Applying a smothering press, Florida State's basketball team I broke a tight game wide open in the last minutes and I skipped on to a 91-76 upset victory over highly favo red Tulsa here Monday night.

The lead c hanged hands 21 times in the f irst half, with the Seminoles ah ead 48-45 at the buzzer.

FSU went at read for good with 9:46 left in the game, when guard Pete G anzalez flipped in an underhand shot to make it 66-64.

The Tribe went into a full court press.

With Gonzal ez, forward Pete Rogers and gu ard Bill Peacock each sinking field goals, FSU led 74 - 67 two minutes later.

Spurred on 1 by the flashy defensive work of Gary Schull and Rogers, FSU turned the game into a ru maway when the clock read 2:35 t

Peacock, a 6-4 sophomore from Campbelli on, ended it with two easy field goals, the last one a layup without a Tulsa player within 2 0 feet of him.

The victory went a long way toward brightening up FSU Coach Bud Komnedy's Christmas. His Sem Inoles, 3-4 now after a rough start, meet the Air Force Acad emy in the Gator Bowl Tourn ament Thursday night at 7:30.

Well regarde d Tulsa is 5-3 now.

Tulsa is a member of the Missouri Valley Conference, a traditional sour me of national champion baske ball teams. The Golden Hurricar ies finished fifth in the eight - to sam league last season, had an overall 17-8 record.

Only other te ams to top Tulsa this season have been a pair of powerhouses. St. Bonaventure and New York University.

A sparse cro wd of 1,000 at Tully Gymnasiu: n saw the Seminoles use their first press of the season. Along with Schull and Rogers, 1? eacock made some timely interceptions and stole the ball twice from the Golden Hurrican es.

Game's top scorer was Tulsa forward Bill Kusickia, a 6-3 deadeye who rai med in 10 field goals and hit out six of seven foul shots for 11 points.

FSU was led by Peacock, who struck for a tot at of 22, on 10 fielders and two "charity tosses. Four other Sem holes had double - figure tot als — 6-6 center Jerry Shirle y 17, Schull 16, Gonzalez 12, aut I Rogers 11.

Both quint: 1 had accurate shooting. FSU r ong 38 of 64 attempts from the floor for 59 per cent, the Golder i Hurricanes 29 of 50 for 58 pc r cent.

Kennedy's cagers hit a sizzling 79 per cent of their 19 free throw attempts. Tulsa scored on 67 per cent of its 27 trips to the foul line.

With Shirley and Schull showing the way, FSU outrebounded the visiting Oklahomans 2822. Shirley pulled down nine,
Schull 8. Tops for Tulsa was
6-4 guard Bob Fedorko.

The Seminoles started the game with a press, and led 5-0 before the Hurricanes got into the scoring. FSU discarded it's press for a zone defense.

The Tribe held the front until Fedorko's short jumper from the baseline tied it 18-18 with 12:17 left in the half. Tulsa went ahead seconds later on Kuslekia's one - hander. Peacock tied it with a long set shot, and the Seminoles led 21 - 20 on Schull's free throw.

During the next five minutes, the game turned into a scoring spree, with each retaliating after the other scored a basket. One point separated the wo for four full minutes.

Rogers was shaken up and taken out of the game with 8:11 to go.

With 3:20 left in the half, Gonzalez went to the foul line, missed his shot. Shirley leaped, tipped it in and FSU led 43-39. A long jumper by Cal Huge and three foul shots by Gonzalez gave FSU its final points of the half.

Kuslekia, showing the talent that has made him one of the Southwest's best, quickly potted two long distance field goals, and it was 48-45 at the half.

Tuisa tied it up and went ahead 53-51 early in the second half, with Kuslekia providing the points for the most part. Shirley's baseline shots were crucial in keeping the Tribe going.

That 53-51 lead was both Tulsa's last and biggest. Shirley continued his deadly shooting, and he and Kuslekia kept the scoreboard blinking until FSU went into its well - executed final press.
