Dick Kendall, rangy guard from Shelbyville, Ind. paced all individual acorers for the evening with 12 points, but it was stocky Lee Benjamin of Miami who got the Seminoles off to their running start. Lee opened the game with his one-handed push shot red hot, and personally accounted for the first ten points of theball game with five field goals.

Benjamin added a free-throw later in the contest for a total of 11 points and was runnerup to Kendall for indidivual honors.

Veteran Center Larry Dickson of Tampa registered 8 points for the winners, setting the pace in the Seminoles' last half drive.

The outclassed Troy State quintet battled all the way but was unable to hit field goals or free throws with any degree of regularity. The Wavemen missed time and again on apparently easy layup tries, and made good on only 9 of their 27 charity throw attempts.
