Gary Schull, Florida State's basketball team hung an 85-81 defeat on Manhattan College in a consolation game of the Gator Bowl Tournament here Friday night.

Florida overcame a terrific j. Air Force Academy defense to defeat the Falcons 74-68 in the lines finals for the tournament title.

Recovering brilliantly from a thoroughly had performance in a loss to the Air Force Academy on Thursday, FSU was a daring and alert team against Manhatten's Jaspers.

The Seminoles took the lead at 16:15 and never trailed after that, though it was a heart-stopper in the fading minutes when the Jaspers, behind as it much as 11 points, fought back to tie and had a couple of lovely opportunities to go shead.

A rugged 6-6 type, Schull v poured in 27 points for the 0 Tribe, pulled down a game - 6 tying 11-rebounds.

Manhatten's great scoring ace, 6-5 Larry Lembo, racked up 29, including 17 in the second half,

FSU was hot with its shots from the field, putting in 33 of 55 for an even 50 per cent, contrasted with Manhatten's 30 of a 58 for 44 per cent. The Seminoles led in rebounds 46-39. It Seminole efficiency at the foul T line was a factor. FSU dropped A in 19 of 25 free throws. Manhatten 21 of 29.

FSU also had a standout effort by Jerry Shirley, who notched 17 points, plucked 10 rebounds. Manhatten's Len Schnaptauf, who fouled out with 9:08 to play, hit 16 points.

Manhatten, on four straight points, by 6-9 Henry Chlupsa, jumped to a 6-3 lead in the early going.

Behind 15-13, FSU went on a nine-point tear for a 22-15 lead. It was 38-35 at intermission, with Schull scoring 10 first half points, Shirley nine and Cal Huge 8.

On two quick buckets by Pete Gonzalez, another by Shirley, FSU stepped away 44-35 at the start of the last half.

With Schull packing them in from outside, FSU drove on to a 51-40 lead before Manhatten came back big.

Behind 56-47, a seven - point points, by 6-9 Henry Chulpsa, Lembo's three-point spray, narrowed things to 56-54.

With the score 59-57, Pete Rogers stole the ball and pounded in for a layup that gave FSU a 61-57 advantage. But Manhatten tied it with 10:36 to go as Lembo hit a two-pointer and Matthew Link matched it.

Schull got his fourth foul with 7:50 left and FSU ahead 70-65. With 4:55 and the Seminoles leading 73-69 Shirley registered his fourth foul. Things got real sticky after that.

With some clutch work by Rogers for four points, FSU pushed to 77-72 lead. It was 80-75, then Joe Pette and Lembo sank fielders to cut things to 80-79 with 2:15 to play.

Schull missed a 20-footer at 1:49, and Manhatten pulled off the rebound. But Joe DeSantis missed on a shot that would have put the Jaspers ahead. FSU got the rebound. Then an offensive foul by Schull-putting him out of the game-provided Manhatten with the ball, with 54 seconds left.

Lembo tried a 20-footer with 87 seconds remaining. No good. Shirley was fouled as he went

for the rebound.

In a key 1-1 situation, Shirley put through both shots for
an 82-79 lead. Manhatten immediately came back on a fielder by Pette, and trimmed it to
82-81 with 24 seconds to go.

But Genzalez was fouled and he sank two free throws. Shirley added another on a technical foul call for the final 85-81 margin.

it was a nip and tuck game in the finales from the outset and the final score represented the higgest margin either team held. Brooks Henderson's floor work and the inside maneuvers of Florida's three big men — 6-feet-11 Richard Peek, 6-feet-6 Mont Highley and 6-feet-4 Chick Tomlinson — made the difference.

All were in double figures, held by Tomlinson's 22. Hender-son had 17. Highley 14 and Peak 11.

It was 66-66 with 4:02 to go and Florida made an effective stall pay off with six free throws and one jump shot by Tom Baxley the rest of the way. All Air Force could hit in the final four minutes, was a jumper.
