

MIAMI BEACH (AP)—"Hot Rod" Hundley put on the show but Lloyd Sharrar provided the scoring as West Virginia beat Miami 83-78 in the championship game of the Orange Bowl basketball tournament last night.

Sharrar, a center, completely eluded the Miami defense, alternately hooking and jumping above the other players. He sank 28 points.

**ALSO HIT 17**

Hundley, a forward, held his head in anguish, juggled the ball, collapsed with fake injuries and otherwise attracted the attention of the crowd of 3,571, but he also dropped in 17 points, including five field goals.

Miami outlit the Mountaineers on field goals, 29 to 25, but missed 15 of 35 free throws. West Virginia sank 33 of 47 free throws.

Columbia, which staged a drive in the last seven minutes to defeat Tulane 64 to 61, took third place in the tournament.

Yale smashed through Santa Clara's defense to take an easy 86 to 67 victory in the consolation finals.

**SOPHOMORES STAR**

Florida State edged New York University 85 to 83 for seventh place in the tournament. Two sophomores, used little during the regular games, saved the day for the Seminoles. Wayne Patton scored two free throws and a field goal and Tom Garcia dropped in a field goal to send the Seminoles home.

Dick Miani, a guard for Miami, was the tournament's top scorer with 82 points. Chet Forte of Columbia, at 5 feet 9 inches the

shortest man in the tournament, was runnerup with 80.

Miani and Forte were named by the coaches to the all-tournament first team. The other first stringers were Hundley and forward Ed Morris of Miami, and Center Frank Thomas of Columbia.

The second team was made up of guards John Lee of Yale and Roy Stoll of Tulane, forwards Willie Bergines and Sharrar, and center Richard Montgomery of Santa Clara.
