WAKE HOSTS SEMINOLES IN HOME FINALE

There's a bit of a chill in the air as the 1998 football season reaches November and Wake Forest's only home date this month.

But even if the temperature is significantly lower than it has been here in Groves Stadium for earlier contests in September and October, there's sure to be enough action on the field to keep the Demon Deacon faithful warm as they cheer for the "Old Gold & Black" one more time this season.

It hasn't been the year that many folks associated with Wake Forest Football had hoped for — fans, players and coaches alike — but the one constant quality in this '98 squad has been its determination and commitment to keep playing hard despite some difficult circumstances.

All that effort and desire will certainly be required here this evening as the Deacs entertain the powerful Florida State Seminoles before a national television (ESPN2) audience. This is only the second Winston-Salem appearance by FSU since the school joined the Atlantic Coast Conference six years ago.

Here's a look at both teams:

DEMON DEACON DATA

Wake Forest has lost three straight games to three very talented opponents — North Carolina, Virginia and NC State — all of which are in contention for a postseason invitation. Of course, Florida State (along with next week's opponent Georgia Tech) will be playing somewhere during the holidays, too, so the Deacs must regroup quickly in order to get back in the win column before the schedule concludes next Saturday in Atlanta.

The Deacon offense has relied on the passing game almost exclusively the past two weeks and veteran quarterback Brian Kuklick has posted some impressive numbers.

Last week, in particular, Kuklick enjoyed one of his most productive outings in his splendid career, passing for a person-best 421 yards in a 38-27 loss to NC State. In that game, the Hatboro, PA, senior became Wake Forest's all-time leading passer, now having thrown for 7,602 yards during the past four seasons.

In the two other major passing categories, Kuklick needs just six completions to pass Gary Schofield and become the school's

all-time leader in the category, and his current total of 42 career touchdown passes is just two behind Schofield.

Kuklick is now fifth in ACC history in passing and needs just 403 yards to move past former Duke QB Steve Slayden (8,004 yards) into the #4 spot on the

league's all-time list.

With his favorite target Desmond Clark sidelined last week at NC State with a sprained knee (Desmond is still questionable for this week's game with FSU, too), Kuklick turned his passing attentions to junior Jammie Deese, who after an excellent start to the '98 campaign had been somewhat quiet in recent weeks.

Deese erupted for 12 receptions for 167 yards versus the Wolfpack, both figures representing new career highs for him. He also caught a touchdown pass (of 9 yards) in that contest.

Another receiver to emerge at State was a running back. That's right, sophomore Chris McCoy caught six passes from his position in the Deacon backfield and covered 107 yards on those plays, including 17 yards for a TD that pulled Wake to within four points (31-27) in the fourth quarter in Raleigh.

If Kuklick is to continue to put the ball in the air so often, he will need a tremendous effort from his offensive line tonight. That groups has been a steady and durable unit all season. Senior tackle Jeff Flowe and junior guards Brian Wolverton and Sam Settar have each played all 623 plays this season.

Youngster Michael Collins has taken over at one tackle spot for Willie Lam, who has been slowed by physical problems, while Vince Azzolina has replaced an injured (shoulder) Marlon Curtis at center. Walkon Wil Spires also filled in against State and did a solid job in his first real action.

On the defensive side, the Deacon numbers continue to dwindle, particular at linebacker where Jon Mannon is now out for the season with a shoulder injury. Mark Makovec, at just 212 pounds, has helped out on the inside along with Abdul Guice (at 195 lbs), while safety DaLawn Parrish (197 lbs) has spent some snaps at Makovec's outside linebacker position. Obviously, it's not a linebacking corps that will impress anyone with their size, but they have certainly done that with their effort.

Fred Robbins anchors the defensive line, while Mat Petz has continued his successful sophomore season at end. Petz ranks third among ACC leaders in tackles-for-loss with 15, while also making a team-high six sacks.

The Deacon secondary has also maintained its aggressive play, picking off two more opposition passes at State to increase its season total to 13. Reggie Austin leads that group with three "picks", while Parrish and Jeffrey Muires each have two.

The Wake Forest kicking game experienced some tough times last Saturday, losing a punt return on a fumble and having a punt of its own blocked. Matthew Burdick also had his string of seven straight successful field goal tries ended when he was short on a 50-yard attempt. Look for the Deacon "specialists" to rebound with a good showing this evening.

"NOLE 'NOWLEDGE

When a football fan thinks of Florida State and the outstanding program that coach Bobby Bowden has structured there, the inclination is to think speed, depth, explosiveness. And that would be correct, but that fan should consider those qualities and their impact from a defensive standpoint first of all with this particular group of Seminoles.

Granted, FSU again this season has one of the most explosive and productive offenses in the nation. But look at the defense.

The 'Noles are first in the ACC in total defense (nearly 100 yards better than anyone else), first in rushing defense (the only

ACC team holding the opposition below 100 yards per game), first in passing defense (opponents complete a mere 44% of their passes against them), and first in scoring defense (less than 12 points per game).

That success defensively comes through a team effort, too. Of course there are individual stars, such as safety Dexter Jackson who has four interceptions, and outstanding veterans like end Tony Bryant and linebacker Lamont Green, but FSU simply attacks an opposing offense relentlessly — a tactic it can employ because of its tremendous depth.

On offense, quarterback Chris Weinke has settled in quite comfortably as the field general of the Seminole attack. He has thrown for 19 touchdowns while being intercepted only six times. His favorite receiver is one of the country's premier receivers, junior Peter Warrick, who has scored 11 times as a receiver and once on a reverse and averages an eye-catching 21.2 yards per reception.

Travis Minor and Jeff Chaney give FSU a potent one-two punch at running back, operating behind a young but extremely talented offensive line. The 'Noles do not have a single senior listed on their depth chart along the offensive front, which instead includes three juniors and five sophomores among its top players.

The kicking game is also outstanding. Sebastian Janikowski tied an ACC single season record with his 23rd field goal of the season in last week's lopsided pounding (45-14) of

Virginia. His current total of 108 points are the most by any kicker in ACC history as well.

SERIES WITH THE SEMINOLES

Wake Forest has lost all six of its games with Florida State since the school joined the ACC in 1992, and now trails in the overall series, 13-2-1. The only Demon Deacon wins over the Seminoles have come in 1959 (22-20) in Tallahassee and in 1973 (9-7) here in Groves.

In the last six meetings with FSU, Wake has been outscored, 319-48, for an average deficit of nearly 45 points per game. The closest that the Deacs have come to the 'Noles during that time was a 35-7 loss in 1992.

SENIOR FAREWELL

This evening also marks the final home appearance for 14 Wake Forest seniors, who have meant a great deal to the university the past four years. This class includes the school's all-time leading receiver, Desmond Clark, and all-time leading passer, Brian Kuklick, but each of these individuals has contributed in his own way to a much-improved football program.
