ATHENS, Ga.—High scoring guard Jimmy Oler ripped the nets for 28 points and sparked a last-half rally as Florida State University defeated Georgia's Bulldogs, 79-76, here last night.

The pint - sized sharpshooter hit nine times from the floor and added 10 of 15 free shot attempts. Beventeen of his points came in the last half.

Georgia took a 47-34 halftime lead but the Seminoles came back for 45 points in the last two quarters while holding the Buildogs to 29.

Morris Dinwiddie, like Oler a 5-10 guard, battled the FSU star point for point most of the way. Dinwiddie scored 10 field goals and six charity shots for 26 total points.

Oler scored the Seminoles' last six points in a hectic finish that had the fans standing and hollering. Dinwiddie got 12 of Georgia's last-half points.

Georgia's big center, Bill Ensley, came through with 21 points. Guards Dick Artmeier and Tommy Garcia got 14 each and center Cary Wold added 11 for FSU.

It was FSU's ninth victory against six defeats. The Beminoles have defeated Georgia four straight times in a series that began last year. Georgia's
