

MIAMI BEACH — University of Miami overcame a record-tying, 43-point scoring burst by sophomore Dave Fedor to wrap up their most successful basketball season ever with a 107-89 conquest of Florida State here last night.

A crowd of 4,109 lively fans at the Exhibition Hall watched the Hurricane wind up their regular campaign with a 23-3 record, despite Fedor's amazing sharpshooting.

SNAPS RECORD

A 6-6 forward, from Little Zephyrhills, Fedor poured in 16 field goals — a one-game FSU record — and 11 straight free throws for his 43-point total. The tremendous effort tied the single-game Seminole scoring record set by Hugh Durham against Stetson in 1956.

It was the third straight game that the ninth-ranked Hurricanes, headed for the NCAA post-season playoffs, topped 100 points. The 'Canes averaged 90.1 points for their 26 games, a scoring pace that probably will rank them second for the year behind Ohio State.

The loss leaves Coach Bud Kennedy's young Seminoles with a 9-15 season mark. FSU closes its campaign against Georgia in Tallahassee tomorrow night.

MIAMI HOT

The Hurricanes came out with a full-court press on FSU and in two minutes built up an 8-2 lead. This swelled to 25-12 after seven minutes, then the Hurricanes cooled off as Fedor began to bomb the basket from near the foul stripe. Fedor knotted the count at 39-all after 17 minutes.

Jack Spisak put Miami ahead again with a field goal as he was falling backward from the basket. The Hurricanes quickly rebuilt their lead to an eight-point spread at halftime.

The regulars constructed a 24-point lead with six minutes to play. Coach Bruce Hale sent his entire second unit into the game and the Seminoles narrowed the gap slightly before the final buzzer.

EARNs APPLAUSE

Fedor's shooting earned him applause from the season's largest basketball turnout here. The soft-shooting lefthander, hitting mostly from the key, pumped in 16 of 27 shots. He had 23 points at intermission, collected 20 more in the final half.

The Seminoles were outbounded by a good margin. Center John Richter fouled out with 12:50 left.

Fedor, best sophomore in Seminole cage annals, hiked his season point total to 493, an average of 20.5 points that will rank him among the nation's top scorers.

He has now scored 203 field goals, second best in FSU history and 13 less than the single-season school record of 216

field goals set by Jimmy Oler in 1956.

STARTERS SCORE

All five Miami starters hit in double figures, with forward Ron Godfrey and center Harry Manushaw bagging 24 each. Diminutive guard Dick Hickox, whose 31 points and last-second field goal shaded FSU by 93-91 in Tallahassee earlier this year, managed only 13 points, nearly 10 points below his season average.

Soph guard Jack Davis turned in one of his finest efforts, aiding the Seminole cause with 17 points. Sophomore forward Ray Swain had 14 points.
