The Floridians, who led briefly around the 12-minute mark, fell behind 33-21 at the half, then slipped further off the pace before they finally started to close the gap.

Capt. Bob Whitmer paced the Indian offense, dropping in 18 points for his best night of the season.

The Badgers, defending Gulf States champions, were led by Jules Mugnier and Andy Mc-Laughlin who looped in 22 and 19 points respectively.

FSU is scheduled to play Sewance in Tampa Friday night in half of a twin-bill sponsored by the Tampa Lions club. Tampa U. plays Nebraska in the other game.

On Dec. 27-29 the Seminoles will compete in the Gator Bowl round robin with Florida, Georgia and Clemson.
