## FSU Wins Third Place in Tourney

Lecking, height and short on the finesse and sharpshooting tacg ties that the mighty Mercer Bears had displayed in the early rounds of the Dixle tournament here, the little Mocs simply outran and outit fought the highly-touted Bruins to register an upset 59:55 triumph over the top-seeded Macon, Ga er quintet in the finals last night.

The Southern victory, which wound up the three-day meet in the FSU gym. climaxed a stirring back-to-the-wall battle that the Mocs had staged since the outset of the elimination play.

Trailing against Howard, Florida State and Mercer in the second half of all three of their encounters, the Mocs won every game the hard way—pounding up from behind and winning in a drive down the stretch.
