

TOP-RANKED

he 1993 N.C. State football game programs and the 1993-94 Wolfpack basketball game programs were recently ranked among the best in the nation. The programs, published by the NCSU Sports Information Office, were edited by assistant sports information director Carter Cheves '78. Titled PACK Preview, the basketball programs were judged second-best in the country while football claimed the No. 6 spot. Both sets of game programs captured first in the district, which includes the states of North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, Georgia and Florida. In addition, the program cover for the Virginia game (Homecoming) was selected as the top football program cover in the nation. The cover, which incorporated an Autumn/Halloween theme, was chosen as the cover of the year from among 100

WOLFPACK (7-2, 5-1 ACC) vs. SEMINOLES (8-1, 7-0 ACC)

THE SERIES: The Seminoles lead the overall series by a 10-4 count, winning the last four encounters. Prior to FSU joining the ACC before the start of the 1992 season, these two teams had met 12 times between 1952 and 1969. The Pack's wins came in 1952 — 13-7 in Raleigh, in 1957 — 7-0 in Tallahassee, in 1965 — 3-0 in Raleigh and in 1967 — 20-10 in Tallahassee.

Last season Florida State took the frustration of a loss to Notre Dame the previous week out on visiting N.C. State with a 62-3 win in Tallahassee. The 'Noles went on to capture the National Championship with a 12-1 record. FSU took advantage of a pair of early turnovers by the Pack to take a 14-0 lead just five minutes into the game. FSU totaled 553 yards of offense but the Pack didn't help the cause with six turnovers. State managed 317 total yards, but were forced to take too many chances because of the big deficit. Heisman Trophy winner Charlie Ward completed 27 of 36 passes for 278 yards and four touchdowns.

During five of the meetings between the schools, N.C. State captured the ACC Championship during that year. Three out of those five years, the Seminoles were able to upend the ACC Champion Wolfpack.

STOP THE STREAK: Florida State is gunning for its 24th consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference victory and its third straight league title this evening against the Wolfpack of N.C. State. The old record of consecutive ACC wins belonged to Maryland when they won 21 straight from 1973-77. N.C. State was the team that ended the Terps string when the Pack won a thrilling 24-20 victory in Carter-Finley Stadium on October 1. Can the Pack play spoiler again? State's best string of ACC wins is 14 set in 1972-74.

N.C. State has a huge chore to upset No. 6 Florida State, but a Wolfpack win would be one of the biggest in school history. A State win would put the Pack in a dead heat with FSU for the league championship. It would also be the Noles' first loss in the league since it joined in 1992. And of course, it would carry significant meaning in the bowl picture.

CHUCK: Former Pack player Chuck Amato (1965-67) is the assistant head coach and defensive line coach for Florida State. Amato was a member of the famed 1967 Wolfpack, which featured the "White Shoes" Defense. The '67 squad rose to No. 3 in the country, going 9-2 and beating Georgia, 14-7 in the Liberty Bowl. In fact, it was Amato's idea to brand the defense with the nickname "White Shoes." Amato made the suggestion to then Coach Earle Edwards and with his approval State's defensive unit began polishing their shoes white in a ritual every Friday night.

Amato was also a standout wrestler at NCSU winning ACC Championships at heavyweight in 1966 and at 191 pounds in 1968. Amato began his football coaching at NCSU, beginning as a student assistant coach in 1968. In 1971 he was hired by

former coach Al Michaels as a graduate assistant and in 1973 he was promoted to full-time assistant by Lou Holtz. Amato's last year at State was in 1979 as the defensive coordinator for Bo Rein.

RARE FB REPEAT: When sophomore Rod Brown raced for 117 yards against Duke last week, he became the first fullback in 17 years to post back-to-back 100-yard rushing games. He ran for a career-high 125 yards during State's 47-45 win at Maryland. Ironically, these are the first two 100-yard rushing games of his career. The last NCSU fullback to pull off the feat was Billy Ray Vickers in 1977. Vickers ran for 102 yards against Virginia and followed that with 108 against Syracuse.

HOMEBOYS: In recent years, the N.C. State football program has expanded its recruiting efforts into fertile Florida for student-athletes. There are currently eight players on the Wolfpack roster who are native to the Sunshine State:

REACH OUT AND TOUCH SOMEONE: For two consecutive weeks, the N.C. State Wolfpack has received an AT&T Long Distance Award. Two weeks ago when speedster Alvis Whitted broke through the Maryland coverage unit and hit paydirt to complete a 97-yard kickoff return, AT&T honored him with their Long Distance "kickoff return" award. Whitted's return marked the first time in 32 years that a Wolfpack player had accomplished this feat. This past week, two more N.C State players were awarded national honors after the Wolfpack rallied to a come-frombehind victory over Duke. Quarterback Terry Harvey and flanker Adrien Hill received the AT&T Long Distance "pass play" award. Late in the third quarter, Harvey, playing with a partially separated shoulder, hit Hill on an 82-yard pass play moving the ball from State's 8-vard line to Duke's 10. Two plays later, Harvey hit Hill again, this time in the end zone for a touchdown.

VIDETICH IS RED-HOT: A semifinalist for the 1994 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, N.C. State's Steve Videtich is producing the kind of kicking that is hard to overlook. He made a career best four field goals during State's 47-45 victory at Maryland. His last field goal of the game was a 35-yarder with just six seconds remaining in the game and provided State with the winning margin. It was Videtich's first last-second, game-winning field goal of his career. All of this came just one week after he kicked his career-long

50-yard FG against North Carolina. The 50-yarder is the longest in the ACC this season. Videtich has now hit eight straight field goals and 14 of 15 during the '94 season. Over the last two years, the 1993 all-ACC kicker has connected on 26 of 28 attempts and for his career he is 40 of 50.

HOME STREAK AT NINE: The Pack has a modest nine-game win streak going at Carter-Finley Stadium. State owns a 111-55-6 record (.663) in C-F. The Pack's longest home winning streak is 16 games spanning through 1972 until 1975. The Wolfpack is 10-1 at home since Mike O'Cain took over the reins last season.

TIES TO NCSU: FSU Sports Marketing & Promotions Director Kim Ayers-McWilliams is a former N.C. State volleyball player and alumnna.

State won 49-13 in '72 and the Mountaineers took a 13-10 win in '75. Lou Holtz was the coach at NCSU during those games.





ollowing an inaugural season that included thrilling finishes, record-setting individual performances and a New Year's Day books. bowl appearance, Mike O'Cain begins his second season at the Wolfpack helm focusing on the themes of attitude and consis-



O'Cain's leap into the head coaching fire was successful in every sense, considering he inherited the program just five weeks prior to the start of fall camp. His first team was competitive, posting a 7-4 regular season record that sent the Wolfpack to its sixth straight bowl game and seventh post-season appearance in eight years. He was the nation's only first-year head coach to take his team to a bowl game. His team was exciting, mounting fourthquarter comebacks in six games that resulted in four wins. And his team was successful academically, placing 15 members on the ACC Honor Roll while 14 players earned their degrees in May.

In the meantime, O'Cain and his staff have put together one of the Pack's most highly-regarded recruiting classes in recent memory, a class of 24 signees who combine excellent skills with the game's most valuable natural talent — speed.

"There's no doubt that last year's team will always be special to me," O'Cain said. "Not only because it was my first year as a head coach, but also because of the 'never-say-die' effort those players put forth. Despite some extensive injuries, particularly to our defense, they worked hard and, for the most part, were an extremely competitive football team week in and week out.

"Now the challenge is to continue with that kind of attitude and effort and combine that with a consistency in performance that will smooth over some of those roller coaster highs and lows we experienced last season."

It was on June 29, 1993, that O'Cain's view of Wolfpack football changed dramatically. On that day, he was named to lead the Pack program, moving up from his role as NCSU's quarterback coach, succeeding Dick Sheridan, who resigned on that same day for unspecified health reasons after seven successful years at the Wolfpack helm. In accepting the promotion from Director of Athletics Todd Turner, O'Cain became the 31st head coach in the school's

O'Cain coached for 17 years prior to accepting the challenge of his first head coaching assignment. But he didn't just inherit the program, he was part of its transformation over the last eight years from a middle-of-the-road unit to a consistent ACC contender and bowl participant. During that time, NCSU offensive players, with O'Cain directing the State quarterbacks, re-wrote

But just as important have been the accomplishments of the Wolfpack team off the field. Wolfpack players have succeeded in the classroom as well as in the community, giving the N.C. State program a well-earned and highly-respected reputation.

"There are values that we instill in our program that are very consistent — discipline, doing things the right way and recruiting student-athletes who have the ability to graduate from North Carolina State University, to name just a few," O'Cain said. "To a man on this football staff, we are committed to these values."

O'Cain began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Clemson University where he had lettered for four seasons as a quarterback. He was the Tigers' MVP during the 1976 campaign and, ironically, he still holds the Tiger record for rushing yards in a game by a quarterback (140 yards on 13 attempts) set against N. C. State during his senior season. He stayed with the Clemson program for the 1977 season as a graduate assistant working with

From 1978 through 1980, O'Cain worked with Art Baker at The Citadel as the offensive backfield coach.

O'Cain then moved on to Murray State for four years, where he served as quarterback coach and offensive coordinator for his first season and then assistant head coach and offensive coordinator for three more years.

O'Cain rejoined Art Baker in 1985, this time at East Carolina. where he served as assistant head coach.

He moved to Raleigh in 1986 when Dick Sheridan took over the Wolfpack program.

A native of Orangeburg, S.C., O'Cain's association with Dick Sheridan began at Orangeburg-Wilkinson High School, where Sheridan coached O'Cain. A three-year starter at quarterback, O'Cain led the team to a perfect 13-0 record, the state 4-A title and a No. 12 national ranking as a senior.

He received a series of accolades, including 4-A South Carolina Back of the Year, all-state and all-America. He was the starting quarterback for the 1971 Shrine Bowl where he teamed with Wolfpack offensive line coach Robbie Caldwell, who was the starting
