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## FSU Quintet Wins, 80-75, Over Georgia In Last Game

## Oler Racks 34 For 741 Total; Bulldogs Tough In See-Saw Battle

A persistent Georgia five furnished Florida State with some uneasy moments here last night but the Seminoles still managed to close their basketball season happily.

The victory was the 23rd straight at home for the Seminoles; who ended the season with a 16-9 mark. The loss was the Bulldog's 18th in 21 contests.

It all started innocently enough for the Seminoles, who shot to an early 6-0 lead. But before the contest was over, the losers had knotted the count numerous times and at one stage in the third period held an eight-point lead.

## ENSLEY HOT

The Tribe had led throughout the first half until the final stages when Georgia, boosted by the shooting of center Bill Ensley, tied the score at intermission, 44-44.

The Seminoles jumped backed in front in the opening minutes of the second half, but the Bulldogs, now dominating the backboards as the Tribe had in the first 20 minutes, managed to keep up with or slightly ahead of the winners during most of the mythical third quarter.

Florida State did not again gain a reasonably secure lead

until midway into the last period, when they went ahead, 67-63.

Jimmy Oler, the Tribe's relentless scorer, was high man for the night with 34 points. The FSU guard, who closed out his career, scored 741 total points for the campaign and averaged 29.6 per contest. Both are good for state and school records.

## OTHER SENIORS

Four other Seminoles closed out their careers Monday night—center Gary Wold, forwards Dick Artmeier and Ed Wursbach, and guard Wayne Patton. FSU coach Bud Kennedy started the five seniors in the game Monday night and all played considerably.

Forward Curtis Gleaton, a jump-shot specialist, was high man for the losers with 20 points. Ensley and guard Morris Dinwiddle also provided the Bulldogs with a scoring punch, the former getting 19 and the latter, 14.
