JACKSONVILLE. March 3— The Florida State University Seminoles staged a roaring finish here Friday night to come from behind in the last six minutes of play and defeat the Stetson University Hatters 65 to 58 in the first round of the district 25 NAIBbasketbail tournament.

The Seminoles, who had trailed Stetson by 6 points at intermission time, and midway in the second half were behind 36 to 45, took the play entirely away from the taller Hatters down the stretch. A free throw and field goal by husky Bob Whitmer, and a fielder by Bud Scott narrowed the margin to four points. The two teams traded baskets three times, then field goals by Bob Hartman and Larry Dickson tied the count at 51-51 with 8:15 of play remaining.

Big Tom McLaughlin was a major factor in Fiorida state's victory as he played his best game of the season to hold Stetson's 6-foot, 8-inch high scoring center; Jim Yonge, to 11 points. His rebounding, particularly off the defensive backboard, was great.

Dickson came in just in time to contribute his 5 points to the Seminoles closing drive. Trohaugh and Bud Marsee, the latter playing with his injured arm heavily bandaged, got in their share of the heavy work.
