



Florida State University is a study in contrasts, its palm trees and oaks shading charming old buildings with Gothic spires and striking contemporary structures of brick and steel.


Its history dates back to 1857, when the state legislature named it the Seminary West of the Suwanee. Later it became Florida State College for Women but in 1947, that venerable institution became coeducational Florida State University and a growth spurt started that hasn't stopped yet. Enrollment this year has topped 21,000.

The University has a total population larger than many towns. Add the staff of over 7,100 employes, including some 1,300 faculty members and you have a nearly 30,000 members of an active, vital community.

Contract and grant expenditures for 1974-75 for research and training at Florida State amounted to \$17,285,000. The University has an operating

MEMPHIS STATE UNIVERSITY

During its six and one half decades of service to the Mid-South area, Memphis State University has grown from a rural teachers college to a nationally respected institution offering major study in 82 different areas.

More than 22,500 students are enrolled for courses on the highly developed campus and they represent almost every state in the United States as well as more than 45 foreign countries. Degrees ranging from the associate of arts in nursing to the doctor of philosophy are available.

Founded in 1912, Memphis State University is comprised of a College of Arts and Sciences, a College of Business Administration, a College of Education, The Herff College of Engineering, the School of Law, the Graduate School and the Division of Continuing Studies.

With a total land area of 1,100 acres, the University extends to four separate locations. A 640-acre forest farm houses biology field stations and a retreat area for conferences to the northwest, while Chucalissa Indian Village, a local tourist attraction and archaeological field site, is located in southwest Shelby County. The University also operates the Memphis Speech and Hearing Center in the

mid-town medical center. The main campus, now in the heart of the city, comprises 150 acres.

Memphis State was founded in 1912 as West Tennessee State Normal School. It became West Tennessee State Teachers College in 1925 and Memphis State College in 1941. University status was granted by the legislature in 1957.
