**Cal Huge** passed in 10 minutes to pack a 19-3 lead and Florida State's basketball team rambled on to a 73-57 victory over Stetson here Saturday night.

It wasn't quite as easy as it sounds, and it might have been a real toss-up save for a bushel of Stetson door errors. Eventually, FSU began making more than a dozen quota of mistakes itself.

Huge was hot all the way, however, tracking 21 points for the evening. That was eight more than the 6-4 sophomore's previous game high of 13. He also grabbed 11 rebounds.

#### ROUGH LATELY

Stetson had come into this one with five victories in six games, and was unbeaten in six Florida Intercollegiate Conference outings. The Hatters walked out with an 11-3 record.

The Hatters were never closer than four points after the early going. By halftime it was 43-33. Stetson pulled within five at the start of the second half. Then it was pretty much Johnny-barn-the-door.

FSU senior Charley Long sputtered down from his torrid pace of late, settled for 11 points after missing his first seven field-goals until 2:53, remained in the half-

Pete Rogers, who also got 11 for the night, teamed with Huge for the bulk of the early scoring and FSU was away winging. Stetson hit one fieldgoal in the first seven minutes.

After FSU stretched its lead to 24-12 Stetson rallied sharply. With 6-7 Lemar Deaver and 5-11 Floyd Gladden getting four points apiece, the Hatters trimmed things to 26-22.

#### REEVES HITS

In came Dale Reeves off the

bench with 6:36 to go in the half. He fired through eight of his 10 points for the evening in short order to spark the 43-33 half-time cushion.

On jumpers by Bill Foster and Gladden, Stetson narrowed the margin to just one point, 45-44, just before the end. Long had three hits and points. Reeves got a 3-pointer and a pair of free throws and Lemar Deaver finished his career with a basket.

A couple of times after that FSU led by as much as 30.

Hester was the leading scorer with 13. Denver got 10.

FSU led in rebounding, 44 to 33, hit 20 of 63 from the field for 31 percent, versus Stetson's 28 of 51 for 41.1 percent.

For once, the Seminoles got the best of it at the free-throw line, sinking 15 of 20 while Stetson dropped in 13 of 26.

It was the Seminoles' 10th victory in 21 games. Next action is here Monday against Centenary.

#### FRESH BOMP

FSU's freshmen squad rallied to an 83-82 victory over Old Southern Food, a Jacksonville AAU team, as Gary Schull polled down a whopping 24 rebounds.

Bill Phillips, Ken Leakey and Bill Peacock racked 21, 19 and 18 points for the Baby Seminoles. Ed Johnson got 21 for the visitors, who held a 37-35 lead at the half.
