ATHENS, Ga, (AP) — Georgia defeated Florida State 85-70 le last night in a final basketball a game of the regular season for both teams:

The Bulldogs trailed for most of the first half but bullt up a 39 - 32 halftime lead and increased it steadily in the second half.

Coach Red Lawson cleared his bench, in the final minutes: if Jimmy Pitts, presented a trophy before the game as Georgia's most valuable player, led the Bulldogs with 21 points be fore fouling out with one minute left.

Sophomore Lee Martin, playing his last game of the season, was second for Georgia with 19 points. Sophomore, Jerry, Waller had 17.

Captain Pete Rogers led Florida State with 17 points before fouling out with four minutes left

Florida State built up a 2116 lead before Georgia began to
hit. John Mathews put the Bulldogs ahead for the first time
since the opening minute 24-23
with a 10 - foot set shot. The
lead changed hands several
times before Georgia pulled
away behind Martin's field goal.

Florida State was unable to gain ground in the second half.
Pitts, Martin, Waller and Mathews kept the drive going for Georgia. Mathews scored 18 points.

The victory left Georgia with a season mark of 12-14. FSU finished with an 11-14 chart.

Georgia outshot FSU in every department. The Bulldogs made 31 of 60 field goal attempts for 51.7 per cent. They had 23 of 28 free throw attempts for 82.1 per cent.

Florida State made 27 of 67 field goal attempts for 40.2 percent, and had 18 free throws out of 24 for 66.7 per cent.

Georgia also outrebounded the

Seminoles 48 to 34.

The crowd of 7,000 was the smallest of the four games Georgia has played in its new coliseum. A crowd of 13,200 saw the inaugural Tech - Georgia game, and crowds of 10,000 showed up for both the Vanderbilt and Florida games.

Georgia's record in its new arena now is 3-1. The Bulldogs lost only to Florida.
