. The scholarships are \$1,000 each, but actual cost of athletic scholarships is nearly \$2,250 yearly.

Scholarship pledges less than \$1,000, or the \$1,000 scholarships in excess of 68, will be assigned to miscellaneous Academic-Athletic Scholarship donations, income which will make up the difference between \$1,000 and the actual scholarship cost.

## Placing Emphasis On the Student-Athlete

All grants under the Baylor Academic-Athletic Scholarship Program are based on scholarship, character, leadership and athletic ability. The grants are awarded by a faculty scholarship committee of Baylor University.

The Baylor Academic-Athletic Scholarship Program is a cooperative endeavor which gives business and professional men, ex-students and friends of Baylor University an opportunity to provide a college education for worthy young men who qualify scholastically and participate in athletics. A faculty scholarship committee administers the program. This committee prescribes regulations under which the program is administered, including the selection of candidates and the awarding of scholarships.

The scholarship shall not exceed the maximum benefits permitted by the Southwest Athletic Conference and shall be renewed each year or until the student has completed his undergraduate program, provided he continues to meet all requirements.

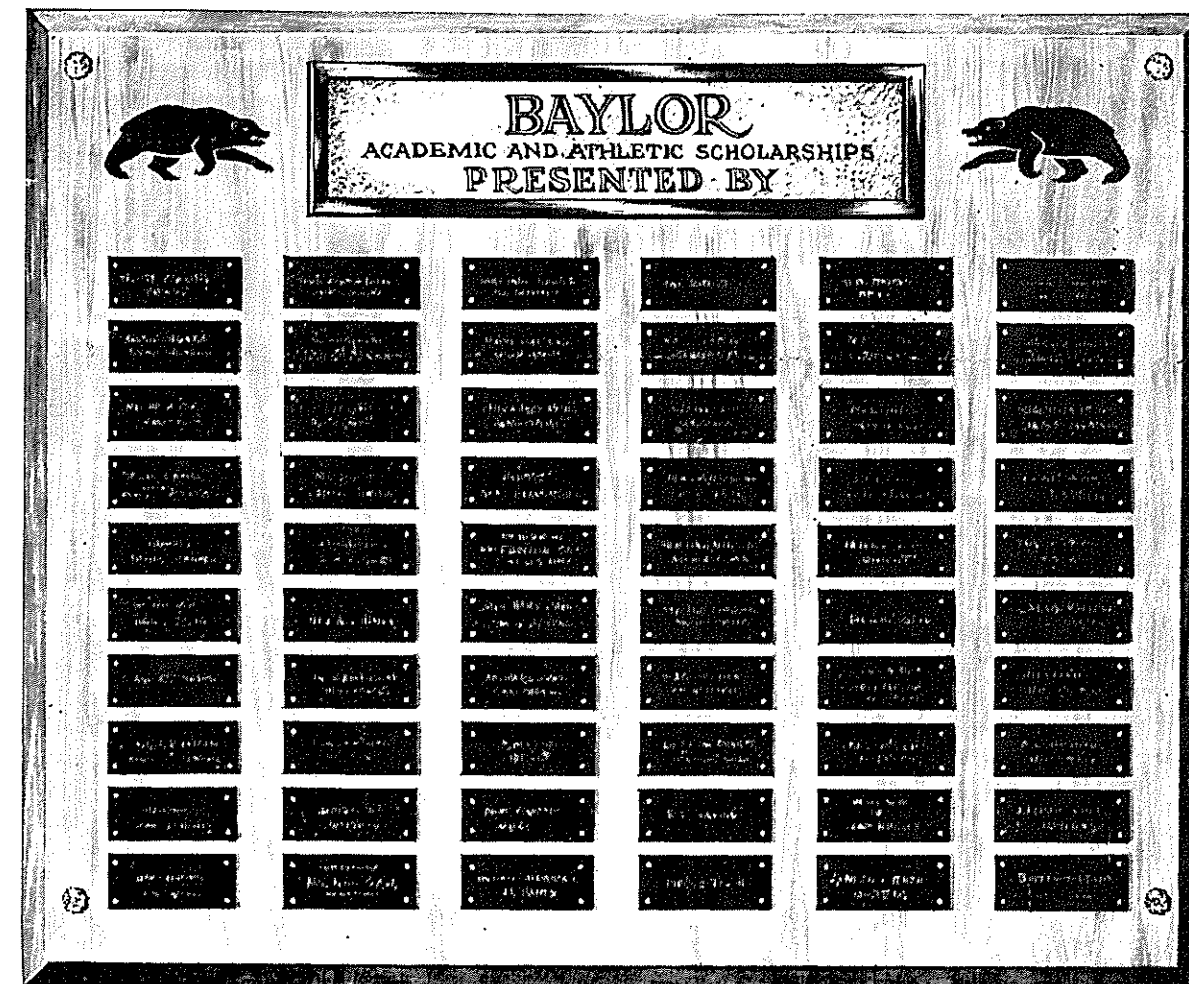
Baylor University's athletes who are placed on the Baylor Academic-Athletic Scholarship list not only have first earned their places through scholastic achievement, the honor also has inspired the great majority of these student-athletes to achieve further scholastic improvement to the point where the average grade of these student-athletes is at least equal to the scholastic level of virtually any similar group in the University.

The Baylor Academic-Athletic Scholarships, sponsored through the loyalty of many ex-students and other friends of Baylor, also have proven to be a financial boom to the growing Baylor athletic budget.

Some of the University's finest scholars are athletes who are enrolled in this program.

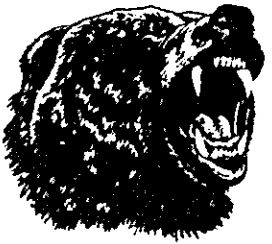

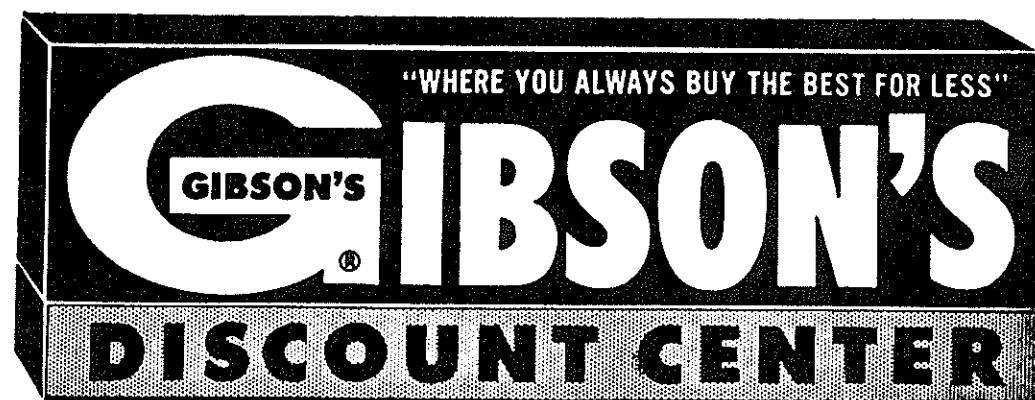

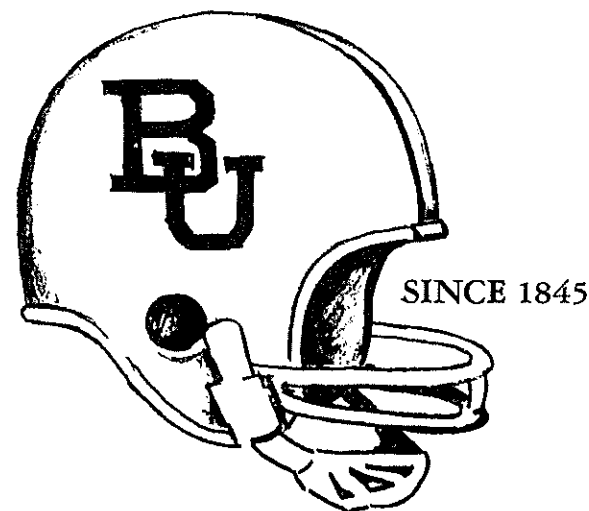

## TEAFF'S COACHING STAFF

### PAT CULPEPPER

Defensive Coordinator

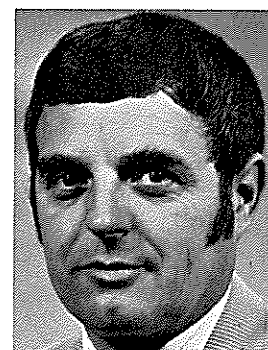


John Patrick Culpepper lives, eats and drinks defense, so it was no surprise to Southwest Conference followers last season when the Baylor Bears wound up the third-ranked group in the league despite an inheritance of few battle-tested performers. The fiery Culpepper, who made several All-America selections at the University of Texas despite physical credentials more adapted to a halfback, was a motivating factor in the development of All-America Roger Goree in 1972 and David Jones, Sports Illustrated's Player of the Week in 1970. Culpepper was retained from the previous Baylor coaching staff, and was immediately placed in charge of the defense by new mentor Grant Teaff. Culpepper has done nothing to indicate a failing in the selection.

Married to the former Martha Edith Commagere of New Orleans, Pat came to Baylor from the University of Colorado where he was in charge of linebackers and defensive ends. Previously he had worked under the late Jim Pittman at Tulane and Darrell Royal at the University of Texas. During his undergraduate days Culpepper received the prestigious Earl Blaik and Swede Nelson awards. The Cleburne native played in the Bluebonnet Bowl against Alabama in 1960 and in the Cotton Bowl in 1961 and 1962. The Culpeppers have two children, Connie, 4, and John Patrick III, who was born March 24, 1972. Culpepper recruits in the Houston area.

### GEORGE KIRK

Offensive Coordinator



George Kirk was one of the most successful high school coaches in the state of Texas when he joined Grant Teaff's Baylor program as offensive coordinator. Since then he has turned a mediocre offense into a well-polished scoring machine to the extent that he has been offered a myriad of jobs... pro, college and high school. However, his loyalty to Teaff has kept him in Waco where he is an established member of the community.

As a high school head coach at Cameron, Littlefield and Amarillo Palo Duro Kirk posted a most impressive record, 67-27-5.

When Teaff named the ex-high school mentor to the important position of offensive coordinator, eyebrows were lifted. But Kirk came through in the manner Teaff knew he would, and in this year's spring game, a total of 72 points were tacked on the scoreboard along with over 1,000 yards total offense.

Kirk, 42, is a native of Littlefield. He spent one year at New Mexico Western, then transferred to McMurry where he played center-linebacker in 1951. He spent the next four years in the Air Force and received his degree from TCU in 1956. He later got his M.A. from Baylor in 1960. He was assistant coach at Fort Worth Diamond Hill in 1956, then moved to Temple as assistant to Jay Fikes. He was named head coach at Cameron in 1963 and posted a 22-8-3 record there. In 1966 he went home as head coach at Littlefield and had a 9-2 record and a bi-district championship. In 1967 he went to Palo Duro. Kirk is married to Baylor-ex Barbara Stephens of Slaton. The couple has a daughter, Renee, a junior at Baylor. Recruits in Panhandle.

### FRANCIS (Cotton) DAVIDSON

Quarterbacks, Receivers



Coach Grant Teaff hit the jackpot when he reached into the professional ranks to lure Francis (Cotton) Davidson to his Baylor staff. Not only did he get a man with vast college and professional playing experience, but one sought then (and now) as a pro coach. And, the bonus was that Davidson was a former Baylor star with ties to the alumni and supporters.

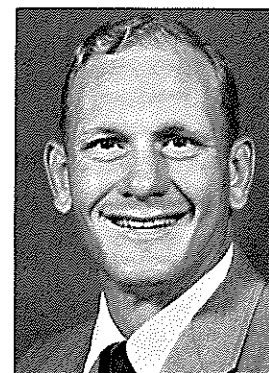
The 41-year-old Gatesville native was credited with the development of sophomore quarterback Neal Jeffrey last season and a passing attack that kept defenders honest.

Davidson declined an opportunity to remain with the Oakland Raiders as offensive coach to return to Baylor where he had previously been a member of John Bridgers' staff.

Davidson was an all-state quarterback who was redshirted at Baylor in 1950, then was a defensive starter in 1951. The next two years he was the starting quarterback, completing 127 of 312 passes for 1871 yards and 11 touchdowns. He was co-captain of the West team in the Shrine East-West classic and played in the College All-Star game. He was the number one draft choice of the Baltimore Colts and started three games as a rookie in 1957 as alternate behind Johnny Unitas. He went to the Canadian League and played one year before injuring a shoulder and in 1959 came to Baylor where he helped John Bridgers install the Colt offense. In 1960 he joined the Dallas Texans and made the all-star team and was voted the all-star game's most valuable player. He went to Oakland in 1962 and made the 1963 all-star team. He remained active until reinjuring his shoulder in 1966 and finished out his career as player coach and scout. He is married to Baylor-ex Carolyn Mabry. The couple has two sons, Tommy, 16, and Ty 9, and two daughters, Kelly, 15, and Tracy, 12. Recruits in Central Texas area.

### BILL HICKS

Defensive Line



The son of a Baptist minister, a former Baylor All-Southwest Conference center and academic All-America, William Douglas (Bill) Hicks is right at home as defensive line coach for Grant Teaff.

The 33-year-old Arkansas native who was named center on the "All 1960's" decade team at Baylor has known nothing but success as a player and coach. His Little Rock Central High School team had a 33-game winning streak when he was the all-state center and he was all-SWC in 1959, 1960 and 1961 for the Bruins. After graduation Hicks spent two years as assistant coach for the freshman team as a graduate student, then went to Texas A&I where he was a varsity assistant until 1966 when he joined Jim Carlen's West Virginia staff. In 1969 he was brought back to Baylor by Bill Beall and was one of three holdovers retained by Teaff when he took over.

Hicks played in the 1960 Gator Bowl and the 1961 Gotham Bowl and in the North-South All-Star game after his senior year. Married to the former Iris Neill of Midland, Hicks has four children, Janie, 8, Doug, 6, Wendy, 3, and Clint, born April 14, 1972. Recruits in Central-South Texas area.

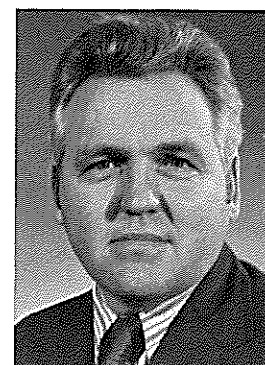

### BILL LANE

Defensive Ends



Defensive end coach Bill Lane believes in Grant Teaff and Baylor University. He believes to the extent that when Teaff left Angelo State University to take the Bruin position, he recommended Lane as his successor. Lane was offered the job, but declined to follow Teaff, "a man I can work for every day and feel that I don't have to compromise a thing."

The 40-year-old Denison native is the second member of Teaff's team to wear a Balfour ring symbolic of winning a state championship in the rugged Texas high school ranks. His 1968 Daingerfield team won the Class AA title before he joined Teaff in the rebuilding job at Angelo State. His record the last three years at Daingerfield was an impressive 37-5.

A former all-district lineman at Denison, Lane played two years at San Angelo College then went to Stephen F. Austin where he picked up two letters. He was assistant at Daingerfield seven years and was head coach five years. He is married to the former Barbara Stanfield of Tyler and the father of two sons, Kirk, 15, and Kyle, 10. Recruits in Dallas-East Texas area.

### BILL SCOGGINS

Freshman Coach



If Bill Scoggins ever decided to change careers, the lanky West Texas native would be a sure hit in the entertainment world where his homespun stories might push Jerry Clower for prominence.

However, coaching is in Bill Scoggins' blood and the 44-year-old ex-Howard Payne College All-America is most effective working with freshman recruits whom he fathers and counsels.

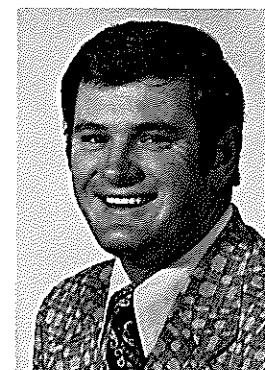
Scoggins made his mark in the high school coaching ranks where his 1971 Sonora club was state Class A co-champion. Before Scoggins could get through shaking

hands of his proud townsmen, Teaff called him and offered him a position at Baylor and he accepted.

### JOHN O'HARA

Tight Ends



John B. O'Hara, 29-year-old former offensive coordinator at Midland Lee High School is the latest addition to Coach Grant Teaff's staff, moving into his new responsibility in mid-July.

O'Hara is in charge of tight ends and serves as assistant to offensive line coach Bill Yung.

"When the vacancy came up, I immediately started looking for an outstanding young coach who would be an asset to our program, both off and on the field, and I believe that I came up with a real find in John O'Hara," Teaff said. "He is an outstanding coach, a strong

worker in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and the kind of young man who will fit in well with our staff."

O'Hara is a native of Elk City, Okla., where he was an all-state center-linebacker. Recruiting Coordinator



Mickey Sullivan made All-America at Baylor University as a baseball player (he still holds the Southwest Conference batting record of .554), was an outstanding football player, was a successful high school coach . . . and now is regarded as one of the top recruiters in the nation.

The 41-year-old Houston native was retained from the previous Baylor staff and put in charge of recruiting. This past season the Bears signed three of the 12 "blue chips" in the state and garnered a fine crop of Jucos.

Sullivan was a top running back on the 1951 Orange Bowl team, and compiled an illustrious high school coaching career before coming back to Baylor. He was assistant coach at Houston Bellaire in 1960 and 1961 and at Houston Westbury from 1962 to 1965 before getting the head coaching job at Bellaire. He won three consecutive district titles and compiled a 41-12-1 record before returning to Baylor in 1969. 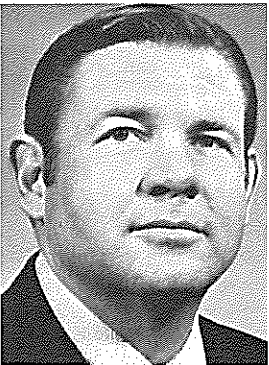

He immediately started preaching "Pride" and went about altering techniques. The persistent effort paid off and at the end of the first campaign, Teaff had an offensive line that was the talk of the league.

Yung came to Baylor from Grand Prairie where he wound up a high school coaching career with a won-loss record of 48-20-4. A former Ranger High all-district tackle, Yung was a redshirt at TCU in 1952. He lettered the next three years at guard and was a member of the 1956 Cotton Bowl team. In 1956 he served as associate freshman coach at TCU, then was line coach under Chuck Curtis from 1964 through 1967 when the team won one state championship. He was head coach at Grand Prairie in 1968 and in 1969 won district. He had formerly been coach at Coleman in 1960, winning the regional championship. He was also player-coach at Fort Sill while in the service. Married to the former Esther Peters, Yung is the father of two children, Martin, 13, and Cindy, 11. Recruits in Dallas-Fort Worth area.

Head Athletic Trainer

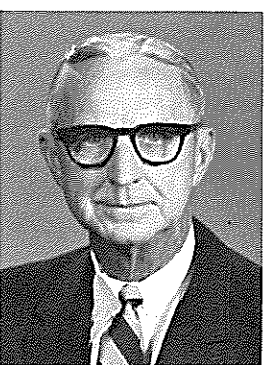

The personable, pencil-thin former Texas high school coaching great previously served as freshman coach for nine seasons.

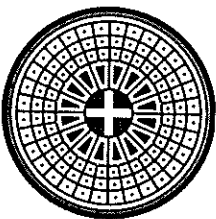
Catfish really needs no introduction to Texas sports fans. He was a legend as a high school mentor at Carey, Borger, Longview and Mt. Vernon and posted 26 straight wins over a three-year period. At Carey his basketball team won the state championship and Catfish is one of the few men who ever went undefeated in an entire high school basketball season, achieving this feat at Mt. Vernon in 1948 as they won the state title. In 1947 his Mt. Vernon football team was also undefeated.

Smith is a past president of the Texas High School Coaches Association and was honored as coach of the year in 1953 by the Texas Sports Writers Association.

# NCAA Reorganizes Itself into Three Divisions

Some folks think the National Collegiate Athletic Association's reorganization into three divisions is much like ordering from a menu in a Chinese restaurant—with One you get football; or with Two you may choose one from Division I.

Actually, the NCAA remains the same—only the names have been changed.

The Constitution remains a single document, applicable to all members. The reorganization allows for each division to adopt amendments to the Bylaws applicable only to that specific division without the approval of any other division.

Each NCAA member institution will select its division through self-determination, except in the sport of football, in which Division I membership will consist of those 126 institutions currently classified as "major" by the Football Statistics and Classification Committee.

Self-determination is a key phrase. Many think that Division I membership is restricted to those 126 "major" teams. However, an institution may classify itself Division I in all sports other than football. Fordham University would be a prime example. Its program, except football, is Division I. Its football team is classified Division III.

## To Each His Own

The members of each division may establish criteria for membership in that division subsequent to self-determination.

An institution in Division II or III may elect to participate in Division I in one sport, other than football or basketball, and must abide by the Division I Bylaws which govern the sport in question, even though the institution's membership rests in another division. An example could be Pan American University, which could have an overall Division II program, but could elect to participate in Division I in baseball, its strongest program.

There are numerous other examples, also, and it's possible that some institutions could compete in all three divisions in different sports. An institution's football team could be classified Division III, it could self-determine Division II for its overall program, and still choose Division I for one sport.

No matter what division an institution competes in, it will have a much

better opportunity to compete in a National Collegiate Championship event.

The NCAA will sponsor a minimum of 39 National Championships by the 1975-76 year with at least 10 Championships in each of the three divisions.

Only one National Championship will be conducted in the sports of fencing, hockey, skiing, indoor track, volleyball and water polo. All member institutions are eligible to compete in the above Championships under eligibility rules of the division they elect for their overall program through 1975-76. After that, the member institution and its individual athletes must be eligible under the governing legislation for the division conducting the championship.

Each of the three divisions will have National Championship competition in the sports of baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming, tennis, outdoor track and field and wrestling.

In addition, Divisions II and III will have a National Championship tournament in football.

Gymnastics and lacrosse championships will be sponsored in Divisions I and II and members of Division III will be eligible for the Division II championship in these sports.

In individual events, certain place winners from Division II and III championships who meet the qualifying standards will be eligible to compete in Division I competition, providing such individuals have met all academic and eligibility requirements of Division I, including academic standards for initial participation. For example, the top five finishers in the Division II and Division III cross country championships will be eligible to compete in the Division I championship.

## Movement Possible

An institution may change its division membership by petitioning the NCAA Council if it meets the established criteria for membership in the division it wishes to be transferred to.

The Council itself will be restructured to give each division representation.

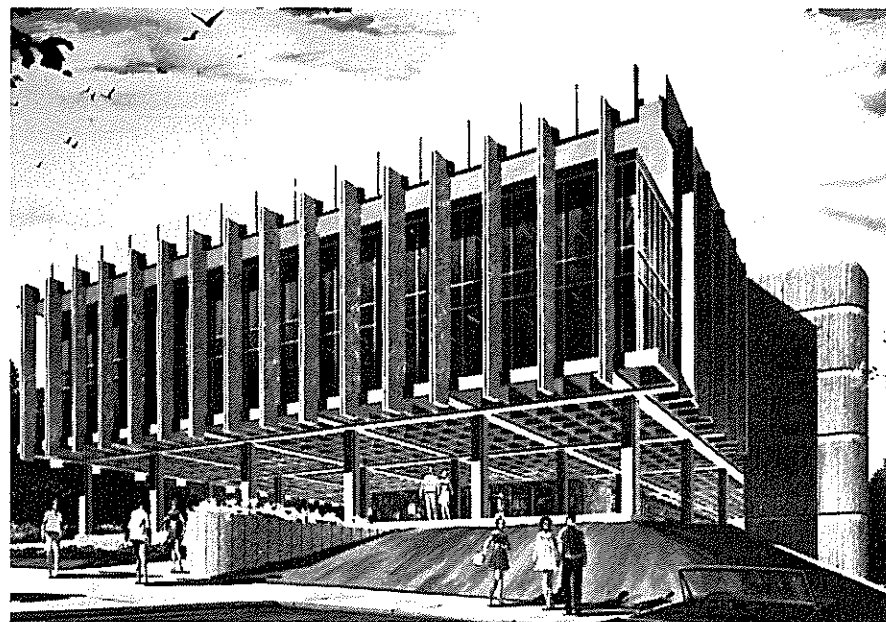
The Council will retain its 16-member make-up, but each NCAA District shall have a vice-president and eight vice-presidents will be elected at-large.

Among the 16 vice-presidents, eight will be from Division I members and four each will come from Divisions II and III. The president and secretary-treasurer will be ex officio members of the Council, as they currently are, and they may be elected from any division.

The Executive Committee will also be restructured with five members being elected from Division I and three from Divisions II and III with each division being represented by at least one member.

All standing committees of the NCAA will be evaluated with a view towards providing representation to each division where appropriate. Specifically, each of the three divisions shall be represented on all rules committees. This will be accomplished after the Association's 68th annual Convention in January in San Francisco, where the implementing legislation will be presented.

The reorganization plan was considered to be a vital course of action for the NCAA. "It will enable our members to enact rules which pertain to their own competition," said NCAA President Alan J. Chapman. "It will make the NCAA an even more valuable force in intercollegiate athletics."

## NEW BASKETBALL ERA OPENS AT BAYLOR

Fast-break Baylor Basketball '74 opens under the dynamic leadership of Head Coach Carroll Dawson and new assistant Jim Haller on December 1 with four starters returning from last year's entry that posted a 14-11 record.

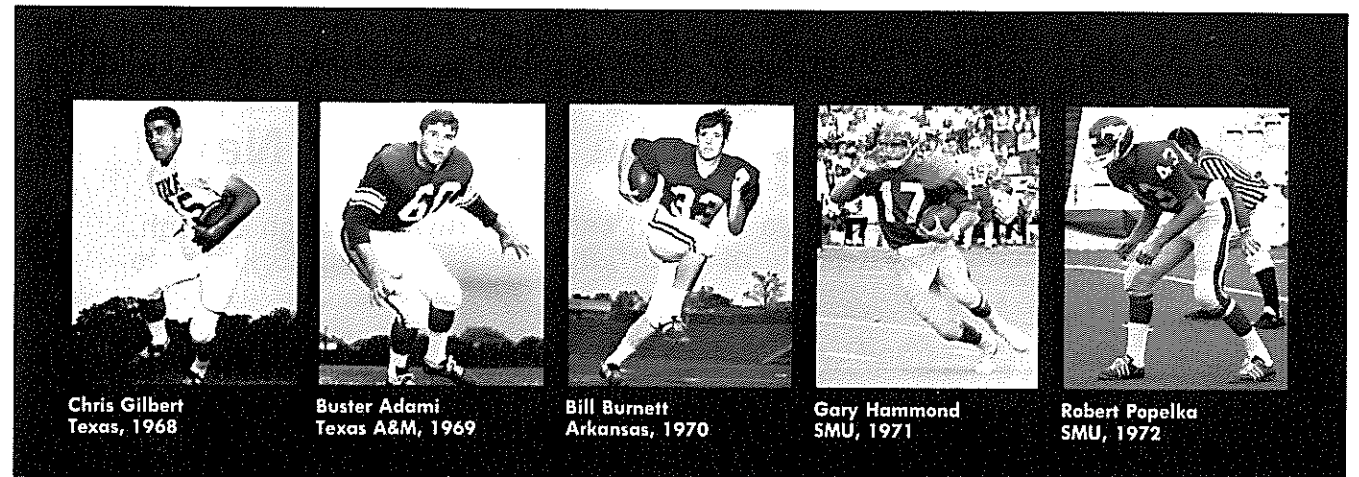
Dawson takes over the helm after a 10-year tenure as assistant to the now-retired Bill Menefee and went into the junior college ranks to lure defensive expert Haller across town to the Baylor staff. Haller, in his first year as head man at McLennan Community (Jr.) College, took his youngsters to the national juco tournament to rank as one of the fast-rising young stars in the basketball coaching field.

Returnees include 6-4 Jerry Ahart of Edwardsville, Ill., who scored 505 points last year, the third best in Baylor cage history; 6-6 Charlie McKinney of San Antonio, the team's leading rebounder with 287 who hit for 424 points and started the fast-break last season; fiery guard Steve Dallas of Long Beach, Calif., who scored 126 points and was the defensive mainstay; and Lee Griffin, 6-6 who contributed a mighty 353 points and 144 rebounds to the cause. Others returning are 6-5 Mark Wattier of Fort Worth, 6-5 James Weaver of Waco, 5-10 Buddy Carlisle of Clear Creek and 6-0 Mike Luce of San Antonio.

Dawson, long recognized as one of the premier recruiters in the Southwest, came up with five big ones who could contribute to the cause in a big way. These include Dallas Kimball All-America Gary McGuire, 6-10, who had a career total of 2,504 joints and 2,013 rebounds and hit an impressive 62 per cent field goal accuracy; 6-8½ Lom Hutchison of San Antonio Roosevelt who had a 17.2 point mark and a 14.4 rebound average while being voted the most valuable cager in the city; Billy Carlisle, 6-3 blue chipper from Clear Creek and the brother to the varsity's Buddy Carlisle with a 20.6 scoring mark and a 7.6 rebound average; John Coulter, 6-1 ace from Arlington, Tx., High who had a 16.7 scoring mark and an 8.0 rebound average while being voted the most valuable player in the district; and the lone out-of-stater, 6-7 Jeff Miller, all-metro forward from Parkway West High School in St. Louis, who had an 18.8 scoring mark and a 12.3 rebound average while being voted the most valuable player in his district.

"I think we have a good balance between veterans and newcomers and enough talent to become highly-competitive this season," Dawson predicts. "We will be a running ball club and I think that
