

BOW TO CHOCTAWS

CLINTON, Miss, Feb 5—The Florida State University Seminoles encountered the same road-game difficulties that have hampered them all season as they dropped a 57-46 decision to the Mississippi College Choctaws Friday night.

The setback was the seventh the Seminoles have suffered in the nine games on foreign floors this year, and it squared their season record at eight wins and eight losses.

FSU Won Opener

In the opening game of the season between the two teams FSU grabbed a 53-21 verdict over the Chocs, but last night the Mississippians played steady ball to even the series.

Big Tom McLaughlin topped the Seminole scorers with 13 points, while Sessums paced the Choc attack with 16.

Little Lee Benjamin was taken ill in Mobile en route to Clinton and was below his usual from Friday night, but still managed to click with eight points to take runnerup honors to McLaughlin in the Seminole scoring table.
