The University



With over a century of service to the people of North Carolina and the world, N.C. State University is a national leader in education. Situated in a beautiful area of the capital city, N.C. State provides its students with everything necessary for a productive, enlightening and enjoyable collegiate experience.

Founded in 1887 as the state's first land-grant university, N.C. State continues a tradition of excellence in undergraduate teaching. N.C. State offers the advantages of studying at one of the nation's leading research universities, whose graduates are working throughout the United States as scientists, engineers, teachers, agricultural experts, business men and women, accountants, physicians, veterinarians and professionals in many other fields.

With an enrollment of more than 27,000 students, N.C. State is the largest university in North Carolina. The main campus, comprised of 623 acres, is located amid the tall pines and large oaks of Raleigh, the capital of North Carolina. The state's first veterinary school is located nearby on a 182-acre campus. The university's facilities are supplemented by 88,000 acres of research farms and forests across the state.

In the next 20 years, N.C. State will double its size with the development of the new 1,000-acre Centennial Campus. Plans for the campus, with beautiful Lake Raleigh at its center, envision a bold new model for universities everywhere. The Centennial Campus will be an academic city consisting of research laboratories, classrooms, residences, conference facilities, libraries and recreational areas.

N.C. State offers 81 bachelor of arts and science degree programs, 77 master's and 48 doctoral degree programs. The university is organized into 10 colleges and schools—Agricultural and Life Sciences, Design, Education and Psychology, Engineering, Forest Resources, Humanities and Social Sciences (liberal arts), Physical and Mathematical Sciences, Textiles, Veterinary Medicine and the Graduate School.

The University's students come from over 80 foreign countries, all 50 states and each of the 100 North Carolina counties. There are over 17,500 undergraduate students, 3,900 graduate students, and 4,100 Lifelong Education students.

NCSU enjoys one of the best teacher-student ratios in the country at 1-14, proving the university's commitment to individualized education.

Campus life and extracurricular activities make up an important part of the university experience, and N.C. State offers a wealth of programs that make college life stimulating and enjoyable. One such organization is Student Government, where many students gain valuable political and organizational skills. For those students with interests in the communications field, NCSU has several publications such as the student newspaper and yearbook, as well as the campus radio station.

For those students with musical inclinations N.C. State offers more than a dozen musical organizations including the Wolfpack Marching Band, brass bands, symphonic orchestras, choral groups and the Pep Band. Professional theater, musical and dance performances are also held on the campus each year, as well as student productions.

There are 24 social fraternities at N.C. State, 21 of which provide housing, and seven sororities, four of which provide housing. Students may also become involved with service-oriented fraternities.

The University is also the home of the nationally known Wolfpack athletic teams. N.C. State fields 13 varsity sports for men and 10 for women. The men's basketball team has won a pair of National Championships, one in 1974 and the second in 1983, when the "Team of Destiny" captured the attention and hearts of the country enroute to the dramatic title. The basketball squad has also won 10 ACC titles. The Pack football team has been the Atlantic Coast Conference champion five times, co-champion twice, and State has been to 14 bowl games, including five in the past six years.

Because of its location in the capital city and its proximity to the internationally renowned Research Triangle Park, many businesses have come to the area in order to take advantage of the university's research programs and qualified graduates. The return is tremendous as N.C. State ranks fifth nationwide in industry-sponsored research.

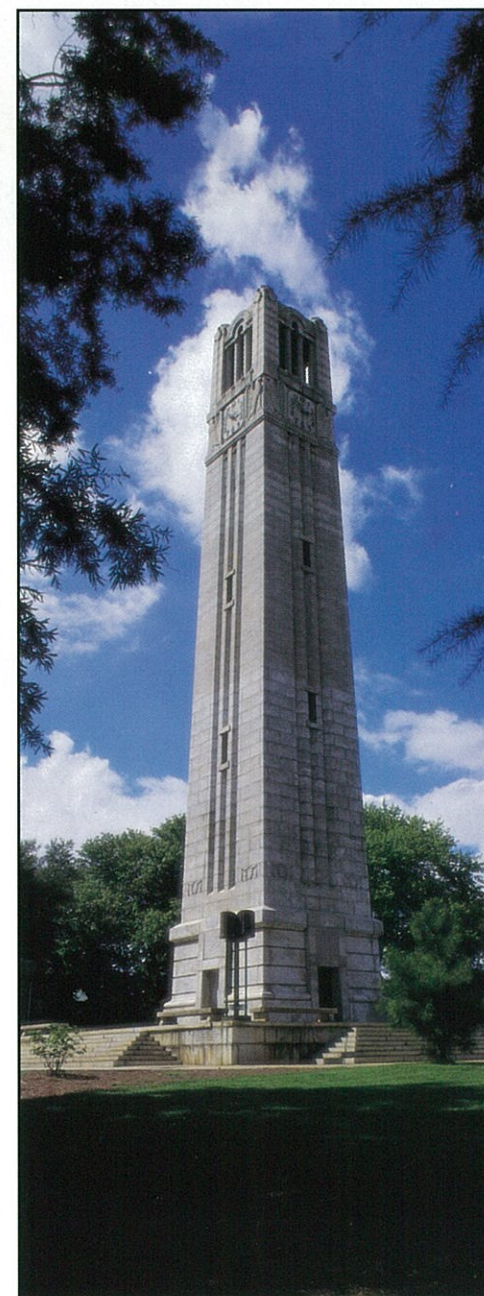

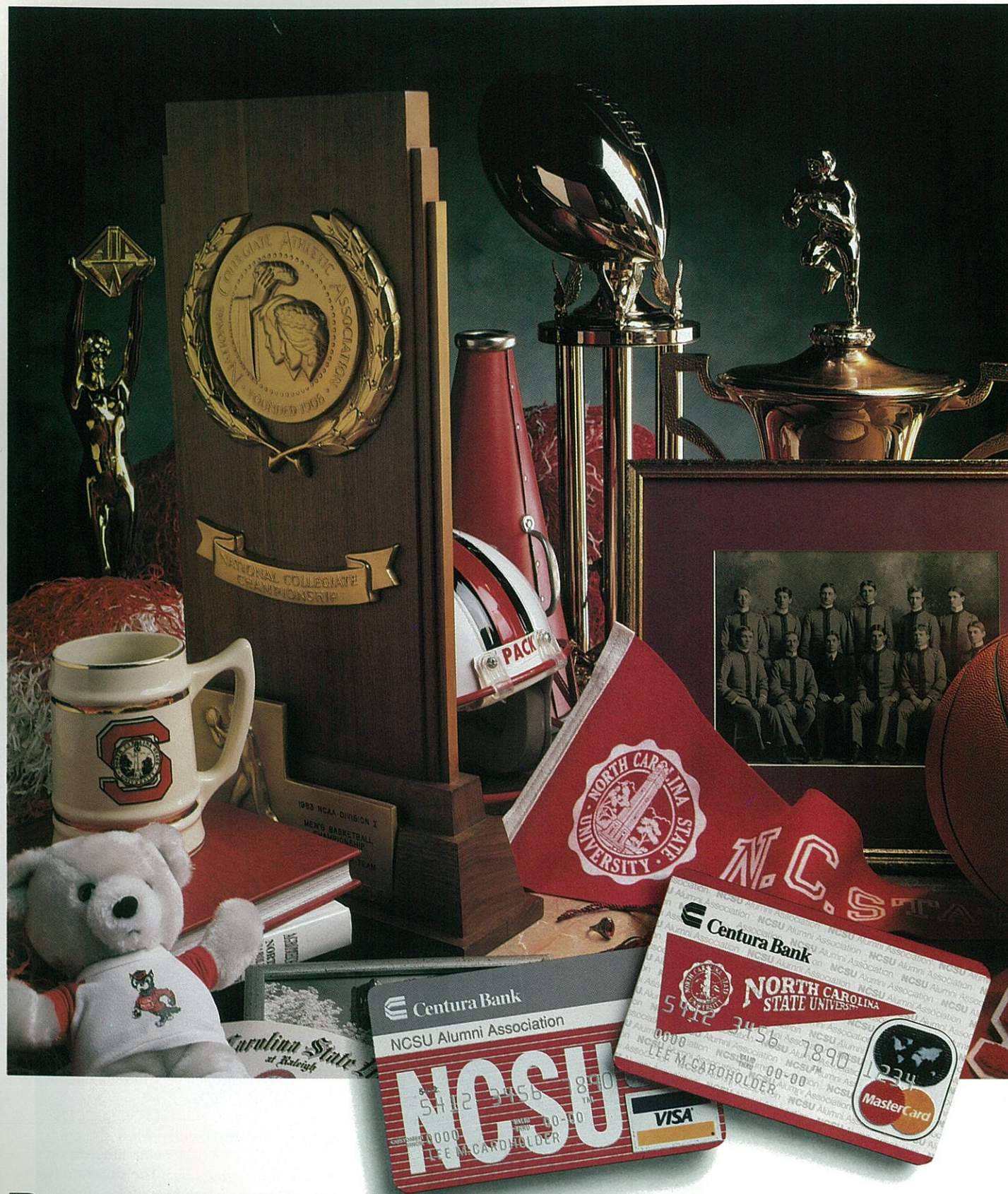

and athletics, all combining to set the stage for successful careers both athletically, academically and professionally.

At N.C. State, a serious commitment is made to involve student-athletes in a wide array of activities outside the athletic arena. The list of opportunities includes the Captain's Table, the ACC Outreach Program, the NCSU Varsity Club, career planning and placement, the Academic Support Program for Student-Athletes, volunteer projects, educational programs and leadership seminars.

The Captains' Table is a group of Wolfpack athletes who are given an opportunity to voice their opinions to the athletic department administration. Each varsity sport elects representatives for the Table. These selected individuals 1) are kept informed of athletic department policies and any changes in policy; 2) provide feedback from the student athletes on department policy; and 3) make suggestions and introduce new ideas and concerns from the student-athlete standpoint.

The ACC Outreach Program is a conference wide organization that allows student athletes to have a positive influence within the local community. Entering its sixth year of existence, N.C. State's program can boast of being the league's most consistent, with more student athletes contributing. Last year more than 50 student-athletes participated in over 30 events which reached more than 1,000 area youth.



The NCSU Varsity Club is a group of current and former State students who help keep the Wolfpack athletics family in touch. Membership is open to any individual who is or was ever a member of a varsity Wolfpack team. The group, besides organizing social and charity events that help bring together old friends and create new friendships, gives back to the athletic department in the form of a post-graduate scholarship for a Wolfpack student-athlete.

One of the FORMULA's objectives is to provide an atmosphere where the student athlete can balance the demands of practice and competition with academic achievement and personal growth. At N.C. State we realize that each of our students is unique and special to our athletics success. This is why we designed the NCSU FORMULA FOR SUCCESS program with the flexibility to meet the student athlete's individual interests and goals.

NCSU "BRAGGING RIGHTS"

North Carolina State's rich research tradition branched from a land-grant heritage. Compared with the more than 3,000 colleges and universities in the United States, N.C. State ranks fifth nationally in industry-sponsored research and No. 36 in total research expenditures. Additional comparisons of NCSU's academic schools and colleges with peers across the nation revealed the following:

Agricultural & Life Sciences: The fifth largest agriculture college in the country; Graduate enrollment ranks No. 4 nationally and undergraduate enrollment is ranked fifth.

Design: Most comprehensive design school in the Southeast; College's Virtual Environments Lab is nationally recognized for computer-based imaging, modeling and simulation.

Education & Psychology: Department of Community College Education ranks among the Top 5 in the nation; College is the largest producer of math and science teachers in the nation.

Engineering: One of the nation's Top 10 engineering schools; No. 1 in African-American enrollment and #4 in female enrollment; Ranks fifth in size of undergraduate program; Graduate school ranks #21; NCSU's Aerospace Engineering program has been chosen by NASA to lead research for the U.S. manned spacecraft landing effort to Mars; NCSU was the first institution in the world to build and operate a nuclear reactor for educational purposes.

Forest Resources: Largest forest faculty in the nation; Largest forestry college and only undergraduate curriculum in pulp and paper manufacturing and management in the Southeast; Pulp and paper major ranks first nationally by industry CEO's; First accredited parks and recreation program in the nation; Nationwide acid rain research effort was born at N.C. State.

Humanities and Social Sciences: Conducts a model Humanities Extension Program that has received national acclaim; Master of Arts in Liberal Studies program is among the largest in the nation.

Physical and Mathematical Sciences: Departments of chemistry and marine, earth and atmospheric sciences both rank among the nation's 10 largest undergraduate programs; Department of statistics, the nation's second oldest, ranks third nationally and is internationally recognized.

Textiles: The largest and most modern university-based textiles school in the world; Educates the majority of textile students in the nation with over half of all of the country's textile graduates N.C. State alums.

Veterinary Medicine: Since the first graduating class in 1985, this program has quickly gained national stature for trailblazing programs, including laser surgery, cancer treatment and avian medicine; Ranks fifth nationally in research expenditures and has the top credentialed clinical faculty in the country.

N.C. State pulled out a pair of dramatic wins last season over Marshall and Duke. In both instances, the Pack utilized the on-side kick. On each occasion kicker Damon Hartman squibbed the ball the necessary 10 yards and Sebastian Savage recovered both times, keying a pair of come-from-behind, one-point wins.

Wolfpack and Seminoles Meet for the First Time Since 1969

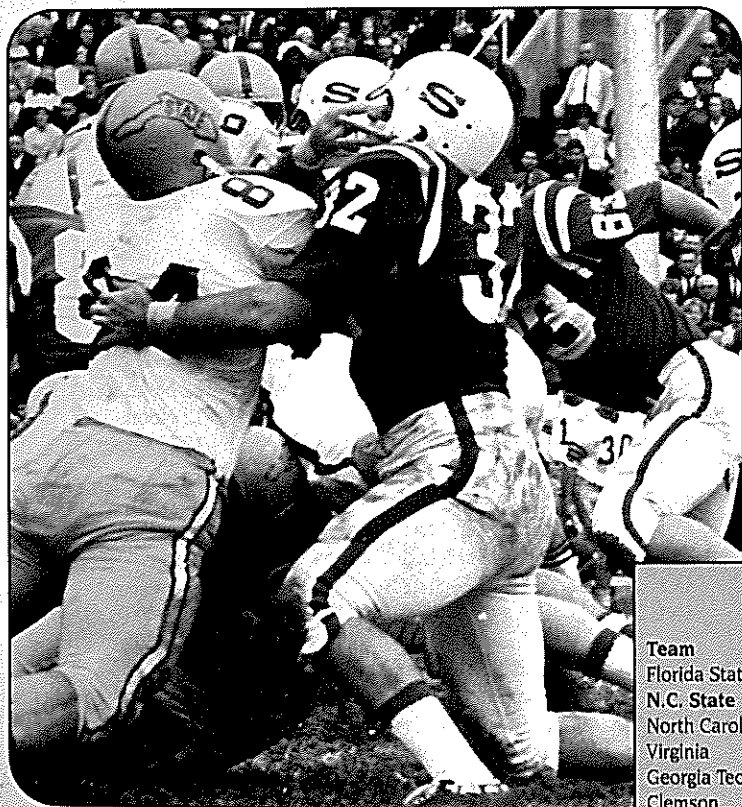
"Today, we'll be facing the best collection of talent in college football." That's how N.C. State head coach Dick Sheridan sums up Florida State as the 16th-ranked Seminoles this afternoon.

"What Florida State did at Clemson last weekend, overcoming turnovers and a hostile environment to win the game, just proves how great a football team they have. Clemson's offense had a tough time scoring on FSU's defense while Florida State's offense made a great fourth-quarter drive to win the game. Their explosiveness on offense and their dominating defense is a unique combination.

"We'll be measuring ourselves against one of the most successful football programs over the last decade. Still, anything you say about their football team just doesn't seem quite enough to express how impressed we are with their performance thus far."

Both teams enter the fray undefeated on the year, with the Wolfpack (3-0, 1-0) opening its ACC campaign with a hard-fought 14-10 decision at Maryland last weekend. Florida State (2-0, 2-0) sits atop the ACC with a pair of league victories following its 24-20 win at Clemson.

Both teams are led by outstanding quarterbacks. Terry Jordan, the Pack's strong-armed senior signal-caller, is 12-4 as a starting QB. He has thrown two TDs and two interceptions this season while completing 56.7 percent of his attempts.

Seminole head coach Bobby Bowden, in his 17th year in Tallahassee, will be making his first trip to Raleigh to face a Wolfpack squad. "I've been impressed with what I've seen from N.C. State. We know they will be a well-coached team and that the key for us will be execution. The problem is execution hurt us against Clemson. We will not win many games if we do not play better than we have in our first two. You can't go up against the quality teams we are facing in the ACC and make mistakes that cause you to beat yourself."

Whatever the outcome of today's game, N.C. State University welcomes Florida State to the Atlantic Coast Conference.

DID YOU KNOW ...

October 12, 1957 N.C. State 7 Florida State 0

An Ernie Driscoll to Dick Christy 46-yard pass play with 36 ticks remaining in the first half was all the scoring in a 7-0 N.C. State win over Florida State in 1957 down in Tallahassee. According to Driscoll, the play was a simple "hook and horn" with Christy streaking down the sidelines. Film clearly showed that Christy was actually an ineligible receiver on the play as he was bumped out of bounds at one point during his route.

The FSU defensive back who went for the hook and left Christy wide-open was #22 Buddy Reynolds. Rumor has it that Seminole head coach Tom Nugent jumped on #22 so bad that day, a new career was born. Shortly thereafter Reynolds joined a theatrical group on campus and thus the showbiz career of Burt Reynolds began.

November 13, 1965 N.C. State 3 Florida State 0

Riddick Stadium's finale, played before a homecoming crowd of 22,000, was a howling success as the Wolfpack scored its third straight shutout, a 3-0 defensive thriller over Florida State.

Harold "Bud" Deters' 41-yard field goal and a brilliant defense, which stopped the visiting Seminoles on 10 of its dozen possessions during the game, carried NCSU to its stirring victory.

A high center snap by the 'Noles was recovered by the Pack's Gary Whitman at the FSU 44, and this led to Deters' FG just after intermission.

The Wolfpack defense allowed FSU into its territory only once in the second half, and that was at mid-field with a minute to go. Then Pete Sokalsky put out that potential threat by throwing FSU quarterback Ed Pritchett for a 20-yard loss.

Harold "Bud" Deters: "It was a real defensive struggle with neither team really getting close. When I kicked the field goal, I had no idea it would be the last points scored in Riddick Stadium. It was a quaint little stadium on campus with a lot of atmosphere. The year before, Florida State had beaten the devil out of us at their place, and I remember Coach Edwards saying after the game, 'we'll get 'em back.' We didn't exactly rub it in, but we were able to sneak past them. The defense did it all, even though I

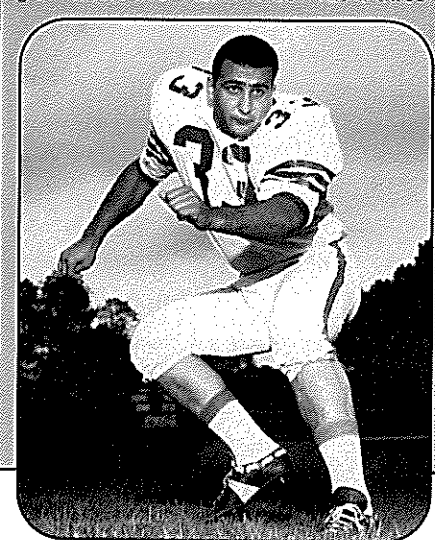

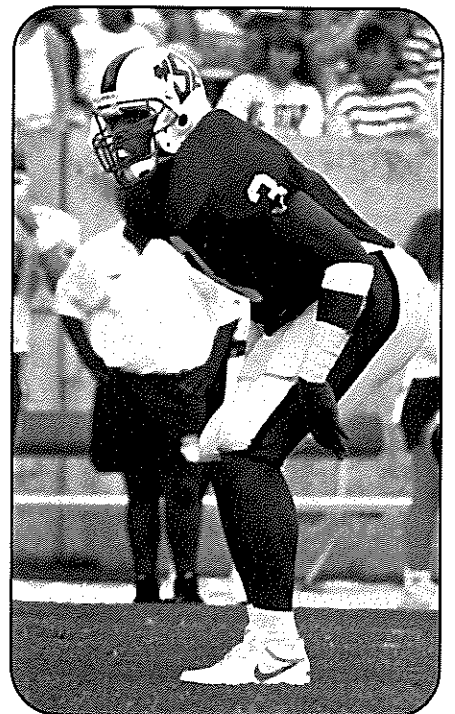
FLASHBACK

year letterman in football and wrestling for the Pack. As a wrestler, he claimed the 1966 ACC heavyweight crown and in 1968, he added the 191-pound weight class to his trophy case. On the gridiron, Amato was a hard-hitting linebacker that according to the late Wolfpack coach Al Michaels ranks with the best in N.C. State history.

It was Amato who suggested to Coach Earle Edwards that the Wolfpack Defense of 1967 polish their shoes white. Thus was born N.C. State's famed "White Shoes Defense" of '67. That team, 9-2, won its first eight games, attained State's highest ever national ranking at No. 3 and defeated Georgia, 14-7, in the Liberty Bowl for State's first-ever bowl victory.

Amato coached at NCSU for 12 years, beginning as a student assistant in 1968 and working his way to defensive coordinator from 1974-80. Amato has been at Florida State since the 1982 season.

September 30, 1967 N.C. State 20 Florida State 10

N.C. State quarterback Jim Donnan outpassed the nation's leading passer (Gary Pajcic) and fullback Charlie Bowers rushed 49 yards for an opening score, while kicking specialist Jerry Warren kicked two field goals as the Wolfpack dominated the Seminoles before 34,573 fans in Tallahassee.

N.C. State's famous "White-Shoed" defense, led by now FSU assistant coach Chuck Amato, picked off two interceptions and held the Seminoles to just 36 yards rushing.

The Wolfpack was ahead 10-0 at the half, but homestanding FSU rallied for a tie in the third quarter, before a 40-yard Warren field goal and a 55-yard march in the fourth quarter.

NOTES: The Wolfpack finished the season 9-2, defeating Georgia 14-7 in the Liberty Bowl, while FSU posted a 7-2-2 record, tying Penn State 17-all in the Gator Bowl....The following week, N.C. State pulled off possibly its biggest football upset, downing No. 2 ranked Houston, 16-6.

NOTING THE PACK ...

• N.C. State was the first current ACC school the Seminoles ever played and FSU has surprisingly played the Wolfpack more than any other conference school, although the series ended in 1969.

• NCSU sophomore wide receiver Eddie Goines and FSU senior flanker Shannon Baker were teammates at Lakeland High School, but back then it was Baker doing the throwing and Goines receiving as Baker quarterbacked the team his senior year and Goines was a sophomore wide-out.

• Five times during the 12-game series between NCSU and FSU, the winning team has posted a shutout.

• Linebacker David Merritt was chosen the Pack's defensive player of the game against Maryland and with good reason. The senior from Raleigh was credited with 11 solo tackles and 11 assists for an amazing 22 stops. For good measure he had two quarterback hurries and one pass break-up.

• RB Anthony Barbour is first in the ACC in yards per carry at a gaudy 8.0 yards every time he touches the ball. An explosive Barbour has 256 yards and four touchdowns in State's 3-0 start.

WOLFPACK vs. SEMINOLES

N.C. State and new ACC member Florida State will resume a home-and-home series today. The two teams have met 12 times in the past with FSU holding an 8-4 advantage.

During four of the meetings between the schools, N.C. State captured the ACC Championship during that year. Three out of those four years, the Seminoles were able to upend the ACC Champion Wolfpack.

Former Pack coach Earle Edwards did all the coaching against Florida State with the exception of the first two meetings in 1952 and '53. Two-year coach Horace Hendrickson was the first NCSU coach to battle Florida State.

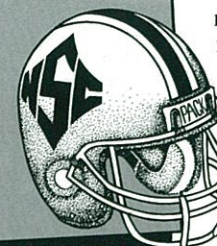

If there was ever an expert on the history of the N. C. State football program, it is Earle Edwards. The modern-era architect of N. C. State football, Edwards left an impressive legacy as the Pack's long-time coach, giving 17 years to the program, becoming the school's all-time victory leader and setting a standard for academic success for the entire coaching profession.

And now, the torch that Edwards lit has been passed to Dick Sheridan who will begin his seventh season at the Wolfpack helm.

Sheridan began his Wolfpack journey on December 30, 1985, when he became N. C. State's 31st football coach, and the ensuing six football seasons have been the most successful in Wolfpack history. Five bowl trips, a record-tying nine-win season and an invitation to the prestigious 1992 Kickoff Classic tell only part of the story.

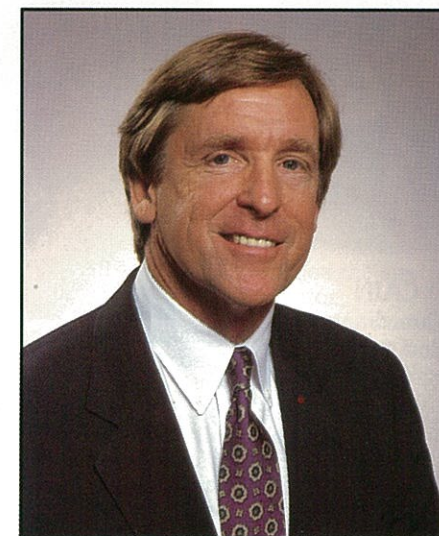
While the athletic successes of the Sheridan-coached Wolfpack teams are impressive, it is equally impressive to showcase successes in academic performance. Quite frankly, there isn't a coach in the country that can boast a better mix of academic integrity and coaching philosophy.

Nowhere is there better evidence of the program's academic improvement than in the records of the 1991 Wolfpack seniors. Of the 25 seniors in the program last year, 16 will receive their diplomas by the end of 1992 while the other nine are on target to graduate in 1993. This is the same group of seniors that became just the second Wolfpack squad to play in four straight bowl games.

The emphasis on academics is just a part of the education process that transpires in the program. That process includes developing such qualities as discipline, confidence, pride, and integrity.

"I've always felt athletics are part of the educational process and viewed myself as a teacher," Sheridan told the *Greensboro News & Record*. "I feel a strong responsibility to develop the attitudes, habits and standards of the young people in our program, not just to win games."

Charles Davenport, a 1992 graduate and fourth-round draft pick of the Pittsburgh Steelers told the *Durham Herald*, "He's trying to prepare you for when you leave. Coach Sheridan asks a lot of his



players—not to make you a better player, but to make you a better person. I really didn't understand when I came in why we can't do this, why we can't do that. I told my brother (Wolfpack receiver Brian Davenport), after two or three years, you'll see, he's preaching the same things our father was preaching ..."

The Pack's consistent success over the last six seasons is due in a large part to a coaching staff that has remained loyal to Sheridan and his philosophy. Of the original staff of nine field coaches that arrived in Raleigh in 1986, seven are still coaching with the Pack while Steve Robertson has moved from field coaching to administrative duties. The *Raleigh News & Observer* said it best, "State is the closest thing ACC football has to a family operation."

Still, the Pack's most visible improvements appear on the football field. Sheridan's 1992 Wolfpack tied the school

record with nine victories, against two defeats, on its way to the Peach Bowl. With its fifth bowl trip in six years, Sheridan has coached the Pack to more bowl contests than any other Wolfpack coach.

Sheridan already is second only to Edwards on the Wolfpack victory charts with his 43-26-2 slate. Edwards won 77 games in his 17 years at the State helm.

But Sheridan has always been a winner. He combines his Wolfpack record with a 69-23-2 mark during eight years as the head coach at Furman University to compile a 14-year, .691 career winning percentage (112-49-4), the nation's 8th-best average among active coaches.

Sheridan came to NCSU from Furman where he and his staff established themselves as one of the finest units ever in Division I-AA. During his eight-year tenure as the Paladins head coach (1978-85), Furman won six Southern Conference titles. He posted a .755 winning percentage, which was the best among active I-AA coaches at the time.

Sheridan himself has been recognized repeatedly for his coaching talents. While at Furman, he was the Southern Conference Coach of the Year three times (1978, 1980 and 1982), and he was the American Football Coaches Association Division I-AA 1985 Coach of the Year. In 1986, he was honored as the ACC Coach of the Year, the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year and as the CBS-TV National Coach of the Year.

Sheridan received both an undergraduate and a graduate degree from South Carolina. In 1964 he earned his B.S. in physical education and five years later he was awarded a master's degree in the same field.

An active member of the American Football Coaches Association, he serves on the AFCA's Board of Directors and spoke before the Knight Commission as a representative of the nation's football coaches.

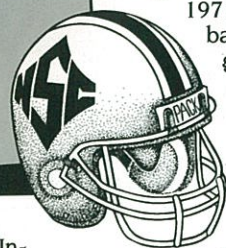

Assistant Athletic

A 30-year coaching veteran, Steve Robertson changed directions in 1990 and is now in his third year as an assistant athletic director at N.C. State. Coach Robertson, who was the Wolfpack's assistant head football and defensive line coach from 1986-89, handles administrative duties with the football program and other support systems for Wolfpack athletic teams.

TED CAIN
Offensive Coordinator &
Tight End Coach

Ted Cain is in his seventh season as the Wolfpack's offensive coordinator and tight end coach.

Under Cain's direction, the Wolfpack passing game has rewritten the record books. The Wolfpack has attempted and completed more passes for more yardage during this staff's tenure than during any period in State history.

Cain developed his offensive style by working with the Furman Paladin passing attack for eight years in the 1980s.

"Whether you are a lineman, receiver or back, you have an opportunity to be an important part of an offense that is exciting and diverse in all phases — power, option and pass. In 1989 our offense averaged over 400 yards a game, the fourth-best average in N.C. State history. Life is a series of opportunities. Becoming a part of the Wolfpack Football Family is an opportunity I hope you will not pass up."

Cain enjoyed an outstanding collegiate football career as a tight end for Furman from 1971-73. He earned his bachelor of science degree in geology from the University in 1974. In 1981, Cain received his master's degree in education from Furman.

Prior to rejoining the Paladin staff in 1978, Cain served as a first lieutenant and platoon leader in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at Fort Benning, Georgia, for two years.

A native of Aiken, S. C., Cain is married to the former Susan Buko of Greenville, South Carolina, and they have a son, Matthew, 9, and a daughter, Erin, 6.



BUDDY GREEN
Defensive Coordinator &
Secondary Coach

"Buddy" Green begins his third season as N. C. State's defensive coordinator and his seventh directing the Wolfpack secondary. His first two seasons in charge of the defense have been nothing short of sensational. In 1990, the Pack finished as the No. 10-ranked unit in the country, yielding just 277.6 yards per game, State's second-lowest total in 21 years. Despite losing six starters from that unit, the Pack defense nearly equaled those numbers last year, ranking 17th in the nation by allowing just 304.2 yards per game.

Green has not only developed great defensive teams, but also great defensive players. Seven of his former secondary players have played in the NFL. When Sebastian Savage earned first team all-ACC honors last season, it marked the fifth straight year that Green has

coached a player onto the ACC's first team.

A 1976 graduate of N. C. State with a degree in speech communication, Green, who played on ACC championship squads in both football and baseball at State, coached briefly on the prep level before returning to NCSU as a graduate assistant to Coach Bo Rein. While filling that position, he helped State win the 1979 ACC championship.

"Don't be afraid to fail." This is a big part of what we try to emphasize to our players at NCSU. Too many players start believing the labels that are placed on their potential and ability. The same is true in life. 'Play beyond all expectations.' Team work habits and mental toughness will merit individual success, and a sincere communication between coaches and players is the most important tool for success."

The Stanley, N.C., native left NCSU in 1980 and traveled to Louisiana State. At LSU, he worked with the defensive backs and was head junior varsity coach. He then coached for Pat Dye at Auburn University before joining the Wolfpack in 1986. He has also coached the defensive secondaries at Southern University and at Virginia Military Institute.

Green, 39, is married to the former Sharon Losco, a German teacher at Ligon Magnet School. They have two children, Todd, 13, and Courtney, 11.



KENT BRIGGS
Outside Linebacker
Coach

Formerly an N. C. State graduate assistant for two years, Kent Briggs enters his second year as the outside linebacker coach. A 12-year coaching veteran, he served on the Western

Carolina staff for nine years before joining the Wolfpack staff in 1989 where he began working on his doctoral degree in adult education.

"Adversity is an everyday phenomenon of life. The game of football is a perfect learning environment to experience adversity. One must learn to overcome obstacles through work, performance and belief in teammates and oneself. He earned his undergraduate degree in physical education in 1979 and obtained his master's degree in the same major in 1981.

ROBBIE CALDWELL
Offensive Line Coach

Robbie Caldwell begins his seventh season as N.C. State's offensive line coach, but has been an associate of Coach Dick Sheridan's as a player or coach for more than 18 years.

Caldwell came to N.C. State after coaching at Furman for eight years. While working with

Caldwell received his health and physical education degree from Furman in 1976, and then worked as a graduate assistant coach for one season.

The Pageland, S. C., native served as an assistant football coach and head baseball coach for one year at Hanahan High School near Charleston, S. C., before returning to coach the Paladin offensive line.

In the 1971 Shrine Bowl, Caldwell played with current Wolfpack staff member Mike O'Cain on the South Carolina all-star unit.

The 37-year-old Caldwell is married to the former Nora Lynn Lassiter of Arlington, Virginia.

KEN PETTUS
Inside Linebacker Coach

Ken Pettus, an original member of Coach Dick Sheridan's Raleigh staff, begins his seventh season as the inside linebackers coach.

Pettus began his coaching career in 1973, when he was a graduate assistant at Furman while he worked towards his master's degree in sociology. From 1975 through 1977, he held a position with the Greenville, S.C., police force. Then he returned to the Paladins' staff for the 1978-80 sea-

O'Cain received a scholarship to Clemson and lettered from 1974-76. He was named Tigers' MVP following his final campaign.

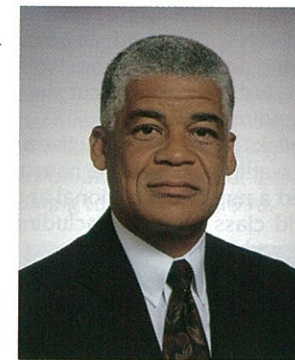
O'Cain, 38, is married to the former Nancy Farnum of Orangeburg, and they have two daughters, Jenny, age 7 and Lizzi, 5.

HENRY TREVATHAN Specialist Coach

A 38-year coaching veteran, Henry Trevathan is beginning his seventh season as the Wolfpack's specialists coach, this year under the title of graduate assistant coach. The highly-successful mentor has coached two all-ACC punters—Kelly Holo-dick and Craig Salmon—plus all-ACC kicker Mike Cofer.

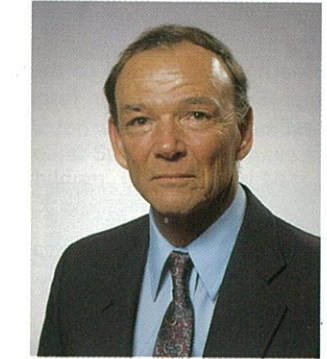
Under Trevathan's guidance the past six years, State place kickers have hit 174 of their 184 PAT attempts for a .945 percentage. Pack booters have connected on 75-120 field goals for 62.5 percent and the punting average for the past six seasons is right at 40 yards per punt.

Trevathan is recognized as one of the finest high school coaches in North Carolina history, having directed Wilson Fike High School to three consecutive 4-A state titles. In the spring of 1991, he was honored by the N.C. Football Coaches Association for his outstanding service
