

### Nip Bulldogs

BIRMINGHAM, Ala.—(Special to the Democrat)—The Florida State University Seminoles came from behind in the last few minutes of play to edge the Howard College Bulldogs 53-55 in a Dixie Conference basketball game here Friday night.

FSU Guard Wild Bill Weigel came through with the winning point, a free throw, with five seconds to play in the game after center Tom McLaughlin had tied the score for the Seminoles with a layup shot a minute earlier. The Indians then froze the ball for the remaining seconds.

### Parks High Man

Howard Guard Hal Parks, the night's individual high scorer with 19 points, and Center Beamon Sparks paced a drive that put the Bulldogs in front 34-27 by half-time. The Seminoles closed the gap gradually in the last half, finally pulling even on McLaughlin's two-pointer which set the stage for Weigel's winning toss.

The Florida State victory, fourth of the season against three defeats in conference play, stopped a Howard winning streak at five games. It was the Seminoles' initial win away from home.

Weigel paced the FSU scorers against Howard with 15 points. Forward Lee Benjamin racked up 12 markers and McLaughlin got 11.
