Now 13-10 with three games remaining, the Seminoles take to the road today for a Saturday night tussie at Tampa, a Monday night game at Miami. They close the season at home a week from tomorrow against Georgia.

Gunning for a post-season tournament berth, Southern had its prospects virtually crased. The Moccasine now stand 15-9.

Most aggressive from starts to finish, the Seminoles jump ed to a 7-0 lead before Southern got on the board,

The Moccasins, led by Dan Doherty, scrambled back to take the lead 13-12.

FSU tied it 15-15, and then guard Darrel Stewart took over for a few moments. He stole and pounded down for a 3-points play, then soon added another basket for a 20-15 lead that the Seminoles never relinguished, !

Southern came within three, at 24-21, with 8:22 left in the half. FSU took the game away with a forrid scoring spree. from that point.

Southern got only one field goal in that 8:22 span to intermission while the Seminoles, with Jim Lyttle showing the way, racked 26 points for a 50-26 lead.

Things never got any better for the Lakeland team in the last half as FSU kept the pressure on and destroyed the Moccasins zone defense with hot outside shooting.

Like most always, Gary Schull led FSU, getting 19 points and 18 rebounds, both
